Dear Mr. Greenewald:

This is in further response to your request for release of information from the files of the U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command (USACIDC) and supplements our response of January 8, 2019. Your initial request was received on December 17, 2018.

The enclosed Report of Investigation (ROI) 2005-CID919-38278-5P, responsive to your request, is part of a system of records exempt from the disclosure provisions of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). The names of law enforcement personnel, as well as names, social security numbers and other personal items of information pertaining to third parties have been withheld. The withholding of this information constitutes a partial denial of your request pursuant to Title 5, USC, Section 552, Exemptions (b)(6), and (b)(7)(C) of the FOIA, because release would violate the personal privacy of other individuals mentioned in the report. We also applied Exemption (b)(7)(E), to withhold the identification numbers of special agents as well as investigatory records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes where the techniques or procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions would be disclosed.

This partial denial, which is made on behalf of Major General David P. Glaser, Commander, USACIDC, and Initial Denial Authority for USACIDC records under the FOIA, may be appealed to the Secretary of the Army.

If you decide to appeal at this time, your appeal must be submitted within 90 days of the date of this letter. In your appeal, you must state the basis for your disagreement with the partial denial and you should state the justification for its release. Your appeal is made through this Center and should be addressed to the Director, U.S. Army Crime Records Center, 27130 Telegraph Road, Quantico, Virginia 22134, for forwarding, as appropriate, to the Office of the Secretary of the Army, the appellate authority.

Be advised portions of the report did not originate with this agency. The USACIDC is not the releasing authority for the documents in question; therefore, your request and the documents have been referred to the following agencies for appropriate action and direct reply to you:

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom Investigation

This investigation was initiated upon notification by INV (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Military Police Investigator (MPI), 939th Military Police (MP) Detachment, Logistical Support Area Anaconda, Balad, Iraq APO AE 09391 (LSAA), of the death of a soldier by gunshot under unknown circumstances.

Investigation established probable cause to believe PV2 JOHNSON committed suicide when she shot herself through the mouth with her assigned M16 rifle, which resulted in her death. An autopsy was performed by Dr. (LCDR) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Office of the Armed Forces Medical Examiner (OAFME), Armed Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP), which revealed the cause of death was an intra-oral gunshot wound to the head, and the manner of death was suicide.

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 0200, 19 Jul 05, this office was notified by INV (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Military Police Investigator (MPI), 939th MP Detachment (DET), LSA Anaconda, Iraq APO AE 09391 (LSAA), of the death of PV2 Lavena L. JOHNSON, (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Headquarters, Headquarters Detachment (HHD), Logistics Task Force (LTF) 129, LSAA, within a tent adjacent to Dining Facility (DFAC) 2, LSAA.

About 0300, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 372nd Transportation Company (TC), LSAA, who rendered a sworn statement in which she detailed her notification by SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 74th Quartermaster (QM) Company (CO), LSAA, of a fire in a tent adjacent to DFAC #2, LSAA.

About 0310, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) canvassed the following airmen of the 332nd Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron (ESFS), LSAA, who responded to the initial call:

A1C (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who related he found the victim under the bench.

SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who related he saw the victim under the bench and verified there were no signs of life.

TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who related he saw the M16 lying across the victim's body. TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he didn't know what firing setting the weapon was on. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related everything was smoking, including parts of the body. Further, TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he called for ambulance, then secured the scene.

About 0315, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 141st Medical (MED) CO, LSAA, who related when he arrived he checked for signs of pulse and breathing, which were both negative. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related the Security Forces were on the scene at the time of his arrival. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further related he knelt down beside the body; the M16 was cradled over the left shoulder when he moved the weapon. Further, SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he only saw trauma to the victim's head and did not provide any further medical care.

About 0400, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein he related he heard a shot and saw a fire within a tent South of DFAC 2, and detailed his subsequent actions.

About 0418, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SRA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) SRA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SRA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C)

USAF, all of 332nd Civil Engineering Squadron (CES), LSAA. The above airmen stated they arrived at the tent at approximately 0130, 19 Jul 05, walked less than three feet inside the tent, did not see a fire, and left. The above airmen related they did not touch PV2 JOHNSON or any objects inside the tent.

About 0450, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Kellogg, Brown, and Root (KBR) employee, LSAA, who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed his actions upon arriving at the scene.

About 0615, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 141st MED CO, LSAA, who rendered a sworn statement wherein she stated she was one of the medics who arrived on the scene, and detailed her actions upon arrival.

About 0620, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement in which he documented his observations upon arrival on the scene.

About 0640, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who stated he was the Flight Sergeant for the day shift when SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) both patrol C-1, notified him of a fire and possible gunshot wound at DFAC 2, LSAA. TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated upon his arrival he stepped inside the tent and noticed a black female lying on her back face up, with her left arm stretched out and her right arm across her face. TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated an M16 was stretched out across the victim's left wrist. TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further related he noticed thick blood that was not moving. TSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he did not check for signs of life; that he immediately left the tent, secured the scene, and called for Rescue.

About 0705, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed A1C (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement in which he detailed his response to a notification by Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who stated he heard shots fired and a tent was on fire.

About 0710, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who stated he and his partner, SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) were driving by DFAC 2 when they were flagged down by a civilian who told them there was a fire and a body. SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) saw flames near the tent and ran toward it. SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) came up to the tent behind SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and saw SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and another soldier carry a burning bench outside the tent. SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) then entered the tent and flashed his light on PV2 JOHNSON, who was lying on the floor with a severe head injury and no obvious signs of life. SSGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) kept everybody out and secured the scene until the Flight Sergeant arrived.

About 0730, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Comtech Company, LSAA, who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed

how between 0120 – 0130, 19 Jul 05, he heard what he thought was someone shooting into the clearing barrel. Mr (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) did not exit the building after hearing the shot.

About 0815, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) conducted a verbal interview of PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) both of 372nd TC, LSAA, as they were close friends of PV2 JOHNSON. Both PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related that PV2 JOHNSON recently broke up with her boyfriend (NFI) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C). PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related that in the last two weeks PV2 JOHNSON had talked about killing herself, however it was in a joking manner; therefore it didn't cause them concern. PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related that PV2 JOHNSON had received an email from the doctor requesting PV2 JOHNSON to return to the clinic for different medications (b)(6) (b)(7)(C).

About 0830, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) coordinated with SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) HHD, LTF 129, LSAA, who related he worked with PV2 JOHNSON. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON seemed as if she was adapting well to working in Iraq. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further related he and PV2 JOHNSON did not talk much about personal matters, other than PV2 JOHNSON mentioning she and her boyfriend split up prior to her deployment to Iraq. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he did not know the name of PV2 JOHNSON's former boyfriend. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he believed PV2 JOHNSON had a close relationship with her family and he did not notice any changes in her behavior as of late. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he provided PV2 JOHNSON with four M16 magazines upon her arrival at the unit.

AGENT'S COMMENT: Three M16 magazines were found within the magazine pouches on PV2 JOHNSON's Interceptor Body Armor (IBA).

About 0845, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein she described her relationship with PV2 JOHNSON, (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 584th Maintenance Company, Fort Campbell, KY (NFI). PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further related PV2 JOHNSON stated she and her boyfriend were going through a rough time.

About 0845, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Cargo Specialist, HHD, LTF 129, LSAA, who provided a sworn statement relating he had not seen any signs of depression in PV2 JOHNSON and thought she was a very happy person.

About 0850, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C)

372nd TC, LTF 129, LSAA, who provided a sworn statement wherein he related he was with PV2 JOHNSON between 1800 – 2345, 18 Jul 05.

AGENT'S COMMENT: During the time he spent with PV2 JOHNSON, SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he did not notice whether she was wearing her identification tags.

About 0850, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) briefed MAJ (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Executive Officer (XO), and SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) LTF 129, LSAA on the aspects of this investigation.

About 0910, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who stated she knew PV2 JOHNSON since they were in deployment classes at Ft. Campbell, KY. PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated last month, PV2 JOHNSON found out she had an (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated during the last week, PV2 JOHNSON changed her eating habits, gave PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) some of her possessions and began smoking. During the past month, PV2 JOHNSON stated several times how she hated her life and wished she were dead.

About 0920, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 372nd TC, LSAA, who stated he did not know of any issues PV2 JOHNSON was having and she seemed in good spirits and never talked of hurting herself. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON started smoking, but would not give a reason why.

AGENT'S COMMENT: During the interview SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was asked if he knew of any medical or personal problems PV2 JOHNSON was having. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) then stated he would not talk bad about her and stated she was fine.

Between 0930 – 0945, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) conducted a search of PV2 JOHNSON's room. At 0940, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) collected two different creams, personal letters, and medical paperwork, from her personal room as evidence.

About 1023, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) coordinated with Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Construction Inspector, KBR, LSAA, who stated the tent where PV2 JOHNSON was found was used as a break area for the workers who were building the new DFAC 2, LSAA. Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated there were no burns on the inside of the tent and there should not have been any small fires made by the workers. MR. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he did not know about the condition of the roof of the tent.

About 1400, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Commander, HHD, LTF 129, LSAA, who made a verbal statement in which he described PV2 JOHNSON as a "good soldier". CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON was a hard worker, always laughing and playing around making others laugh. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he last spoke with PV2 JOHNSON on the evening of 17 Jul 05, where he was joking about PV2 JOHNSON's upcoming driving class. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he noticed no change in work product or behavior over the past few weeks and saw no signs PV2 JOHNSON was having any difficulties. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was aware that PV2 JOHNSON spent most of her time with PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and also felt she was happy with the unit.

About 1400, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) had not seen or spoken to PV2 JOHNSON recently except in a brief encounter while on Internet Duty. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated prior to that, he worked with PV2 JOHNSON during the day. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON always seemed upbeat and happy. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) seemed to have strong family ties and called home a lot. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he considered PV2 JOHNSON as having high moral standards; she was very religious and did not smoke or drink. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he was surprised to return from his pass to find out PV2 JOHNSON began smoking cigarettes. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON always wrote in a green Army journal; work notes and, he believed, personal notes. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he never saw PV2 JOHNSON mad, upset or stressed. 372nd TC, LSAA, and agreed with CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SFC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) assessment. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further stated PV2 JOHNSON was very orderly and organized and very concerned about her appearance.

About 1530, 19 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) examined the personal belongings of PV2 JOHNSON which were already packed up and placed in storage by the unit. PV2 JOHNSON's TA 50, uniforms and a vast supply of personal hygiene items were noted. There were several pictures, which were identified by SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) as being of PV2 JOHNSON and various family members. There were no personal papers or other articles. There was a journal with artwork on the front and back which SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) identified as something PV2 JOHNSON wrote "everything" in and was constantly writing in it when not working. Approximately the first third of the pages were missing from the journal; with the only entry concerning a Combat Lifesaver Course PV2 JOHNSON recently attended. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) further identified a small black Compact Disc holder in which there were music CD's missing.

About 1022, 20 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) coordinated with CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 322nd Expeditionary Aero-Medical Squadron (EAMS), LSAA, who treated PV2 JOHNSON. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated she last saw PV2 JOHNSON on 9 Jul 05, when PV2 JOHNSON was diagnosed with (b)(6) (b)(7)(C). During the check up, CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON appeared shocked and upset at the diagnosis and so CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) offered and recommended PV2 JOHNSON to seek counseling to deal with the stress (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to which she declined. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) told PV2 JOHNSON to go to the laboratory to have blood work done to check for (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C). On 16 Jul 05, CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) sent an email to PV2 JOHNSON to advise her they had medication that would treat her condition, to be used in conjunction with the medication she was given at the 9 Jul 05 check up. CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated it was routine to send emails to patients due to the fact many did not have telephone numbers and all soldiers had Army Knowledge Online accounts that were secure and sensitive information could be sent to them via email.

AGENT'S COMMENT: During the coordination with CPT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) she provided this agent with copies of the write up of the 9 Jul 05 visit as well as a copy of the email she sent to PV2 JOHNSON. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C)

About 1100, 20 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) re-interviewed SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to clarify certain aspects of his original statement. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he exited DFAC 2 enroute to the work trailer behind the DFAC when he heard an explosion then saw a flash of flames coming from a tent that was located approximately 200 meters south of DFAC 2. He advised a KBR employee and the two ran to the tent to put the fire out. Upon arrival to the tent SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and the KBR employee found an individual within the tent and two small fires burning. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and the KBR employee ran back to the DFAC to get additional help. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) notified SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and the two returned to the tent where they attempted to move the individual away from the fire. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) recalled the individual was lying on their left side with the weapon lying somewhat parallel to the body and the muzzle facing down. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he was concerned with the fire burning down the tent so he could not be 100% sure what direction the weapon was facing, it could have been facing up. During their attempt to move the body they found the individual to be deceased and the weight of the individual to be too much to safely move while the fire was still burning. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he and SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) turned their attention to the fire and began putting it out with dirt they found outside the tent using a trash can they found just outside the tent. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated he observed the bench to be upright, parallel to the window of the tent and about one to two feet away from the wall of the tent. There was a can resting on the ground that was also upright and inches from the edge of the fire that was on the ground. The can was located in a position that placed it between the fire and the E/E with it within inches to the fire. The flames from the fire on the ground were low and contained to the area of burning. The flames reached about bench level. Both fires were put out with dirt; however, the fire on the bench began to smoke and re-ignite. By this time a USAF Security Forces airman arrived and was observing the area when it was noticed the bench was beginning to burn again. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) moved around the body to the South of the tent and positioned himself at the far end of the bench. The Security Forces airman positioned himself at the end of the bench closest to the entrance/exit of the tent. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) recalled the Security Forces airman dragging the bench to a position past the extinguished fire on the ground to get the bench away from a pool of blood which would allow SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to grab hold of the bench and carry it out of the tent. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated once the bench was outside a female Security Forces airman poured water on the part of the bench that was burning, which extinguished it. At that point another Security Forces airman asked SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to leave the tent and no one was allowed back into the tent until MP's arrived.

About 1435, 20 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) re-interviewed SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to clarify certain aspects of her original statement. SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) recalled SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) ran into her office and told her there was a fire and a body in a tent. SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) followed SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) to the tent and entered to see an individual on the ground lying next to a bench and two small fires burning. The individual was lying on her left side

with an M16 laying across her left arm, some-what parallel to the body with the muzzle facing up. SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) recalled seeing a can resting upright on top of the bench which was also upright. SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) remembered trying to move the body; however, due to the weight she unable too. SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated her attention then turned to putting the fire out, so her and SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) grabbed a trashcan and filled it with dirt and threw it on the fire that was on the ground and on the bench. The fires appeared to be out and a Security Forces airman arrived to check the area when the bench fire started again. SGT (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) and the Security Forces airman grabbed the bench and took it out side the tent. Another Security Forces airman came into the tent and checked the body at which time he told SSG (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) she needed to leave the tent and standby until MP's arrived.

About 1015, 25 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed PFC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) 372nd TC, LSAA, SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) roommate, who provided a sworn statement wherein he corroborated SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) statement.

Between 0820 – 0905, 26 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) conducted canvass interviews of the following soldiers assigned to HHD, LTF 129, LSAA:

SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Room 6, Building 4747, LSAA, who related PV2 JOHNSON was on internet café duty until 1600, 18 Jun 05. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated she last saw PV2 JOHNSON at 1330 on the same day. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related she did not hear PV2 JOHNSON enter her room the night of 18 Jun 05, which was unusual as PV2 JOHNSON usually came back to her room around 2400 regularly. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) stated PV2 JOHNSON often went to visit friends assigned to the 372nd TC after her internet café shifts, but was unsure whether what PV2 JOHNSON did on 18 Jul 05. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related PV2 JOHNSON was soft-spoken and appeared "closed in". When asked to elaborate, SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related PV2 JOHNSON always wore pants, even with PT uniform, and often wore dark sunglasses.

SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Room 2, Building 4747, LSAA, who related she only held conversations with PV2 JOHNSON on maybe 4 – 5 occasions. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related she never overheard PV2 JOHNSON say a harsh word about anybody, and was typically a happy person. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related even when PV2 JOHNSON was aware of other soldiers talking about her behind her back (about physical training), she wouldn't let it bother her. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related the last time she was aware of PV2 JOHNSON being in her room was at 1830, 18 Jul 05. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) believed PV2 (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was with PV2 JOHNSON. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) was unaware of any changes in PV2 JOHNSON's behavior as of late. SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related she heard PV2 JOHNSON had a boyfriend in the 372nd TC, LSAA; however, did not know for sure.

AGENT'S COMMENT: PV2 JOHNSON lived in Room 8, Building 4747, LSAA.

About 1010, 27 Jul 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) who provided a sworn statement wherein he detailed his relationship with PV2 JOHNSON and related the last time he saw her.

About 0910, 30 Aug 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) obtained a copy of the AR 15-6 Report pertaining to this investigation from MAJ (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) XO, 4/159th Aviation Regiment, LSAA.

About 1700, 13 Sep 05, this office received the Interim Trace Evidence Report pertaining to the gunshot residue (GSR) kit collected from the victim from the US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory (USACIL), Forest Park, GA 30297. The report related gunshot residue was recovered; however, the number was considered insignificant.

About 1610, 19 Sep 05, SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) coordinated with Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) USACIL, who related the following reasons an insignificant amount of GSR could be discovered:

1. The weapon itself did not deposit a significant amount of GSR.
2. The timeline from the event and the collection of GSR.
3. If the body was moved.
4. If the hands were rubbed.
5. Any explosion adjacent to the body.
6. If the hands were dirty/soiled. The collection pads would be ineffective once soiled.

Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related he was unsure whether heat near the body could effect the collection of GSR. Further, Mr. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) related the samples submitted to USACIL were soiled.

About 0800, 23 Sep 05, this office received the Final Autopsy Examination Report pertaining to PV2 JOHNSON, which revealed the cause of death as an intra-oral gunshot wound to the head and the manner of death as a suicide.

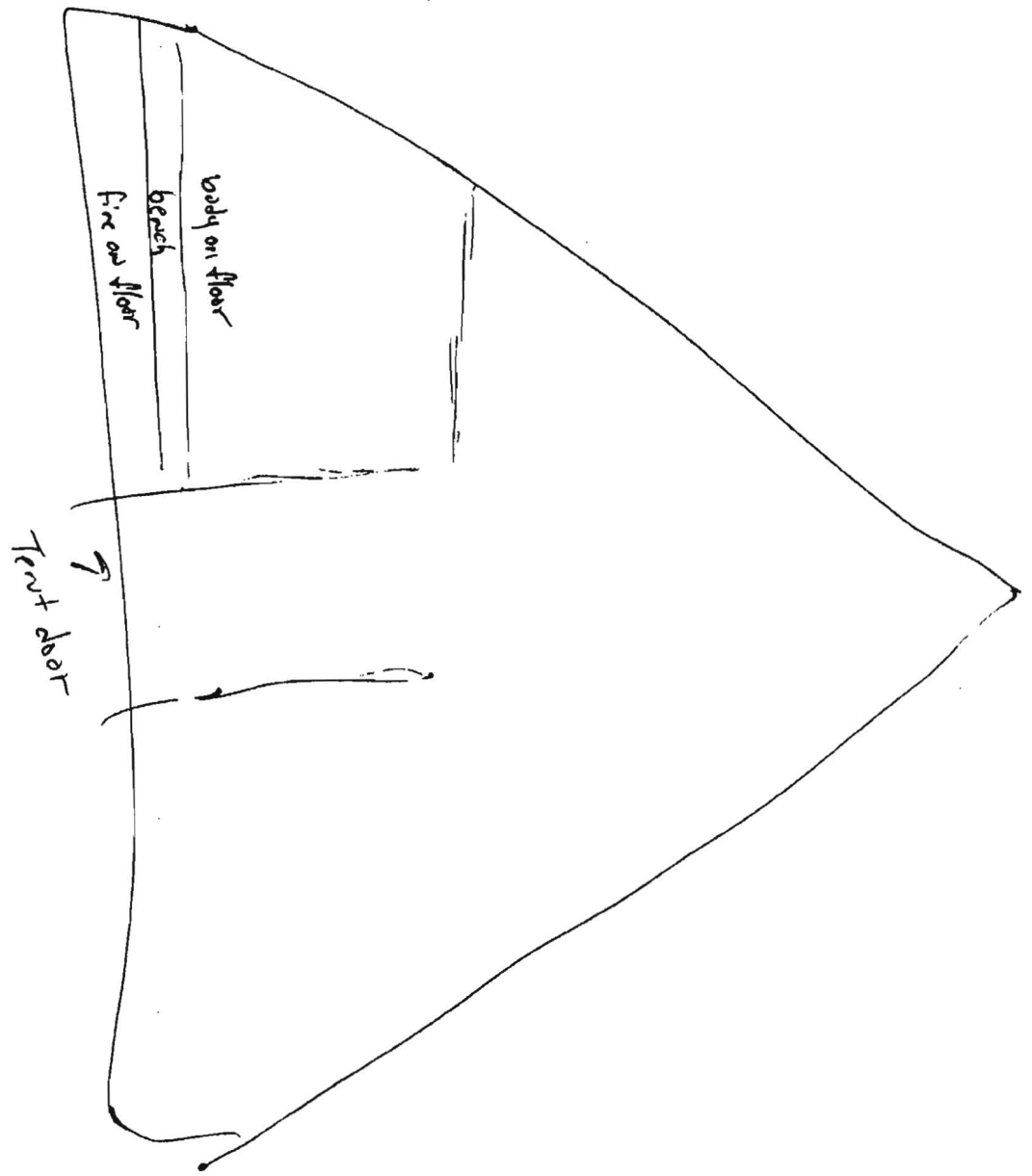

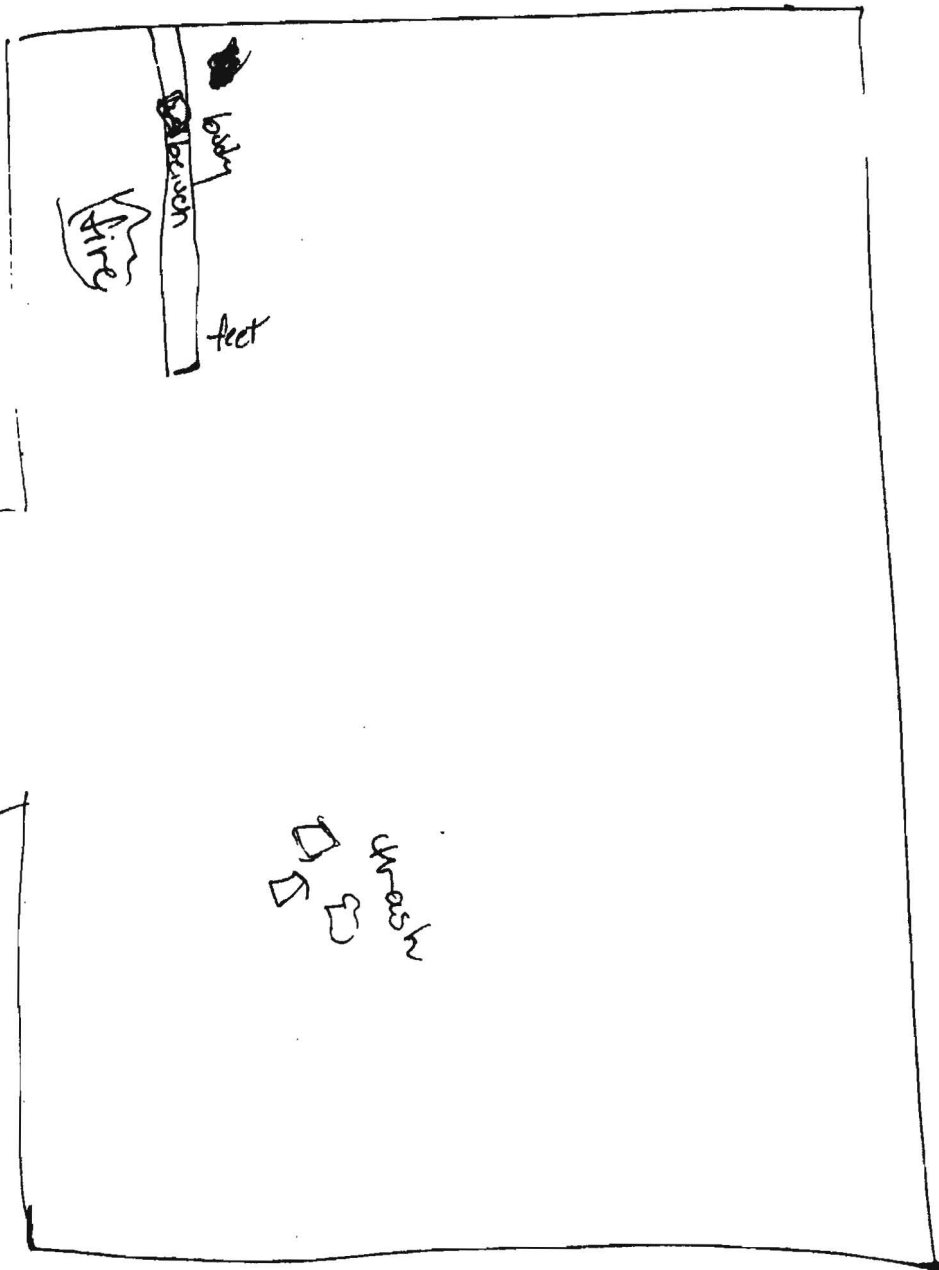

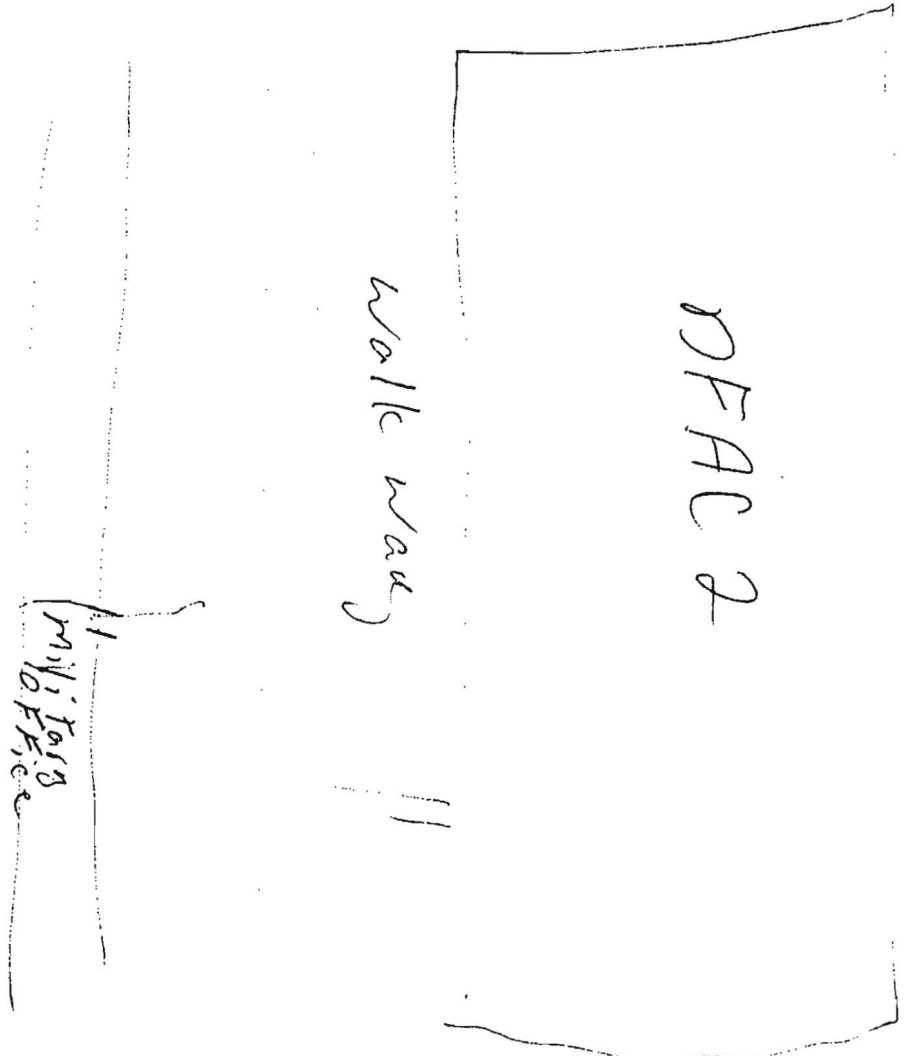

Around 0200 we heard a call over the net for a fire behind DFAC 2 and a victim laying facedown nearby. We were on our way back from a fire on the west side and the call was actually for Thunder, but we were real close so we took the call.

Upon arrival, we pulled up to a small tent outside of DFAC 2. There were 2 or 3 personnel standing outside it and one gentleman standing in the doorway. I went directly up to the gentleman in the doorway and asked where the patient was. He pointed to the far left hand corner of the room.

The room was dark, but I could make out the shape of a body. I ran over to the victim, put my aid bag beside me and knelt down. The first thing I noticed was her weapon and quickly moved it to the side to get it out of the way. Upon taking a better look, I saw that she had massive trauma to the back of the head, where I finally put two and two together that she most likely shot herself thru the mouth. I checked for breathing and pulse immediately which were both absent. From the amount of brain matter and trauma to the head, it was obvious that CPR or further medical care were needed at the time.

While I was assessing the patient, my partner had ran to get a litter. When she arrived with it, there was no use for it. Two or three firefighters were also in the room to ask if we needed assistance. After a minute or so, the room was cleared out, I left my aid bag and litter in the tent. Everyone that was involved, or had been present at the scene was told to stand by for questioning.

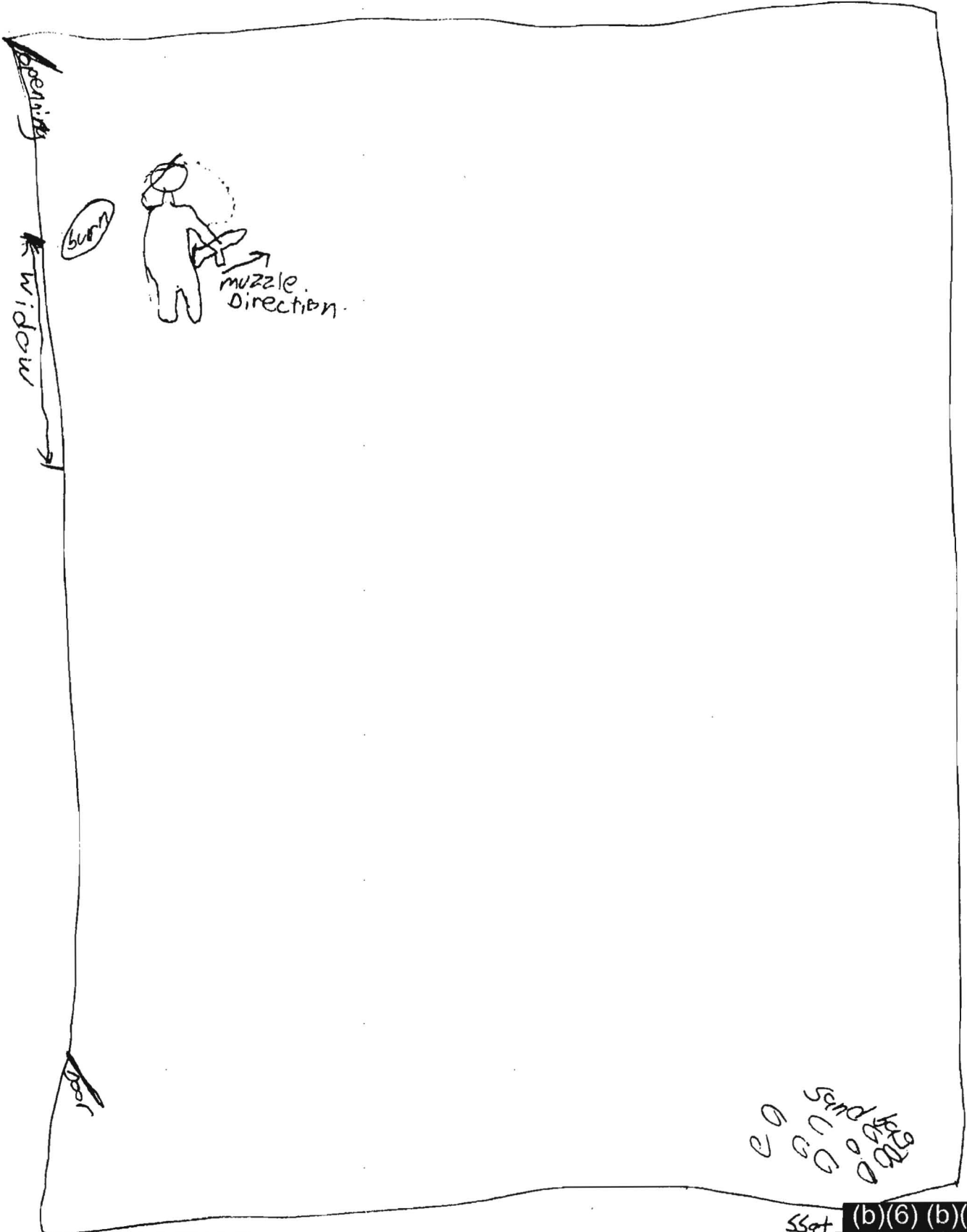

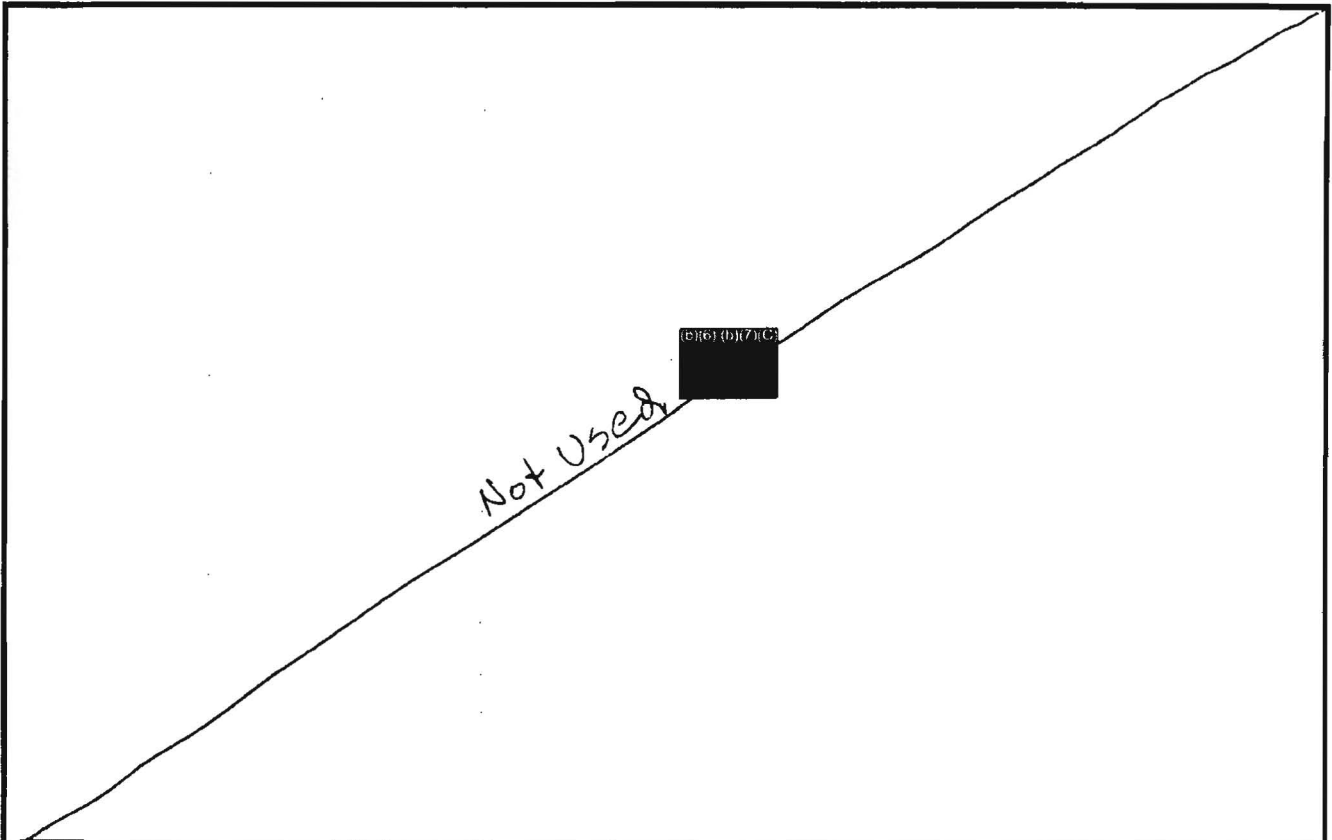

Characteristics of Scene: The tent was a temporary structure, made of canvass type material, and was brown in color. The floor of the tent was a cement pad. There were numerous construction type materials throughout the exterior and interior of the tent and surrounding area. The South end of the tent was somewhat collapsed. There were numerous areas to access the tent, due to openings within the side flaps. Within the North wall of the tent was a window with no screen. Along the West wall of the tent were numerous bags of nails and other carpentry type items. There was a table near the SE corner of the room. There was an apparent loaded M16 rifle (serial number: 7095028) lying on it's left side, magazine well facing South, and muzzle pointed East. The M16 was between the aforementioned table and a medical litter. The litter was lying upright with its long axis running West to East. Lying to the immediate North of the litter were the remains of PV2 Lavena L. JOHNSON, (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) Headquarters, Headquarters Detachment (HHD), Logistics Task Force (LTF) 129, LSAA. PV2 JOHNSON was lying face up, with her right arm resting across her face. PV2 JOHNSON's head was facing East, and the length of her body was running West to East. The measurements from PV2 JOHNSON's head to the NEBC corner of concrete floor was 4'2", and to the middle of the East edge of the concrete floor was 7'. PV2 JOHNSON's right foot was 12'8" to the NWBC of the concrete floor, and 12'10" to the middle of the West edge of the concrete floor. The space between PV2 JOHNSON's heels measured 1'4". There was a pool of suspected blood adjacent to PV2 JOHNSON's head. From the approximate center of the pool of blood to the middle of the East edge of the concrete floor was 6'7", and to the NEBC of the concrete floor was 4'2". Below the window, along the North wall of the tent, was a pile of dirt. Atop the approximate center of the dirt pile was a mostly burnt Bible. The approximate center of the Bible was 6'2 ½" from the NWBC of the concrete floor, and 13'5" from the NEBC of the concrete floor. Underneath the dirt pile was found a melted Camelback brand personal hydration system, an identification tag type chain with a key-ring and various keys, a used book of Meal, Ready to Eat (MRE) style matches, and various unidentifiable items. Adjacent to PV2 JOHNSON's right leg was an aerosol can, which appeared to have exploded, as its top was not attached and had charring to its exterior. From the approximate center of the aerosol can to the NEBC of the concrete floor was 12'10", and to the NWBC of the

concrete floor was 7'4". Found under the right leg of PV2 JOHNSON was a 5.56mm shell casing. From the NEBC of the concrete floor to the approximate center of the shell casing was 6'4 3/4", and from the NWBC of the concrete floor to center of the shell casing was 14'4". There was a medical response bag located adjacent to PV2 JOHNSON's feet. On the exterior area of the tent, adjacent to the window was an empty trashcan. Adjacent to the Entrance/Exit (E/E) was a partially burnt bench, which was allegedly originally inside the tent; however, medical and security forces removed it upon putting out two fires inside the tent. Between the bench and the E/E was an aerosol can top, alleged to be from the aerosol can inside the tent. A pack of Marlboro Light cigarettes were located West of the tent.

AGENT'S COMMENT: The litter and medical bag were allegedly brought into the scene by responding medical personnel.

Condition of Scene: During the examination, this office maintained control of the structure. Access was restricted to USACIDC and MPI personnel, and was guarded by MP Patrols. There were numerous carpentry items throughout the interior and exterior of the tent. The interior and exterior of the tent was covered in dust.

Environmental Conditions: During the timeframe of the examination the temperature fluctuated between 85 – 110 degrees Fahrenheit, and the outdoor visibility ranged from dark to sunny.

Factors Pertinent to the E/E: The tent could be accessed through an E/E located within the North wall of the structure; however, as the structure was a tent, access could be gained through numerous gaps within the walls.

Scene Documentation: SA ^{(b)(6) (b)(7)(C)} exposed photographs utilizing a Nikon Coolpix 995 digital camera, and SA ^{(b)(6) (b)(7)(C)} drafted crime scene sketches.

Collection of Crime Scene Evidence: The following items were collected as evidence during the crime scene examination: One (1) pack of Marlboro Lights cigarettes; one (1) aerosol can top; one (1) bench; one (1) M16, serial number: 7095028; one (1) 5.56mm shell casing; one (1) book, suspected to be a Bible; one (1) gel lifter containing a suspected footwear impression; one (1) aerosol can; and numerous items within the area of the suspected fire. Further, a US Army Criminal Investigation Laboratory Gunshot Residue Kit was utilized on the hands of the victim and collected as evidence.

Search for Latent Impressions: During the conduct of the crime scene examination, one suspected footwear impression was collected as evidence. Some of the above items were

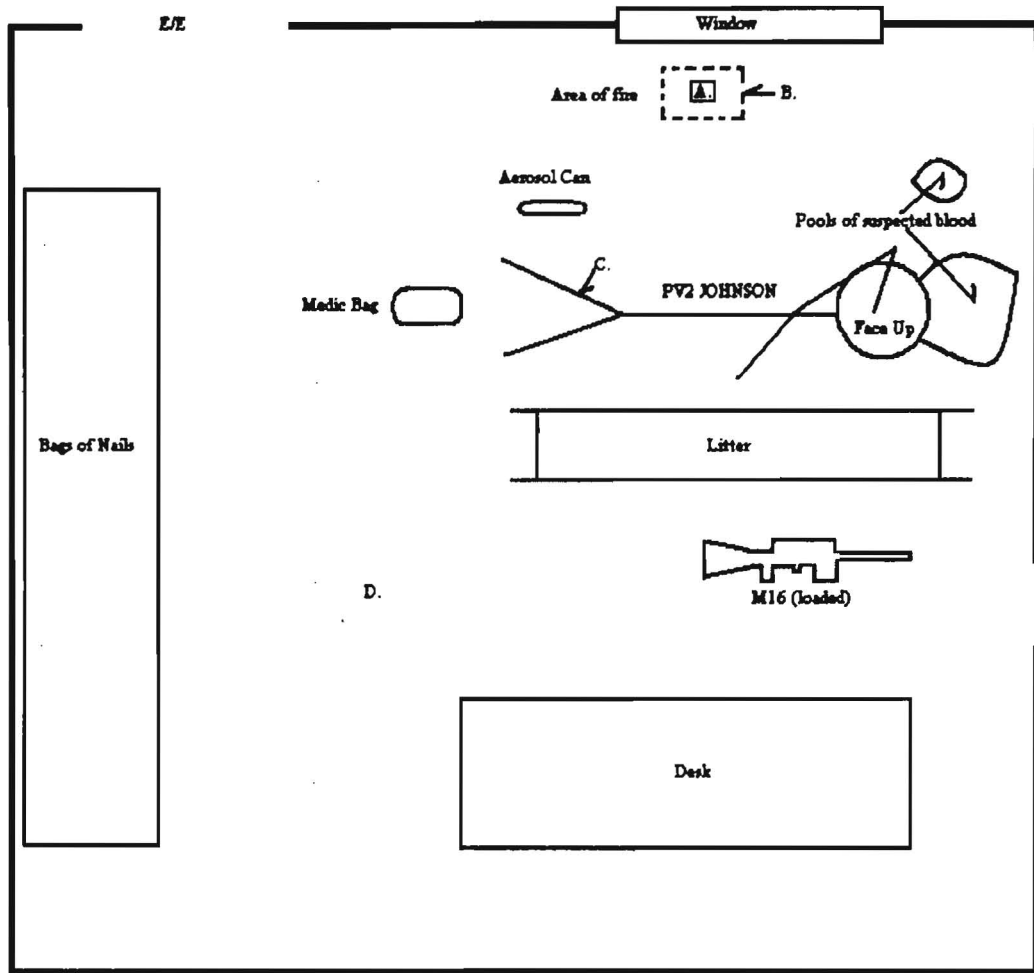

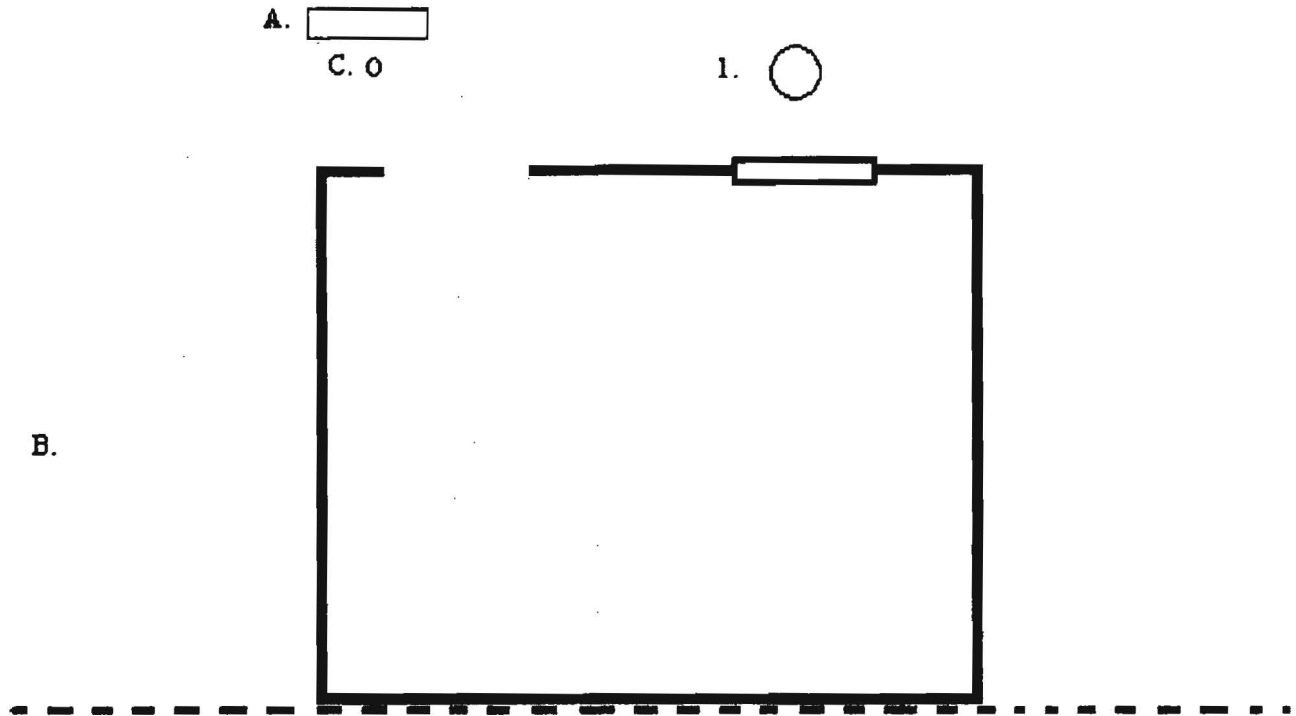

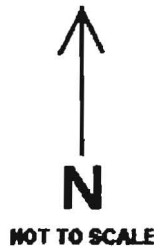
ROUGH SKETCH DEPICTING CRIME SCENE

Mrs. (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) attempted to have her sons speak with SA (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) but they declined.

Based on these findings, it is likely that the heavy petroleum distillate detected in Exhibit 3 is residual from the can's original content. Other commercial sources for heavy petroleum distillates include kerosene, diesel fuel, and some charcoal starters.

Examination of the volatile residues recovered from the contents of Exhibit 9 indicated the presence of components consistent with those present in a heavy petroleum distillate; however, due to the paucity of residues recovered, the presence of a heavy petroleum distillate in this exhibit could not be confirmed.

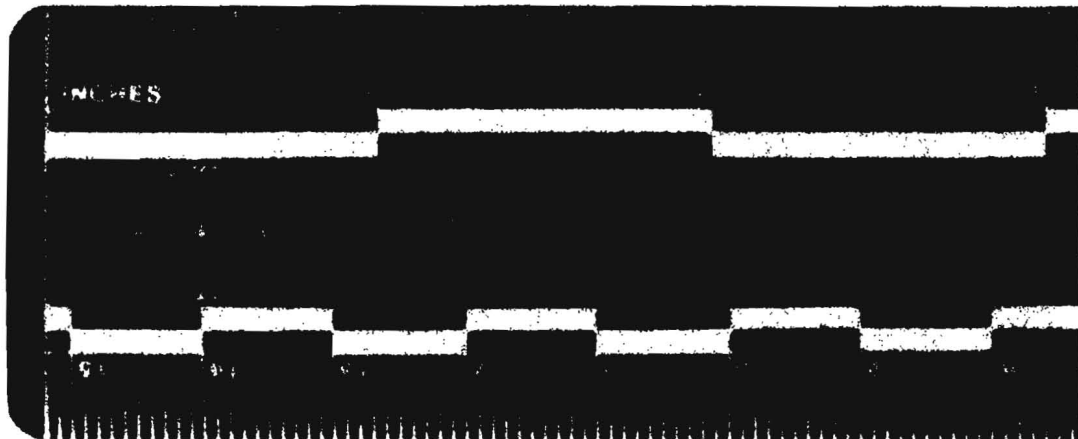

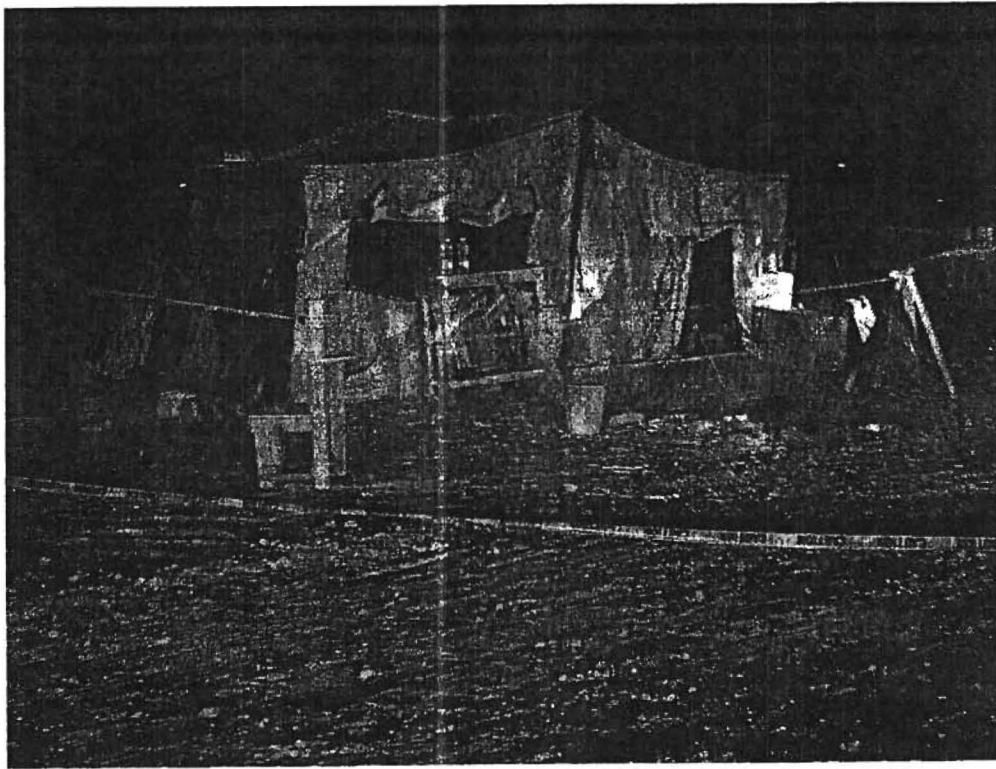
