
The Western Hemisphere's oldest city

PAPITAL OF ADVENTURE, Santo Domingo sprawls beside the meandering Ozama River, where Columbus's brother, Bartolomé, founded the city in 1496 as seat of Spain's first New World colony. Pirates and swashbucklers coveted Santo Domingo for its gold. The English buccaneer Sir Francis Drake seized the city in 1586. His price for leaving: 25,000 gold ducats.

In the old colonial city stand scores of restored structures, including the Ozama

Fortress (above, at lower right) and the Cathedral of Santa Maria la Menor (left). Here and not in Spain, say Dominicans, lie the remains of Christopher Columbus, beneath an ornate marble monument. A Santo Domingo dancer (left, upper) recalls the city's Spanish forebears—rootstock of the nation's influential white minority.

Dizzying growth of Santo Domingo—it has quintupled in population since 1950—reflects a massive influx of rural poor.
