Vessel is white with red trim. It is very large, superstructure somewhat to the front, with an extensive open area to the rear, upon which it is carrying something very large and white ("the main thing on the vessel")

A crew of 6-12 men is aboard and is aware of the contraband aboard - are "protecting it."

Contraband is a "very large quantity of marijuana from Mexico." It has been "hammered in" (that is, nailed behind something) in the area of the vessel indicated on the enclosed diagram.

The words "Jackson" and "Doss" surfaced phonetically.

Location is as indicated on attached map.

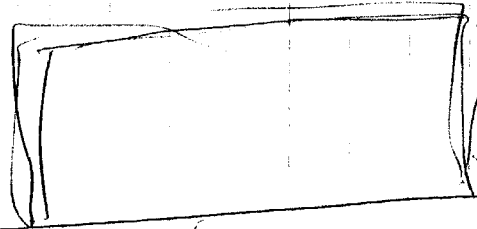
