SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

Airfield consists of a single, fairly long dirt runway in an overgrown / rugged area. There are no facilities

here except a shack and airplanes are not kept here. They fly in from elsewhere then leave.

A long, winding, ~~rough~~ road is the only access to this

airfield. There are currently (051210Z Jul 90) no aircraft at the field.

The aircraft which frequent this airfield are ~~overhead~~ single and twin ^{engine} propeller planes. One of the twin engine ~~it~~ has one propeller built into each wing, its shape is chubby with a rounded nose.

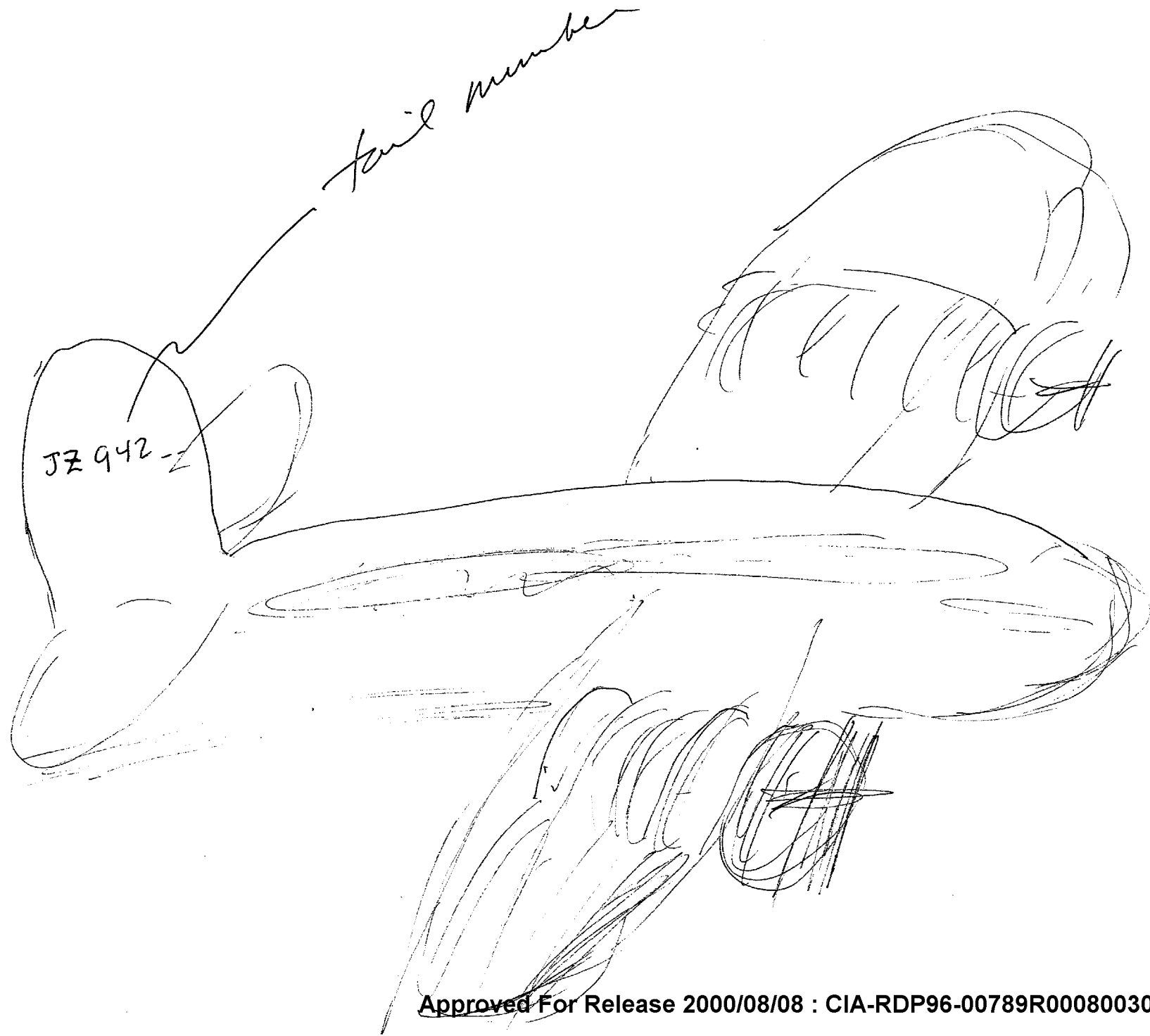
TAI L number looks like "JZ 942 —"

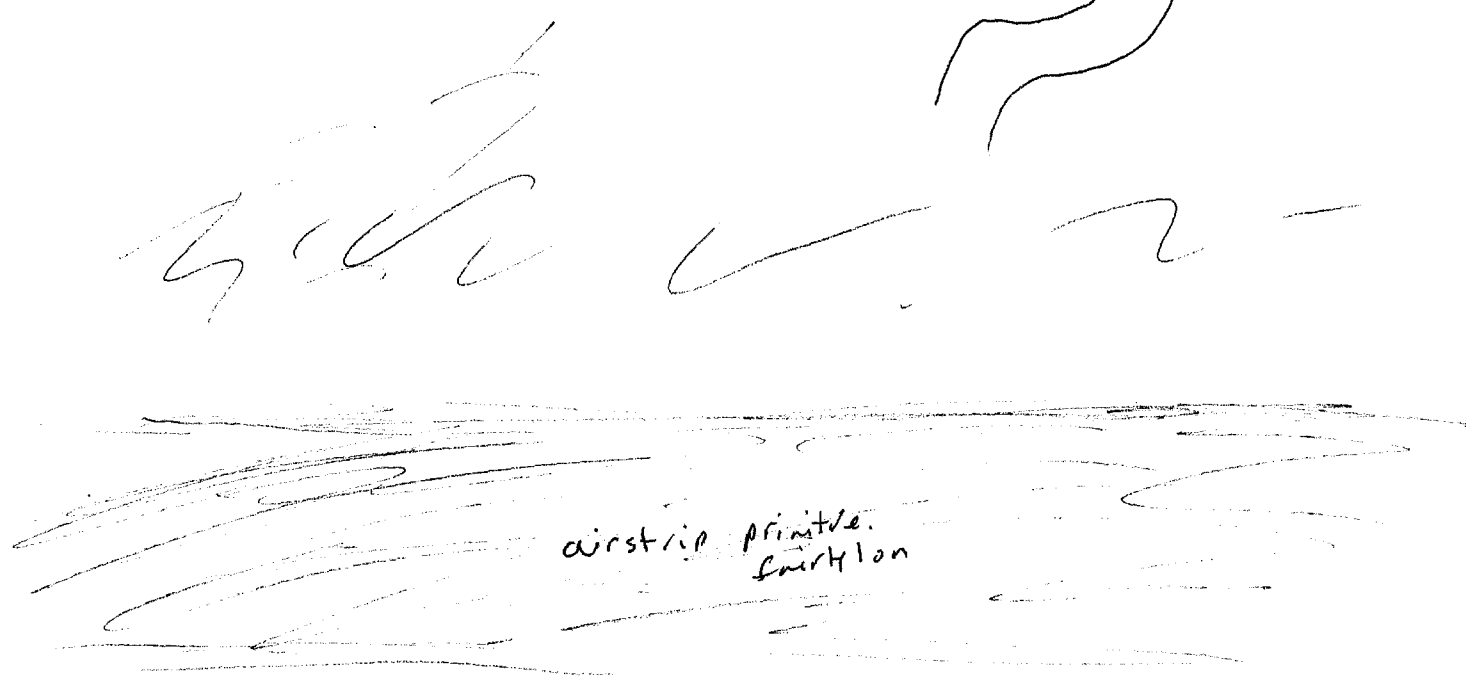
