Dear Mr. Greenewald,

This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, dated February 27, 2017, that you submitted to the Defense Intelligence Agency (DIA) for information concerning, "Agency Security Classification Management Program Data SF-311 Forms filled out by your agency, for the last three years". I apologize for the delay in responding to your request. DIA continues its efforts to eliminate the large backlog of pending FOIA requests. In order to properly respond, it was necessary to consult with another office within the agency.

A search of DIA's systems of records located 11 pages responsive to your request.

Upon review, I have determined that some portions of 3 pages must be withheld in part from disclosure pursuant to the FOIA. The withheld portions are exempt from release pursuant to Exemptions 3 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(3). Exemption 3 applies to information specifically exempted by a statute establishing particular criteria for withholding. The applicable statutes are 10 U.S.C. § 424. Statute 10 U.S.C. § 424 protects the identity of DIA employees, the organizational structure of the agency, and any function of DIA.

Finally, I have determined that the remaining 8 pages are appropriate for release in full. DIA has not withheld any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions of the records.

(U) Due to the sustained prolific application of ORCON in unevaluated reporting, all-source derivative classification agencies are disproportionately impacted by significant administration requirements in seeking approval to share intelligence with its customers. 95% of the ORCON release requests submitted within the timeframe for this survey are still pending approval. Original Classification Authorities are not required to provide timely responses to these requests; as a result, DIA is forced to limit the initial distribution of derivative ORCON to a subset of its intended recipients while approvals are processed. The timeliness of DIA's intelligence and the breadth of intelligence dissemination to customers are negatively impacted by this.
