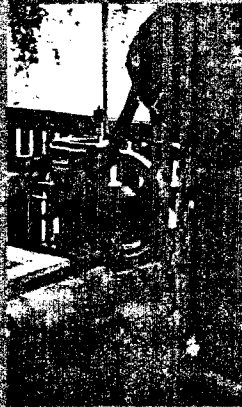
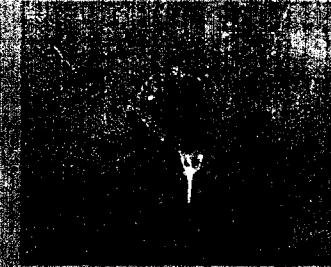


Experience a Day of Adventure and Learning at Squire Boone Caverns & Village
