2. [REDACTED] Cuing: Access in present time and describe the contents, use and functions of areas "A" and "B" of a structure at encrypted coordinates 112301/767476.

3. [REDACTED] Results:

a. AREA A: Area "A" was perceived as:

- 1) a long, tall, cold and mainly empty area
- 2) The floor is white, but gives a strange appearance of not being at a definite level (AOL: as though there were a cloud or haze sitting on the floor).
- 3) There were several perceptions of some (AOL: "plate" or "hatch lid") which had some kind of crisscrossed "straps" on it (see sketches, pages 2 and 3).
- 4) There were a few people either standing in a group, or just walking through. For the most part, area "A" seemed like more of a passageway for most of the people than a workplace or a place to stay. One person appeared to be wearing very heavy protective clothing which seemed to be reflective.

5) The room appeared to be mostly empty, except for some "junk" or things lying around on the floor, out of everyone's pathway. These "things" seemed to be covered with a layer of (AOL: dust or frost).

b. AREA B: Area "B" was perceived as:

- 1) A very large, tall, "funny-shaped" area or junction of areas (see drawing, inclosed, and drawing on page 8 of the transcript).
- 2) While it is tidy, in that there is not a lot of "junk" and things lying around, it is not clean (much as one might describe a very well-kept garage: neat but dirty).
- 3) There was a vague impression that it was a workplace, of sorts, and of the general size one would need for working on either military tanks, or railroad train cars.
