4. (S/NF/SK) SUMMARY: Source furnished the attached summary which was prepared following the session and submitted to the Interviewer within 24 hours after the session. The completeness of the typewritten summary has been compared to the Interviewer's notes and all omissions, changes, and/or corrections have been verified as acceptable by the Interviewer. The information provided in the summary was found to be complete and did not require further modification, clarification or additions by the Interviewer.

5. (S/NF/SK) COMMENTS: Source was quickly able to properly identify the location of the document in a manner which was strongly indicative of known data pertaining to the DIAC. Since the actual subject of the document is unknown to the Interviewer it is impossible to comment on the veracity of Source's subsequent statements concerning the document. This data will be verified in the future through routine liaison and no additional tasking on document N-1 is foreseen with this Source.

Site involves a large, flat-sided structure with glass doors in front, with the front and center portions lower than the side. Squares and rectangles are the primary dimensional elements of the structure. Brownish green is a predominant color at the site. It is sunny, warm, and the whole area evinces a definite man-made, man controlled ambience. Large flat areas--perhaps parking lots and roads--are ubiquitous. Lots of cars and people are present. The structure of interest is administered by some large, widely spread organization, "like" a government or similar establishment. Inside the building the first thing encountered is a large open area with a bar or desk behind which certain people sit to screen those who enter, to determine where they want to go and what their purpose is, or even if they are supposed to be there. It's essentially some sort of reception area. Beyond this are several different directions one could go, through various doors or down a hall with doors opening off of it. Seems to be a white or very light grey color. Someone in the hall is wearing what appears to be a white coat.

[Interviewer tasking] ~~The importance needs to be safeguarded, restricted to only limited access by a select group of people--not all of the same occupation, associations, or responsibilities, but all of whom share similar common responsibilities designated by and for the document and as well as connection with it. Things specified within the document pertain to them and their responsibilities. AOL of Constitution. Document circulates very little; the fact that it exists is important, and that it can be retrieved and referenced as necessary. The concept of progenency seems important. "it is "like" a directive or plan--a guidance document. Though perhaps AOL, the sense that it has to do with control, technical and instructive concerning weapons and strategic considerations, etc. It inventories in some sense, and is technical in places, contains details, engineering constraints, limits, designs, essentials, capabilities, and has attachments, appendices, TABs, and similar things.~~

1st principal component of document: General guidance, purpose section, outline, content, assigns overall responsibilities; ties everything else together.

2nd section: Distribution, proportions, designation of assignments, organized, methodological organization, "deconfliction"--resources addressed, avoids redundancy--how resources are addressed and deployed without getting in the way of other things.

3rd section: Detailed responsibilities, chain of command, authority, who reports to who, who can do what, "like" a task organization, large groups of assets grouped and subdivided to make it all manageable.

4th section: Involves actual assets, quantities, abilities and limits, purpose, like ~~an OB list~~, but doesn't detail what belongs to whom; it just categorizes and details what is available and what it can do. Assets are grouped according to type--least capable at beginning, most capable at end. Five or more groupings. Represent something tangible, solid, and usable, like weapons or something. Large vehicles are also involved.

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5th section: Lots of numbers in rows; numbers are codes in some sense--codes not to disguise but to convey information in a short space. Deals with location, nature, purpose, and other subjects dealing with specific items for which each number stands.

(Reminiscent of BE numbers). Seems to be the last section of the document.

Title of document appears not to be in English. Overall feel of it reminds one of a warplan. Some letters in title seem to be I, N, E; Sudden flash of the word "organization." Classification of document seems to be Top Secret, though not in so many English words--that's the sense of it. A caveat, similar to "ORCON" seems involved. Other, locally devised, informal caveats included which restrict the number of people who may have access to the document. Cover is red, and somewhat rough, like construction paper. Both yellow and black lettering, which is funny-shaped. Date of document may be 17 February 1987, though the year 1977 comes through as well [intuitive analysis: perhaps a revision or evolution of previous similar document]. A line of order around the cover. Date is center bottom third of cover. Left lower corner has a lot of lettering, with a control number or log number or something.

Information was gathered by a group, a specific office, who compiled it from various outside sources; other documents were used to compile it--a synthesis--they take in everything to formulate the whole picture. The room in which the document is maintained has light colored walls, is light inside, has safe or "like" safes; a flat long table with four or five chairs, book shelves along the wall with books and papers on it; a writing table or desk to one side. Two ways in--one door opening inward accesses the outside hall; another doorway without a door opens into the next room where meetings, discussions, and work session occur. Outside (observed through window) it's hazy outside--daylight; some distance up off the ground; trees not too far away, a road; setting reminds one of the DIAC. Nearby are other buildings that are connected in some way with this one, indirectly. On the other side of the structure is the side the sun is on. It's lower in the sky. Open grassy areas; not too far away is a structure with an arched top, like an old theater.
