SUBJECT: General Counsel Review of Human Use Consent Form

TO:

1. (C) On 10 May 1985 I provided [redacted] Office of
 DIA General Counsel a copy of the revised SUN STREAK Human Use
 Consent Form. He read it in my presence and commented that "It
 looks good to me." I then added the rationale behind the
 wording of paragraph 1a, and reiterated my position that SUN
 STREAK constituted experimentation IAW Procedure 13, DoD
 5240.1-R, and not human research IAW DoD directive 6002.4 [redacted]
 [redacted] agreed but also wrote down the Directive name.

2. (U) [redacted] stated he would prepare a memo that would
 acknowledge his approval of the form. That memo would be ready
 in two weeks. He agreed that the consent form now signed was
 sufficient.

3. (U) I administered the briefing certificate to [redacted]
 There was no problem in obtaining his signature. He did ask me
 if the document required any special handling. I explained the
 SAP procedures and told him that the document did not need
 separate storage facilities.
