SUBJECT: Criteria or Measures of Effectiveness to Assess the Value of the Program.

(S-2)  
1. Historically, from 1978 to 1984 over 50 percent of the missions assigned to the US Army's Operational element were evaluated by the intelligence user as being of value. In the other less than 50 percent of the cases the user either did not provide feed back, the information was already known from other intelligence collection systems or the information could not be evaluated.

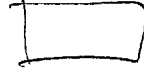
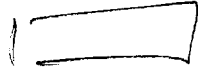
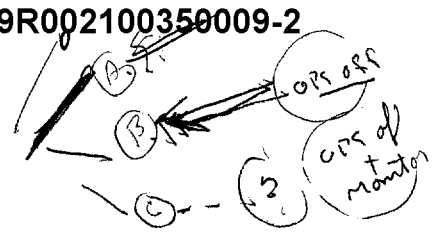

2. The DIA Operational Group will begin a two year evaluation in January 1986. This evaluation is not to prove that the phenomenon exists but rather to determine in what areas and against what types of intelligence collection targets the technology can best be used. The evaluation will involve over 800 sessions targeted against approximately 36 different types of intelligence targets. The evaluation will provide verified statistical data on the effectiveness of the technology in collecting intelligence across a wide spectrum of intelligence requirements.

3. It is not the mission of DIA to address basic research issues involving the underlying mechanism of the phenomena. The three year DIA program known as GRILL FLAME established that the process was a real phenomena and it is now the mission of [REDACTED] to evaluate <sup>the</sup> intelligence potential of this phenomena.  
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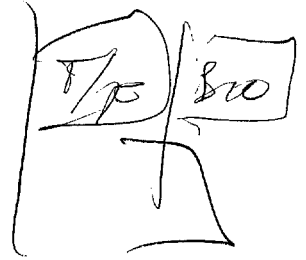
