FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **Intelligence Records.** To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. - (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

letter dated June 26, 1959, the Bureau was requested to have MULLINS' 1958 federal income tax record checked for such information.

ADMINISTRATIVE

Careful consideration has been given to each source concealed and T symbols were utilized in this report only in those instances where the identities of the sources must be concealed.

Suitable photographs of MULLINS are available in the files of the Chicago Office.

MULLINS was interviewed on June 13, 1959, at the cottage of one RUSSELL KIRK, Mecosta, Michigan. MULLINS was interviewed per Bureau instructions and was forcefully admonished to refrain from making derogatory statements previously attributed to him concerning the FBI and the personal life of Mr. HOOVER. During that interview, MULLINS denied making such statements. The Bureau is in possession of all information concerning the interview with MULLINS, none of which is suitable for inclusion in a report to be disseminated.

In regard to referenced Bureau letter dated June 3, 1959, requesting intensified efforts to be made to develop confidential informants in direct contact with MULLINS who can furnish detailed information concerning him, the following is submitted:

[REDACTED] advised that to his knowledge, MULLINS' associates in Chicago who were in direct contact with him were MAX NELSON, JOSEPH BEAUHARNIS, F. ALLEN MANN, and Mrs. LYRL CLARK VAN HYNING, all of whom were described as

racial extremists. [] further stated that MULLINS is strictly an "odd ball" and associates with very few people. He said that MULLINS holds friends for a short period of time only, uses them, and then casts them aside. He knows of no one who is actually close to MULLINS.

[] further stated that he is aware of no organized activity on the part of MULLINS or of other racial extremists in the Chicago area at the present time.

On August 6, 1959, Mrs. OLIVE HEATH, 2239 North Lincoln Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, who resides in the apartment immediately below that occupied by MULLINS, advised that MULLINS is usually home during the daytime and evening hours and seldom leaves his apartment except to go on what appear to be brief shopping trips. She added that MULLINS seldom has any visitors at his apartment and that he occupies his time primarily by doing considerable typing, inasmuch as she overhears the typewriter in MULLINS' apartment being used at all hours of the day and evening.

A review of Chicago files concerning racial extremist organizations reflected that there is no organized group activity in the Chicago area at the present time other than a meeting of the National States' Rights Party, which was held on May 6, 1959, in Chicago, and a meeting of the National Party, held on July 4, 1959, in Chicago. MULLINS did not attend either of those meetings.

A review of Chicago files concerning racial extremists corroborates the non-existence of group activity in Chicago at this time, other than the two meetings set forth above. Chicago Panel Source [] has been furnishing copies of racial extremist

literature to the Chicago Office for some time. However, in view of the lack of organized racial extremist activity in Chicago, he has been in no position to make any personal contacts with extremists.

The pretext conversation on June 12, 1959, was conducted with Mr. and Mrs. GLEN JEWEL, Mecosta, Michigan, by SA KENNETH W. KAISER, accompanied by a plainclothes man from the Chicago Police Department. The pretext utilized was that of checking out the occupants of that apartment after receiving a complaint from an unidentified neighbor that strangers were occupying MULLINS' apartment. It is noted that the JEWELS stated that MULLINS, who was staying at a cottage owned by a nephew of the JEWELS, had given them permission to use his apartment while they were in Chicago to attend a wedding. By letter dated 7/17/59 the Detroit office was requested to search indices for any information concerning the JEWELS and their nephew, RUSSELL KIRK.

He has described himself as one who does the thinking for fellow anti-Semites and has also expressed his anti-Semitic and anti-Negro feelings in connection with anticipated racial tension in the South and in northern industrial areas.

DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

I. BACKGROUND

Residence

On August 6, 1959, Mrs. OLIVE HEATH, 2239 North Lincoln Avenue, Chicago, advised that EUSTACE MULLINS continued to reside in a second floor apartment at that address.

On June 12, 1959, it was determined through a suitable pretext that EUSTACE MULLINS was vacationing during the month of June, 1959, at a cottage near Mecosta, Michigan.

On June 30, 1959, Mrs. OLIVE HEATH advised that MULLINS returned to his apartment at 2239 North Lincoln Avenue on June 29, 1959, after having been away from that apartment since approximately May 31, 1959.

Employment

On August 6, 1959, Mrs. OLIVE HEATH advised that MULLINS was obviously unemployed as he remained at his apartment constantly during the daylight and evening hours. Mrs. HEATH stated that MULLINS was away from his apartment only for short periods of time when he apparently left to do his shopping.

EUSTACE MULLINS, as of July, 1959, has been unemployed for nearly a year. He has had no money coming in since his unemployment compensation ran out around June 1, 1959, and as of July, 1959, was considering obtaining a job of some type as he had no other way of obtaining funds. MULLINS does considerable writing but receives no money for it. In MULLINS' opinion his writing is years ahead and readers at the present time are not ready for that writing.

EUSTACE CLARENCE MULLINS, as of May, 1959, had received Illinois State Unemployment compensation checks for approximately ten months. All unemployment compensation benefits were exhausted as of May 28, 1959.

EUSTACE C. MULLINS, 2239 North Lincoln Avenue, received Illinois State Unemployment compensation benefits during the period August, 1958, through May, 1959.

Criminal Record

Records of the Bureau of Records and Communications, Chicago Police Department, reviewed on June 4, 1959, at the request of Investigative Clerk RAYMOND E. LYTLE, reflected that no arrest record was contained in the files of that bureau concerning EUSTACE CLARENCE MULLINS, JR.

Health

GEORGE LINCOLN ROCKWELL, Washington, D. C., advised SAs CLARENCE W. SLAUGHTER and RICHARD B. LAVIN on May 13, 1959, that it was generally well known that EUSTACE MULLINS was a homosexual.

II. ACTIVITIES

"Women's Voice"

"Women's Voice" is the official publication of "We, the Mothers, Mobilize for America, Inc." That organization was originated in 1941 and maintains headquarters at 537 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois. The editor of "Women's Voice", Mrs. LYRL CLARK VAN HYNING,

is responsible for the policy and views set forth in that publication. Articles contained in "Women's Voice" are violently anti-EISENHOWER, anti-Semitic, anti-Masonic, anti-Catholic, and opposed to all foreign elements in the United States.

Pages 8 and 9 of the April-May, 1959 issue of "Women's Voice" contained an item captioned "The Jews and Rabbi Rabinovich", by EUSTACE MULLINS. Pertinent information contained in that item is set forth below.

"On January 12, 1952, Rabbi Emanuel Rabinovich made a speech to an assembly of Rabbis meeting in Budapest, Hungary. He outlined step by step the master plan which the Jews would follow in the next few years to totally wipe out for all time the political and military power of those Gentiles whom they had not yet enslaved.

"...The phony anti-Semitic campaign in Russia, which is really a struggle between Zionist Jews and Communist Jews was accurately described in this speech before it happened.

"...When I sent copies of the Rabbi's speech to the leading Nationalists, nothing happened. They were struck dumb by the implications of this speech, by the open and arrogant boastfulness of the Jews, as they described how they would destroy the white race.

"...It was the Rabbi's speech which alerted Nasser to the dangers which the Jews represented to the Egyptian people. He kicked out the fat King Farouk, a Jewish stooge, and set up a patriotic government in Egypt.

"...Every year since 1952, approximately one million copies of this document have been distributed all over the world, alerting the Gentiles to the Jewish plan of ritual slaughter. Since the Jews originally planned to herd the Gentiles out to the kosher slaughter pits five years after Rabinovich made this speech, it seems logical to suppose that the circulation of this document prevented the plan from being carried out. ...and widespread circulation of the Rabbi's speech in this country has alerted so many Americans to the true horror of the Jewish conspiracy.

"This single document given to the world has postponed the Jewish slaughter of the Gentiles and may eventually defeat them altogether. Sentiment against the Jewish murderers is growing rapidly.

"Thus, we mark seven years during which the Rabbi's speech has alerted millions of people all over the world to the true nature of the Jewish menace."

A reprint from "Women's Voice" issue of February-March, 1959, captioned "F.C.F. Weiss, Prophet", by EUSTACE MULLINS, stated in substance that only one prophet in the United States, a German named FREDERICK C. F. WEISS in 1945, correctly predicted that with the assistance of thousands of German scientists and technicians signed over to the Russians by DWIGHT EISENHOWER, Russia would gain the lead on the United States in atomic weapons, intercontinental missiles and rockets within seven years. According to that article, WEISS correctly predicted the current impasse between a Soviet Union armed with atomic weapons and a United States armed with atomic weapons.

FREDERICK C. F. WEISS advised that EUSTACE CLARENCE MULLINS had written to him several months ago and asked his permission to write an article concerning WEISS, which was to appear in a Chicago publication called "Women's Voice". WEISS stated that MULLINS did some editorial work for this publication.

WEISS wrote to MULLINS and gave permission for the article to be written.

WEISS pointed out that he had not been in contact with MULLINS for probably several years before receiving the letter which requested permission for the article to be written.

Shortly after the letter from MULLINS was received requesting permission for the article, WEISS received another letter in which MULLINS stated that he was planning to visit New York City, and would be in touch with WEISS.

WEISS's wife telephoned him from their farm at Mt. Hope, Middleton, New York, and reached him at 156 Grand Street, White Plains, New York, where he operates a rooming house. This telephone call was on a Friday evening, several weeks ago and the purpose of the call was for Mrs. WEISS to advise that MULLINS was at the farm and wanted to stay overnight. He was accompanied by a boy about 18 years of age.

WEISS immediately left White Plains and drove to his farm at Middleton, New York. He spent the weekend with MULLINS at the farm. On Sunday evening, they came to White Plains and MULLINS, with his young travelling companion, stayed with WEISS at 156 Grand Street, White Plains, New York, until Tuesday.

MULLINS left on Tuesday, driving his personally owned automobile.

At the time he left, he stated that he was going to return to Chicago, Illinois, and planned to stop to see a man named POLZIN at Parkersburg, Pennsylvania.

WEISS exhibited a letter which he said he had received from MULLINS shortly after this visit.

He pointed out that the letter was dated May 16, 1959, and that the envelope was postmarked May 16, 1959, at Chicago, Illinois. WEISS stated that the address on the letter was 2B, 2239 Lincoln Avenue, Chicago, Illinois.

WEISS advised that MULLINS had discussed with him the operation of a publication named "Truth Seeker", which is published by CHARLES SMITH at 63 or 65 Park Row, New York, New York. SMITH is an elderly man and has been seeking someone to take over the publication. MULLINS indicated an interest in the publication and told WEISS that he had gone to New York to talk to SMITH about the publication.

MULLINS advised WEISS that SMITH did not seem to be in favor of turning the publication over to him, MULLINS.

While MULLINS was visiting WEISS, they discussed rugs. MULLINS indicated that he could buy some good rugs at various second hand stores in Chicago, and could get WEISS some very fine bargains. He further advised WEISS that he had two very fine specimens that he would sell at a reasonable price.

WEISS agreed to take these rugs and paid MULLINS \$15.10 on deposit for the two rugs. After MULLINS returned to Chicago, he mailed these rugs to WEISS.

WEISS stated that they were very ordinary rugs and not worth the price that MULLINS was asking.

WEISS sent a Special Delivery letter to MULLINS about Saturday, May 30, 1959, and advised MULLINS that the rugs were not as valuable as represented, and that he wanted MULLINS to send no more rugs and that he would not send additional money for the rugs already sent by MULLINS.

WEISS was very surprised that he had not heard from MULLINS in reply to this letter.

NY 100-112532

WEISS stated that subsequent to this recent visit of MULLINS, a letter was received from POLZIN, in Parkersburg, Pennsylvania.

POLZIN said that MULLINS had visited him, accompanied by the young man, and that he, POLZIN, was very much embarrassed by the visit. He told WEISS, in the letter, that he hoped MULLINS would detour around Parkersburg, if he made any future trips to that part of the country.

MULLINS, as of July, 1959, continued to do some writing for "Women's Voice".

On June 8, 1959, LIVIO J. PETRICA, Building Engineer, 537 South Dearborn Street, advised after viewing a photograph of MULLINS, that MULLINS visited the office of "Women's Voice" in that building approximately once each week.

Miscellaneous Statements by MULLINS

The following information, except where otherwise noted, was furnished by CG T-1 on May 27, 1959.

EUSTACE MULLINS claims that he does the thinking for fellow anti-Semites. He also claims to be closely associated with Klan leaders in the southern states where the younger element has been taking over, inasmuch as, according to MULLINS, some of the older Klan people have been intimidated by the police. MULLINS has stated that he anticipates greater racial tensions between Negro and white with violence in northern industrial centers, such as Chicago, as well as in the South. MULLINS has also said that the younger element in the Klan are not too well in touch with each other in the South as there are no publications which can keep them informed on the national scene. MULLINS has stated that he has been doing some work in that regard for "Right" magazine and that MATT KOEHL and FIELDS are getting "The Thunderbolt" in better shape. FIELDS, according to MULLINS, has a couple hundred of the "younger crowd" who swear by him and when the time comes for action, they will be in the middle of it with FIELDS.

The Ku Klux Klan has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The membership application forms for the National States' Rights Party (NSRP) reflected as of August, 1958, that MATTHIAS KOEHL was National Organizer for the NSRP. USA

The NSRP is composed of former Ku Klux Klan members, persons with strong states' rights feelings and in general, persons with strong hatred for Jews and Negroes. The official head of the NSRP is EDWARD R. FIELDS.

NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY

(CG T-5, 9/4/58)

The masthead of "The Thunderbolt" states that it is the official racial nationalist organ of the NSRP. MULLINS has stated that many of the young southern generation who have had military experience and who are handy mechanics can and will play rough. One individual in that regard can, if needed, turn out any type of explosives according to MULLINS.

MULLINS has stated that the Jews instigated the arrests of individuals involved in the Atlanta case and that the mayor and the police of Atlanta who fell for their line jailed "the boys" on the chance that they might obtain evidence against them.

On October 12, 1958, a Jewish synagogue in Atlanta, Georgia, was bombed.

MULLINS has said that the shifting of blame for "Nigger uppitness" on the Jews was a smart move. In that regard, he stated that the job has been an easy one in that prominent Jews have been identified with various Negro defense organizations.

The people in the South, according to MULLINS, never thought too much about Jews one way or another until after the church bombings, at which time they suddenly realized that the Jews were different. There will be many more riots and the young southern whites will be leading them, according to MULLINS.

MULLINS has also said that the young southern whites have much less race prejudice than their elders but that they are not afraid of violence. They do not propose to be pushed around by "Niggers", according to MULLINS, and now they talk about Jews as enemies too. MULLINS has said that next year or the year after, when depression hits the country and the young southern whites find their jobs gone, they will get violent and the blame will then be focused on the "Niggers" and the Jews.

MULLINS has remarked that he anticipates racial troubles will start in Chicago, where there is a tremendous Negro housing problem, sometime within the next year. He stated that Negro housing in Chicago is expanding into neighborhoods, whereupon residents then pick up and move. Polish families, according to MULLINS, refuse to budge and therefore, it would be a simple matter to work them into a fighting mood.

MULLINS has stated that in discussions between him and MAX NELSON, they had considered how such a situation might be provoked. They also, according to MULLINS, discussed the possibility of getting riots started last year, but decided that business conditions had been too good for such a venture. MULLINS also said that NELSON and himself had decided that it would be better to wait for a depression, inasmuch as when a reversal in economic conditions does come, things in Chicago will become violent. He also has stated that the South would also be affected in that regard, at which time it could be determined what the young Klan boys who are presently playing it safe, should then do.

MAYNARD NELSON, also known as Max Nelson, in approximately November, 1954, formed the Realpolitical Institute in Chicago, Illinois, which had for its purpose the creating of a new political party. The organization was anti-Communist, anti-Semitic and favored the white race.

Arthur Martin stated he is a printer employed by Admiral Printing Company, Varick Street, New York City.

The source further stated that two unidentified Malaysians appeared at the office of The Truth Seeker on June 22, 1963, stated they were on a world tour and left after purchasing \$160.00 worth of literature from Charles Smith, mentioned above.

The source stated that Madole did not have much to say except that the NRP may hold an indoor rally in New York City, within the next two weeks. However, Madole stated that the NRP has not as yet leased any hall for this meeting. Madole stated that the NRP has has no activity within recent weeks.

The source advised that William Hoff, self-identified as NSRP representative in New York State, mentioned that his brother, ~~Sheldon Hoff~~ is presently in the United States Army at Fort Dix, ~~New Jersey~~, and Sheldon Hoff and others in the United States Army at Fort Dix; not further identified, are trying to get a race riot started at Fort Dix.

Miss Dorothy Berrien, G-2, First Army, New York City, was advised of the above information relative to Sheldon Hoff.

According to the source, [redacted] of the Nationalist Party (NP), [redacted] mentioned that the NP which has been inactive for the past several months, is expected to reactivate and adopt an open policy of being anti-Negro.

The "Racist Forum" is a meeting held by the "Truthseeker" which is an atheist organization run by CHARLES SMITH, according to New York T-1.

New York T-1 on January 7, 1959, advised that JAMES MADOLE had received a letter from LINCOLN ROCKWELL of Arlington, Virginia, who is associated with the National States Right Party (NSRP). This letter dated December 20, 1958, indicated that ROCKWELL was planning on holding a meeting sometime after Christmas and requested MADOLE to attend. ROCKWELL also indicated in this letter a desire for MADOLE to work with ROCKWELL's group against the Jews. MADOLE indicated that he had advised ROCKWELL that he did not desire to attend the meeting but would gladly distribute any literature that ROCKWELL furnished to him.

New York T-1 further stated that MADOLE had had indicated that he would not attend the meeting of the "Truthseeker" organization to be held at Steinway Hall on January 9, 1959. However, he gave no particular reason for not wanting to attend this meeting except that in the past he has stated that he did not get along with CHARLES SMITH, the leader of the "Truthseeker" Group.

It is noted that he did attend this meeting as is set out above.

B. Literature

As is set out above, New York T-1 on January 13, 1959, advised that JAMES MADOLE, while attending the meeting of the "Truthseeker" on January 9, 1959, had passed out anti-Negro literature.

A series of five articles appeared in the "New York Daily News" from 1/20-24/59 written by David Burk entitled "Peddling Hate in America: Egypt's Nasser." In these articles Burk accuses the Arabs (particularly President Nasser of the United Arab Republic) for fomenting much of anti-Jewish acts perpetrated by hate groups in United States by alleging anti-Jewish literature prepared by the Arabs has been given to Americans active in racist and hate campaigns for distribution. The articles further point out that some of these racists have been in contact with Arab officials and establishments in this country and some of their publications have contained pro-Nasser propaganda, the implication being that such propaganda was furnished by the Arabs. One Photostat each of these articles is enclosed for the use of each recipient office.

These articles specifically name certain persons as being leaders of a hate corps acting in behalf of President Nasser of the United Arab Republic in spreading anti-Jewish literature in this country through their publications or their activities. The names of these individuals together with the identities of the offices of origin of investigation concerning them or their publications are:

DETAILS:

T-1 indicated on October 9, 1957, that a meeting of the National Renaissance Party (NRP) had been held at the home of JAMES MADOLE, 10 West 90th Street, New York City, on October 3, 1957. MADOLE indicated that he is continuing to be active with regard to the segregation issue in the South.

MADOLE further stated he is preparing a new National Renaissance Bulletin which will be ready for mailing in a few days.

T-1 said MADOLE had originally planned to devote this issue on an attack upon the American Legion but was apparently moved to making this issue to deal with segregation. T-1 said he was not able to learn whether the decision to change to writing on segregation was MADOLE's decision alone or whether he had been influenced. However, MADOLE appears to be taking advantage of the great notoriety on segregation caused by the Little Rock incident and he hopes to obtain new subscriptions to his bulletin and contributions by exploiting this present publicity.

T-1 indicated on October 24, 1957, that subject had been in bed with asthma and the flu for several days. He said that ~~GRACE~~ MADOLE, the subject's mother, indicated she was arranging for an ambulance to take the subject to the hospital, because it is usually necessary to place him in an oxygen tent when these asthma attacks occur as they have in the past. *N.Y.*

T-1 indicated on October 25, 1957, that the subject was taken from his home by ambulance to St. Luke's Hospital, 113th Street and Amsterdam Avenue, at 10:30 PM on October 24, 1957, and is presently in Room 119. T-1 indicated on October 30, 1957, that the subject was brought home from the hospital on this date and apparently

is recovered from his illness which was a combination of flu and asthma.

T-1 indicated on December 9, 1957, that the subject is again ill at home with an asthma attack and has not worked for several days.

T-1 indicated on October 18, 1957, that the subject attended a meeting on October 13, 1957, at the headquarters of "Common Sense" in Union, New Jersey. He stated this meeting was presided over by CONDE MC GINLEY, Editor of "Common Sense" and was attended by about 75 persons. He said that MADOLE was not called upon as a speaker and he was quite disappointed because he was overlooked. N.Y.

T-1 further stated that the subject had received a letter from Father FEENEY of Boston in which FEENEY ordered MADOLE to refrain from mentioning him or from quoting from his monthly periodical, "The Point". MADOLE stated that it is evident that his attacks on Christianity and his Catholic bating is the cause for FEENEY's letter.

The following investigation concerning ARCHIBALD S. COODY was conducted at Jackson, Mississippi:

On November 19, 1957, Mr. HENRY FLOWERS, former Special Agent of this Bureau and head of the Credit Bureau, 520 South President Street, Jackson, Mississippi, advised SA ROBERT F. COOPER, Jr. that there is no credit record for ARCHIBALD COODY, 776 Northwest Street, Jackson, Mississippi. However, the files contain the following record for ARCHIBALD S. He said he would devote a full Bulletin later to the Arabs and the title of the article in the current bulletin would be "The Catholic Church versus Racial Nationalism". T-1 added this article was written by MADOLE and was anti-Semitic and anti-Religion. He stated that MADOLE has been preaching the anti-Christianity of NIETZSCHE for a long time and it is more apparent now that he has come under the influence of CHARLES SMITH, Editor of "Truth Seeker," and religious fanatic in New York City, who is presently on an all out campaign against equality and spreading anti-Semitism.

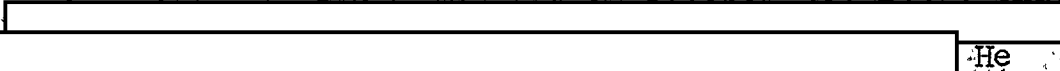

He said these meetings were usually attended by only a few persons. He added the Party apparently has very little organization at present and he does not know where the money comes from which MADOLE uses to operate the Party. He said, however, that in the past, FRED WEISS, a member of the NRP and others whom he does not recall, indicated to him that the Anti-Defamation League in New York City was furnishing money to MADOLE for operation of the NRP. He said he did not know how this money was given to MADOLE and does not know if any Agents of the ADL are members of the NRP. He said MADOLE appears to be in complete charge of the Party's activities and leads the discussions which are held at the meetings. He added that MADOLE attempts to induce persons to attend these meetings by offering them free beer at his apartment on Thursday evenings and from time to time has told those attending that [redacted] and other

EARL NEESE and ROBERT GOREY, Investigators, Central Intelligence Corps, indicated on November 14, 1957, that JAMES H. MADOLE had been interviewed by them at his apartment at 10 West 90th Street on November 6, 1957, and indicated the following. They stated that MADOLE had been listed by a GRANT HARRIS, 322 16th Avenue, Seattle, Washington, as a reference on an Army Questionnaire. MADOLE stated that he had never met HARRIS but that they corresponded when HARRIS joined the NRP in 1956. MADOLE stated that HARRIS at that time was residing in Davenport, Iowa and had been made Chairman of the Davenport, Iowa Chapter of the NRP by MADOLE. MADOLE stated he knew nothing about HARRIS except what he had read in HARRIS's letter to him. MADOLE also stated that the NRP stands for dictatorship and that this dictatorship is the solution to problems in the United States. However, he indicated the Party does not advocate the violent overthrow of the Government. He also advised that if the NRP were in power they would "kill all the Jews and ship the Negroes and Puerto Ricans back to the countries of their origin."

MADOLE declined to answer any questions concerning the present strength or membership of the NRP. MADOLE advised that he visited the Syrian Consulate, New York City, where he was given literature and that the Syrians buy his literature for distribution in Syria and Egypt because they, as he, are anti-Jewish and Nationalistic in nature.

APPENDIX

NATIONAL RENAISSANCE PARTY (NRP)

On April 29, 1957, a confidential source stated that the NRP is an anti-Semitic, anti-Negro, neo-Fascist organization with activities generally confined to the New York area. He indicated that JAMES MADOLE, founder and leader of the Party, is the only person who consistently performs Party functions. He stated the Party's main function is the printing and distribution of the "National Renaissance Bulletin" on a monthly basis and other literature from time to time, which is distributed throughout the United States and abroad where it is reprinted by similar organizations.

He stated that the NRP recently has distributed large quantities of Arab literature after stamping it with the name of the NRP and that finance for the Party's operation is partly obtained in this manner.

NY T-1 indicated on October 27, 1958, that JAMES H. MADOLE still operates the National Renaissance Party (NRP) as a one man venture and maintains no formal leadership organization.

Mr. DONALD PRENTICE, Apartment 6, 10 West 90th Street, advised SA MAURICE P. LEEN on October 30, 1958, that JAMES MADOLE resides in Apartment 8, 10 West 90th Street. PRENTICE stated that MADOLE resides in this apartment with his mother and appears to have no regular employment but spends all of his time with the activities of the NRP which he handles out of his apartment.

NY T-2 indicated on October 29, 1958, that [REDACTED]

Information obtained from NY T-2 above is not to be made public except on issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

On October 22, 1958, JAMES MADOLE was interviewed under a suitable pretext by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) at which time MADOLE furnished copies of the literature that he has passed out throughout the country in his role as leader of the NRP. Included in this literature were the following:

1. A pamphlet entitled, "Massacre of Arabs in Israel," by TOUFIQ TOUBI. TOUFIQ TOUBI is identified on the pamphlet as a member of the Israeli Parliament. The pamphlet concerns itself with a "massacre perpetrated at the Arab village of Kafr-Quassem inside Israel on October 29, 1956, the day Israel launched its military attack on Egypt. The front of the pamphlet bears the stamp of the NRP.

2. A throwaway leaflet which is a biography of President GAMAL ABDEL NASSER of the United Arab Republic.

3. "Israel and the Arab States" by SYBIL EYRE CROW, published by the Iraqi Embassy, 21 Queens Gate, London S.W. 7. This pamphlet deals with the problems of settling more than a million Arab refugees. It bears the stamp of the NRP on its front.

4. An advertising throwaway captioned, "Arab Nations Support Egypt's Arms Deal." On the back this throwaway has the stamp of the NRP.

5. A booklet entitled, "Threats and Intimidations" compiled by the Egyptian Information Department, 22 Solomon Street, Cairo, Egypt. This booklet bears the stamp of the NRP on the front and deals with the intervention of the British and French Governments in Egypt, and an interpretation of Article 33 of the Charter of the United Nations (UN) with respect to that intervention in the Suez Canal area.

6. A pamphlet entitled, "The Policy That Invited Soviet Russia to the Middle East" by IZZAT TANNOUS, MD. This booklet is originated by the Palestine Arab Refugee Office, 801 Second Avenue, Room 801, New York 17, New York. It also bears the stamp of the NRP. The bottom of this booklet states that the material has been filed with the Department of Justice where the required statement of the "Palestine Arab Refugee Office," registration number 897, is available for inspection. This booklet makes the point that "the Palestine tragedy which has made one million Palestinian Arabs homeless and destitute is at the root of the grave tension that prevails today in the Middle East."

The booklet also points out that the foreign policy of the United States in the Middle East had alienated the Arab people and compelled them to turn their faces to other directions. The concluding paragraph of this booklet states,

"It is a fact that the failure of the United States to take the lead in the implementation of United Nations resolutions -- resolutions which were of the making of the United States and which only gave the Arab refugees a fraction of their rights -- has driven a large number of the Arab people to look East for their salvation. The Soviets seized the opportunity and the tug of war is now in progress between East and West."

MADOLE, when interviewed under pretext, explained that he is distributing pro-Arab literature since he agrees with the Arab position in the Middle East. He stated that he and his organization are anti-Jewish and they feel they should distribute pro-Arab literature since both he and the Arabs are working in the same direction. He also made the statement that he was distributing literature from the Iraqi Government.

The records of the Bureau of Special Services of the New York City Police Department were checked on October 22, 1958, by SA MAURICE P. LEEN. They indicated a meeting was held at Steinway Hall, 113 West 57th Street, New York City, sponsored by CHARLES SMITH, publisher of the magazine "The Truth Seeker." This was in general a meeting of racists and most of the speakers were highly critical of the Jewish peoples. JAMES MADOLE spoke at this meeting as a representative of the NRP. His speech was entirely devoted to anti-Jewish statements. Plans were made for another general meeting at which MADOLE would be the principal speaker. This meeting was to be held on November 14, 1958, also in Steinway Hall.

T-1 indicated on November 15, 1958, that the subject was the main speaker at a meeting on November 14, 1958, at Steinway Hall, 113 West 57th Street, sponsored by an atheistic publication called "The Truth Seeker." He indicated that MADOLE spoke for about two hours on the general topic of anti-semitism and described President EISENHOWER as a tool of the Jews in the United States. MADOLE insinuated that the bombing of the Jewish synagogue in Atlanta, Georgia, was a plot by the Jews to raise money and to curry political support. MADOLE claimed that the present form of government

in the United States should be replaced by a "corporate form of government" and that this step was really inevitable.

NY T-3 advised on November 20, 1958, that the subject spoke at a meeting held at Steinway Hall on November 14, 1958, in which he mentioned that he had been at a meeting which was attended by three Arabs. NY T-3 stated MADOLE did not indicate where or when this meeting took place but that he, MADOLE, had had a conversation with the Arabs concerning the Jewish question.

NY T-1 indicated on December 15, 1958, that the subject stated that he has no new Arab literature but expects to have some in the next few days. MADOLE indicated that an Iraqi official in New York City had requested him to furnish the August, 1958, National Renaissance Bulletin to the Iraqi Government who desired to reprint it and distribute it in Iraq. NY T-1 indicated that this bulletin pertained to Zionist imperialism in Western Germany and had been written by the subject.

On April 21, 1958, a confidential source stated that the National Renaissance Party is an anti-semitic, anti-Negro, neo-Fascist organization with activities generally confined to the New York City area. The party's main function is distribution of the National Renaissance Bulletin on a monthly basis and distribution of pro-Arab literature obtained from official Arab establishments in New York City.

N.Y. T-1 advised on September 17, 1958, that JAMES MADOLE, leader of the National Renaissance Party (NRP), recently indicated he intends holding a meeting of the party on October 17, 1958, at Steinway Hall, on West 57th Street, New York City. This source indicated that originally MADOLE indicated that he would not hold any public meetings of the party this year, but instead would appear as a speaker at meetings to be held by CHARLES SMITH, leader of "The Truth Seeker". MADOLE indicates now, however, that SMITH will hold a meeting at Steinway Hall on October 10, 1958, at which he, MADOLE, will be a speaker. MADOLE indicates that SMITH's meeting will be devoted to racialism and equality rather than atheism which his previous meetings were concerned with.

This source indicated that MADOLE continues to have large quantities of Arab literature at his apartment, and he states that he is very busy, and needs nearly all of his time to work for the Arabs. This source indicated that it does not appear that MADOLE is in need of funds, and MADOLE has advised that he is not going to devote his next National Renaissance Bulletin to segregation because the Arabs want him to do an article on West Germany and the Zionists. MADOLE stated that he has to get this article out in a hurry and it will be entitled "Germany - The Slave of Zionist Imperialism".

N.Y. MADOLE also indicated that this source that his NRP bulletin dealing with J. EDGAR HOOVER is entirely sold out and he is asking CONDE MC GENLEY, publisher of "Common Sense", to run off another five hundred copies of this bulletin so that he can fill requests. T-1 further stated MADOLE recently had obtained the following literature, which he stamped with the NRP stamp, and is distributing through NRP channels, as he does all Arab literature which he receives. MADOLE did not indicate where he received this literature or for what purpose he is distributing it, but it is the first instance that MADOLE has handled any

Chinese literature. The following are the titles of this literature:

"Communism At Work In China" by STANLEY K. HORNBECK, a twelve-page booklet issued by American and Asian Educational Exchange, Incorporated, 17 Park Avenue, New York.

"Communist China" by GRAG O'DWYER, Published by the Committee of One Million (against the admission of Communist China to the United Nations).

"Communist China In Asian Affairs" by C.M. CHANG, issued by the Institute of Ethnic Studies, Georgetown University, Washington, D.C.

"The Republic of China", issued by Chinese News Service, 1270 Sixth Avenue, New York, dated January, 1958.

This source indicated that all of these publications are anti-Red China and MADOLE probably picked them up during his visits to some official establishment in New York City.

T-1 indicated on October 2, 1958, that MADOLE indicated his topic for the meeting at Steinway Hall on October 10, 1958, would be "Jews In Modern Times". T-1 further indicated that MADOLE is presently distributing the August, 1958, NRP bulletin, which consists of the articles entitled "Western Germany, A Slave - Colony of Zionist Imperialism" by JAMES H. MADOLE. This source added that this bulletin is anti-Semitic and deals with German reparations to the state of Israel and the reasons why the Jewish race has been driven from nearly every country of the civilized world. T-1 stated that MADOLE also had CONDE MC GINLEY print a one-page leaflet entitled "Is Anti-Jewish Feeling Justified By World History?" He

stated that the leaflet is anti-Semitic and requests readers to subscribe to the NRP bulletin for facts on the Jewish question.

T-1 indicated on October 20, 1958, that MADOLE was called upon to speak at the "Truth Seeker" meeting at Steinway Hall, on October 10, 1958. He said that MADOLE made his usual speech concerning the Jews and how they are behind Communism. CHARLES SMITH, leader of the meeting, announced that MADOLE would be the principal speaker at the meeting of this group to be held on November 14, 1958. T-1 indicated that MADOLE stated he is now working on his next bulletin which had been delayed because of his prior commitment to the Egyptians. He said that MADOLE evidently had to write something for them and had no time until now for his own bulletin.

T-1 indicated on October 27, 1958, that MADOLE continues to operate the NRP from his apartment at 10 West 90th Street, New York City. He stated that MADOLE continues to distribute large quantities of Arab literature, but there is no indication that MADOLE is being paid by the Arabs or whether or not his activities are being directed by the Arabs.

T-2 indicated on October 23, 1958, that as far as he knows, JAMES MADOLE has not visited the United Arab Republic Delegation to the United Nations, 900 Park Avenue, New York City, in several months. (S) (U)

LEON ZOLBROD, Superintendent at 10 West 90th Street, indicated on September 23, 1958, that MADOLE holds frequent meetings at his apartment and has a great many people visiting him. He stated, however, he knows nothing of MADOLE's activities and was unable to furnish any further information concerning him.

DETAILS:

T-1 indicated on March 31, 1958, that the National Renaissance Party (NRP) continues to maintain headquarters at 10 West 90th Street, New York City in the apartment of JAMES MADOLE, its national leader. He stated that MADOLE holds informal gatherings weekly at this apartment which are attended by handfuls of NRP supporters. He stated that at present, MADOLE is un-employed but claims to have sufficient funds to continue operation of the NRP. MADOLE has stated according to T-1 that he plans no further public meetings of the NRP, but is content to have his followers attend meetings of such groups as the "Truth Seeker" which MADOLE speaks at. T-1 added that the "Truth Seeker" is an atheist group headed by one CHARLES SMITH, which has been active for many years in New York City and which publishes a monthly pamphlet entitled "Truth Seeker" - oldest freethought paper in the world, founded 1873.

T-1 indicated on March 10, 1958, that JAMES MADOLE stated that he had been laid off from his job because of business conditions and there had been nothing personal in his discharge as others in the company had also been laid off. MADOLE indicated that he is not seeking another job and has not signed for un-employment benefits, stating that he doesn't need it. MADOLE added that he would have enough money to continue putting out the NRP Bulletin and will be able to manage funds for the NRP without working.

T-1 indicated on March 10, 1958, that MADOLE indicated that he would attend a "National Review Forum" to be held at Hunter College on March 20, 1958. MADOLE indicated that he and some of his boys would be out on the sidewalk prior to the meeting passing out NRP literature. It is noted that the "National Review" 211 East 37th Street, New York City, states that it is the "weekly magazine of conservative opinion". MADOLE also indicated he would attend a "Truth Seeker" meeting on March 14, 1958, and take members of the NRP to this meeting.

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed JAMES MADOLE, JOSEPH RUDDEN and an unidentified person named JOHN in attendance at the National Review Forum in Hunter College on March 20, 1958. These three individuals were observed on the sidewalk outside Hunter College distributing literature to persons as they departed from this meeting. The literature distributed was in the form of various National Renaissance Bulletins and Arab literature stamped with the name of the NRP.

T-1 stated on March 21, 1958, that a meeting was held in Pythian Hall on March 14, 1958, by the "Truth Seeker" group, also known as the Ingersoll Forum. He stated that the subject attended with a large group of his followers and that MADOLE spoke at this meeting and distributed many copies of Arab literature, which had been stamped with the name of the NRP.

T-1 indicated on March 8, 1958, that MADOLE had indicated the new bulletin would be ready for mimeographing about March 5, 1958 and the title would be "Anti-Semitism Justified by History". MADOLE stated the main theme of the article, which stated the causes of anti-Semitism in the near East, had been written by the Arabs. MADOLE explained that the Arabs he had reference to were "the Egyptians and everything clears through them".

T-1 indicated on March 11, 1958, that the February, 1958 NR Bulletin had been mimeographed in the office of "Common Sense" and contained one article entitled "Is Anti-Semitism Justified by History?" by JAMES H. MADOLE.

T-1 indicated on March 14, 1958, that MADOLE had stated he and eight others of the NRP had attended a meeting at the headquarters of the Arab Student League, 2875 Broadway on March 2, 1958. MADOLE indicated there were about fifty persons present, 25 of whom were students and the remainder presumably American friends. He stated that it was primarily a social gathering but that he was asked to deliver a talk and complied by speaking for about a half an hour and answering questions. MADOLE indicated that he gave his usual NRP speech against the Jews. T-1 added that MADOLE also collected a great deal of literature at these headquarters which he stamped with the NRP name and which he will distribute through NRP channels.

T-1 indicated on April 2, 1958, that in the past, MADOLE has received money from FREDRICK WEISS for support of the NRP, however, at present WEISS and MADOLE are not friendly. He stated that it has long been rumored by persons working with MADOLE in the NRP that FREDRICK WEISS is an agent for the Anti-Defamation League through his friendship with SANFORD GRIFFITH, a known agent of the Anti-Defamation League. It is noted that the Anti-Defamation League is the investigative agency of B'nai B'rith, a national Jewish organization.

T-1 added that it does not appear at present that MADOLE is receiving financial support from anyone including many Arab officials. T-1 further stated that MADOLE does not need anyone's financial support to continue operation of the NRP, inasmuch as his personal financial needs are taken care of by his mother with whom he resides and the small amount required for publication of the NR Bulletin is obtained by sales of literature and small contributions. He stated that in recent months, the NRP has held no public meetings and made no wholesale literature distribution by mail and, therefore, its expenses have been nominal.

Mr. GEORGE BAILEY, 1541 First Avenue, New York City, indicated on February 19, 1958, that he recently became interested in the NRP and as a result, had invited JAMES MADOLE and other members of the NRP to his home. He stated that it is his opinion that the NRP is a rather small ineffectual organization with MADOLE in complete charge. He stated that it appears at the present time that MADOLE is making a great effort to publicize the Arab point of view in its struggle against Israel. He added that MADOLE apparently regularly visits official Arab establishments in New York City, where he obtains much Arab literature. BAILEY indicated that he was not able to ascertain if MADOLE was being paid for this work or what he expected to get out of this. 1.5

T-2 indicated on March 13, 1958, that he was not acquainted with JAMES MADOLE and he had never heard that MADOLE was being supplied with funds by any Arab establishment in the United States particularly the Egyptian establishments. 1.4

T-3 indicated on April 1, 1958, that he was not acquainted with anyone by the name of JAMES MADOLE, however, he identified a photograph of MADOLE as a person who regularly visited the United Arab Republic Consulate at 900 Park Avenue, New York City. T-3 was unable to advise whom this individual visited or what his business was at the Consulate. 1.3

He stated that the NRP recently has distributed large quantities of Arab literature after stamping it with the name of the NRP and that finance for the Party's operation is partly obtained in this manner.

Series of five articles appeared in "New York Daily News" 1/20-24/59, written by DAVID BURK and entitled, "Peddling Hate in America: Egypt's NASSER." BURK accuses Arabs for fomenting much of anti-Jewish acts perpetrated by hate groups in the United States by alleging anti-Jewish literature prepared by the Arabs has been given to Americans active in racist and hate campaigns for distribution. ARTICLES IN "NEW YORK"
DAILY NEWS

Egypt *Brooklyn, N.Y.* *David Burkovitz*
A series of five articles appeared in the "New York Daily News" from January 20 to 24, 1959, written by DAVID BURK and entitled, "Peddling Hate in America: Egypt's Nasser." In these articles BURK accuses the Arabs for fomenting much of the anti-Jewish acts perpetrated by hate groups in the United States by alleging anti-Jewish literature prepared by the Arabs has been given to Americans active in racist and hate campaigns for distribution.

The articles further point out that some of these racists have been in contact with Arab officials and establishments in this country and some of their publications have contained pro-NASSER propaganda, the implication being that such propaganda was furnished by the Arabs.

These articles specifically name certain persons as being leaders of a hate corps acting on behalf of President NASSER of the United Arab Republic in spreading anti-Jewish literature in this country through their publications or their activities. On 4/13/56, NY T-2 advised that TRUTH SEEKER COMPANY, INCORPORATED, Room 2019, 38 Park Row, New York City, was chartered October 1, 1940, in the State of New York. The officers were listed as follows:

CHARLES SMITH, President and a Director of the concern.

MARTHA BIGINELLI, Secretary - Treasurer and a Director.

TRUTH SEEKER COMPANY is the publisher of a monthly "free thinkers" magazine entitled "Truth Seeker" with a average monthly circulation of 2,000 copies. This concern also publishes books and acts as book sellers. The present management obtained control in 1936, assuming assets and liabilities of TRUTH SEEKER COMPANY, INCORPORATED, which corporation was chartered in New York State August 11, 1883. It is a nonprofit organization with income derived from donations and mail order sales of publications. This source further advised that CHARLES SMITH was 67 years of age as of January 25, 1956, and was single and native born. He had been employed by the corporation for a number of years prior to 1936 at which time he was elected president.

MARTHA BIGINELLI was indicated as being 68 years of age, as of January 25, 1956, single. native born and a long time employee of the concern.

[NY T-13 advised on July 21, 1958,] (X) that, if legally possible, picketing would take place on Sunday, July 27, 1958, in front of the Israeli Embassy, Washington, D.C.; the United Nations (UN) building in New York City, and possibly at various churches and synagogues. This picketing was intended to be the start of a revolution to rid the world of Jews. This source subsequently stated on July 27, 1958, that 8 persons picketed the White House at Washington, D.C., on that date from 12:45 p.m. to 2:12 p.m. According to this source, among those picketing was CHARLES SMITH, an elderly man, who publishes the "Truth Seeker", 38 Park Row, New York, New York.

[NY T-14 advised on September 3, 1958,] (X) that CHARLES SMITH, 38 Park Row, New York City, was in attendance at the National States Rights Party (NSRP) Convention held in Louisville, Kentucky, on August 30, 1958.

[NY T-1 advised on November 3, 1958,] (X) that the NSRP was founded in 1958 and is composed of former members of the Ku Klux Klan and notorious anti-Semites.

This source also stated that at a convention in Louisville, Kentucky, on August 30, 1958, the NSRP indicated it was a political party dedicated to segregation.

The Ku Klux Klan has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Sex and Stars', 'An Open Letter to Jesus Christ', 'Sex in
Religion', 'Short History of Sex Worship' and many others.

"Smith's monthly Truth Seeker, 'Oldest Freethought
Paper in the World - a Journal for Reasoners and Racists',
splashes its pages with groups of items like this:
'White racists do not hate the colored man. It is the bad
seed within him which they desire to eliminate. The race
leveler is the hate preacher'."

he had no further information at this time concerning
CHARLES SMITH or "Truth Seeker".
