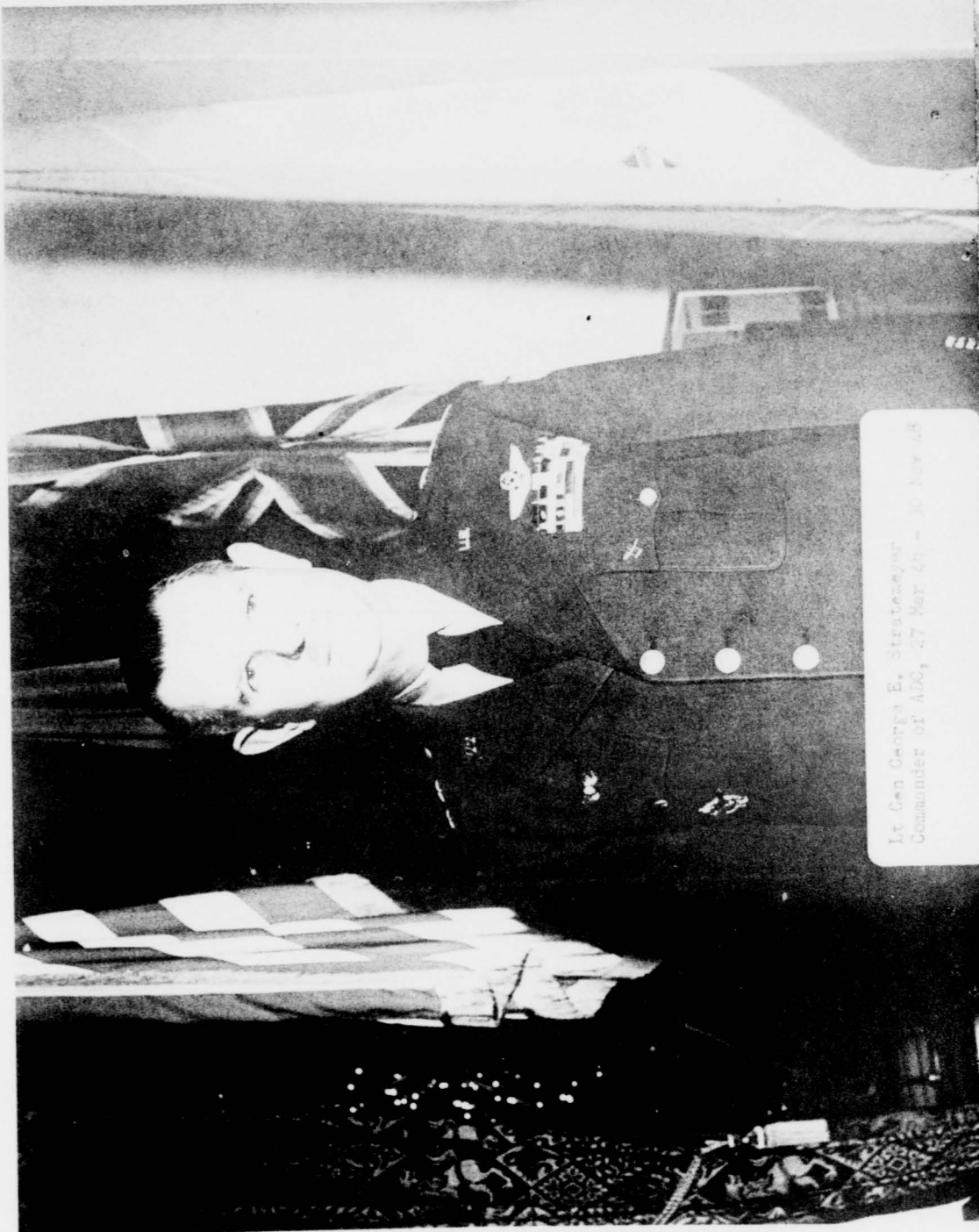

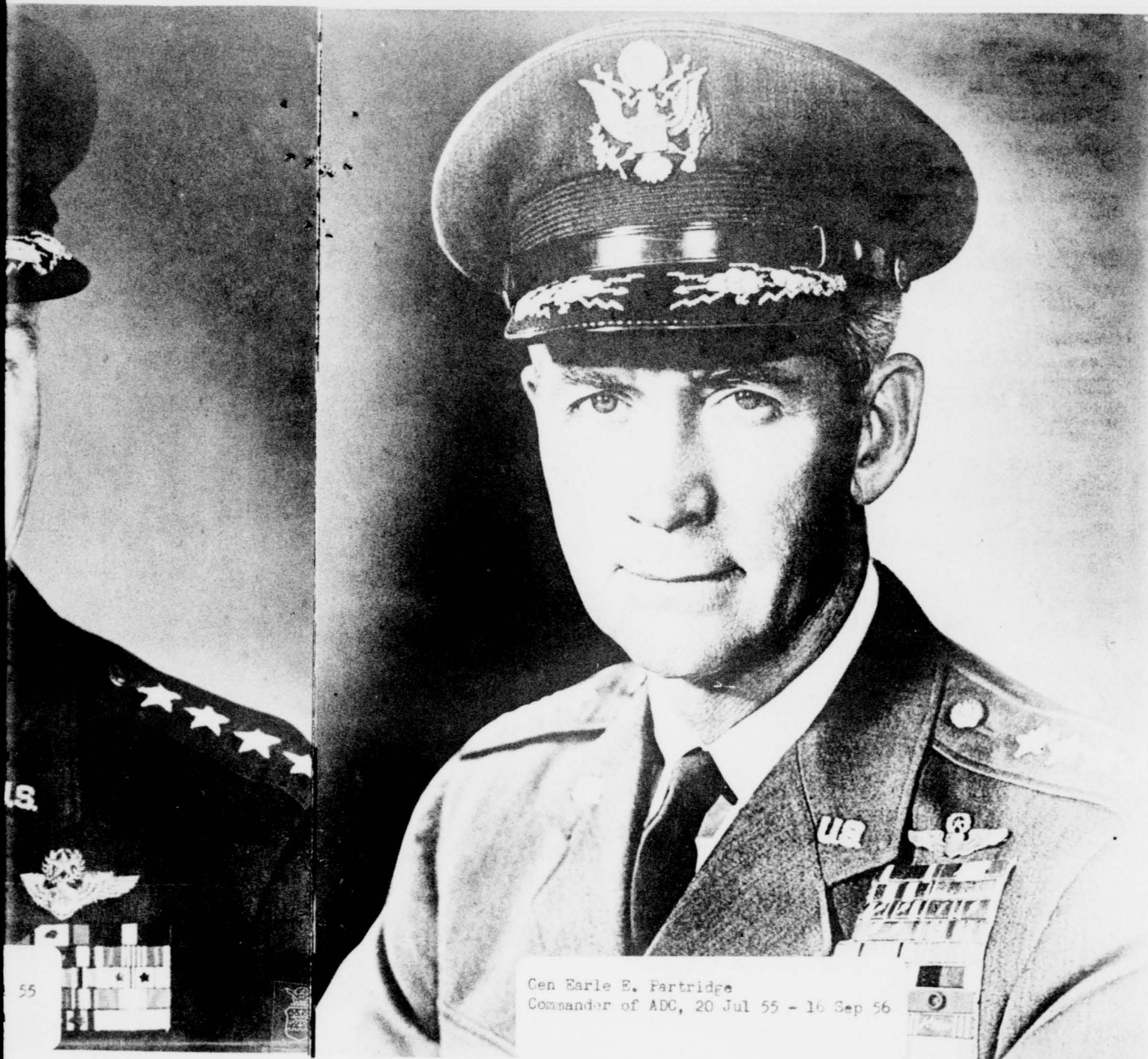

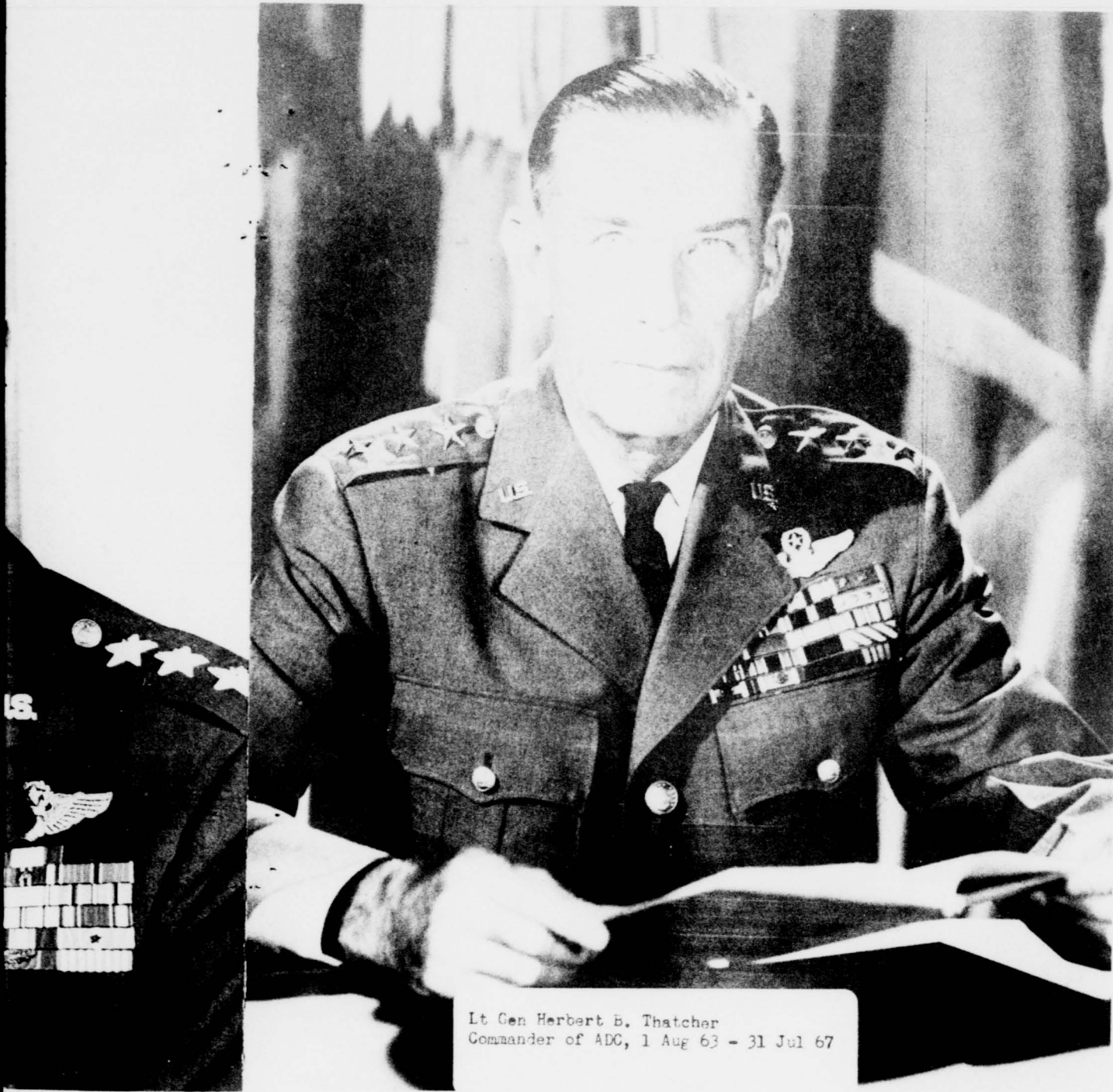

Andrews AFB, Md., 11 mi. SE of Washington D. C., (ADC aircraft 1951-1962). Formerly Camp Springs Army Air Base, renamed for Lt Gen Frank M. Andrews, airpower pioneer, CG, European Theater of Operations, killed in aircraft accident, Iceland, May 3, 1943.

Baer Field, Ind. (ADC aircraft 1951).

Berry Field, Tenn. (ADC aircraft 1951).

Bunker Hill AFB, Ind., 9 mi. S of Peru, (ADC aircraft 1955-1962). Formerly the location of a naval air station. Named geographically.

Castle AFB, Calif., 7 mi. NW of Merced, (ADC aircraft 1955-1968). Formerly Merced Field, renamed for Brig Gen Frederick W. Castle, WW II B-17 pilot and recipient of CMH, killed over Germany, 1944.

Charleston AFB, S. C., 10 mi. N of Charleston, (ADC aircraft 1954-1968). Named for city.

Davis-Monthan AFB, Ariz., 4 mi. SE of Tucson, (ADC aircraft 1953-1964). Formerly Tucson Municipal Airport, renamed for Lt Samuel H. Davis, killed in U.S., 1921, and Lt Oscar Monthan, bomber pilot, who was killed in Hawaii in 1924.

Dover AFB, Del., 3 mi. SE of Dover, (ADC aircraft 1951-1972). Named for city.

Dow AFB, Me., 2 mi. W of Bangor, (ADC aircraft 1947-1948, 1951-1954, and 1959-1967). Formerly Bangor AB, renamed for 2d Lt James F. Dow of Oakfield, Me., killed in crash near Mitchel Field, June 1940.

*As of December 1972, ADC owned four bases: Duluth IAP, MN; Ent AFB, CO; Hamilton AFB, CA; and Tyndall AFB, FL. ADC had a fighter squadron located at Hamilton and had fighter squadrons as tenants at nine other bases: Dover AFB, DE; Grand Forks AFB, ND; Griffiss AFB, NY; Keflavik NAS, Iceland; K. I. Sawyer AFB, MI; Langley AFB, VA; McChord AFB, WA; Minot AFB, ND; and Wurtsmith AFB, MI.

Duluth IAP, Minn., 7 mi. NNW of Duluth, (ADC aircraft 1951-1972). Formerly Williamson-Johnson AP, renamed for city.

Ellsworth AFB, S. D., 8 mi. NE of Rapid City, (ADC aircraft 1951-1959). Formerly Rapid City AFB, renamed for Brig Gen Richard E. Ellsworth, killed in B-36 crash in Newfoundland, March 18, 1953.

England AFB, La., 6 mi. NNW of Alexandria, (ADC aircraft 1959). Formerly Alexandria AFB, renamed for Lt Col John B. England, WW II ace killed in an air crash in France, November 17, 1954.

Ethan Allen AFB, Vt., 2 mi. E of Winooski, (ADC aircraft 1951-1959). Housing and administration for Burlington Municipal AP prior to 1954. Named for the famed Revolutionary War leader of the Green Mountain Boys.

George AFB, Calif., 6 mi. NW of Victorville, (ADC aircraft 1950-1966). Formerly Victorville AAB, renamed for Brig Gen Harold H. George, WW I ace, Commander, U.S. Air Forces in Australia in WW II, killed in Australia, April 1942.

Glasgow AFB, Mont., 18 mi. NNE of Glasgow, (ADC aircraft 1959-1967). Named for city.

Goose AB, Nfld., (ADC aircraft 1957-1966).

Grand Forks AFB, N. D., 14 mi. W of Grand Forks, (ADC aircraft 1960-1972). Named for city.

Greater Pittsburgh AP, Pa., 5 mi. SW of Coraopolis, (ADC aircraft 1950-1957). Named for nearby city.

Grenier AFB, N. H., 4 mi. S of Manchester, (ADC aircraft 1951-1952). Named for 2d Lt Jean D. Grenier of Manchester, killed in U.S., 1934, while in snowstorm during airmail test run.

Griffiss AFB, N. Y., 2 mi. NE of Rome, (ADC aircraft 1950-1972). Formerly Rome AFB, renamed for Lt Col Townsend E. Griffiss of Buffalo, recipient of DSC, killed in flight from Russia to England, February 1942.

Hamilton AFB, Calif., 6 mi. NNE of San Rafael, (ADC aircraft 1947, 1949-1972). Formerly Marin Meadows, renamed for 1st Lt Lloyd A. Hamilton, recipient of DSC, killed in fighter combat, France, August 1918.

Hanscom Field, Mass. (Laurence G. Hanscom Field), 1 mi. SSW of Bedford, (ADC aircraft 1955-1959). Formerly Bedford Airport, renamed for Laurence G. Hanscom, Boston and Worcester newspaperman, Army Reserve pilot, killed near the base, 1941.

Harmon AB, Nfld., (ADC aircraft 1957-1959). Ernest Harmon AB, 1 mi. E of Stephenville. Named for Capt. Ernest E. Harmon, specialist in piloting large aircraft and winner of many air trophies. He was a parachute patent expert and ironically lost his life while bailing out of a plane with a chute that failed to open.

Homestead AFB, Fla., 5 mi. NNE of Homestead, (ADC aircraft 1962-1971). Named for city.

K. I. Sawyer AFB, Mich., 23 mi. S of Marquette, (ADC aircraft 1956-1972). Named for Kenneth I. Sawyer, Marquette County Road Commissioner, who died in 1944.

Keflavik NAS, Iceland, (ADC aircraft 1962-1972).

Kincheloe AFB, Mich., 3 mi. SE of Kinross, (ADC aircraft 1968). Formerly Kinross AFB (1958), renamed in honor of Capt Iven C. Kincheloe, Jr., Korean War jet ace and holder of world altitude record of 126,200 feet, set in 1956 in Bell X-2 rocketplane; killed July 26, 1958, in crash of an F-104 Starfighter at Edwards AFB, Calif.

Kingsley Field, Ore., 5 mi. SE of Klamath Falls, (ADC aircraft 1956-1970). Formerly Klamath Falls Municipal Airport, renamed in honor of 2d Lt David R. Kingsley, killed in Ploesti raid in June 1944.

Kirtland AFB, N. M., 4 mi. SSE of Albuquerque, (ADC aircraft 1949-1959). Formerly Albuquerque AAB, renamed for Col Roy S. Kirtland, aviation pioneer and former CO of Langley Field, died in 1941.

Langley AFB, Va., 3 mi. N of Hampton, (ADC aircraft 1948-1949, and 1952-1972). Named for Samuel P. Langley, pioneer aeronautical scientist, died in 1906.

Larson AFB, Wash., 6 mi. NNW of Moses Lake, (ADC aircraft 1948-1959). Formerly Moses Lake AFB, renamed for Maj Donald A. Larson, native of Yakima, Wash., WW II ace, killed on fighter mission over Ulzen, Germany, August 1944.

Lockbourne AFB, Ohio., 11 mi. SSE of Columbus, (ADC aircraft 1951 and 1956-1968). Named for nearby city.

Long Beach Municipal AP, Calif., 3 mi. NE of Long Beach, (ADC aircraft 1951). Named for city.

Loring AFB, Me., 2 mi. NW of Limestone, (ADC aircraft 1959-1971). Formerly Limestone AFB, renamed for Maj Charles J. Loring, Jr., CMH recipient, killed in Korea in November 1952 when he crashed his damaged F-80 into enemy artillery emplacements, destroying them.

Malmstrom AFB, Mont., 4 mi. E of Great Falls, (ADC aircraft 1953-1971). Home of nation's first Minuteman ICBM. Formerly Great Falls AFB, renamed for Col Einar A. Malmstrom, killed in airplane accident near Great Falls, August 21, 1954.

March AFB, Calif., 9 mi. SE of Riverside, (ADC aircraft 1946). Named for Lt Peyton C. March, Jr., son of WW I Army Chief of Staff, killed in an air crash in U.S., 1918.

McChord AFB, Wash., 8 mi. S of Tacoma, (ADC aircraft 1947 and 1950-1972). Named for Col William C. McChord, killed in U.S., 1937.

McCoy AFB, Fla., 7 mi. S of Orlando, (ADC aircraft 1957-1960). Formerly Pinecastle AFB, renamed for Col Michael N. W. McCoy, B-47 wing commander, killed in an aircraft accident, October 1957, near Orlando.

McGhee-Tyson AP, Tenn., 12 mi. SSW of Knoxville, (ADC aircraft 1952-1957). Named for Charles McGhee Tyson, WWI flyer whose family donated land for the airport. Known as Nashville Field prior to 1951.

McGuire AFB, N. J., 18 mi. SE of Trenton, (ADC aircraft 1949-1966). Formerly Fort Dix AAB, renamed for Maj Thomas B. McGuire, Jr., of Ridgewood, N. J., second ranking WW II ace with 38 victories, P-38 pilot, recipient of CMH and DSC, killed over Leyte, Philippines, January 7, 1945.

Minot AFB, N. D., 13 mi. N of Minot, (ADC aircraft 1960-1972). Named for city.

Mitchel AFB, N. Y., 2 mi. NE of Hempstead, L. I., (ADC aircraft 1947-1948). Named for Maj John P. Mitchel, first fusion mayor of NYC, fighter pilot, killed in air crash in Louisiana, July 1918.

New Castle Co. AP, Del., 5 mi. SW of Wilmington, (ADC aircraft 1951-1956). Named geographically.

Niagara Falls IAP, N. Y., 4 mi. E of Niagara Falls, (ADC aircraft 1951-1959). Named for city.

O'Hare IAP, Ill., 15 mi. NW of Chicago, (ADC aircraft 1950-1958). Formerly Douglas Airport, renamed for Lt Cmdr Edward H. O'Hare of Chicago, Navy pilot in WW II, winner of CMH, killed in action near Tarawa in the Pacific, 1943.

Otis AFB, Mass., 5 mi. NNE of Falmouth, (ADC aircraft 1948-1970). Named for Lt Frank J. Otis, killed in an air crash in the Illinois River on January 11, 1937.

Oxnard AFB, Calif., 5 mi. E of Oxnard, (ADC aircraft 1952-1969). Named for city.

Paine Field, Wash., 6 mi. S of Everett, (ADC aircraft 1952-1968). Formerly Paine AFB. Named for 2d Lt Topliff O. Paine, airmail pilot, who was killed while mapping airmail routes, 1922.

Presque Isle AFB, Me., 1 mi. NW of Presque Isle, (ADC aircraft 1951-1958). Named for city.

Portland IAP, Ore., 7 mi. NE of Portland, (ADC aircraft 1951-1966). Named for city.

Richards-Gebaur AFB, Mo., 16 mi. S of Kansas City, (ADC aircraft 1953-1967). Formerly Grandview AFB, renamed for Lt John F. Richards, II, of Kansas City, first area pilot to die in combat in WW I; and for Lt Col Arthur W. Gebaur, Jr., who was killed in action over North Korea in 1952.

Scott AFB, Ill., 6 mi. ENE of Belleville, (ADC aircraft 1951-1958). Named for Cpl Frank S. Scott, first enlisted man to die in an air accident, killed at College Park, Md., 1912.

Selfridge AFB, Mich., 3 mi. E of Mount Clemens, (ADC aircraft 1948-1970). Formerly Joy Aviation Field, renamed for Lt Thomas E. Selfridge, killed in 1908 while on flight with Orville Wright to demonstrate Wright plane.

Seymour Johnson AFB, N. C., 2 mi. SSE of Goldsboro, (ADC aircraft 1956-1959 and 1961-1965). Named for Lt Seymour A. Johnson, Navy pilot of Goldsboro, killed in 1942.

Sioux City Municipal AP, Iowa, 10 mi. S of Sioux City, (ADC aircraft 1952-1959). Named for city.

- Spokane IAP, Wash., 6 mi. WSW of Spokane, (ADC aircraft 1953-1962). Formerly Geiger Field (1960), named for Maj Harold Geiger, WW I dirigible expert, killed in crash landing at Olmsted Field, Pa., May 1927; renamed for city.
- Stewart AFB, N. Y., 4 mi. W of Newburg, (ADC aircraft 1952-1958). Named for Lachlan Stewart, sea captain whose son provided land for the base.
- Suffolk County AFB, N. Y., 3 mi. N of Westhampton Beach, L. I., (ADC aircraft 1951-1969). Named for geographical area.
- Thule AB, Greenland, (ADC aircraft 1957-1965), 2.5 mi. SE of Thule.
- Travis AFB, Calif., 6 mi. ENE of Fairfield and Suisun, (ADC aircraft 1954-1966). Formerly Fairfield-Suisun AFB, renamed for Brig Gen Robert F. Travis, bomber pilot, recipient of DSC, killed in B-29 crash in U.S., August 1950.
- Truax Field, Wis., 1 mi. E of Madison, (ADC aircraft 1951-1966). Named for 1st Lt Thomas L. Truax of Madison, pilot, killed in training flight in U.S., November 1941.
- Walker AFB, N. M., 6 mi. S of Roswell, (ADC aircraft 1959). Formerly Roswell AAB, renamed for Brig Gen Kenneth N. Walker, a native of New Mexico, CG, 5th Bomber Command, WW II recipient of CMH, killed in Southwest Pacific while leading a bomber attack, 1943.
- Webb AFB, Tex., 1.8 mi. SW of Big Spring, (ADC aircraft 1958-1966). Formerly Big Spring AFB, renamed for 1st Lt James L. Webb, Jr., F-51 pilot, killed off Japanese coast, 1949.
- Westover AFB, Mass., 3 mi. NNE of Chicopee Falls, (ADC aircraft 1950-1959 and 1961-1962). Named for Maj Gen Oscar Westover, Chief of the Air Corps, who was killed in an air crash near Burbank, Calif., September 1938.
- Wold-Chamberlain Field, Minn., 7 mi. SSE of Minneapolis, (ADC aircraft 1951-1957). Name of base changed to Minneapolis-St. Paul International AP for geographical area in 1956.
- Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, 2 mi. ENE of Dayton, (ADC aircraft 1950-1959). Formerly separate areas including Fairfield Air Depot, Wilbur Wright Field, McCook Field, and Patterson Field; renamed for Orville and Wilbur Wright, and for Lt Frank S. Patterson, who was killed in air crash near this base during early firing tests of synchronized machine gun, June 1918.

Wurtsmith AFB, Mich., 3 mi. NW of Oscoda, (ADC aircraft 1950-1972). Formerly Camp Skeel, later Oscoda AFB, renamed for Maj Gen Paul B. Wurtsmith, CG, 13th AF, who was killed in B-25 crash in North Carolina, 1946.

Youngstown Municipal AP, Ohio, 10 mi. N of Youngstown, (ADC aircraft 1952-1959). Named for city.

Ent AFB, Colo., named for Maj Gen Uzal G. Ent, CG, Second Air Force, recipient of DSC, died in 1948, participated in Ploesti raid.
