Index of Classified Records

1. In late August, Alan Thompson, Director, Records Declassification Division, NARA, sent to this office a computer print-out (sample attached) of classified documents requiring CIA declassification review. The listing is made up of CIA documents deposited with NARA by other federal agencies and of other agency documents that contain information concerning intelligence sources or methods or of interest to CIA. NARA requested that we determine whether or not the listing contains classified information.

2. We have reviewed the listing and have met twice with Mr. Thompson to clarify a number of questions concerning the listing and its general usage. We have determined that the index contains information which requires that it be classified at the SECRET level.

3. At least four categories of information initially evident in this index are classified under Executive order 12356 and are further protected against unauthorized disclosure by provisions of the National Security Act of 1947 and the CIA Act of 1949. The four recognized categories are as follows:

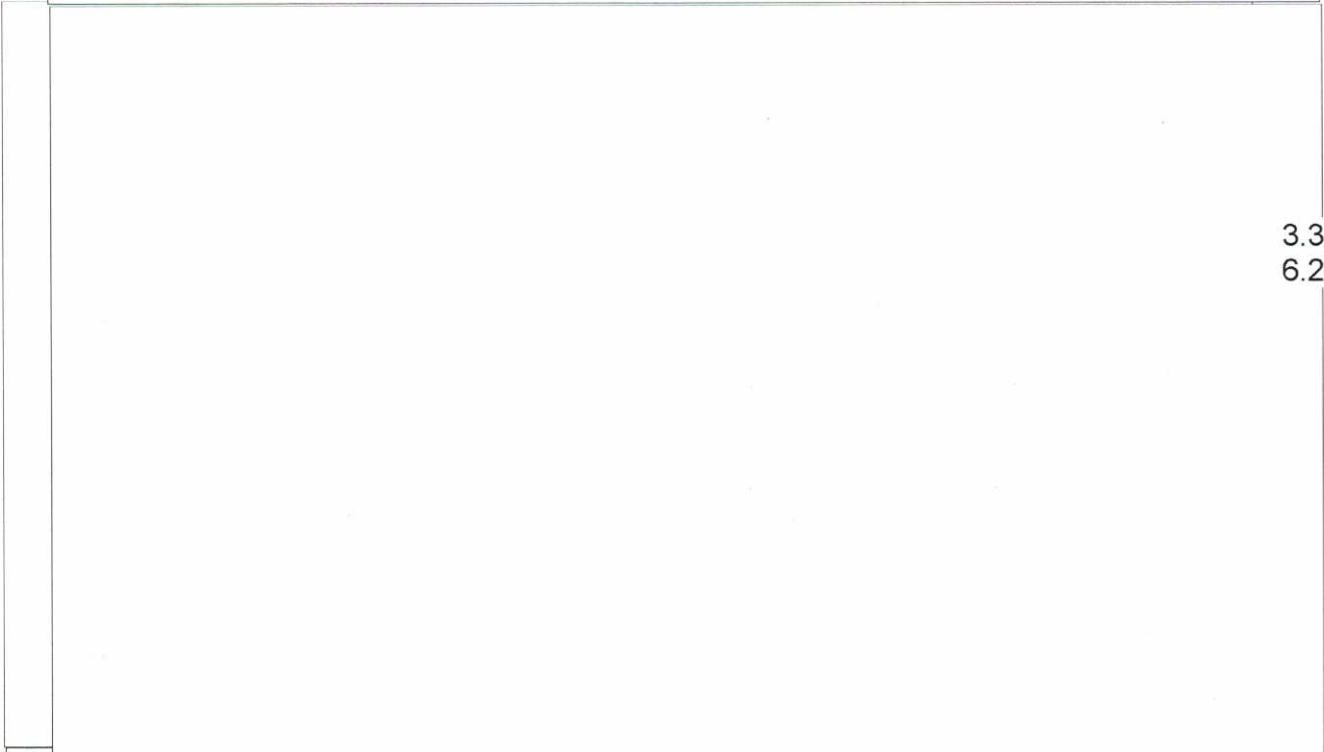



Dear Alan:

We appreciate your bringing to our attention the NARA computer index of approximately 130,000 documents which have been separated or withdrawn from collections of documents transferred to NARA by other federal agencies. We also appreciate having had the opportunity to meet with you and your deputy, Ms. Jeanne Schauble, on 27 September to discuss the classification of this computer index and related matters.

Upon review of the computer index print-out of withdrawn documents we have determined that the index contains information which requires that it be classified at the SECRET level. This index, and any other index of CIA documents or information created by NARA, should be referred to the CIA Information and Privacy Coordinator for a classification review prior to release or use by uncleared persons.

At least four categories of information initially evident in this index are classified under Executive Order 12356 and are further protected against unauthorized disclosure by provisions of the National Security Act of 1947 and the CIA Act of 1949. Other categories may appear in other indices whenever the indexing criteria or the manner of identifying the documents differ. Continuing review of the indexing process would be desirable. The four recognized categories are as follows:


