





Charging toward history, last year's Triple Crown winner Secretariat (above, third from right) bursts late from the starting gate in the Kentucky Derby. His number, 1A, indicates that his trainer, Lucien Laurin, has another horse in the same race. Giant 25-foot strides help Secretariat make up the lost yardage. Virginia-born but Bluegrass-sired, he blazed over the 11/4-mile course in 1 minute, 59% seconds—a new Derby record.
