



Dear Mr. Greenewald,

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, and February 27, 2017, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for information concerning, "Agency Security Classification Management Program Data SF-311 Forms filled out by your agency, for the last three years". I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. DIA continues its efforts to eliminate the large backlog of pending FOIA requests. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with another office within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 11 pages responsive to your request.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 3 pages must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 3 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3). Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statutes are 10 U.S.C. § 424. Statute 10 U.S.C. § 424 protects the identity of DIA employees, the organizational structure of the agency, and any function of DIA.

Finally, I have determined that the remaining 8 pages are appropriate for release in full. DIA has not withheld any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the records.

If you are not satisfied with my response to your request, you may contact the DIA FOIA Requester Service Center, as well as our FOIA Public Liaison at 301-394-5587.
