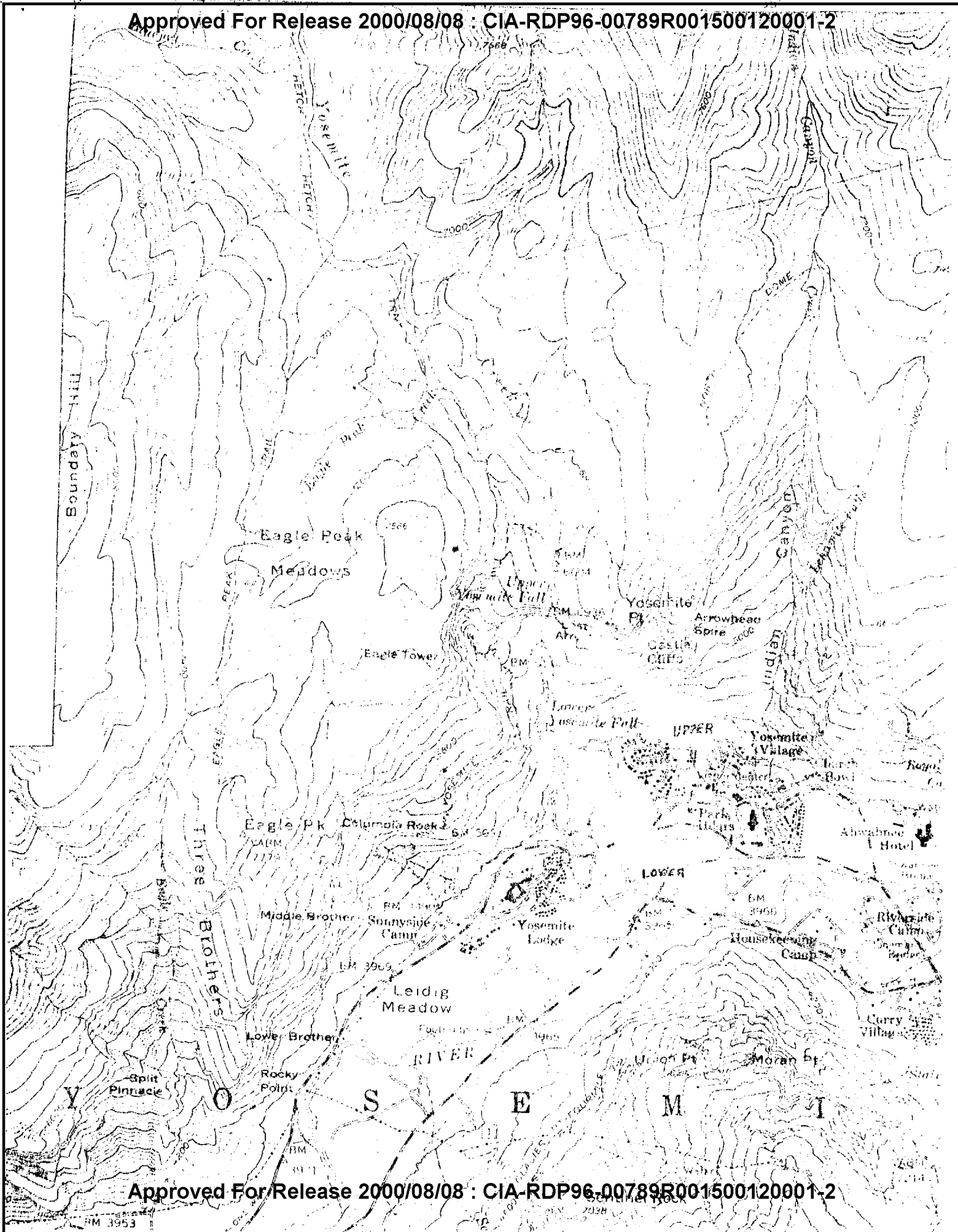

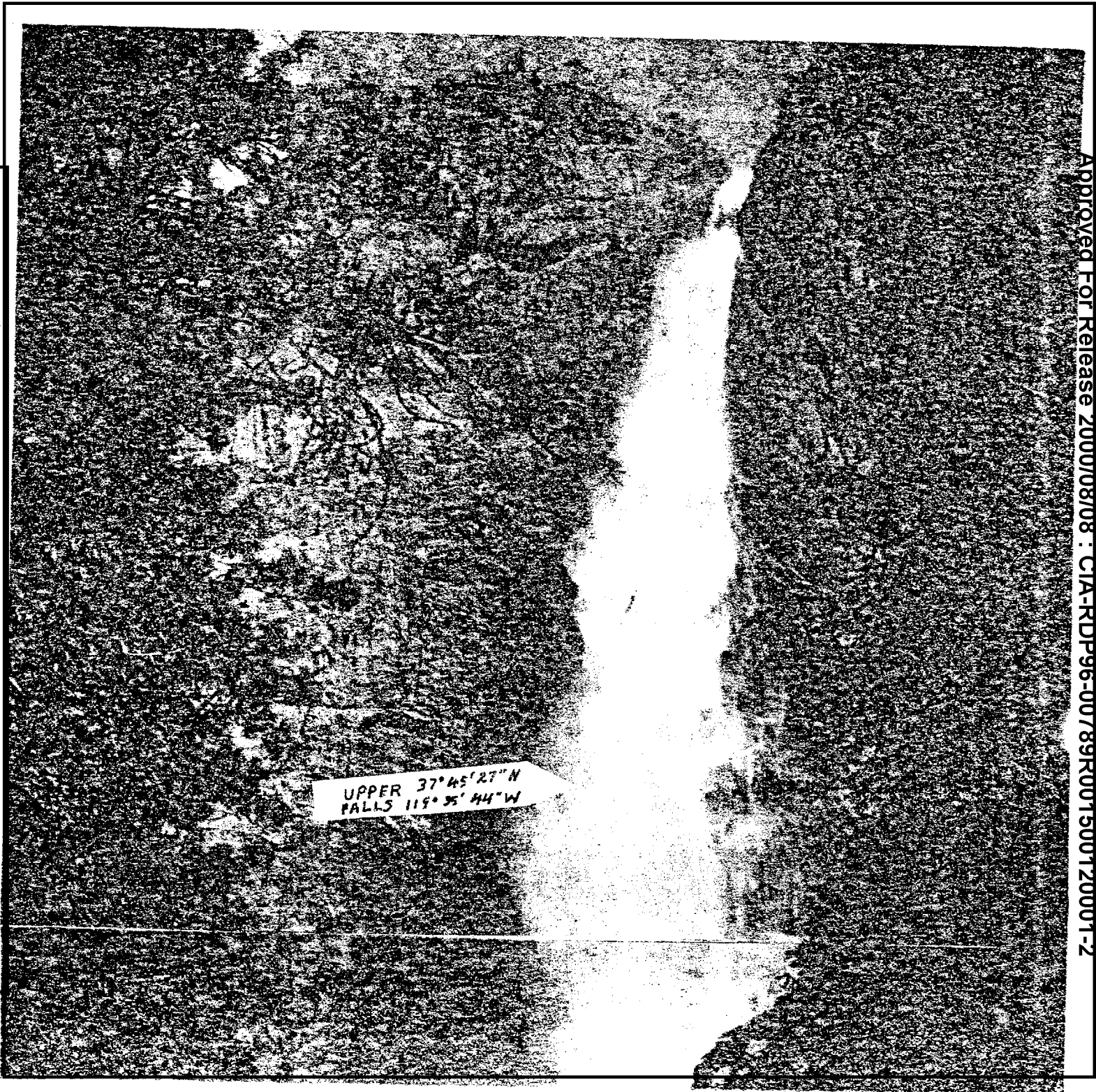
Yosemite

CHURNED TO FROTH in its wild leap, Yosemite Falls plunges with such force that the ground trembles at its base. Upper Fall, Middle Cascade, and Lower Fall plummet a combined 2,425 feet, North America's loftiest cataract.

Swollen by spring melt, the falls fills Yosemite Valley with its thunderous roar. In early summer the waning waters whip in the wind like a gossamer veil. By mid-August only a tear trickles down the canyon face.

Pressed between sheer rock walls half a mile high, Yosemite Valley follows a seven-mile gorge carved by glaciers and the Merced River. From hanging valleys high above the river spill many other spectacular falls, including Bridalveil, Vernal, Illilouette, Nevada, and Ribbon, which drops 1,612 feet, longest single fall on the continent.

Yosemite became a national park in 1890, a few days after nearby Sequoia attained park status.
