Site is two structures on soft, gently rolling, open, cold Inside the main structure it is dry, cold and crisp. land. Colors in the structure are browns, whites, and reddish brown. The structure is 20-25 feet wide (don't know how long) and has a main room and an equipment room and also a sort of half partitioned off alcove type area. In the main room is a collapsible metal table, some metal things and metal cots. Inside the main room is the sound of a gas stove burning. The equipment room is a room with equipment along all walls, some on tables (see sketch next page). The equipment room appears to be accessible only from the main room of the structure and not from outside. The equipment is electronics type equipment in very sturdy metal boxes with lots of dials and knobs. They appear to be old. Some of the boxes are connected together others are not. One of the pieces of equipment is a radio. Another looks like (AOL/S) a plotter. Many of the equipment cases are a blue metallic color. In the small space in the middle of the equipment room are chairs.

The structure is a 'functional station', AOL like a weather station. Causing the impression of a weather station were ideas such as equipment, location/area, routine, and fixed schedule. One of the functions of the station is reporting.

In the main structure were at least two men. One was a jack of all trades type, sort of a combination go-fer/handyman. He performs a variety of tasks; he prepares things and also writes and sends reports. Associated with 'writing reports' are the concepts teletype machine, pads of paper, timeliness, scheduled, frequency, progress, and figures and numbers. This person is responsible for keeping track of these numbers and measurements. When I examined how the numbers made me feel; my reaction to the numbers was boredom. There are pages and pages of meticulously recorded numbers.
