This is in response to the request for information you made on February 10, 2020, and received on February 11, 2020, pursuant to the District of Columbia Freedom of Information Act (§§ 2-531-539), requesting:

The Office of Risk Management (ORM) has conducted a search for the information requested. As a result of the search, the enclosed information is responsive to your request.

Please know that if, for some reason, you interpret this as a denial of your request in whole or in part, under D.C. Official Code § 2-537 and 1 DCMR 412, you have the right to appeal this letter to the Mayor or to the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. If you elect to appeal to the Mayor, your appeal must be in writing and contain "Freedom of Information Act Appeal" or "FOIA Appeal" in the subject line of the letter, as well as on the outside of the envelope. The appeal must include (1) a copy of the original request; (2) a copy of any written denial; (3) a statement of the circumstances, reasons, and/or arguments advanced in support of disclosure; and (4) a daytime telephone number, e-mail and/or mail address at which you can be reached.

The appeal must be mailed to: The Mayor's Office of Legal Counsel (MOLC), FOIA Appeal, 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Suite 407, Washington, DC 20004. Electronic versions of the same information can instead be e-mailed to the MOLC at foia.appeals@dc.gov. Further, a copy of all appeal materials must be forward to me, the Freedom of Information Officer of ORM. Failure to follow any of these administrative steps will result in delay in the processing and commencement of a response to your appeal to the Mayor.



Day Ahead Communications Rundown for Monday, November 18, 2019 Office of Communications

MAYOR MURIEL BOWSER'S PUBLIC CALENDAR EVENTS FOR TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19:

Mayor Bowser will announce the recipients of more than \$2 million in grants aimed at improving birth outcomes and maternal and child health.

INTERVIEWS:

NEW DMOI contacted Lisa Fletcher (ABC7) who is conducting a story on the 295 S speed camera. Fletcher says drivers have complained about lack of sufficient signage, punitive fines, and the camera being used primarily to generate revenue. She has submitted FOIA requests for ticket and other data from MPD, DDOT and DMV. DM Babers was interviewed last Friday morning. The first story is scheduled to air Monday and will almost certainly focus on driver complaints with a soundbite from the DM. Fletcher is considering a second story focusing on the Babers interview. DM Babers emphasized several times that the goal of the camera is to promote

- safety as per Vision Zero and if people drive the speed limit, guess what, no ticket. Furthermore, while we might look further into the allegation that their is inadequate signage around the work zone in question, we do follow the federal DOT signage guidelines.
- *NEW* Petruce Jean-Charles (American University) inquired to interview someone about health equity for her community news reporting class. DOH provided the link to the Health Equity Report and is scheduling an interview with Senior Deputy Director for Office of Health Equity (OHE) Dr. Anita Arnoby for Wednesday afternoon.
- *NEW* Tom Fitzgerald (Fox 5) interviewed Carrie Dahlquist, Program Manager, Tobacco Control Program and Dr. Anjali Talwalkar, Senior Deputy Director for Community Health Administration (CHA) about youth, vaping and the President not moving forward with the federal vaping restrictions.
- *NEW* Ana Lysa Gayle (ABC7) interviewed DDOT Director Jeff Marootian about DDOT's launch of three pedestrian-only zones.
- *NEW* Pete Muntean (WUSA9) interviewed DDOT Director Jeff Marootian about leading pedestrian intervals (LPI) and overall pedestrian safety.
- *NEW* Mina Radman and Kathy Fackelmann (GWU Milken Institute School of Public Health) invited DBH Dr. Bazon to speak with US News & World Report about our school-based behavioral health program. This interview will be conducted over the phone with Katelyn Newman, the publications public health reporter. Once the date and time for the interview are confirmed I will share it with the group. Thank you.
- *NEW* Kara Arundel (LRP Publications) contacted DCPS inquiring aninterview for the special education office about DCPS's process for supported decision making for students with disabilities who are age 18 or older who benefit from assistance from family or friends regarding educational decisions. DCPS is internally following up.
- *NEW* Univision conducted a tabbed interviewed with FEMS on the dangers of Carbon Monoxide.
- *NEW* Bruce Johnson (WUSA9) contacted DCPS inquiring to interview RuQuan Brown, a Banneker HS senior accepted into 7 out of 8 Ivy Leagues. DCPS set the interview up last Friday.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

NEW CRO Kevin Bush will participate in a panel hosted by Politico and Pew Charitable Trusts focused on resilience, climate change, and flooding. Other panelists include Rep. Kathy Castor (D-WA); David I. Maurstad, Deputy Associate Administrator for Insurance and Mitigation, FEMA; and Anna Weber, Senior Policy Analyst, Natural Resources Defense Council. The panel is moderated by Zach Colman, Politico.

- *NEW* Jeanne Huber (Washington Post) is conducting a story to inform residents about the actions they should take when rats are in their neighborhood and contacted DOH for background information.
- "DC Health's Rodent and Vector Control Division (https://dchealth.dc.gov/service/rodent-control) provides rodent control on the exterior of private property and public spaces for residents of the District. Residents can access this free service by calling 311 and a Code and Pest Inspector will be dispatched to that location within 3 business days. Inspectors apply rodenticides, baits and tracking powder when rat burrows are observed. All Code and Pest Inspectors are certified in rodent control and apply rodenticides according to the label. The Inspector inspects for any rat burrows and applies the rodenticides directly into the burrow and covers the burrow with dirt, out of the reach of any children or pets. Rats need 3 things to survive, food, water, and harborage. DC Health works with residents to reduce those things by providing education sessions at community meetings and through the information listed on our web site. DC Health has received 6,226 complaints from residents and visitors in FY 19 and we can track these complaints by the Service Request Number provided to residents when they file a complaint"
- *NEW* Makena Roberts (GW Hatchet) contacted DHCD inquiring about affordable housing on F Street that was created by the university as an community amenity in a PUD application for the university, focusing on how these units are helping residents.DHCD provided information on the units, including size, affordability and the terms of the covenant.
- *NEW* DGS was contacted by WUSA9 reporter Kolbie Satterfield who is fielding a story on the parameters of the District's recycling program. DGS advised that the agency could only speak to the 'DCPS Recycles' program which it partners with for District Public Schools. Satterfield emphasized that she was working on how 'dirty' recycling (i.e. pizza boxes) were parsed out, for example, from apartment buildings. Again, DGS emphasized its role working with DCPS only and referred her to DPW. DGS Comms made a call to DPW Comms as a heads up.
- *NEW* *NEW* Martin Austermuhle (WAMU) contacted DCPS inquiring for a comment on plans to provide an at-risk preference at the Stevens school when it opens. DCPS is conducting research.
- *NEW* Perry Stein (Washington Post) contacted DCPS inquiring clarification on data points she received around selective high schools in DCPS. DCPS confirmed the data points.
- *NEW* Lawrence Carney (Fox5) and Shomari Stone (NBC4) contacted DCPS inquiring about a teacher with School at Goding who is on leave but at school after allegations of abusing a student. DCPS is preparing a response. Story to run on NBC4 tonight.
- *NEW* Peter Hermann and Dana Hedgpeth (Washington Post), Natalie Delgadillo (DCist) and Megan Cloherty (WTOP) requested the report for a Homicide offense that occurred on 11/17/19 in the 4600 block of Hillside Road, Southeast. The homicide involved a 17 year old juvenile male. Hermann and Hedgpeth also requested the report for an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon

(Gun) offense that occurred on 11/17/19 in the 2900 block of Knox Place, Southeast. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the reports.

- *NEW* Peter Hermann and Dana Hedgpeth (Washington Post) requested the report for an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (Knife) offense that occurred on 11/17/19 in the 200 block of Anacostia Road, Southeast. Hermann and Hedgpeth also requested the report for an Assault with Intent to Kill offense that occurred on 11/17/19 in the 1200 block of 49th Street, Northeast. The reports were requested for fact finding MPD sent the reports.
- *NEW* Peter Hermann (Washington Post) and Amber Ali (CBS News) inquired about the report of a suspicious package today in the 1200 block of Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest. MPD stated that at approximately 9:17 am, MPD received the report of a suspicious package in the 1200 block of Pennsylvania Avenue, NW. MPD is currently investigating, and the package has not yet been cleared.

Update: The scene was cleared with no hazardous material found.

- *NEW* Angie Dorr (Live PD: Wanted on A&E) if any arrests were made in an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (Knife) offense that occurred on 11/8/19 in the 1200 block of North Capitol Street, Northwest. This incident is being investigated as a potential hate crime. MPD stated that no arrests have been made yet. This case remains under investigation.
- *NEW* Anna-Lysa Gayle (ABC7) requested data on violent crimes that occurred in the Shaw neighborhood since the implementation of the Fall Crime Initiative. MPD stated that there has been no clear upwards or downward trends since the weeks before and a few weeks after the start of our Fall Crime Initiative (Oct. 14). MPD advised Gayle to contact us towards the end of our Fall Crime Initiative (December 15) when we obtain concrete statistics regarding the Shaw FCI area.
- *NEW* Charlie Bragale (NBC4) requested information on a traffic accident that occurred in 11/15/19 in the Unit block of H Street, Northeast. MPD stated on Friday, November 15, 2019, at approximately 8:23 pm, MPD's First District requested the Major Crash Investigations Unit to respond for a Traffic Accident in the Unit Block of H Street, NE, involving a vehicle and a pedestrian. The victim in this case remains in critical condition.

UPDATES:

- *UPDATE* Andrew Giambrone (Curbed DC) is conducting a story about the permanent supportive housing for the Hill East project. DMPED is working on a response regarding the zoning changes. Additionally, DMPED will provide the following statement on behalf of Sarosh Olpadwala, Director of Real Estate Development.
- "We are proud that Hill East will now provide more deeply affordable housing with the addition of permanent supportive housing. This addition ensures the residents of the Harriet Tubman Shelter can continue to live together as a family in the neighborhood they call home. This action aligns both with the life and legacy of Harriet Tubman and Mayor Bowser's citywide effort to make homelessness rare, brief and non-recurring."

UPDATE Steve Thompson (Washington Post) is inquiring for the filings for Center for Global Policy Solutions. Elijah Cummings wife, Maya Rockeymoore is the president and CEO. She is running for Mr. Cummings congressional seat. DCRA sent the filings.

UPDATE Veronica Johnson (ABC7) will air a series of (4) reports on DPW's Snow Operations. Reports will air on consecutive days beginning Tuesday November 19, 20, 21, 22, 5:00am & 6:00am and then 6:00am and 7:00pm each day. Coverage will include all snow planning and management; fleet and manpower; snow coordination. She is also is doing several DPW staff profiles and interviewed Director Christopher Geldart. Series Start Date has changed to begin Tuesday November 19, 2019 and condensed to 4-parts.

MAYOR MURIEL BOWSER'S PUBLIC CALENDAR EVENTS FOR THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 21:

Mayor Bowser and the DowntownDC BID will host a Hypothermia Pledge and Awareness event for community partners to pledge to help identify and assist neighbors outside in cold conditions and to raise awareness about services available during the winter months for individuals experiencing homelessness. Later, Mayor Bowser will deliver remarks at the Forward:51: A DC Vote Celebration Champion of Democracy annual award gala. Afterwards, Mayor Bowser will celebrate the 35th anniversary of Washington, DC's Sister City relationship with Beijing and Vice Mayor Lin Keqing to discuss mutual city interests such as education, sustainability, transportation, culture, and tourism.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

- *NEW* (American University) contacted DBH to inquire why did St. Elizabeth's hospital continue to admit patients when there was no potable water for three weeks? Why weren't patients sent to other local hospitals during the treatment? If there was going to be any coordination between the psychiatric care part of St. Elizabeth's and this new health care center? For example, if patients needed dental health care services or STI testing but doctors at their facility are not available, would they be able to use the Whitman Walker services on this campus? Or will the new facility only be used for citizens that are not committed to the St. E's.? DBH provided the following responses and included Mayor Bowser's press release:

 "During the water restriction, Saint Elizabeths continued to provide high quality care in a clean, safe environment and continued to admit individuals committed by the D.C. Superior Court. As Mayor Bowser said, this new, state-of-the-art health care facility helps ensure that Washingtonians in every corner of DC can access the services they need, right in their communities. You can direct questions about use of the facility to Whitman Walker."
- *NEW* Marc Segraves (NBC4) contacted DPW to inquire when DMV alerts DPW of "boot eligible" cars, how do they find the cars? License plate readers? PEOs? Do you boot out of state cars for unpaid photo tickets? When DMV alerts DPW of outstanding tickets on out of state cars, what action is taken by DPW? Is it DPW's role to wait until these cars reappear in the city? DPW coordinated with DMV to provide the following response on background: "If an officer is writing a citation on an out of state tag and the vehicles shows outstanding tickets, the officer can request a boot and/or tow."
- *NEW* Peter Hermann (Washington Post) contacted DCRA for a statement related to 2 minors who were arrested and detained by MPD yesterday for selling fruit on a sidewalk in Columbia Heights. The family, held a press conference at 3:30pm today said that DCRA has kept them from getting licenses to operate, which is what's causing the police to harass them. DCRA is drafting a statement.
- *NEW* Perry Stein (Washington Post) contacted DCPS inquiring background on the school system's response to when a School without Walls student was allegedly harassed at the school for supporting President Trump. Perry is conducting an article about increased hate incidents since President Trump took office. DCPS is preparing a response.
- *NEW* Sam Ford (WJLA7) contacted DCPS inquiring about a fob system that is out of date at Cardozo High School requiring a door to be left opened for teachers to access. DCPS shared efforts are being made to resolve the situation and provided the following statement: "The safety of our students and staff is our top priority. DCPS is actively working to expedite replacement of the fob system at Cardozo Education Campus. We are also continuing to work with the school administration to ensure that the building remains secure. Security measures currently in place at Cardozo include the presence of Metropolitan Police Department School Resource Officers, security guards, and a thorough weapons abatement protocol."
- *NEW* Sam Collins (Washington Informer) will profile DCPS elementary swimming program this Friday. He will cover Hendley ES at Ballou HS' swimming pool.

- *NEW* Susan Rogers (WUSA9), Lerita Carter (Fox5), Jamie Scott (ABC7) inquired about a traffic accident that occurred this morning in the 2500 block of Good Hope Road, Southeast. MPD stated our Major Crash Unit responded to the 2500 block of Good Hope Rd SE, in regards to a call that came in at approximately 4:40 am for an accident involving a pedestrian. One suspect is in custody. The pedestrian struck is in critical condition. No further details are available at this time, as this is an ongoing investigation.
- *NEW* Carlos Martinez (NBC4) requested the report for an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (Gun) offense that occurred on 11/16/19 in the 1600 block of Kenilworth Avenue, Northeast. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report.
- *NEW* Nathan Baca (WUSA9) is writing a story in reference to criminals using Bluetooth signal scanners to detect which cars have devices to steal. Baca asked if MPD has encountered any criminals who have committed crimes using Bluetooth. MPD stated that we have not heard any specific trend of this occurring in the District. However, we do encourage the public to follow these tips to help prevent themselves from being a victim of thefts from autos.
- *NEW* Peter Hermann (Washington Post) inquired about a shooting that occurred this afternoon in the 1300 block of Saratoga Avenue, Northeast. MPD stated this incident appears to be connected to a walk-in shooting. Victim is a juvenile male, in his late teens, conscious and breathing.
- *NEW* Karla Flores (NBC4), Mark Segraves (NBC4), Sharae Griffin (WUSA9), Liliana Gonzalez-Ramirez (Telemundo), Evan Lambert (Fox5), Ryan Sprouse (ABC7) and Rosbelis Quinonez (Univision) inquired about an incident that occurred last night in the 3500 block of 14th Street, Northwest involving two children. MPD stated that we are aware of the incident. This is currently an ongoing investigation as we review footage to learn more about the incident.

Mayor Bowser will attend the Mayor-Council breakfast. Later, the Mayor will sign into law the Sexual Assault Victims' Rights Act of 2019, which will strengthen protections and improve outcomes for victims and survivors.

INTERVIEWS:

NEW Today, Chief Newsham and other MPD officials participated in the Mayor's press conference announcing the expansion of MPD's CCTV cameras. NBC 4, WJLA 7 and WUSA 9 were in attendance.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

NEW Graham Vyse (Washington Post) contacted DPR to inquire when did DPR agree to extend the deal. Vyse stated that Maret has now pledged to invest \$950,000 at the Jelleff property moving forward and confirmed if the school made that pledge before DPR agreed to the extension and if that contributed to DPR's consideration? DPR informed Vyse that on July 19, 2019, the extension to the partnership agreement with Maret was signed. DPR also provided Dirrector Delano Hunter's testimony at the Public Hearing on Access to the Public Field at Jelleff Recreation Center on October 21, 2019:

"Our decision (to extend the partnership agreement) was based on Maret's performance as a partner and the value they have helped provide to DC residents." "Our review of Maret's performance showed that Maret has invested \$2.4 million in improvements to the field, pool, and facilities at Jelleff. FY19 alone, more than 3,613 residents have enjoyed the pool; 1,300 people use the field weekly; and more than 17 organizations, groups, and leagues have hosted their games and meets on the field. In total, DC residents enjoy more than 76 hours (out of a total of 91 hours) of permitted field time per week, on a substantially upgraded field at little or no cost to taxpayers. Of the 3,958 hours permitted in FY19 at Jelleff, 100 percent of permits issued went to DC Residents or organizations, 98 percent of which were issued to non-profits, schools or youth oriented programs. Those numbers speak to the value and benefits that DC Residents have reaped from this partnership with Maret. With this extension, Maret will invest \$700,000 to replace the artificial turf on the field, which has reached the end of its lifespan, as well as repair the surrounding fencing and support the renovation of Jelleff with an additional \$250,000."

NEW Rachel Chason (Washington Post) contacted DPR to verify Eddie L. Martin's employee status. DPR HR records only date to 2004 and payroll doesn't have any records or information on him. A DPR employee that has been with the agency for over 40 years and knows Martin's personally also says he has never worked for DPR to his knowledge.

NEW Josh Kaplan (Washington City Paper) requested a copy of the current Magellan pharmacy benefits manager contract with the Department of Health Care Finance. His interest is on payment structure and deliverables outlined in the contract. OCP contacted DHCF to inform them of this contract request, as it is likely related to the November 8th City Paper article on DC Medicaid patients being denied Suboxone due to a programming error. The contract documents are being reviewed by OCP's legal team for necessary redactions. OCP will send the contract to DHCF prior to sending to the reporter. This contract will also be posted on OCP's Transparency Portal.

NEW DGS received a request on 11/25/19 from Councilmember Brandon Todd's office to respond to 'Shepherd Park News' regarding any updates for the Shepherd Park Recreation Center. DGS is efforting a response to include the groundbreaking date of December 17 at 3:00 p.m.

NEW DCPS pitched Malcolm X Elementary School's first-ever homecoming celebration to the Washington Informer. They will cover it tomorrow.

- *NEW* Charlie Bragale (NBC4) requested the report for a Sex Abuse (Misdemeanor) offense that occurred on 11/22/19 in the 2600 block of Woodley Road, Northwest. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report.
- *NEW* Mark Segraves (NBC4) requested the report for an Assault on a Police Officer offense that occurred on 11/23/19 in the 300 block of 37th Street, Southeast. - *NEW* Alana Wise (WAMU), Jamie Scott (ABC7), and Evan Lambert (Fox5) asked if an arrest has been made in a homicide that occurred on 11/22/19 in the 3200 block of Dubois Place, Southeast. MPD stated this case remains under investigation and there are no additional details to provide.
- *NEW* Sophie Kaplan (Washington Times) is conducting a story regarding the increased traffic people will see in the region over the Thanksgiving weekend. Kaplan asked what steps MPD is taking to keep travelers safe this weekend. Kaplan also requested information on the number of citations, DUIs or car crashes that took place over the Thanksgiving weekend last year. Please contact the Department of Motor Vehicles for matters related to citations. Please contact DC Department of

Transportation for matters related to car crashes. MPD is currently pulling data for the number of DUIs that resulted in an arrest last year from 11/22/18-11/25/18.

NEW Mel Madarang (Capital News Service) reached out to CRO Kevin Bush for a story on flood risk, climate change and resilience. She also reached out to DOEE. DOEE plan's to highlight the Resilient DC Strategy and Mayor's existing commitments to climate action and addressing flood risk.

NEW Amanda Horowitz (ABC 7) is conducting a story about school nurses, if DCPS is experiencing a school nurse shortage and if so, what the details are. DCPS referred the reporter to DC Health, link to story: https://wjla.com/news/local/school-nurse-shortage-montgomery-county

DOH provided the following response:

"All DC Health approved health suites in DCPS schools receive coverage. The goal for all schools participating in the School Health Services Program, which includes 115 DCPS schools and 81 Public Charter Schools, is to have full time staffing in their health suites. Currently, most schools - 173 schools out of 196 total - have 40 hours of coverage (89% of the DCPS schools and 81% of the DCPCS). Coverage will change as new schools with approved health suites are added, if nurses leave the program, and as the clinical needs of students are assessed. All school health suites receiving less than 40 hours of coverage are provided access via telephone to a school nurse in the event any questions or emergencies arise. Amidst a national nursing shortage, School Health Services Program implements strategies for staff retention and recruitment. In an effort to improve staff retention, SHSP has increased managerial and clinical supports for all staff. Recruitment events like open houses have also proven to be successful for increasing the workforce. The most recent one occurred last week. DC Health remains committed to providing health services in District of Columbia public and public charter schools to accommodate the health needs of all students. We collaborate with our education partners to ensure all schools are kept apprised of individual level health suite staffing schedules. In addition to the baseline coverage needs, we also respond to daily changes in staffing due to nurse availability and changing clinical needs of students. Daily short-term shifts in nursing coverage for a particular school are often required to accommodate daily/frequent needs for health care across the public school and public charter school system. Contact information for the nurse managers is also included so school leaders can reach out directly and stay informed about specific school-level concerns."

NEW TodayStephanie Ramirez (Fox5) interviewed Chief Newsham regarding the shooting of two juveniles that took place outside the National Zoo on November 30.

NEW Liz Farmer (Lincoln Institute) interviewed OP Director Trueblood for a story she is conducting that focuses on the Comprehensive Plan, Housing Equity Report, and how these fit into a larger strategy to increase access to opportunity.

Before a license can be issued, the applicant must demonstrate that their business is in compliance with the District's regulations. These regulations, which include operational and design standards for food carts and stands, are in place to protect the health and safety of District consumers. When a vending operation does not meet the District's regulations, they cannot be issued a license. DCRA has issued licenses to sidewalk vendors who follow the regulations in place to protect the public."
- *NEW* James Romoser (Inside Health Policy) is conducting a story about state and federal responses to the opioid crisis and contacted DHCF to inquire about the District's recently approved Behavioral Health Transformation waiver and wanted to inquire about the 1115 waiver, its goals and its implementation.
- *NEW* Anna Ferrazzi (The Hoya) is conducting a story about Ellington Field and the concern around DPR bringing the field into its inventory.

INTERVIEWS:

NEW Jasmine Whittington (WUSA9) contacted OCME to request an interview with Dr. Mitchell to include in a story she's conducting about the high homicide rate in Southeast D.C. due to gun violence. She would like Dr. Mitchell's perspective of the professional and community work he has done on this topic. She is also interested in learning what the entire process is, from start to finish when OCME receives news that someone was killed.

NEW WHUT will interview DPR Deputy Director Monique McSween Saturday at the Toys for Tots being held Bald Eagle Recreation Center on Saturday. WHUT will present Bald Eagle with 10 new PBS play pads, for youths and their families. They will cover the event to run on their station during the holidays.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

NEW Mitch Ryals (Washington City Paper) is conducting a story that is focusing on a whistleblower complaint that alleges political favoritism in the award of Housing Production Trust Fund dollars. He is aware of DHCD Director Donaldson's responsed to the allegations, but is inquiring to give her an opportunity to comment further. DHCD reiterated Director Donaldson's response:

"Mayor Bowser has made support for the production and preservation of affordable housing her top priority. She has made more investments and delivered more results than any Mayor previously. My agency followed all laws in making decisions in the best interest of the District. Further, the Council Auditor herself lauds the Development Finance Division controls that I put in place. DC must be inclusive and we must take into account developments across the city in making decisions with each RFP round."

Ryals also contacted DMPED for a comment, Director of Real Estate Sarosh Olpadwala provided the following statement:

"I am not involved in the DHCD scoring or ranking, and I work closely with Director Donaldson (and previously former Dep. Director Ladd) on many projects in DHCD's, DMPED's and other District government portfolios to increase the supply of much needed affordable housing in the District."

NEW Eliza Berkon (WAMU) is conducting a story on an upcoming rent-strike rally that's due to take place in Columbia Heights on Friday. And is inquiring what rights do renters have when they feel a property-management company is not adhering to D.C. housing codes/not responding to their needs, what are the D.C. housing codes surrounding issues such as vermin, mold, heat/ac?; and is DPR is aware of past rent strikes in D.C. and their efficacy? DCRA is currently drafting a response in coordination with DMOI, determining the Director's availability for an interview, DPR is investigating if any complaints were lodged at DCRA regarding the building (3435 Holmead Place). DCRA recommended the reporter to contact the DC Department of Housing and Community Development rent strike organizers and legal organizations for those answers.

NEW Denise Lavoie (Associated Press) is conducting a story on child sex abuse in the Catholic Church and discovered lists of credibly accused priests published by the Roman Catholic diocese(s) in the District of Columbia and surrounding jurisdictions. She is inquiring if OSSE considers those lists when issuing teacher licenses.OSSE sent background on DC regulations on licensing teachers.

NEW Amanda Menas (Northwest Courier) contacted DGS inquiring about progress on the Chevy Chase Community Center, if there are any new updates that have come since the November 6th meeting. Reporter plans to print story next week. A hard deadline was not provided. DGS is drafting a response.

- *NEW* Elise Dean (American University) is a student reporter and contacted OCME regarding the cause and manner of death for Gerald Watson with an additional question about the proximity of hospitals to gunshot victims. OCME replied that Gerald Watson's cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds and the manner of death was ruled a homicide, and referred her remaining question to the Department of Health's communications director for a response.
- *NEW* DMV received a query from Justin Moyer at the Washington Post asking if DMV has any restrictions on words used on vanity tags. Mayor Bowser will participate in the opening press conference of the USCM Winter Meeting, highlighting the policy priorities of USCM for 2020. Then, the Mayor will give remarks at USCM's Opening Plenary Luncheon. That evening, the Mayor will join volunteers to engage neighbors experiencing homelessness to highlight available services and programs, as well as execute the annual census of persons experiencing homelessness as part of her Administration's annual Point in Time Count.

INTERVIEWS:

NEW Eliza Berkon (WAMU) contacted DCHR to inquire what D.C.-area companies are doing to assist their employees with long commutes, such as offering teleworking, Metro passes and housing stipends, specifically interested in learning more about what options are currently available to D.C. employees, and how those benefits differ depending on the GS grade, as well as with federal contractors. DCHR provided the following on background:

The District's Personnel Manual details information regarding the various compressed, flexible, alternate and telework schedules that employees may receive approval for. Metro subsidies are offered to those who are covered under relevant collective bargaining agreements managed by the Office of Labor Relations and Collective Bargaining. The Department of Housing and Community Development manages the Employer Assisted Housing and Home Purchase Assistance Program. The District also offers pre-tax flexible spending accounts to use on metro transit for all employees, even those who are not under a collective bargaining agreement.

- *NEW* Perry Stein (WAPO) inquired about the number of juveniles who were fatally stabbed and shot in 2019. Stein also requested the number of juveniles who were non-fatally stabbed and shot in 2019. MPD advised for Stein to submit and FOIA request in order to receive stats on the number of juveniles who were non-fatally stabbed and shot in 2019. We also stated there were a total of 12 juveniles who were killed in 2019. Two juveniles were fatally stabbed and 10 juveniles were fatally shot.
- *NEW* Liliana González-Ramírez (Telemundo 44) and Rosbelis Quiñonez (Univision) inquired about missing person Ezequiel Guzman. MPD provided background on the incident and stated that the juvenile was being combative when he was located. The child was then transported to an area hospital for a medical evaluation.

UPDATE Dana Goldstein (New York Times) contacted DCPS with follow up questions related to Garrison ES' PARCC gains for ELA. DCPS is working with the school to answer the questions.

MAYOR MURIEL BOWSER'S PUBLIC CALENDAR EVENTS FOR THURSDAY, JANUARY 23:

Mayor Bowser will serve on a USCM panel to discuss how the District is innovating to improve public safety through the Private Security Camera Rebate Program and the expansion of MPD's crime camera network. That evening, the Mayor will co-host a Washington, DC welcome reception with Ambassador Shinsuke J. Sugiyama of Japan for UCSM attendees.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

NEW WRC 4, WTTG Fox 5, and WUSA 9 contacted FEMS regarding an apartment fire at 2656 Bowen Rd SE that occurred yesterday evening, after a scanner monitor tweeted that a Molotov cocktail had been thrown there. Although that was the language used by a unit on scene over the radio, FEMS cautioned against using that term and advised that the unit responded to a report of an apartment fire, found fire outside an apartment door that was out on arrival, and that fire investigators were called to the scene.

NEW Washington Post (Fenit Nirappil) contacted DOH inquiring the current status of National Holistic Healing Center's license to operate in the District given that DOH found that its owners improperly owned the Charmed dispensary in violation of the one dispensary license per owner limit and if there are going to be additional consequences. DC Health informed him that the National Holistic Healing Center has a registration to operate as a medical marijuana dispensary.

NEW Maureen Pao (WAMU) is conducting a story on faith-based preparedness, with a specific interest in the Jewish community. She is seeking information on what sort of outreach or support HSEMA has conducted or been a part of following Mayor Bowser's meeting with religious meeting earlier this month. HSEMA spoke briefly about the Interfaith Preparedness & Advisory Group (IPAG) and HSEMA is interested in pitching the IPAG as a large focus for this story to show the support the IPAG provides the District's faith-based community. HSEMA is coordinating with MOCA Director Lamont Akins. HSEMA Director Rodriguez will speak with Maureen to highlight the Nonprofit Security Grant Program, and what religious institutions can do with the assistance of this grant, and the preparedness support and outreach that is available for our religious community.

NEW Max Smith (WTOP) contacted DDOT about the pre-Performance Hearing question responses related to the extension of the DC Streetcar, which includes language that DDOT will not pursue extending the Streetcar to Georgetown. DDOT referred Max to the language included in the hearing responses:

DDOT does not see a feasible path towards implementation of this project in the short term, due to funding priorities and storage and maintenance needs discovered during the NEPA analysis. As such DDOT has decided to stop additional analysis on the USGT EA. DDOT will not seek federal funding for design or construction of the USGT Improvement Project for the foreseeable future. Although DDOT will not build the USGT Improvement Project in the near term, the agency will continue to pursuit other projects that improve the corridor, including the K Street Transitway, H Street Bridge reconstruction, reconstruction of New Jersey Avenue, and bus operational improvements. DDOT is currently focusing on designing the K Street Transitway, to improve speed and reliability for east/west buses through downtown. The K Street Transitway shares some goals with the USGT project and offers a more feasible path for implementation. Much of the analysis included in the draft USGT EA will further the designs and operations of K Street project.

NEW Martin Austermuhle (WAMU) contacted DDOT about the building collapse at Florida Avenue and Staple Street last week. Martin is inquiring about the installation of safe accommodation pedestrian crossing that was approved by DDOT but not installed. DDOT found

- that the contractor never paid for the permit, which would have triggered inspections. DDOT is working with DCRA and DMOI on a coordinated response.
- *NEW* Fenit Nirappil (Washington Post) is seeking to interview ABRA Director Fred Moosally following his testimony this morning at the public roundtable on the games of skill emergency and temporary legislation. Interview is scheduled for thursday afternoon, or friday morning.
- *NEW* Chloe Fatsis (Wilson Beacon) contacted DCPS inquiring about Wilson High School's push to switch to a seven-period day. DCPS is following up internally for a response.
- *NEW* Paul Wagner (Fox 5) requested the report for a Possession of an Unregistered Firearm offense that occurred on 1/14/20 in the 4400 block of F Street, Southeast. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report.
- *NEW* Keith Alexander (Washington Post) asked when DFS Firearm Specialist Steven Chase retired from MPD and the number of service years he had at the time of his retirement. MPD stated Steven Chase was hired February 1991 and retired effective July 2019.
- *NEW* Alberto Pimienta (Telemundo 44) and Melissa Howell (WTOP) requested the reports for Robbery offenses that occurred on 1/5/20 in the 3200 block of 17th Street, Northwest; 1/12/20 in the 3000 block of Mount Pleasant Street. Northwest and 1/20/20 in the 2800 block of 11th Street, Northwest. Melissa Howell (WTOP) also asked if MPD is investigating these incidents as being potentially related. MPD confirmed that we are investigating the following incidents as being potentially related
- *NEW* John Henry (WUSA9) asked if any arrests have been made in a Traffic Fatality that occurred on 1/1/20 in the Intersection of Minnesota Avenue and L'Enfant Square, Southeast. MPD stated this case remains under investigation and no arrests have been made.
- *NEW* Alana Wise (WAMU) asked how many ghost guns were recovered in 2019. MPD stated that there were a total of 115 ghost guns collected in 2019.
- *NEW* Thomas Lynch (NBC4) and Pamela Leahigh (NBC4) requested the report for a Sexual Abuse allegation that occurred on 1/21/20 in the 4800 block of Nebraska Avenue, Northwest. The report was requested following the dissemination of a press release. MPD sent the report.
- *NEW* Adam Tuss (NBC4) asked for additional information regarding a metro bus that crashed into nearly a dozen cars along Porter Street, Northwest on Tuesday. MPD stated at approximately 1:11 am, MPD responded to the 2800 block of Porter Street, NW, for the report of a traffic accident. Upon arrival, MPD observed that a Metro Bus had collided with a legally parked vehicle. This collision caused a chain reaction in which 10 other vehicles were pushed forward into one another. Including the metro bus, there were 11 vehicles involved

NEW Ryan Sprouse (ABC7) requested the report for an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon (Gun) offense that occurred on 1/10/20 in the 400 block of Chesapeake Street, Southeast. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report.

UPDATE Elizabeth Festa (Freelance) contacted DISB to inquire why Stephen Taylor is no longer Commissioner and why his departure was sudden. DISB provided the following response: "The District government does not comment on personnel matters."

UPDATE Michael Quander (WUSA9) will profile Masi Preston, Dorothy Height ES Principal and Standing Ovation Principal of the Year, tomorrow morning.

UPDATE Scott MacFarlane (NBC4) submitted a FOIA request to DCHR for copies of the 10 most recent FOIA responses where DCHR produced records (attached). As requested, DCHR included a chart of the last 10 requests that produced responsive records with a brief summary of the request, what was provided to the requester, and additional redactions (in addition to the ones provided to the requester) in the response to Mr. MacFarlane. The response is due Friday, January 24, 2020.

MAYOR MURIEL BOWSER'S PUBLIC CALENDAR EVENTS FOR FRIDAY, JANUARY 24:

Mayor Bowser will co-chair a USCM taskforce on threats to nutrition and food security and how mayors can respond to the recent cuts to critical federal program like SNAP. That afternoon, the Mayor will join Nextdoor CEO Sarah Friar and New York Times Columnist David Brooks for a conversation on the critical role neighborhoods play in civic life.

INTERVIEWS:

- *NEW* Sophie Kaplan (Washington Times) is inquiring how the PIT was conducted, what are the expectations for the results and general comments about the government services available for the homeless population. DMHHS Executive Director Kristy Greenwalt conducted a phone interview.
- *NEW* DCPS Chancellor Lewis D. Ferebee interviewed with Perry Stein (Washington Post), Debbie Truong (WAMU), and Amanda Gomez (Washington City Paper) this morning on the decision to close Washington Metropolitan High School.
- *NEW* Alana Wise (WAMU) interviewed DM Donahue regarding ghost guns and its impact in the District as part of her "Guns in America" series. The interview will be a part of the DFS interview she did yesterday and the story will run at a later date.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

- *NEW* Noel Gasca (WAMU) contacted HSEMA inquiring for any information on the Coronavirus and possible impacts to the District. HSEMA referred the inquiry to DOH who provided the following statement attributable to Dr. Nesbitt:
- "DC Health is closely monitoring the novel coronavirus outbreak that originated in Wuhan, China. We are participating in national calls led by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and providing guidance to local healthcare providers and hospitals. Currently, there have been no cases of the novel coronavirus identified in the District. At this time, there is no reason for us to advise that cultural activities related to the Chinese Lunar New Year not occur as planned, including the parade scheduled for Sunday, Jan. 25."
- *NEW* Jon Swaine (Washington Post) contacted DCRA inquiring for corporate filings for CONSTITUTIONAL LITIGATION AND ADVOCACY GROUP, file number 231451. He is researching the background of the company and needs to compile all available public records about its location and personnel. It appears that this organization is connected Donald Trump's lawyer, Jay Sekulow. DCRA provided the filings.
- *NEW* Rachel Kurzius (DCist) is conducting a story about the latest developments at McMillan. DMPED provided the following statement:
- "Permits to commence development at McMillan were issued following the affirmance of the District's zoning and historic preservation cases in 2019. These permits were appealed and the D.C. Court of Appeals set a consolidated briefing schedule so it will be in a position to rule on these matters in the coming days. The Bowser Administration respects the Court's administrative injunction and it is our great hope that we can move ahead soon with our vision to revitalize the vacant McMillan site into a place to live, work and enjoy. This site will one day include more than 650 units of housing; 6,200 jobs; neighborhood-serving retail; a new park; community center and more for the Ward 5 and the District as a whole."
- *NEW* Jess Arnold (WUSA9), Anna-Lysa Gayle (WJLA7), and Juliana Valencia (NBC4) contacted DCPS requesting a comment on the decision to close Washington Metropolitan High School. DCPS shared the letter and the following statement:

"DC Public Schools has a responsibility to create learning environments where every student can succeed at their neighborhood school, and we do not take the decision to close Washington Metropolitan High School lightly. We believe that the unique educational offerings and support services provided at our neighborhood high schools and opportunity academies are well suited to meet the needs of Washington Metropolitan students. We are committed to partnering with the Washington Metropolitan community to thoughtfully transition students to schools where they will be loved, challenged, and prepared to positively influence society. In evaluating the impact of this proposal, DCPS heard from students, educators, and families through student listening sessions, as well as staff and community meetings. We thank the more than 200 community members who provided valuable feedback and share in our commitment to ensure Washington Metropolitan students are set up for success."

NEW Liz O'Gorek (East of the River) contacted DCPS inquiring about the auditor's report on enrollment projections and equitable school funding. DCPS shared DME's response letter and connected her with DME Paul Kihn.

NEW Katie Shaver (Washington Post) contacted DDOT requesting a comment about the decision to not extend the DC Streetcar to Georgetown. DDOT Director Jeff Marootian talked to Katie about Mayor Bowser's goal to improve east west transit in the District through the K Street Transitway and also spoke about the benefits of the Benning Road Extension.

NEW Washington Post (Karin Brulliard) is conducting an article about DC residents whose car wiring has been damaged by rats and is inquiring how many complaints about this specific issue (car wiring) have been filed in recent years, and what neighborhoods the complaints are most commonly coming from? DC Health informed her that the agency and 311 do not track rat complaints based on the nature of complaint (e.g. chewing of car wiring). Anecdotally, Gerard Brown, Program Manager for DC Health Rodent and Vector Control Division says he's seen about 7 complaints about rats chewing on car wires over the past two years. Mr. Brown adds that one of the reasons that rats are attracted to the wiring is because soy bean oil is one of the additives to wiring. Also, it is a rat's natural instinct to gnaw on tree branches and wires mimic branches.

NEW Ryan Sprouse (ABC7),Lerita Carter (Fox 5) and Kenny Martin (Fox 5) requested the report for a requested the report for an arrest that was made in a Sexual Abuse allegation that occurred on 1/21/20 in the 4800 block of Nebraska Avenue, Northwest. The report was requested following the dissemination of a press release. MPD sent the report.

NEW Michael Miller (Washington Post) requested the report for a Threats to Do Bodily Harm offense that occurred on 9/24/19 in the 400 block of Valley Avenue, Southeast; the report for a Destruction of Property offense that occurred on 12/31/19 in the 1200 block of 9th Street, Northwest; the report for a Stalking offense that occurred on 10/29/19 in the 4000 block of Minnesota Avenue, Northeast; and the report for a Robbery offense that occurred on 9/17/19 in the 7700 block of Eastern Avenue, Northwest. These offenses were investigated as suspected hate crimes. In each of these cases, an arrest was made. MPD sent the reports.

NEW Andrea Cambron (WTOP), Luke Lukert (WTOP), Lerita Carter (Fox 5), and Kenny Martin (Fox 5) asked about the condition of the person who was rescued from the water at the Wharf last night. MPD stated last night, at approximately 10:14 pm, MPD Harbor Patrol and DC Fire and EMS responded to the 700 block of Wharf Street, SW, and located an adult male in the water. Unfortunately, after all lifesaving efforts failed, he was pronounced dead. This is currently a death investigation; however, no foul play is suspected at this time.

NEW Cory Smith (NBC4) is working on a story in reference to preparation for covering tomorrow's March for Life event. Smith wanted to know what people can expect security-wise in and around the Capitol since the president will be attending this event. MPD advised Smith to contact US Secret Service in reference to the President's visit and US Capitol Police in reference to the Capitol. MPD stated the Metropolitan Police Department, along with our partner agencies, has been working with event organizers to ensure this is a safe event for all residents and visitors planning to attend. MPD is fully equipped to handle large scale events, including the annual March for Life event.

UPDATES:

UPDATE Delia Goncalves (WUSA 9) is conducting a story on New Hampshire Market at 1900 16th St. NW (corner of 16th and T). She is hearing from neighbors the store was condemned, and a gate surrounding the crumbling building about a month ago. She would like to get any inspection reports related to this market, she was told the market was operating for years in dangerous conditions. DCRA met with the owner today and a fazed stabilization of the building will likely begin at the end of the week.

Mayor Bowser will host the first Mayor-Council breakfast of 2020 to discuss several issues, including the Administration's investments and priorities to build a safer, stronger DC.

STORIES IN THE WORKS:

- *NEW* HSEMA is planning to pitch the District's preparation plans for 59th Presidential Inauguration to Martin Austermuhle (WAMU), Nick Ianelli (WTOP) and Sophie Kaplan (Washington Times). The District is activating EOC for the State of the Union Address & SOTUA activation is closest to a presidential inauguration, working with partners, exercises across District government, etc. suggesting print route. There aren't a ton of cameras in the EOC due to high presence of law enforcement liaisons in EOC for SOTUA.
- *NEW* Martin Austermuhle (WAMU) contacted DCRA to inquire why there was a Stop Work Order placed on the site of the building collapsed on 1102 Staples St NE. He is asking what the developer is accused of that would warrant a SWO. DCRA provided the following response attributable to Director Chrappah:
- "The Stop Work Order was placed to halt any further damage and unsafe construction. Construction plans are being revised by the builder to demolish most of remaining building, but keeping to the original plan for a 4-story apartment building, albeit changed to a completely wood-framed structure as a result of the partial collapse and planned demolition. Plans are also being developed to provide overhead sidewalk protection along Florida Ave during the construction."
- *NEW* Sam Ford (WJLA) preview of St E's parcels out for RFP, on camera interview with the JJF, expected to run tonight
- *NEW* Alex Koma (Washington Business Journal) also on the preview of the St E's parcels out for RFP and comments from JJF on his nomination as DM, likely something online later and more in depth on St E's later
- *NEW* Jonathan Capriel (Washington Business Journal) contacted DCPS inquiring how many DC schools were receiving funding from the Amazon Future Engineer program. DCPS is preparing to let him know that the Amazon Engineer program is being piloted at five high schools.
- *NEW* Sam Collins (Washington Informer) will shadow DCPS' Teacher of the Year at Ron Brown on Thursday.
- *NEW* Airey, J. (DC Line) contacted DMPSJ to inquire about the administration's response to OUC's performance hearing, specifically if OUC's call processing delays and accuracy issues mentioned during yesterday's hearing (such as documented dispatch delays or Metro having the wrong emergency number) worry the mayor or staff and if the mayor or staff are planning to order an investigation into OUC operations following any of these concerns, or after the Kennedy Street incident specifically? The story is due to run this evening or tomorrow morning. DMPSJ provided the following response:
- The Office of Unified Communications responds to more than 1 million 911 calls each year. Under the strong leadership of Director Karima Holmes, the agency works continuously to improve its processes and ensure every call is handled quickly and professionally. Because of its critical role in coordinating our first responders, there is no margin for error. Any time a mistake happens, OUC immediately reviews the incident to prevent recurrence. As a result of this approach, OUC has made critical investments in its IT infrastructure and daily

- operations, resulting in improvements in response and dispatch times. Immediately after the tragic fire, Mayor Bowser ordered a comprehensive, independent review of the District's responses to the building's housing conditions. She also asked federal prosecutors to open a criminal investigation into the illegal rental of the property by its owner. In order to be fully transparent and accountable to our residents, the Mayor made the entire, unredacted report public. It is available for review here.

- *NEW* Evan Lambert (Fox5) and Dave Ingram (NBC News) have requested an interview about stolen vehicles related to car rental apps such as Getaround and Turo. Commander Parsons has been approved to speak with Fox5 tomorrow, February 5. The media is interested in this topic since the OAG issued a Consumer Alert.

On my most recent visit to Wash Met, students shared with me their interests beyond our Opportunity Academies including arts programming at Duke Ellington and earning different certifications at Phelps and Ballou STAY. Based on those conversations and the interests students expressed, DCPS believes that the educational offerings and support

- services provided at our neighborhood high schools and other opportunity academies are best suited to meet both their academic and social emotional needs. We will continue to focus on thoughtfully transitioning these students through one-on-one engagement with schools that align with their college and career interests and future aspirations.
- *NEW* Caroline Patrickis (WJLA7) contacted DCPS to confirm whether Banneker HS student RuQuan Brown committed to Harvard University. DCPS confirmed.

DMOI followed up with background, DMOI explained via telephone that DDOT's Vision Zero Rulemaking issued in January 2019 increased the fine for blocking the bike lane to \$150, but a technical error found in a separate, subsequent rulemaking unintentionally reduced the fine to \$65. DDOT is working to fix that error through the rulemaking process. DMOI also followed up via email that the # of bike lane tickets issued between November 12, 2019 to Jan. 26, 2020 total approximately 930. The amount of those tickets is \$65, and, since January 27, 2020, approximately 20 bike lane photo enforcement warnings have been issued, with a statement attributable to DPW Director Chris Geldart: "DPW will continue to issue photo enforcement warnings to drivers blocking bike lanes through February 27. Beginning February 28, \$65 tickets will be issued while the DDOT rulemaking process is being executed."

UPDATE Sophie Kaplan (Washington Times) inquired about a general attribution for the information shared about the rulemaking process. I noted she could attribute the following language to DDOT Director Jeff Marootian:

"Vehicles blocking bike lanes is one of the most dangerous roadway behaviors that threatens bicyclists traveling through the District. Through the Vision Zero Rulemaking issued in January 2019, the Bowser Administration sought to deter drivers from blocking bike lanes by increasing the fine to \$150. The Department of Public Works (DPW) subsequently gained the authority to issue camera tickets to drivers who drove away before a ticket was placed on their windshield. In 2019, DPW focused its efforts on acquiring the resources required to enforce this provision, including adding 26 additional parking enforcement officers and equipment to issue photo tickets, as announced by Mayor Bowser in November 2019. In turn, DDOT has been working to fix a technical error found in a separate, subsequent rulemaking that unintentionally reduced the fine for blocking the bike lane from \$150 to \$65."

The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report and stated 25 year-old Roger Hedgpeth of Brandon, FL was arrested in this case. - *NEW* Dana Hedgpeth (WAPO) and Peter Hermann (WAPO) requested the report for an Assault with Intent to Kill offense that occurred on 2/8/20 in the 1000 block of Ridge Road, Southeast. The report was requested for fact finding. MPD sent the report.

- *NEW* On Sunday, Martin Austermuhle (WAMU 88.5) asked for an estimate of how much security cost for the white nationalist protest that occurred. MPD advised Austermuhle to contact the Office of the City Administrator for information regarding costs.
- *NEW* Sam Ford (ABC7) contacted MPD's Communications Director, Dustin Sternbeck, directly in reference to the National Patriotic Front protest. Specifically, if the group had a permit to march and if it was legal for the protesters faces to be covered. MPD stated there is no record of a permit being issued to the group. MPD became aware of the event through open source information. DC law prohibits wearing masks in certain circumstances, for example, in the commission of a crime.

MPD stated that Officer Wright is currently on Full Duty status. MPD also asked Ryals why this information is being requested. Ryals stated that he is gathering facts at this time and does not have any more specific information to share about a potential story. This request is pending.
- *NEW-- Maureen Pao (WAMU, reporter) would like a general overview about <u>Healthy Steps</u> and <u>Help Me Grow</u> Programs.
