Dear Sir:

In reference to your access to the former Nike Battery Site which you recently purchased, this Depot has reviewed the conditions of the sale and there are no rights in the sale that permit you to utilize Navy property to gain access to your land. The notice distributed by GSA describing the property stated that "It is approximately 4.55 acres of landlocked land irregular in shape".

Not wanting to be unreasonable, temporary passes were issued to you with the understanding that the access problem to your property would be solved in the near future. In my letter of 29 July 1965 it was stated that this permission would expire on 1 September 1965. However, the passes have been repeatedly reissued. This is an abuse of the original agreement and has caused the Government additional cost in opening up the various gates involved and the utilization of a critically short supply of Marine Corps security personnel. Present world problems now dictate more stringent security of military bases and the present condition involved in access to your property detracts from these efforts.

In view of the above conditions, you will be prohibited access thru the Navy property and will be prohibited the use of Normandy Road as of 1 May 1966, which is the expiration date of the presently issued passes.
