SUMMARY OF INFORMATION


The vessels are described in sketches #1 and #2. The vessels are common to the area and have been selected for that reason — to limit exposure. There will be a small, slow diesel powered vessel which will deliver the contraband under the cover of darkness to the larger one. The larger vessel is of Panamanian registry and is a cargo vessel normally used to transport bulk produce. There is a strong possibility that the vessel transports oil in small quantities also.

The transfer of the narcotics will take place at the southward of the helppines of 68 N/DIE position indicated on the map— on the open water. The transfer will be accomplished on a night when there is no moon visible — I think that the stars are out there is just no moon.

The location for delivery of the contraband is not in the map area it is to the east as indicated by the arrow on map #2. * (550/133030'W) Thomas Buy, Preside of Wales

The radios used during the exchange are simple FM and not HF. The smaller ship is using a small radio (looks like a PRC 77). The frequencies are in the 35.00, 85.35, 95.55; I'm not real clear on these.
