The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the requirement for Deputy Secretary of Defense or Secretary of Defense approval of DIA participation in Human Use activities.

2. (S/NOFORN/WNINTEL) LTC Buzby briefly outlined the decisions since 1979, pointing out that the human use issue has always been at the Department of the Army level, rather that at INSCOM level, as the question had been raised by ACSI. The issue evolved from a medical issue to a legal issue. LTC Buzby explained that he had attempted to get the human use issue to the INSCOM level and away from DA when INSCOM established its own Human Use Review Board. While all members of the board were briefed on Project CENTER LANE, it never got to the decision-making point because of the decision to transfer CL to DIA. The latest Human Use approval by the Secretary of the Army was obtained in September 1983, and was considered to be valid until the project was attached/transferred to DIA.

SG1J 3. (U) said that DIA will not set up it's own Human Use Review Board, and will abide by past decisions of the DA General Counsel. continued by saying that the Deputy Secretary for Defense will probably cite past DA decisions and will approve DIA participation. He said that the DIA request for approval should parallel the DA reasons for the request without going into great detail. He said to include the background of the 1981 Deputy Secretary of Defense approval for DIA to participate in Project GRILL FLAME citing that the DoD General Counsel accepted the DA General Counsel's opinion on the human use issue.

IAGPA-F-SD (27 Feb 1985) SUBJECT: Meeting with DIA General Counsel SG1J (S/NOFORN/WNINTEL) asked LTC Buzby why he considered Project CENTER LANE an operational activity. Buzby explained that the Project was not involved with researching and developing techniques and protocol, but was those techniques developed by a contractor and transferring the technology that had been developed in order to collect intelligence. The contractor was an R&D activity while SG1J developing techniques and were subject to the human use controls of the contractor and DoD. LTC Buzby, then explained that the DIA effort will be a balance of collection and research and development. The collection unit will be called a prototype unit as DIA will be validating the capability to use the techniques for collecting intelligence. It was stated that DIA actually has a three-part role: collection operations, research and development, and threat SG1J analysis. 5. asked that a draft request to the Deputy (U) SG1J Secretary of Defense be prepared in the next couple of days. LTC Buzby said he would prepare the draft. will coordinate the draft through the DoD General Counsel before taking it to the Deputy Secretary of Defense. A question arose as to who would sign the request, with LTC Buzby saying he SG1J thought it should be LTG Williams as Director, DIA. said that perhaps Mr. Hurwitz should sign the request as the Project will be an NFIP capability and Mr. Hurwitz is the GDIP SG1J Program Manager. It was then brought out by SG1J that LTG Williams could also sign as the GDIP Program said the would talk to Mr. Hurwitz about SG1J who should sign the request and stated that he feels a signature by the GDIP Program Manager would carry more leverage with the Deputy Secretary of Defense than would the signature of the Director, DIA.
