- 2. (S-SS) Cueing:
 - View and describe the target event.
- 3. (S-SS) Results:
- a. Almost from the very beginning of the session, I was plagued with <u>very strong</u> visual and sensory perceptions which finally became too strong to work through. Perceptions gained were:
- 1) Perception of a rather plump man riding along a (AOL: dirt) road in the back seat of an open-topped convertible. The car was either an old-fashioned model, or was designed to look like "old-fashioned elegance". All around the road on which the car was traveling there were large-leafed plants, trees and bushes (AOL: like a jungle or tropical rain forest). Off to the man's right the ground slopes steeply upwards.
- 2) Immediately after this perception, the high ground off to our right breaks up into huge chunks and flies upwards, as though there had been an underground explosion. First the hillside explodes upwards and outwards, then the entire surrounding ground lifts straight upward, and begins to break up and be forced outward, away from the explosion. Pretty soon, all is gone.

- b. The visual and sensory impressions were so strong that I took several breaks to get rid of them, but they even continued during the breaks. At the first impression of the "explosion", I was so swamped by the physical impression of a concusion wave, that I stopped the session to see if something had happened outside the room. As a result of the strength of these impressions, I was not able to work through them, and finally gave the session up. I can only conclude that I was either at the correct site (at which time any self-cuing to go to the "correct" site would have just kept me there), or I was so fixated on the wrong site that I couldn't break loose.
- c. From almost the beginning of the session, I kept having the repeated "logical" (as opposed to emotional or sensory) AOL of "Krakatoa".
