- 1. (U) The Project Manager, INSCOM CENTER LANE Project (ICLP) recently reviewed the project's contracts in conjunction with his Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR) responsibilities. During this review the following questions surfaced:
- a. Is there a requirement for the contractor to inform their subcontractors/consultants that the contract is with a Department of the Army Intelligence Activity?
- b. Are their subcontractors/consultants required to comply with applicable human use regulations?

The current contract includes a statement that the contractor will comply with applicable human use regulations, but it places no requirements on subcontractors/consultants. It should be noted that the contract requires a product but does not stipulate how work is to be done.

- 2. (S/CL-3/NOFORN) ICLP is considering a testing procedure which would involve an ICLP participant performing personality and medical assessments on unwitting non-DoD affiliated individuals. These tests would be performed by a civilian contractor to document the ICLP participant's abilities. The objective is to test psychoenergetic collection techniques, and not to collect and store personal information on those individuals.
- 3. (U) Request a review of these issues to ensure our compliance with all applicable DoD and DA regulations.
