a) The emphasis of this vessel is centered around the central "hold" area. However, there is a sense that there are stacks / piles of squarish objects ~~stacks~~ occurring throughout the ship i.e. on deck, along the gunwales, w/i the hold, in the hallways, etc. There is an isolated stack of objects on the bow deck just behind the forward "mast" (see page 7).
