

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

He stated that he has no knowledge of the Appointee's family background other than that he knows the Appointee is well known in Boston, Massachusetts. stated that he considered the Appointee to be a brilliant and capable individual, that during the period he has known bim he has known of nothing unfavorable regarding the Appointee. advised that he would recommend the Appointee highly for a Government position of trust and confidence. concluded by stating that the appointee is presently residing at the Commodore Hotel, New York City, and has been for the past few weeks. b6 b7C b7D advised that he has known Mr. AXWELL M. RABB for a period of four years. He advised however, that his association was limited to a political association and that he knows nothing regarding the Appointee's family background. said that the Appointee is a person who goes about his work in a vigorous manner and one who is capable. He added that the Appointee was secretary to Senator HENRY CABOT LIDGE, Jo. from 1936 to approximately 1942. stated that he would recommend the Appointee very highly for a position with the Government involving trust and confidence. concluded by stating that the Appointee is well known in Boston, Massachusetts.





## PURPOSE:

To advise of information developed during our investigation that has not been included in the summary for dissemination to Governor Adams who requested this investigation in his letter dated December 9, 1952, and to point out some possible derogatory information that has been included.

## DETAILS:

The name of one Milton Rabinowitz, not otherwise identified, but believed to be from the New York area, appeared on the letterhead of the American Committee for the Settlement of Jews in Birobidjan, Inc., in 1948. This organization reportedly had many officers and members who are members of the Communist Party.

Maxwell Milton Rabb, the subject of our inquiry, changed his name from Rabinowitz to Rabb in 1933. He is not known to have lived in the New York area. The current Manhattan telephone directory lists 4 persons named Milton Rabinowitz. It is therefore believed unlikely that the above information relates to the subject of our inquiry and it has therefore been deleted.



Birth - Records of the Massachusetts State Division of Vital Statistics reflect that Max Rabinowitz was born September 28, 1910. His parents were listed as Solomon Rabinowitz and Rose Kostivk, both of whom were born in Russia

Change of Name - The above records reflect that the name of Max Rabinowitz was changed to Maxwell Rabinowitz on March 10, 1933, in accordance with the desires of the father, Solomon Rabinowitz.

Records of the Probate Court, Norfolk County, Dedham, Massachusetts, disclose that Maxwell Milton Rabinowitz filed a petition to change his name to Maxwell Milton Rabb and by decree of the court on December 13, 1933, this was accomplished.

Education - Records in the Office of the Registrar, Harvard College, Cambridge, Massachusetts, reflect that Mr. Rabb, as Maxwell Milton Rabinowitz, enrolled on September 21, 1929. He was awarded an A.B. degree, cum laude, in 1932.

# Rabb Resigns As Secretary To Cabinet

Maxwell M. Rabb has resigned from his \$20,000-a-year White House job as Secretary to the Cabinet, effective in mid-May, in order to practice law in New York City.

In accepting Rabb's resignation yesterday, President Eisenhower told him in a "Dear Max" letter that he had performed "a truly large service." He added:

"A letter of resignation and its acceptance customarily has an air of finality that in this instance is unacceptable. Your willingness to be of assitance in the future is something I shall not fail to remember and put to good use.

"My thanks and best wishes

"My thanks and best wishes go to you, along with my complete confidence that the future will be full and satisfying for you and your good family." Aided in '52 Campaign

The President's association with Rabb goes back to the 1952 campaign. At that time Rabb was secretary to Henry Cabot Lodge, then Senator from Massachusetts and now this country's ambassador to the United Nations.

When Lodge became campaign manager in the drive to win the Republican presidential nomination for Gen. Eisenhower, Rabb continued as his right-hand man, and played a prominent role in the '52 political battle.

Once Gen. Eisenhower moved into the White House, Rabb became his associate council. He assisted in carrying out the President's directive to end segregation in all Federal establishments, and the Chief Executive praised him yesterday for the way in which he handled that assignment.

#### First Cabinet Secretary

Later on he became Secretary to the Cabinet, a post created by President Eisenhower, the first in this country's history. Rabb, in his letter of resignation, told the President that in creating the post he had "changed the Cabinet from what was a somewhat haphazard, inconclusive conclave into an effective, vital coordinating body."

Rabb, a 47-year-old native of Boston, Mass., and a graduate of Harvard College and Harvard Law School, lives at 3101 Albemarle st. nw. with his wife and four children—Bruce, Sheila, Emily and Priscilla.

He declined some glittering offers from firms which had dealings with the Federal Government to join the law firm of Stroock, Stroock and Lavan.

#### PERSONAL HISTORY:

He is a member of the Massachusetts Bar and has served in the following positions: Administrative Assistant, U. S. Senator Henry Cabot Lodge, Massachusetts, 1937-1943; Executive Assistant, 1951-1952; Administrative Assistant, U. S. Senator Sinclair Weeks, Massachusetts, 1944; Legal and Legislative Consultant to Secretary of Navy Forrestal in 1946; Consultant, U. S. Senate Rules Committee, 1952; Assistant to the Assistant to the President, January-November, 1953; Secretary to the Cabinet and Associate-Counsel of the President, November, 1953, until May, 1958.

# INFORMATION IN RABB'S MAIN FILE:


