FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia.website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. (U//LES)) Bitcoin's creation and transfer is based on an open source cryptographic protocol and is not managed by any central organization. Since it is an open-source project, there may be vulnerabilities in the code that hackers can exploit.

How it Works

(U//LES)) To use Bitcoin a new user needs to choose a wallet such as Bitcoin-QT app for Windows, MAC, and Linux or Bitcoin Wallet for Android phones or tablets that will install on a computer or smart phone.

Law Enforcement Pensitive: For Officiar Use ONLY (Probab)

(U//LES)) A Bitcoin wallet allows users to do transactions including sending and receiving coins to other users. Users can even receive Bitcoins when they are offline and all wallets are compatible with each other. There are software wallets, mobile wallets and web wallets. Software wallets are installed on your computer, mobile wallets allows users to pay in a physical store (see Figure 1) by scanning a Quick Response (QR) code or using **Near Field Communication (NFC)** "tap to pay" system, and a web wallet which allows users to use Bitcoin anywhere with less effort to protect your wallet. Once your wallet is installed, the system will generate your first Bitcoin address; additional addresses can be created if needed. You can reveal any of vour Bitcoin addresses to friends so they can pay you or if you want to pay your friends; however, you must have a user's Bitcoin address to process transactions.

(U///LESI)) Bitcoins are not considered to be a currency backed by a sovereign government. Bitcoins have no fixed value; its trading behavior is similar to stocks or commodities with no underlying value. The price of a Bitcoin is unpredictable and can increase or decrease at any time, therefore it is considered to be very high risk. Bitcoin trades at different values based primarily on speculation, supply and demand. Bitcoins can double in value one week and then take a massive dip the following week. For example, on April 1, 2013, Bitcoins were valued at about \$102, it rose to \$265 within 10 days and then it dropped suddenly to \$100. Several currency exchanges exist where you can trade Bitcoins for U.S. dollars, Euros, Yen, etc.





(U///LES)) Since Bitcoins can be combersome to exchange for hard corrency, they came up with an ATM solution. The Bitcoin ATM acts as a method of exchange between Bitcoin and local corrency. Bitcoin users can use the ATM for both deposits and withdrawals to and from their Bitcoin wallets. Users can access their Bitcoin wallets using a QR code or they can type their Bitcoin wallet address directly into the ATM. Users can then see their current balance and will be given the option to deposit or withdraw. The world's first Bitcoin ATM was unveiled in California on May 2, 2013.

Anonymity

(U//LES)) Bitcoin is not anonymous, but it still works to protect customers' privacy. All Bitcoin transactions are stored publicly and permanently on the network so everyone can see balances and transactions of any Bitcoin address. The identity of the owner cannot be connected to their Bitcoin address unless the owner reveals personal information during a transaction. However, Bitcoin shows all transactions between all users Bitcoin addresses. Therefore, Bitcoin recommends that owners use different Bitcoin addresses every time they receive money and also hide their computer's IP address so it cannot be logged.

Law Enforcement Impact


(U//LES)) Law enforcement is concerned about the use of Bitcoins to facilitate illegal activities online. The Silk Road is an online black market exchange for contraband goods, like illicit drugs, stolen credit cards, etc. and it operates using Bitcoin. Recently on October 1, 2013, the FBI was able to shut down the website because they captured alleged founder, Previously authorities were unsuccessful because the site was hosted as a hidden service on the <u>Tor network</u>.

(U//LES)) To use Bitcoin a new user needs to choose a wallet such as Bitcoin-QT app for Windows, MAC, and Linux or Bitcoin Wallet for Android phones or tablets that will install on a computer or smart phone.

(U//LES)) A Bitcoin wallet allows users to do transactions including sending and receiving coins to other users. Users can even receive Bitcoins when they are offline and all wallets are compatible with each other. There are software wallets, mobile wallets and web wallets. Software wallets are installed on your computer, mobile wallets allows users to pay in a physical store (see Figure 1) by scanning a Quick Response (QR) code or using **Near Field Communication (NFC)** "tap to pay" system, and a web wallet which allows users to use Bitcoin anywhere with less effort to protect your wallet. Once your wallet is installed, the system will generate your first Bitcoin address; additional addresses can be created if needed. You can reveal any of your Bitcoin addresses to friends so they can pay you or if you want to pay your friends; however, you must have a user's Bitcoin address to process transactions.








Without meddling banks in between transactions, Bitcoins trade seamlessly and offer nearly as much privacy as cash.

(U//LES)) That's why the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Government Affairs is hearing from various sides. According to prepared statements from the Justice Department, an official at the DOJ said it needs more help catching criminals who use the secretive currency. Meanwhile, Bitcoin users want the government to back off and let the system blossom.

(U//LES)) Law enforcement doesn't like the anonymity: There are legitimate uses for Bitcoins, but it's also being used to anonymously buy drugs, hire assassins, trade child porn and dodge taxes. The nation's acting assistant attorney general, Mythili Raman, described the more notorious ways bitcoins are being used. She mentioned the recent FBI shutdown of Silk Road, an online black market.

(U//JES)) Illicit drugs and services -- like hacking -- were sold there using the (mostly) untraceable currency. The agency arrested its alleged founder and seized 170,000 BTC, valued at \$101 million.

(U//LES)) The way Bitcoins are transacted -- using coded wallets and special keys that don't need real names -- enables substantial privacy. That makes it more difficult to follow the money and catch criminals. It would be easier to fight crime with appropriate antimoney laundering and know-your-customer controls.

(U//LES)) Along those lines, there are concerns that those making money from sex trafficking and pornography involving children have started to adopt Bitcoin.

(U//LES)) The International Centre for Missing and Exploited Children noted how anonymity offered by Bitcoin has made it the currency of choice for predators.


(U//LES)) The technologically complex Bitcoin system makes it hard for everyday agents to stay on targets' tails. They need more tech-savvy investigators.

(U//LES)) Treasury already issued guidance in March saying that groups exchanging Bitcoins must register with the government and keep records. Everyday Bitcoin users remain unregulated.

TRANSITORY RECORD

Message from AD Patrick W. Kelley, Office of Integrity and Compliance

Due to a number of inquiries seeking guidance for the reporting of digital currencies such as "Bitcoin," the Office of Integrity and Compliance (OIC) is providing this interim guidance regarding the application of the Standards of Conduct (SOC) to situations involving digital currencies.

Digital currencies, such as Bitcoin, are not backed by any government or any other legal entity, are not considered legal tender like the U.S. dollar, and are not controlled or regulated by a central bank. Generally, such currencies share the following characteristics: (1) open source—the controlling computer code is open to public view; (2) peer-to-peer—transactions do not require a third-party intermediary, such as a credit card; and (3) they are digital with no physical manifestation. User transactions are encrypted with a unique identity and each transaction is recorded on a decentralized public ledger of sorts that is visible to all users on the network but the ledger does not reveal any personal information about the involved parties. Transaction costs are lower and transaction times are quicker than those associated with traditional financing methods. Digital currencies are stored in a user's "wallet" in the user's computer or in an online "wallet service." These features make digital currencies attractive for use in both legal and illegal transactions. The market for such currencies is volatile but continues to grow. The acquisition, use, and sale of such currencies by Federal employees poses a number of issues under the SOC. Unfortunately, the Office of Government Ethics (OGE) has not issued guidance in this regard although we expect it to do so as the use of digital currencies increases. In the interim, OIC offers the following guidance for FBI personnel. (We refer to Bitcoins below but the guidance pertains to any similar digital currencies.)

Conflict-of-Interests

Federal law prohibits employees from participating in any official matter which may reasonably and predictably affect their financial interests (or the interests of anyone whose interests are imputed to an employee by law, such as a spouse). For example, you may not participate in a criminal investigation involving a company in which you own stock or in a procurement if you own stock in one of the companies competing for the contract. The law does, however, permit you to participate if your interest consists solely of stock that is publicly traded and your total investment in that security is valued at \$15,000 or less. Bitcoins are currency; they are not a form of securities although at least one court has agreed with the Securities and Exchange Commission that investments purchased with Bitcoins can be a security. Because Bitcoins are not securities, the \$15,000 de minimis rule does not apply. Similarly, because Bitcoins are not legal tender and because the market for them is volatile and their price relative to other currencies is determined by supply and demand, they can't be treated like ordinary cash for conflict-of-interests purposes. Thus, if you own any Bitcoins, and if your official duties require you to engage in any activities that could reasonably and predictably affect the market for, or investment value, of Bitcoins (such as investigations into significant fraudulent activities involving Bitcoin investments, payments, etc. or which could result in the seizure of significant amounts of Bitcoins), then you must "recuse" yourself from participating in such matters and notify your supervisor accordingly. If your supervisor determines that such action will result in your disqualification from the core or essential duties of your position or would otherwise unduly impact the FBI, then you and your supervisor must contact OIC for further guidance. In some cases, divestiture may be required. Personnel in such positions should refrain from investing in Bitcoins if they do not already own them. Further, to avoid "insider trading" problems and related statutory and SOC violations, no FBI employee may take any personal financial action based on any non-public information involving Bitcoins, such as information regarding the initiation or conduct of assessments or investigations.

Financial Disclosure

Employees who are required to file financial disclosure reports (OGE-450 or 278 forms) must, with some exceptions, report all assets held by them (or by their spouse and dependent children) for investment or the production of income which has a fair market value exceeding \$1,000 at the close of the applicable reporting period, or which generated more than \$200 in income. The pertinent regulations don't require disclosure of money deposits in a single financial institution

unless they aggregate to more than \$5,000. As stated above, a Bitcoin is a form of currency but, on the other hand, a Bitcoin is not legal tender, is not regulated by any government, its supply is not controlled by a central bank, and it is not held in a financial institution so they shouldn't be treated like traditional currencies for disclosure purposes. This means that, if you have acquired Bitcoins or other digital currencies for investment or income-producing purposes and if the value of these currencies in your "wallet" exceeds \$1,000 in U.S. dollars at the end of the reporting period, or they generated more than \$200 in income during the reporting period, then you must report them. If you used Bitcoins to purchase investment assets, then you must report those assets if they meet the investment/income reporting thresholds of \$1,000 and \$200, respectively. Further, the purchase or sale of Bitcoins as investment assets must be reported on your annual ("incumbent") report if the value of the transaction was over \$1,000. Such transactions, however, need not be reported monthly under the STOCK Act since they do not involve the sale, purchase or exchange of securities. If, however, Bitcoins are used to buy securities and the value of the transaction exceeds \$1,000, then that transaction must be reported.

Outside Employment

Bitcoins can be obtained in three ways. A user can: (1) exchange conventional money for them; (2) exchange them for goods or services; or (3) engage in a process called "mining," which involves using powerful computers to solve complex math problems to "discover" more Bitcoins. As with any other form of endeavor, if your involvement in such activity involves the rendering of personal services in return for financial compensation, then you must first obtain permission under the FBI's outside-employment rules before engaging in it. Activities that solely constitute passive investment do not constitute employment and no permission is required to engage in them. If, however, you run what amounts to a business to either exchange Bitcoins for money, goods or services, or to "mine" for Bitcoins, then you may be engaging in employment and need approval to do so. Please consult OIC if you have any questions in this regard.

Taxes

Federal employees are required under the SOC to pay their taxes. The IRS has cautioned that: "you can receive income in the form of money, property, or services" from the virtual world and, "if you receive more income... than you spend, you may be required to report the gain as taxable income." Consult your tax advisor if this is an issue for you.

Applying the SOC to the virtual world isn't always easy but following these guidelines will ensure that you don't inadvertently violate Federal law or regulation. Please contact your CDC or OIC, if you have related questions.

MYBITCOIN has been in business since middle of 2009 and it is one of the first to offer such service. MYBITCOIN had thousands of users and their wallets that may contain up to millions of dollars in BTCs.
On July 29, 2011, MYBITCOIN's website went offline. Every account at MYBITCOIN was inaccessible, virtually leaving all of its users without any of their stored BTCs. using the exchange rate around the time of the incident, as a result of this event.
MYBITCOIN did eventually come back online after approximately 7 days. During this time there was an inquiry/investigation driven by the online BTC community against owner(s) of MYBITCOIN. When MYBITCOIN came back online, it announced that their servers were compromised by hackers and a certain percentage of BTCs were stolen. However, MYBITCOIN stated that some of the BTCs were recovered and offered a claim process that allowed for its users to settle their losses by MYBITCOIN reimbursing 49% of their last known stored value.

Background on Bitcoins (BTC)

BTC is an open source project published by Satoshi Nakamoto in 2008. BTC is a decentralized, peer-to-peer, virtual currency. The value of BTC is represented by a public/private keypair. Public keys serve as a address or a wallet of BTC users and it is shared between parties involved in a BTC transaction. Private keys are secured by the owner of a BTC and it is used as proof of ownership and authorization to transfer a certain BTC to another party. This keypair structure, along with decentralized organization provides a level of anonymity since there are no registered accounts in existence.

All transactions that occur in the BTC system are broadcasted to as many computers within the BTC sytem as possible. This block chain is collectively maintained and extended as valid transactions are added on to the block. The block chain contains all transaction history and can not be altered. In order to corrupt the block chain, one will need to overpower the aggregate computing power of the BTC system.

The first 50 BTC were generated in January of 2009. BTC are generated by calculating a target matching cryptographical hashes, also known as a block. This mathematical problem is controlled by a set of rules that are agreed upon by computers participating in the BTC system. The difficulty of calculating the target hashes are precisely known and adjusted to be solved at an average of every 10 minutes.

Users correctly calculating the target hash are rewarded with a set amount of BTCs. Currently, each "mined" block pays out 50 BTC. The pay out amount will be halved every 4 years from beginning of BTC system's existence. The amount of BTC that can be in circulation is predetermined. The maximum number of BTC in circulation will approach limit of 21 million, while never reaching 21 million. The smallest denomination of BTC is 0.00000001. In 2140, all of the available BTC will be in circulation with 6,929,999 hash blocks being solved, having mined a total of 20,999,999.99999999 BTC. Currently, there are over 7 million BTC in circulation, which is 1/3 of BTC that can be in circulation.

Other than mining for BTCs. Users can obtain BTC by purchasing it from anyone that is willing to barter. There are money exchangers, ranging from a organized business entities to a private individuals, that convert hard currency to BTC and vice versa. BTC is valued by scarcity of BTC in circulation, driven by supply and demand. A fair exchange rate for BTC can be obtained by observing major exchangers, i.e. Mt. Gox. Mt. Gox is a website that facilitates BTC to money exchanges between its registered users. Mt. Gox does not appear to provide money exchange service itself but rather play as a match maker between its users.

BTC is stored on the computer running a BTC client, within the public key representing the wallet. Since BTC is virtual and stored as if it was a computer file, BTC is susceptible to corruption, damage and compromise on its host computer. There are online businesses that provide escrow service, like an online piggy bank that serve as a protected repository of BTC. BTC user may open an account with an online wallet service who then can provide better security of BTC wallets to include data backups, accidental deletion prevention and remote accessibility. BTC users are left to blindly trust the integrity and security of such service provider.







(III) NE Bitcoin Potentially Conceals Virtual Financial Transactions

Bitcoin is a peer-to-peer virtual currency which allows its users' increased anonymity, and provides a method to securely transfer and generate funds. By removing financial institutions from the process and allowing transactions to take place between individuals (similar to paying in cash through the Internet), Bitcoin allows users to buy or sell goods and services from others who accept Bitcoin as payment. Bitcoin may be used by online extremists for material support facilitation and financing terrorist organizations through online solicitations, donations, and fundraising activities, although limited reporting confirms its use for these purposes.

(U) Bitcoin was created in 2009 and is the first decentralized, peer-to-peer network-based distributed and anonymous digital currency that may be exchanged for dollars and Euros. As of early 2011, according to open source reporting, the Bitcoin economy was valued at \$5 million and continues to grow. The key to Bitcoin's success is distributing the database of transactions across a peer-to-peer network, which allows the transactions and users to remain anonymous. The distributors of the Tor network, the Electronic Frontier Foundation, call Bitcoin "a censorship-resistant digital currency."

The FBI assesses that as extremists become aware of tools such as Hidden Wiki and Bitcoin, they are likely to expand their use of them. Extremists continue to be active participants on online forums, some of which are sanctioned by al-Qa'ida. Due to technical advances by law enforcement agencies, which have resulted in the disruption of several prominent individuals active online, some extremists are shifting from utilizing traditional Internet platforms to a greater variety of technically advanced applications in order to communicate, share tradecraft guidance, and produce and disseminate propagandal.


