How is He ?

a. not getting much to eat or drink. He has gone days without food. At times he cannot even hold himself to walk

b. He is close to death. Source believed that the people who are holding him do not want him to die because they will be in trouble

c. Source believed that Buckley has not revealed any information to his captors. But he is close to his breaking point.

d. He is weak and disoriented.

e. Source felt something (info) would happen within next 48 hrs.

WHO HAS HIM?

a. THERE are always three guards with him 24 hours a day. Sometimes as many as five. These guards change.

b. Dawds speak arabic. However, when Buckley is questioned, the interrogators speak fluent english with no trace of an accent

c. Dawds are dressed in clothing similar to fatigues, and have rifles carried at sling arms with muzzles pointing down

d. There is another man involved who speaks in a guttural tongue, possibly Russian. He is wearing civilian clothes but if he was in his native country he would be wearing a uniform. (info)

e. The Man making decisions is a member of the Lebanese government. No one would suspect him. He wears civilian clothes but is around soldiers. He appears 50 years old or less. Source has trouble estimating age. This man is concerned for the security of his position within the Lebanese Government. This man is considering two different plans

The arabic word NUTMIL (phonetic) has something to do with this man.

(1) Having someone call and tell us (nfi) when Buckley is.

(2) offering to serve as a go-between in obtaining Buckley's release.

f. Source believed that what ever happens, will happen within the next few days because of the Christian season (nfi) (Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter?)

g. Source believed that this man would contact us (nfi) soon (48 hrs). We cannot contact him because he is concerned about his position with the Lebanese government.

h. Guards ^{believe they} are awaiting instructions to either move Buckley or release him this weekend.
is Phonetic: El Kafra ---

Guard is Thinking - I hope it's done.
