

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010))]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **National Security/Intelligence Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of national security and foreign intelligence records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and PA exemption (j)(2) as applicable to requests for records about individuals [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2); 50 U.S.C § 3024(i)(1)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that national security or foreign intelligence records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) **Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) **Record Searches.** The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching those systems or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. Most requests are satisfied by searching the Central Records System (CRS), an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled and maintained by the FBI in the course of fulfilling its dual law enforcement and intelligence mission as well as the performance of agency administrative and personnel functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization and encompasses the records of FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ), FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide. A CRS search includes Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records.
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheets. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. Forms and directions can be accessed at www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/identity-history-summary-checks. Additionally, requests can be submitted electronically at www.edo.cjis.gov. For additional information, please contact CJIS directly at (304) 625-5590.
- (iv) **The National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private citizens cannot request a name check.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552


- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

My dear Mr. Vice President:

The Department of Justice again desires to urge the early enactment of the bill (S. 595) "Relating to the internal security of the United States."

For several years, this Department has been seeking means of strengthening the laws relating to the internal security of the United States. The above bill is the result of considerable study and investigation of this subject. Recent world developments stress the necessity for immediate action on this matter and further delay can only react to the prejudice of the security of this country. Therefore, the immediate enactment of this legislation is recommended.

The Department wrote the Chairman of the Judiciary Committee on September 20, 1949, concerning the amendment to the bill intended to be proposed by the Chairman. Although the Department believes the measure would be more effective without the amendment, it would interpose no objection to the adoption of the amendment if it is deemed necessary to secure the enactment of the legislation.

Re my memorandum, November 2, 1948, which advised that instant meeting had by agreement been cancelled and which recommended that approval of Pat Coyne's Progress Report to the National Security Council be approved through Liaison with the IIC members. The Director approved such recommendation.

The Working Committee members were contacted by Special Agent Edward S. Sanders and each obtained the approval of Coyne's report from his Director. Each also stated that there was no objection to Coyne's listing the members of the IIC Working Committee at the end of his report. Reference is made to the Progress Report of the ICIS dated October 17, 1949.

It is noted that the third paragraph of the report sets forth a resume of actions taken by ICIS to date of October 17, 1949, which included the establishment of subcommittees of the ICIS and provided that the subcommittees would determine their own terms of reference. It is noted that a Sub-Committee on Foreign Diplomatic and Official Personnel has been set up to be composed of membership from the Departments of State, Defense, Treasury and Justice. It is further noted that Problem #1 assigned to this committee is as follows:

To neutralize so far as possible espionage and subversive activities of the personnel of foreign diplomatic, consular or other missions, including international organizations.

You will recall that my letter dated August 4, 1949 pointed out in connection with this problem that while there are a number of ways to neutralize the espionage and subversive activities of these individuals through investigative techniques, there is, at the present time, no specific policy as to diplomatic action which will be taken against these individuals when it has been shown by the investigative agencies of the IIC that they are actually engaging in espionage and subversive activities. It was pointed out in my letter that it would greatly aid the members of the IIC in applying investigative techniques if it were possible for the ICIS to develop a specific policy in this regard. I am sure that you will agree that the problem facing your subcommittee in this connection is the formulation of a policy for action to be taken against these individuals after it has

been shown by the investigative agencies of the IIC that they are actually engaging in espionage and subversive activities and that the problem facing the subcommittee is not actually to neutralize so far as possible espionage and subversive activities of foreign diplomatic personnel.

It has been noted further that also assigned to this ICIS subcommittee is the following problem:

"To strengthen legislation of the Espionage Act of 1917 with respect to internal security."

As you know, this matter has been closely followed by the IIC and the Department of Justice and every effort is being made to have this legislation become law. In view of the assigned responsibility of the IIC members in the field of espionage, counterespionage, subversion and related intelligence activities, it would be appreciated if any proposed legislation in this connection is forwarded to the IIC for its approval.

Please be assured of my desire to cooperate closely with you in all matters of mutual interest.

Intelligence Conference at SOG

There is a meeting of the Interdepartmental Intelligence Conference scheduled for 2:30 p.m., December 1, 1949, in your office. Attached hereto is the proposed agenda for instant meeting.

In connection with the second item on the agenda concerning furnishing of background information to ICIS with reference to the licensing and operation of private, amateur, and commercial radio facilities, a review of the files indicates that about 1941 the FCC required fingerprints of applicants for radio operators, et cetera. At that time the FCC declined to furnish the fingerprint cards in their possession to the Bureau, stating that they had been obtained for the sole purpose of determining citizenship, and the operators and employees had not been advised that their fingerprints would be turned over to the Bureau. Arrangements were finally made for the transmittal of these fingerprint cards to the Bureau.

On June 14, 1946, the Acting Chairman of FCC advised the Attorney General that the Commission had eliminated its requirements for the submission of fingerprints by applicants for commercial and amateur radio operator licenses. However, available fingerprint cards would be delivered to the FBI. In 1948, 17 cards were received. During 1949, 2 cards were received, and to date in the fiscal year 1950, no cards have been received.

RECOMMENDATION:

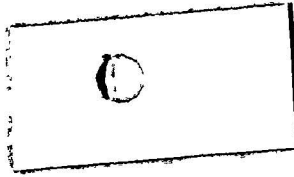

The National Academy of Sciences and its operating unit, the National Research Council, although created to serve Government, are not strictly governmental organizations. They therefore have no internal security problems of their own in relation to their activities with the scientists of the United States and do not participate in any inter-agency security committee.

Both organizations, however, are constantly faced with the matter of clearance of scientists serving on committees and of staff members who deal with classified material under contracts with the National Military Establishment, the Department of State, the Atomic Energy Commission, and other Government agencies. The National Academy and National Research Council, having no arrangements for clearing employees, refer these cases to the contracting agency for clearance.

If this arrangement satisfies the obligations of the Interdepartmental Committee on Internal Security, it would appear that no further action is required on the part of the Academy. If not, we will be very glad to receive further instruction on this matter.
