The FBI has completed its review of records subject to the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) that are responsive to your request. FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C.** § **552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Confidential Informant Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of confidential informant records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F) [5 U.S.C.§ § 552 (b)(7)(D), (b)(7)(E), and (b)(7)(F)] and Privacy Act exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C.§ 552a (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records would reveal confidential informant identities and information, expose law enforcement techniques, and endanger the life or physical safety of individuals. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches and Standard Search Policy. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems, such as the Central Records System (CRS), or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. The CRS is an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. The standard search policy is a search for main entity records in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include a search for reference entity records, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files.
 - a. *Main Entity Records* created for individuals or non-individuals who are the subjects or the focus of an investigation
 - b. Reference Entity Records- created for individuals or non-individuals who are associated with a case but are not known subjects or the focus of an investigation
- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Foreseeable Harm Standard.** As amended in 2016, the Freedom of Information Act provides that a federal agency may withhold responsive records only if: (1) the agency reasonably foresees that disclosure would harm an interest protected by one of the nine exemptions that FOIA enumerates, or (2) disclosure is prohibited by law (5 United States Code, Section 552(a)(8)(A)(i)). The FBI considers this foreseeable harm standard in the processing of its requests.
- (iv) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;

- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

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OLIVIA MARY/GOODRICH oko. Olivia Mary De Havilland Born; July 1, 1916 Tokyo, Japan

No investigation has been conducted by this Bureau concerning the above-named individual.

However, a review of Bureau files reveals that it was reliably reported that in November, 1941, a dinner was given in Hollywood, California, by a committee of sponsors under the auspices of the American Committee to Save Refugees, the Exiled Friters' Committee; and the United American Spanish Aid Committee. Olivia De Havilland's name appeared on a list of the Committee of sponsors for this dinner. The American Committee to Save Refugees has been cited by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March, 1944, as a Communist front. The Exiled Writers' Committee has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, pp 234 and 270 as a "Communist League of american friters to bolster the Communist front." The United Spanish aid Committee has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as Communist. 100-7061-115

In Warch 1943, it was reliably reported that Hiss De Havilland was one of the principal speakers at a meeting sponsored by the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. Another reliable informant advised that Olivia De Havilland was a member, sponsor for, and very active in the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee during the years 1942 and 1944. Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as Communist.

(100-7061-320) (100-138-254-52) In May 1944, it was reliably reported that the Hollywood Democratic Committee attempted to raise \$50,000.00 to be used to elect certain candidates in the California primaries. This committee formed groups of its members to go from door to door, in Hollywood, endeavoring to influence voters. According to this informant, Olivia De Havilland was among those who were extremely active in this "Ring the Doorhell."

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At a meeting of the Hollywood Democratic Committee on September 6, 1944, it was reliably reported that Olivia De Havilland was elected a member of the Executive Committee of the Hollywood Democratic Committee and was one of the main speakers at the convention. The Hollywood Democratic Committee has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1947, page 370 as, "a Communist front that grew out of a series of fronts designed to entrap Hollywood's innocents in the motion-picture industry." 100-138754-31

On February 12, 1944, it was reported, from a reliable source that the National Council of American-Soviet Friendship sponsored a radio program in honor of the women of Soviet Russia. Olivia De Havilland was one of the speakers on this program. The National Council of American-Soviet Friendship has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as Communist.

In the summer of 1944, according to a reliable informant the American Youth for Democracy at Les Angeles was active in organizing a "Young Voters for Roosevelt Committee" and that Olivia De Havilland was on the Committee for organizing this new group. The American Youth for Democracy has been cited by the Attorney General of the United States as Communist.

100-352566-4 It was reliably reported that in June 1945, before a crowd of approximately 3,000, a meeting of the Hollywood Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions was held. An address was made by Olivia De Havilland who made an appeal for the American people to unite in order to fight against Fascists and isolation groups operating in this country, "not merely as a patriotic group but as a whole united group to back up President Truman in carrying out former President Roosevelt's dream of forming a union with Great Britain and Russia to keep the world peace, and preserve American Democracy." She also stated that it was time to reform political action groups to see that those elected to California legislature would not block bills such as unemployment insurance, health, full post-war employment, taxation, ahild care, etc. She stated that mistakes had been made and the Hollywood Independent Citizen's Committee, of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions as well as labor and political groups were going to take steps to see that it does not happen again.

It was reliably reported that in February 1946, at a meeting held in the Alvin Theater, New York, that Olivia De Havilland was elected to the Board of Directors of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions.

A circular issued by Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions announced that this organization would sponsor a "Call for Action" on jobs, housing, price control, peace, and discrimination. This rally was to be held at Madison Square Garden in New York on May 16, 1946, and according to the circular, one of the speakers would be Olivia De Havilland.

On June 11, 1946, it was reliably reported that a dinner was held by the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions on June 20, 1946, at the Edmond Meany Note1, Seattle, Mashington. Olivia De Havilland was listed as one of the guests of honor at this dinner.

The Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions has been cited by the California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, page 262 as a, "Communist front growing out of the Independent Voters' Committee of the Arts and Sciences.

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

BAKALEINIKOFF, C. Musical Director. According to Confidential
National Defense Informant BAKALEINIKOFF is Russian born and is
affiliated with the Russian American Club, which was reportedly organized
by MICHAEL and CLARA WALDEN, who are presently members of the Northwest
Section, Los Angeles County Communist Political Association, and were formerly Communist Party. U.S.A. members in the Northwest Section. Informant

KOERNER, CHARLES W. According to CNDI KOERNER must be aware of the Communist situation at RKO Pictures. Informant stated that KOERNER was a member of the Motion Picture Producers Association, which had discussed the Communist situation in the motion picture industry on many occasions, and he recalled that Congressman MARTIN DIES had discussed this situation with the Executive Board of the Motion Picture Producers Association some time ago. Informant said he did not believe that KOERNER is in sympathy with the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association, but that he could not be provoked to take action against them. Informant believes that the chief interest of KOERNER as head of production at RKO Studios is to release motion pictures with box office appeal in order that RKO may be financially successful, and he is not interested in fighting the Communists.

CROW, JAMES, assistant to WILLIAM DOZIER. According to CNDI
CROW was formerly President of the Los Angeles Newspaper Guild. Prior to the
Hollywood Citizen-News strike in 1938, CROW went along with the Communist
fraction in the American Newspaper Guild, but during this strike he was critical
of the Party program; however, he still socializes with the Communists. In ant stated that he would say that CROW went along with the Communist Party some of its line, but did not follow the Communist line completely.

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supported the North American Aviation, Inc. strike in June 1941, but changed his position immediately after Russia was attacked by Hitler. He sponsored the Fourth Writers' Congress in 1941 and was one of the chief speakers at the Writers Congress at U.C.L.A. in October 1943. He was also a member of the Advisory Board of the Writers' Congress in 1943 and was made a member of the Continuations Committee of that Writers' Congress, and is carrying on the work of the Continuations Committee at the present time, although the writers claim that the League of American Writers has gone out of existence. He was active in the American League for Peace and Democracy in 1938 and 1939. He was also active in the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League and was a member of the Executive Board of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League after the Stalin-Hitler pact. He supported the program known as "The Yanks are not Coming." He was active in the Contemporary Theater and also active in the New Theater League. was also active in the International Union of Revolutionary Writers in 1932. He was a speaker at the International Union of Revolutionary Theaters. signed the protest against the investigation of the Moscow trials which were demanded by JOHN DEWEY in 1937. He was a sponsor for the Hollywood Citizens Committee and for the Federal Theater in 1938. He supported the Loyalists' cause in Spain in 1937 and was on the Reception Committee for the reception of ANDRE MALRAUX, French Communist, who visited Hollywood on August 6, 1937. He was a member of the Sleepy Lagoon Defense Committee, the noted Los Angeles mass murder case. He sponsored the Los Angeles Council of American Soviet Friendship. He was also a member of the Citizens Committee for Harry Bridges. He is Chairman of the Free World Association in Hollywood. He is also a member of the Screen Writers' Guild and the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization. He is also a member of the Hollywood Council of Guilds and Unions to fight the Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals. Positive proof of membership in the Communist Party is not available, but according to CNDI he has been one of the most active supporters of the Communist movement in Hollywood for the past seven or eight years.

ROBINSON, CASEY. According to CNDI ROBINSON is the husband of TAMARA TOUMANOVA, who is a product of the New Theater League, a Communist controlled organization. She is Russian born and a dancer. Informant advised that he knew nothing of the activities of CASEY ROBINSON himself.

SCOTT, ADRIAN. SCOTT was formerly a writer at Paramount Studios and was elevated to the rank of producer at Paramount by WILLIAM DOZIER. (See Communist affiliation of DOZIER under Title I.) When DOZIER left

In November 1943 she was Labor Chairman of Club I, Northwest Section, Communist Party, U.S.A. Her 1943 CP membership book number was 25127. Her 1944 membership book number was 48855. JK. U.

WELLES, ORSON was born in the State of Wisconsin. He is not working at the present time, but he has been a director, and writer. He was last employed by RKO as a director. [CNDI] has informed that WELLES has been an active member of a large number of front organizations and groups, some of which are the following: New Theater Alliance, League of American Writers, Bridges Defense Committee, American Peace Mobilization, Theater Arts Committee (TAC), sponsored the Rescub Ship Mission to Spain, member of and active in the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, Chairman of the Sleepy Lagoon Defense Committee (the notorious mass murder case in Los Angeles), sponsored the Los Angeles Council of Soviet American Friendship, and is a member of the Hollywood Democratic Committee. Membership in the Communist Party is not available.

He is presently an instructor in motion picture direction at the People's Educational Center. Hollywood Extension, which is the successor to the League of American Writers School. He was active in the New Theater League and participated in the 1943 Writers' Congress sponsored by the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, a reported Communist controlled organization. He is also a member of the Continuations Committee of the 1943 Writers! Congress. He has recently been named Secretary of the Council of Hollywood Guilds and Unions, which was reportedly set up on the instigation of the Communists to combat the Motion Picture Albiance, an anti-Communist organization. ESTABROOK is a member of the Executive Committee and has been very active therein. He is also a California sponsor of the American Youth for Democracy, the successor to the Young Communist League.

LANG, FRITZ. According to CNDI LANG is a German refugee who came to the United States in about 1936. He produced "Fury" and became the hero of the New Theater League as a result of this production. LANG has been currently active, in the Free Germany Movement. He is reported to be an acquaintance of OTTO KATZ, reported Communist leader now in Mexico.

MENZIES, WILLIAM CAMERON. (For-details, see under title II, Producers.)

MILESTONE, LEWIS. MILESTONE was born-in-Russia and claims that he was naturalized in New York-City. He came to Hollywood in 1919, according to L CNDI The informant further states that MILESTONE was active in the New Theater League and the Contemporary Theater in 1936. In 1929 he directed the picture, "All Quiet on the Western Front." He sent a telegram supporting the play, "Bury the Dead," by IRWIN SHAW. MILESTONE served on the committee to honor ANDRE MALRAUX, a French Communist who came to Hollywood in 1937 to collect funds for the Loyalist cause in Spain. He signed the letter defending the "purges in Soviet Russia." Informant advised that he is a member of the Executive Board of the Motion Picture Artists Committee; that he sponsored the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, and was a member of the Hollywood Theater Alliance. He directed a picture called "Our Russian Front" with JORIS (IVENS, which was sponsored by ARTKINO. MILESTONE sponsored Medical Aid to Russia and aided-HERBERT BIBERMAN, an outstanding Communist in the Los Angeles area; in organizing Russian War Relief, the original reception for which was held at his home. MILESTONE directed "North Star," a Samuel Goldwyn picture written by LILMIAN HELLMAN. He was a speaker at the Russian Relief Rally at the Shrine Auditorium in November 1942. He also supported the "Sleepy Lagoon Murder Defense," notorious

MOGUY, LEONIDE. According to CNDI MOGUY is a Russian refugee who mixes socially with the Hollywood Communists. Informant knew of no Communist organizations to which he belonged, but he advised that the Communists like MOGUY.

NICHOLS, DUDLEY. (For details, see under title II above.)

ODETS, CLIFFORD. ODETS is a native born citizen, according to He has been a writer and is now a director and producer. He has redently produced "None But, the Lonely Heart" for RKO. He wrote the plays "Waiting for Lefty" and "Till the Day I Die" during 1934 and 1935. These two plays were considered Communist propaganda as they glorified the role of the Communist Party in the underground work and in labor unions. Informant further stated that ODETS has been active in the following fronts and groups: New Theater League; National Advisory Council of that league in 1935, which was affiliated with the Union of Revolutionary Theaters, the headquarters of which were at Moscow, Russia. He was a teacher in the New Theater School in New York and was a member of the Theater Arts Committee (TAC). He was a member of the National Advisory Council of TAC, which supported the American Peace Mobilization Auxiliary. He was one of the original organizers of the League of American Writers and was a member of the National ' Council of that league, which was affiliated with the International Union of -Revolutionary Writers. He was Chairman of the delegation of young Communists who went to Cuba in 1936 to protest the arrest of workers, and was himself arrested there along with CELESTE STRACK, President of the California Young Communist League, who was in the delegation. He wrote the booklet, "Rifle Rule in Cuba," in conjunction with CARLSTON BEALS, which was pure Communist propaganda. He was a sponsor of the benefit in 1939 for the anti-Nazi writers and the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. He was a speaker at a symposium held by the Contemporary Theater in Hollywood on March 8, 1939. In June 1941 he attended the Fourth Writers' Congress in New York and was elected a member of the National Executive Board of the League of American Writers. He was on the Reception Committee to honor MIKHAIL KALATOZOV. Russian film director, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 21, 1943. a Communist Party member, has informed that

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QUINN, DON: According to CNDI QUINN was originally a publicist and later a writer. He described QUINN as one who goes along with the Communist policy in the industry. He stated that QUINN was active in the Hollywood Writers! Mobilization and was one of the members on the panel entitled KHumor and the War" in the 1943 Writers' Congress which was sponsored by the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization and which was reportedly Communist instigated and controlled. He collaborated with HOWARD ESTABROOK in the preparation of the screen play, "Heavenly Days."

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RENOIR, JEAN: CNDI has informed that RENOIR came to the United States about two years ago as a refugee from France. He is not a citizen. He directed the screen play, "Our Native-Land," which was written by DUDLEY NICHOLS: This was a propaganfia picture depicting that the middle class could not be depended upon to defeat fascism and that only the workers could be trusted. The "People's World" for April 30, 1940, stated that the Civil Rights Defense Committee sponsored a picture shown at the Ebell Club, "People of France." directed by JEAN RENOIR. This picture was made in conjunction with the Communist Party of France. Appearing in the picture were MAURICE THOREZ, the Early Browder of France; and MARCEL CACHIN, who was one of the leaders of the Communist Party in France and the editor of "Humanite." He is very active in Russian War Relief and moves in Communist groups in Hollywood, but he is very careful, not being a citizen. He attended the reception for MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Russian Film director, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 12, 1943. He sponsored-the Los-Angeles Council for American Soviet Friendship.

SEITER, WILLIAM A. According to CNDI SEITER was active in the 1943 Writers! Congress held under the auspices of the Hollywood Writers! Mobilization, which Congress was reportedly Communist instigated and controlled. Informant stated that SEITER was a newcomer and appeared to be developing in the Communist movement. He had no information that SEITER was actually a Communist Party member or a member of the Communist Political Association.

There are two types of writers in the studios, the original store writer and the scenario writer. The scenario writer writes the dialog an original story; therefore propaganda might be injected either into

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original story or by the scenario writer. One thing is certain; it is the writer who actually injects Communist propaganda into a picture because he writes the script upon which the production of the picture is based. It is to be noted that in the motion picture industry in the Los Angeles area, the Communists are the strongest nucleus of the writers' group. There are approximately eighty-five screen writers in the two writers' clubs of the Communist Party in the Northwest Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party, now known as the Communist Political Association. It also appears that the Communists have recognized the basic value of the writer in the production of the picture, as will be seen from the large number of Communist writers appearing on the list of RKO writers. From January 1, 1942, to the present time, approximately 120 writers were employed on the ninety-odd full length pictures produced or released through RKO Studios. As of November 1, 1944, there were fifty-three writers at RKO, sixteen of which are contract writers and the remainder are hired only for individual pictures.

Following is a list of those writers who have Communist records or affiliations as noted. Those writers on whom no Communist record or activity was found in the Los Angeles files are not being set out.

AKINS, ZOE, according to records of the Los Angeles Office, was an official of the Pasadena Book Panel for Allied Relief in 1942. This panel was organized by known Communists.

BARZMAN, BEN. According to the records of CNDI BEN BARZMAN was a member-of Branch A, Group 2, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A. in 1943, and held 1943 membership book #48291. He was transferred to the Cultural Section, New York City, on January 18, 1943. Later he returned to New York and is now assigned to Club A-1, Northwest Section. BARZMAN, according to informant, was one of the writers of the original meet the People" play. This play was against national preparedness, and the producers are reported Communists in the Northwest Section. BARZMAN is presently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee and the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization.

BAUM, VICKI. According to CNDI EAUM is also a novelist and was born in Austria. She has signed many petitions sponsored by the Communist controlled organizations and has been a follower of the Communist line continually, but informant had no evidence that she is an actual Party member.

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BIBERMAN, HERBERT. CNDI advised that BIBERMAN is presently	7

Her 1944 CPA membership card number is not available, but she has been observed in attendance at a Club A-3 meeting of the CPA recently by Bureau agents. Her husband, PHILIP/TAYLOR, was a member of Club K, Northwest Section, CP-USA, recently

GARRETT, OLIVER H. P. According to CNDI GARRETT is a former novelist. He is a member of the League of American Writers, the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, and active in the Hollywood Council of Guilds and Unions, which was formed to combat the Motion Picture Alliance, an organization set up to combat communism. He has also been active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee, has signed numerous petitions in the Communist cause, and is a member of the Executive Board of the Screen Writers' Guild CNDI advised that on June 28, 1944, GARRETT was one of the principal speakers at a meeting of the Council of Hollywood Guilds and Unions, at which nine hundred people were present, and gave what the informant described CONF. Inaspthe most subtle Communist speech of the evening.

GIBNEY, SHERIDAN. She was on the Reception Committee for MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Russian film producer, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 22, 1943. She also wrote "The Little Foxes" and "North Star." "North Star" is also considered a strong propaganda picture. She signed the call for the Third and Fourth Congresses of the League of American Writers, and signed the "Letter of 150."

She sponsored a dinner given for the benefit of "anti-Fascist fighters who went to Spain." She has been sponsor and supporter of a large number of front groups, many of which were distinctly Communist. She is now working on her play, "The Searching Wind." She has a long record as a sympathizer of the Communist cause, and CNDI that she is officially connected with the national headquarters of the Communist Party in New York City.

KANDEL, AVEN. CNDI described KANDEL as a mild Communist sympathizer. He said that KANDEL rationalizes a great deal and does not follow the Communist Party line completely. He knew of no organizations to which KANDEL belonged, and said that KANDEL was not a Party member.

LAVERY, EMMET. According to CNDI elected President of the Screen Writers' Guild and also the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization. The Hollywood Writers' Mobilization was currently one of the most important reported Communist controlled organizations in Hollywood. LAVERY himself is not a known Communist, but according to this informant he is sympathetic with them, and the Communists are using him as a front because he is not known as a Communist at the studio. He is comparatively new and the Communists can use him successfully. LAVERY was active in the 1943 Writers' Congress, sponsored by the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, and has been active in the Council of Hollywood Guilds and Unions, which was set up to fight the Motion Picture Alliance, an anti-Communist organization. When LESTER COLE, former President of the Screen Writers' Guild, was nominated for reelection, COLE withdrey in order that LAVERY would have no opposition, the reason, according to CNDI being that the Communists did not want to split the progressive vote: The Communists strongly backed LAVERY in the election, although it is to be noted that he had no opposition, he being the only one nominated for the position.

MANOFF, ARNOLD. According to CNDI MANOFF was recently Educational Director of Club A-3, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A. He held 1943 CP-USA book #10909 and was a delegate to the Los Angeles County CP-USA convention, held on October 31, 1943, at Los Angeles. Educations: Western Writers' Congress, League of American Writers, Screen Writers' Guild, instructor at People's Educational Center He is also a subscriber to the "People's World," "The Daily Worker," and is a regular reader of "The Communist." His wife, RUTH MANOFF, is also a member of the Northwest Section, according to CNDI and a functionary therein.

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RE: COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE CONFIXENTIAL MOTION PICTURE INDUSTRY INTERNAL SECURITY - C foined the Communist MELTZER, LEWIS, according to CNDI Party, U.S.A. in 1943 under the name of DEWIS CALLAHAN. He held 1943 CP-USA book #36025. MCCOY is a member of MCCOY, HORACE. According to CNDI the League of American Writers, taught at the League of American Writers School for Writers, and has been active in the Hollywood Writers Mobilization. This informant had no evidence that McCOY is an actual Party member. MISCHEL, JOSEF. According to CNDI MISCHEL was formerly a member of Branch B, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 book #27851. In 1943 he was assigned to Club A-3, Northwest Section. He held 1944 CP-USA book #48885. His wife, FLORENCE MISCHEL, is President of the Screen Story Analysts' Guild and is also a member-of Branch B; Northwest Section: The records of the Los Angeles Office reflect that MITTLER, LEO. MITTLER is an associate of reported German Communist sympathizers. He has been a contributor to the Free German Movement and was present at a reception tendered by the Council on American Soviet Friendship, a reported Communist dominated propaganda organization, for MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Soviet film representative in Hollywood, which was held on August 22, 1943. There is no indication that he is, an actual Party member. MURFIN. JANE, according to CNDI is not a Communist Party . member or a member of the Communist Political Association. Her activities have been chiefly in the Screen Writers' Guild, where she is a member of the Executive Board, and in-the Writers' Congress, where she was Chairman of the ? Ticket Committee, and also a member of the Seminar Panel. She is a member of the Continuations Committee of the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization. She, like EMMET LAVERY, apparently is being used by the Communists, according to this informant.

MYERS, HENRY, according to CNDI was a former Educational Director of Branch A, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A. He held 1943 CP-USA book #25065. The was a member of the League of American Writers and taught at their Hollywood school. He attended a meeting with ALEXANDER TRACHTENBERG on February 7, 1943, at the League of American Writers School, according to a surveillance by Bureau agents. He was one of the authors of Meet the People, staged in 1940, which reportedly was against lend-lease, against the draft, and against war. He was also one of the three authors of the CIO stage show entitled "Marching with Johnny," which played

in the East in 1943. BARBARA MYERS, when she was still living with her husband, HENRY MYERS, was for a time Northwest Section Membership Director Recently they have separated.

NICHOLS, DUDLEY. (For details, see under title II above.)

Western Regional Vice President of the Radio Writers' Guild and who is alternate to the Executive Council of the Radio Directors' Guild, Hollywood Chapter, is a member of the League of American Writers, and was active in the New Theater Guild and the Motion Picture Cooperative Buyers' Guild. He was also active in the 1943 Writers' Congress and is a member of the Continuations Committee thereof. In 1943 he was elected to a two-year term on the Western Regional Council of the Radio Writers' Guild, and he is the Western Representative of the Authors' League of America. On April 15, 1944, a car registered to ARCH OBOLER was observed at the Hollywood Mobile Theater, 1791 North Sycamore, Hollywood, where JOHN HOWARD LAWSON was addressing new recruits to the Northwest Section. This was a strictly invitational meeting, and agents observed a man who may have been OBOLER enter this address after leaving OBOLER's car.

ODETS, CLIFFORD. (For details, see under title III.)

QUINN, DON. (For details, see under title III.)

ROBERTS, STANLEY. A car registered to STANLEY ROBERTS was observed by Bureau agents at a "People's World" benefit party at the home of E. Y.

HARBURG on July 16-1944. Furthermore CNDT advised that

The informant interpreted this as meaning that ROBERTS would go along in the Communist cause when he had other supporters, but who was not considered an important person by the Communists.

ROBINSON, CASEY. (For details, see under title II, Producers.)

ROBISON, DAVID. ROBISON is a reader and a writer at RKO. According to CNDI he is Treasurer of the Screen Story Analysts' Guild and was a member of Club B, Northwest Section, Communist Party, U.S.A., having been transferred to this club on October 18, 1943, from Branch L, Northwest tion. He is still active in Branch B, Communist Political Association, his 1944 CPA membership card number is 46889. His wife, NAOMI ROBISON, Northwest Section Financial Director, where she handles apparently all moin the Northwest Section. She is a member of Branch D (Radio Artists), No west Section.

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SALT, WALDO MILLER; is a native born citizen and a free lance screen He was recently the Organizer of Branch A (Writers), Northwest Section, Los Angelès County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #48263, and 1944 CP-USA book #48986. When J. PETERS visited Los Angeles in May 1942, he stayed at WALDO SALT's home. PETERS has been identified as former Comintern representative in the United States. SALT has been described by ELIZABETH/LEACH, Organizer of the Northwest Section, as one of the twelve leading writers in the Party: He has been active in the League of American Writers, the Hollywood Democratic Committee, and the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, as well as the Council of Hollywood Guilds and Enions. was formerly Los Angeles Treasurer of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberty, alleged Communist dominated organization. On September 24, 1944, he attended a birthday party at the home of CARL WINTER, President, Los Angeles County Communist Political Association, and on numerous occasions has been observed by Bureau agents at meetings with key functionaries of the Party and the CPA. His wife, MARY SALT, is a member of Branch F (Actors), Northwest Section, and is an instructor in the Actors' Laboratory, reported Communist actors ' work shop.

SCOTT, ADRIAN. (For details, see under title II above.)

SCOTT, ALLAN. According to CNDI ALLAN SCOTT is a member of the League of American Writers and was active in the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization and the Hollywood Democratic Committee. He formerly taught at the League of American Writers' School for Writers in Hollywood and has been closely associated with the Communists and fraternizes with them. / His wife's sister, JANE MEAD, who has lived with them, was recently the Educa- Wife tional Director of Club K, Northwest Section, Communist Party, U.S.A., and was formerly the Southern California Field Organizer for Russian War Relief, which she formed under the leadership of HERBERT BIBERMAN. One of ALLAN SCOTT's screen plays entitled "So Proudly We Hail" was strictly Communist in theme, which theme was that this war is a people's war. The "People's World" liked the theme (as expressed in a letter read in the film) so well that they printed it and commended it. SCOTT is not a known Party member. He is a brother of ADRIAN SCOTT, RKO producer. (For details on ADRIAN SCOTT, see under title II, Producers.)

SCHULBERG, BUD WILSON was born in New York and is presently an Ensign in the United States Navy, assigned to the Office of Strategic Services. He was previously a screen writer and alternated between Hollywood and Mexicology. He is reported to be a Communist Party member, by a former Los Angelounty Communist Party Organizer and CNDI The was active in many

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front organizations in the Hollywood area while residing in Hollywood, such as the American League for Peace and Democracy, Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, Hollywood League for Democratic Action, Hollywood Peace Forum, Motion Picture Democratic Committee, American Peace Mobilization, Hollywood Theater Alliance, Contemporary Theater, United Spanish Aid Committee, Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, New Theater League, and the Motion Picture Artists' Committee. VIRGINIA SCHULBERG, wife of BUD SCHULBERG, was a member of Club C, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A. in 1943, and held membership book #30304. At that time she was classed as a new member. She is currently assigned to Club A-1, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Political Association and holds membership card #46828.

SIODMAK, CURT. CNDI described SIODMAK as a refugee who is regarded favorably by the Hollywood Communists and who fraternizes with them. This informant had no record showing any organizations of a Communist nature to which SIODMAK belongs.

SMITH, HAROLD J. (HAL). The records of CNDI reflect that SMITH was a former Membership Director of Club A-3, Northwest Section, Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #25216. He held 1944 INFT.CP-USA membership book #48677. [CNDI advised that SMITH was, one of the writers of a pageant to be presented at a rally for WILLIAM Z. FOSTER under the auspices of the Los Angeles Communist Party Executive Committee in July 1943. His wife, SYLVIA SMITH, is also a reported member of the Communist Party, Northwest Section, and a former functionary.

SPENCER, RAY. According to records of the Los Angeles Office, SPENCER was a former reader at Paramount Studios, who was elevated to awriter while at Paramount by WILLIAM DOZIER. (For details regarding DOZIER, see under title I; Executives.) According to CNDI SPENCER is a member of Club B, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #25219 and 1944 CP-USA membership book #48910. He now holds 1944 CPA card #46885. His wife, professionally known as HELEN McGREGOR, is also a member of Club B, Northwest Section.

SPIEGELGASS, MAJOR LEONARD. According to CNDI PIEGELGASS, a Major, in the Army, is a member of the League of American Writers, was active in the Motion Picture Cooperative Buyers' Guild, and participated in the 1943 Writers' Congress, which was sponsored by the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization.

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COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE MOTION PICTURE INDUSTRY INTERNAL SECURITY - C. SWERLING. JOE. According to CNDI SWERLING was an instructor in the League of American Writers School for Writers in Hollywood, was active in the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and participated in Communist Party open meetings. He is currently very active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. TARLOFF, FRANK. CNDI advised that FRANK TARLOFF was a new member of the Communist Party, U.S.A. in 1943, and was assigned to Club A-3, Northwest Section. He held 1943 membership book #36008 and 1944 Communist Party, U.S.A. membership book #48663. His wife, LEE BARRIE TARLOFF, is also a reported Communist, and according to CNDI as very active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. TAFFEL. BESS. CNDI advised that BESS TAFFEL was assigned to Group 2, Branch A. Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A. in 1943, and held 1943 membership book #48133 and 1944 CP-USA book #48645. She is presently assigned to Club A-1, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Political Association, and holds, 1944 CPA membership card #46818. She was formerly a club functionary. stated that TRIVERS is reported to TRIVERS BARRY CNDI be the brother of PAUL TRIVERS (member of Club A-3, Northwest Section, CP-USA) He is comparatively new in Hollywood, is not a member of any known Communist affiliated organization; but informant knows him to be a sympathizer and one who fraternizes with the Communists. b7D TRUMBO, DALTON. According to CNDI DALTON TRUMBO in 1943 was classified as a new member of the Communist Party, U.S.A., and was assigned to Group 3, Club A, Northwest Section, and held 1943 membership book #36082 and 1944 membership book #48654. He is presently assigned to Club A-1, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Political Association. was a member of the League of American TRUMBO, according to CNDI Writers, participated in the 1943 Writers' Congress, and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee and the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization. He was one of the principal West Coast speakers in the American Peace Mobilization and the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties. He was the author of the book entitled Johnny Got His Gun," an anti-war novel in line with the Communist line when it was published in about 1939 or 1940. In 1942 he wrote a pamphlet advocating the immediate opening of the second front, published under the auspices of many labor unions in Hollywood. He wrote a pamphlet in defense of HARRY BRIDGES and has written many

articles which have appeared in the "People's World." He is very active

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at the present time against the Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals. His wife, CLEO/TRUMBO, is also a reported member of the Northwest Section.

VON CUBE, IRMGARD. According to information in the Los Angeles Office, VDN CUBE is an associate of the German Communist sympathizers, such as FRITZ LANG and LEO MITTLER. She is also believed to be an acquaintance of OTTO KATZ, reported Communist leader now in Mexico.

WEISBERG, BRENDA. CNDI advised that WEISBERG had been active in the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. He described her as a rank-and-file person who had never been a leader in any of these organizations. He did not know if WEISBERG is an actual Party member.

WEXLEY, JOHN. "Variety" (daily trade publication), November 15, 1944, issue, reflects that WEXLEY had just returned from military service and was assigned by RKO to handle the screen play, "Cornered," for Producer ALIAN SCOTT. According to CNDI WEXLEY was a member of Branch A, Group 2, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., in 1943, and held 1943 membership book #36005 and 1944 CP-USA book #48640. He was given special leave by the Party to go into the United States Army. He made a trip to Europe, and according to dispatches in the "People's World," was in Russia but returned about the first of November 1944 and is now in Hollywood and has been discharged from the United States Army. His wife, known as COOKIE/WEXLEY, is a member of Club C, Northwest Section. She is foreign born but was recently naturalized.

V. ACTORS AND ACTRESSES AT RKO

Tt should be stated here that RKO has no contract "star players," but the studio employs what are known as stock players generally hired for a period of six months, and as a result the players' roster is continually changing.

The "star players," when used in an RKO release, are signed only for the picture and are not regular contract players of RKO. A review of the RKO feature pictures released from January 1, 1942, to date reveals approximately 160 different actors and actresses in leading roles. As of November 1, 1944, RKO had 55 stock players on its roster. There are being listed below the actors and actresses who have taken the leading picture parts produced or released by RKO from January 1, 1942, to date, who have

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Communist connections as indicated below; also those stock players presently on the RKO roster who have Communist connections. Those actors and actresses on whom no Communist records have been found are not being included in this list.

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BRIDGES, LLOYD (BUD). According to CNDI BRIDGES joined the Communist Party in 1943, was assigned to Branch K, and held 1944 CP-USA membership book #102346 and 1944CPA book #46950. He is also active in the Actors! Laboratory, alleged Communist actors! work shop. His wife, DOROTHY BRIDGES, was also a member of Branch F, CP-USA, and is now a member of Branch F, CPA.

BROOKS, JEAN. CNDI advised that JEAN BROOKS was a member of Branch F (Actors), Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #48194 and 1944 CP-USA book #48972. She is also a subscriber to the "People's World." Her husband, DICK BROOKS, a former screen writer, is now reportedly in the United States Army and was on special leave from Club A-3, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A.

CNDI provined that she became active in Communist affairs in 1938, to his personal knowledge; also that she is a member of the Screen Actors Guild. Informant further advised that she was a member of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League after the Stalin-Hitler pact and was very active in its affairs until it was dissolved. She was a member of the Emergency Committee

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of the Hollywood Anti-Nazi League to save that organization, as many deserted the cause of the Stalin-Hitler pact. She was a member of the Motion Picture Democratic Committee and the American Peace Mobilization. She was also a member of the Motion Picture Artists' Committee (Spanish Aid Committee). She is also a sponsor for the Free World Association of Hollywood and is a member of the Executive Council of the Hollywood Democratic Committee. She joined in a telegram by the Hollywood Democratic Committee to the United States Senate Judiciary Committee relating to the poll tax legislation then pending. Proof of membership in the Communist Party is not available.

CARNOVSKY, MORRIS. According to CNDI -CARNOVSKY and his wife, known professionally as PHOEBE BRAND, were transferred from New York to the Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., in early 1944, and were assigned to Branch, F, Northwest Section. He held: 1944 CP-USA membership book #48975 and now holds 1944 CPA membership card #46951, and is attached to Branch F. Northwest Section.

CARRADINE, JOHN. According to CNDI CARRADINE was active * in the Committee of Foreign Agricultural Workers and contributed money to this organization, which this informant described as a Communist controlled organization. He knew of no other activity of a Communist nature in which CARRADINE had participated, stating he believed CARRADINE was neither a Communist nor a Communist sympathizer, and his activity in this committee was because of his sympathetic interest in the particular group involved. CARRADINE, it is to be noted, is a Shakespearean actor.

COPLAND, AARON, a musicion, and according to CNDI member of the League of American Writers and a former instructor in the League of American Writers School for Writers. He was active in the 1944 Musicians' Congress, reportedly organized and controlled by the Communists, and has contributed to various other Communist sponsored rallies in a musical way. He was also active in the Harry Bridges Defense Committee.

COTTON, JOSEPH. -According to CNDI COTTON is a member of the Executive Board of the Screen Actors' Guild and is a sympathizer with Communist aims, but is not a member of the Party. He has lent his name to many front organization/rallies, is a member of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, and spoke at the Philharmonic Auditorium for the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. He is a product of the Actors' Laboratory. reported-Communist work shop, and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee.

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Her citizenship is unknown. CNDI knowledge she began showing sympathy for the Communist cause in Hollywood in 1942, and since that time has taken an active part in various Communist front activities, such as the Hollywood Committee for Writers in Exile, Free People's Dinner honoring PAUL ROBESON, attended the reception at the Soviet Vice Consulate in 1942 in Los Angeles, which was attended by many Communists, is a sponsor for the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. She signed the protest which was sent to the State Department protesting the detention of JESUS\HERNANDES\TOMAS: Spanish Communist held by the Immigration authorities at Seattle, Washington, in 1943. She attended the celebration of the 26th anniversary of the Russian Revolution. She also attended the reception in honor of MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Soviet motion picture representative, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 22, 1943. She is sponsor for the Los Angeles Council for American Soviet Friendship, a member of and active in the Russian American Club in Hollywood, a sponsor of the Free World Association of Hollywood, a member of the Executive Council of the Hollywood Democratic Committee, and is very active in that organization. She was prohibited, along with ORSON WELLES and REX XINGRAM, from making a speech during the Los Angeles Street Railway strike in August 1944, on the grounds that "they were too red." -

DEL RIO, DOLORES. According to CNDI DEL RIO, a Mexican actress, was involved in the Salinas, California, strike in 1934 or 1935, along with ELMA WINTER, notorious cultural Communist. Informant stated that he believed DEL RIO was just duped into lending financial aid to this strike because of the Mexican laborers involved, and he knew of no other instances of activity by DEL RIO indicating any Communist sympathy.

GARFIELD, JOHN, alias JACOB GARFINKEL. CODI has informed that GARFIELD is a citizen and had his name officially changed to JOHN GARFIELD. He is a screen actor and a member of the Screen Actors' Guild. He has been very active in Communist front activities, to his personal knowledge, for the past six or seven years, and he teaches at the Hollywood Writers' School. Informant further advised that he is a sponsor for or active in the following Communist front groups: Hollywood Committee for Writers in Exile, Hollywood Anti-Nazi League, New Theater League, Hollywood League for Democratic Action, Russian War Relief, Hollywood Canteen, Hollywood Democratic Committee; also he was a sponsor for the reception to MIKHAIL KALATOZOV, Soviet film director, at the Mocambo Cafe on August 12, 1943. Informant further advised that GARFIELD returned about May 1 from the Italian front, where he had been on an entertainment tour. At this time GARFIELD gave out the information that he had interviewed "TITD" while over there and eulogized

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TITO for his great efforts, which eulogy appeared in the "People's World." reported Communist publication on the West Coast. [According to CNDI GARFIELD was a former YCL organizer in the eastern United States, possibly Chicago or New York. His wife, ROBERTA GARFIELD, was an active member of Branch H, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and continues active in the Communist Political Association.

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GERSHWINE, IRA. According to CNDI GERSHWINE is a member of the League of American Writers, a former instructor at the Writers School, active in the Musicians, Congress, and the Hollywood Democratic Committee, and a sponsor for the Harry Bridges Defense Committee.

GRANT, CARY: CNDI said that he knew GRANT to be a Communist sympathizer, but he' knew of no Communist organizations to which GRANT had belonged. Informant said that the Communists make a great deal of GRANT," although he did not know that GRANT fraternized with them.

GUILFOYLE, PAUL. CNDI advised that GUILFOYLE is an Actors' Lab product, active in the Hollywood Theater Alliance, and was an actor in the stage musical, "Meet the People," which was an anti-war show in 1940, and was produced by reported Communist Party members. He did not know that GUILFOYLE is an actual Party member.

HENREID, PAUL. According to CNDI RENREID was reportedly born in Austria. He is a product of the Actors! Laboratory, reported Communist work shop, and a sympathizer with the Communists. He is not a known Communist, and the informant knew of no other organizations of a Communist nature to which he belonged.

HOWE, JAMES WONG. According to the records of the Los Angeles
Office, HOWE, a Chinese cameraman, was a former instructor in the Hollywood
League of American Whiters School for Writers, and presently is an instructor
in the People's Educational Center, successor to the League of American
Writers School. He was a sponsor of the Soviet American Friendship rally
held on November 16, 1943, in Los Angeles, and is active in the 1943 Writers
Congress sponsored by the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization. He is reportedly
currently residing with SONORA BABB, former contributor to the "Clipper,"
official publication of the League of American Writers. BABB, according to
CNDI was a member of the Communist Party, U.S.A., and is currently
a member of Club A-1, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Political
Association, and holds 1944 CPA membership card #46824. HOWE is not a lown
CP member.

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DEAD HUSTON. WALTER, a native born American citizen, is an actor and is a member of the League of American Actors. He played the leading role of Ambassador Davies in the picture, "Mission to Moscow." [CNDI informs that membership in the Communist Party is lacking, but he stated that to his personal knowledge HUSTON has supported Communists and Communist controlled front activities, such as sponsoring the 25th anniversary of the Soviet Republic, a salute to our Russian allies; that he was on the Invitation Committee and was a member of the program and arrangements committee for this function; that he is a member of the Executive Board of the Hollywood Democratic Committee, the leading Communist front organization in Hollywood at the present time; that he was a member of the Motion Picture Democratic Committee; that he is a close friend and associate of JAY/LEYDA and JORIS IVENS, Communists who are leaders in the production of documentary propaganda films. He is associated with the League of American Writers, Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, and Russian War Relief. He was the narrator of "Our Russian Front." He was an actor in "Edge of Darkness." He has met many times with leading Communists in open meetings. He also played the leading role in the picture, "The North Star" by LILLIAN HELIMAN.

JAGGER, DEAN. According to CNDI he knows this individual to be sympathetic to the Communists, but not active in the Communist movement.

NELSON, RUTH. According to CNDI RUTH NELSON was recruited

NELSON, RUTH. According to CNDI RUTH NELSON was recruited into the Communist Party in 1943 and assigned to Club F, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, U.S.A., and held 1943 membership book #47965 and 1944 CP-USA book #58491. She is presently assigned to Club F, Northwest Section of the Communist Political Association, and holds CPA membership card #41773. According to CNDI And is a product of the Actors' Laboratory, reported Communist work shop, and of the Hollywood Theater Alliance; another Communist controlled organization. She is considered by the Communists to be one of their best developments and she is receiving the Communist buildup. It is to be noted that she has an important role in the motion picture, "Wilson," produced by DARRYL ZANUCK for Twentieth Century-Fox.

RUSSELL, ROSALIND is regularly in the employ of Warner Brothers

She was associated with DUDLEY NICHOLS, WALTER WANGER, SAM GOLDWYN, HOWARD ESTABROOK, CHARLES BOYER, and SOL LESSER in the Free World Association. She is a member of the Committee on Ricture Arts and Sciences with JAMES WONG HOWE; JORIS IVENS, and FRANK TUTTLE. She is a very active member of the Hollywood Democratic Committee and a member of the Executive Board of that committee. Record of membership in the Communist Party is not available.

SANDERS, GEORGE. According to CNDI ANDERS is an Actors' Laboratory produce who was born in Russia. He is a member of the Screen Actors' Guild and was described by the informant as a Communist sympathizer, but the informant could advise of no other Communist controlled organizations to which he belonged. He said that SANDERS was definitely not a leader, and he had no evidence that SANDERS was actually a Party member.

TOUMANOVA, TAMARA. According to CNDI she is the wife of CASEY ROBINSON, producer at RKO. She is a Russian born dancer who is a product of the New Theater League, a Communist controlled organization. It is not known that she is an actual Communist Party member.

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VI. FEATURE PICTURES PRODUCED BY OR RELEASED THROUGH RKO RADIO PICTURES

A review of the motion pictures of RKO Radio Pictures from
January 1, 1942, to the present time reveals that a total of approximately
ninety full length or so-called feature pictures have been produced by
or released through RKO. A number of these pictures as will be noted
from a perusal of the list of pictures appearing below are "Western" films
and "Mystery" films which, according to Confidential National Defense
Informant are not suitable vehicles for Communist propaganda.
This informant also advised that the Communists do not expect that every
picture or even a majority of pictures produced by a studio be a
Communist vehicle and he advised that from his experience in the Communist
movement the Communists consider themselves successful if even one of
twenty-five pictures contains important Communist propaganda. He stated
that this propaganda may be in the spoken word, the actions or even in
implications in the film.

It is believed appropriate to state here that Communist propaganda does not remain static. In explanation of what is meant by this statement it will be remembered that prior to June 22, 1941, the Communists declared that the present war was an imperialist war and therefore they were 100% against Lend Lease, Selective Service, Rearmament and the whole preparedness program of the United States Government. Since June 22, 1941, and continuing to the present date the Communists have completely reversed themselves and have through varying stages fallen in line with the United States Government's program of "win the war and the peace" until today they consider themselves the leaders in the war program and proclaim themselves to be "super patriots". This pretended position, according to Confidential National Defense Informant by a sham pretext with which the Communists have cloaked themselves in order to deceive the general public, gain prestige and leadership, and by this pretext having gained strength in government and industry will endeavor to direct the policies of the country in every way possible to the benefit of the Soviet Union, so that the propaganda today is wholly different from what it was three years ago.

Confidential National Defense Informant has stated that the present tactics of the Communist movement in respect to using the

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motion picture as a means of propaganda for the Communist Party line is to refrain from any direct advocacy of Communism but on the contrary to create sympathy for the Soviet Union and picture the Communist as a patriotic and loyal supporter of democracy and democratic processes and free enterprise. This position is deemed necessary to carry out the foreign policy of the Soviet Union in its relation to the rest of the world.

For these reasons Communist propaganda in motion pictures may be extremely difficult to detect and brand with its appropriate label; however, this situation, that of the appearance of support by Communists for patriotic causes, is being utilized to the fullest extent in penetrating the industry by Communists and followers of the Communist Party line. The purpose of this intensive penetration into key positions in the industry, particularly executives, directors, writers and actors, is to prepare for the future because the powerful influence of the motion picture must be used in the interests of Internationalism according to the basic Marxist-Leninist philosophy of Internationalism.

Informant further stated that the Communist forces of the United States are anticipating that at some time in the future there may be another change in the Communist Party line and if and when this does occur they want to be so well entrenched not only in the motion picture industry but in all sections of American life that they can assumed their duties called for by the Soviet Union, at that time, whatever they may be.

For these reasons the Communists now profess, in effect, not to be Communists but good American patriots even to the extent of supporting free enterprise and even capitalism itself.

The pictures listed below are those produced by or released through RKO Radio Pictures since January 1, 1942; the only possible way to determine the extent of the Communist propaganda in these pictures would be to review the scripts which are not available or to view them on the screen after release; therefore, all the pictures released by RKO since January 1, 1942, are being listed below with the names of those active in the production underscored where they have Communist affiliation



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It will be noted that some of these pictures appear to be "loaded" with Communists and it would be natural to expect to find propaganda in pictures produced by persons imbued with Communist principles of philosophy.

SAMUEL GOLDWYN PRODUCTION released through RKO

The theme of this picture is the glorification of the Soviet Union and its effect on the Russian people who live under that government, in other words a patriotic boost for the Communists and incidentally the wonders which the Soviet Government has brought to its people.

This is a SAMUEL GOLDWYN production dealing with the Russian question in a most favorable aspect. This picture has been recognized by most reviewers as strictly a propaganda picture. (The Communist connections of the cast of this picture are set out supra.)

Confidential National Defense Informant has informed that this picture is a SAMUEL GOLDWYN production. WILLIAM CAMERON MENZIES, Associate Producer, produced the picture. He is a fellow traveller of the Communist Party. He works in cooperation with the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS and is an instructor and lecturer in the HOLLYWOOD WRITERS SCHOOL. Both the League and this school, which is its offspring, are completely dominated by the influence of the Communist Party.

LEWIS MILESTONE directed the picture. He has been active in Communist affairs over a period of ten to twelve years. He was born in Russia. He has been sponsor of and active in a great number of Communist front organizations. He is considered by the Communist Party to be one of its foremost supporters in Hollywood. He made a trip to Russia with LAWRENCE STALLINGS, author of "Red Square". He contributes liberally to the Communist cause and is a constant follower of the Communist Party line. He supported the New Theater League, which was affiliated with the International Union of Revolutionary Theaters, the headquarters of which were in Moscow, Russia. He wrote for the New Theater Magazine in 1937. He was a member of the Executive Board of the MOTION PICTURE SPANISH AID COMMITTEE, a Communist front. He signed the letter of "150" which was in protest against the Moscow purge trials. He is a sponsor of the HOLLYWOOD THEATER ALLIANCE, a Communist organization. He has engaged in many other Communist activities. He is a director of motion pictures and a fellow traveler and may be a member of the Communist Party. He is a member of the Executive Board of the MOTION PICTURE ARTISTS COMMITTEE and a member of the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS.

Confidential National Defense Informant advised on December 27, 1943, that an official of the LOS ANGELES WORKERS SCHOOL, which is operated by the Communist Party, was told by ROBERT (BOB)

S./ROBINSON, Executive Secretary of the LOS ANGELES WORKERS SCHOOL, that "THE NORTH STAR" is the most wonderful picture he had ever seen, and that it was the best motion picture the Communist Party had ever sponsored.

ROBINSON further said that the pictures, "MISSION TO MOSCOW",
"THE CITY THAT STOPPED HITLER" and "BATTLE OF RUSSIA" were exactly as they
wanted them and portrayed the Communist Party line as it is presently
revealed.

The "LOS ANGELES EXAMINER" for December 27, 1943, under the heading, "NORTH STAR INSIDIOUS PROPAGANDA", carried an article by NEIL RAU in substance as follows:

"SAMUEL GOLDWYN has a reputation for making fine pictures. He is famous for sparing no expense and for his meticulous attention to the smallest production detail. It is therefore hard for this reviewer to understand why he has squandered a cold \$2,000,000 in the making of 'NORTH STAR'. It is a picture that should never have been made—especially by an American presumably as patriotic as SAMUEL GOLDWYN.

"Written by LILLIAN HELLMAN, whose interest in sovietism is well known, it should get more Communist converts among unthinking sophomoric minds than the late EMMA (GOLDMAN) tried to snare before her deportation. It is not that 'NORTH STAR' comes out boldly labeled as Soviet propaganda. It is too insidious for that. The danger is that someone may take the picture's musical comedy version of life in the Nazi invasion as the real thing.

"The HELLMAN screen play pictures a peaceful Russian village with cattle grazing, peasants living in a constant swing of delirious joy, and young people practically bewildered with ecstasy. The admirable fact that Russia is of necessity helping to win our war does not excuse the lack of verity in these scenes.

"Then come the early days of the German putsch and a grim, harrowing tale of the ravishment of the village, the mistreatment of the women and children, and the need for the men to take to the hills. A scene of particular bad taste in a vehicle that is supposed to entertain is the one showing the bleeding of little children until they die from loss of blood.

"In these days when so many homes are desolate through war losses, the witnessing of such a clinical and studied bestiality does not help our American men and women to bear their losses any better.

"LEWIS MILESTONE, of Russian birth and ancestry, was a logical choice for making NORTH STAR'. It required a natural bias for the exploitation of life in the Soviet Union as conceived by Miss HELLMAN. Unfortunate that Mr. MILESTONE'S talent and Mr. GOLDWIN'S money were used in making a picture of this type. Why not American propaganda?"

The "HOLLYWOOD REPORTER" for November 8, 1943, carried an " article by IRVING HOFFMAN relative to "THE NORTH STAR", which stated in substance that JOHN McMANUS has stated: "No matter what Mr. HEARST says. 'THE NORTH STAR! is a superfine film about Russia. It has unforgettable performances by WALTER HUSTON ... and it brims over with rousing music mostly written by the American composer, AARON COPLAND, but also including the international air and children's anthem known to funcions of Soviet folk music as the Russian 'GOD BLESS AMERICA'. It has a moving script by LILLIAN HELLMAN, all of whose films have been notably Hollywood's most literate and purposeful, a multi-million dollar production by SAMUEL GOLDWYN, perceptive, exciting, direction by LEWIS MILESTONE. In other words, 'NORTH STAR' is one hell of a wonderful movie; and the thing to start figuring out now is why the HEARSTS, the SOKOLSKYS, and others of America's blue legion have launched against it the most vicious and unprincipled smear campaign ever launched against a film in America, even more hateful than that against MISSION TO MOSCOW.

"New York critic DAVID LARDNER noted: The picture is a honey, and Mr. GOLDWYN and Mr. MILESTONE ought to be complimented for having had

anything to do with it at all. An award for meritorious script writing in this war had better be wrapped up right away and sent to LILLIAN HELLMAN!."

The "HOLLYWOOD REPORTER" for November 8, 1943, repeated an article which appeared in "PM", which stated that JOHN McMANUS of PM had exposed an alleged order by W. R. HEARST commanding that SAMUEL GOLDNYN'S "NORTH STAR" be smeared as red propaganda. It stated: "The new SAMUEL GOLDNYN film, 'THE NORTH STAR', is by far the outstanding cinema effort dealing with any phase of the global conflict" or its "insidious, unadulterated Soviet propaganda." It stated that the review written by IAIT after orders from "the chief" (HEARST) is an out and out smear describing the picture as evil Red propaganda "which could not be worse if STALIN had paid for it."

WARIETY" for November 8, 1943, under the heading, "NORTH STAR DRAWS COLD FRESS," stated, "HEARST BRANDS FILM AS RED PROPAGANDA", and under a New York dateline stated: "'NORTH STAR' ran into topnotch criticism following opening in New York last Thursday, with biggest storm brewing in HEARST newspapers, as publishers reportedly issued orders to all editors that he wanted film referred to as 'bolshevik propaganda' and that it could not be worse if it had been paid for by STALIN. The order went on to say that editors were to pay no attention to requests from GOLDWYN or his representatives for favorable criticism of the film."

The WLOS ANGELES EXAMINER" for December 9, 1943, under the heading, "EDITOR'S MAIL BOX", quoted a "soldier" as saying, "Many thanks to your stage and screen reviewer, who branded 'THE NORTH STAR' for exactly what it is—Bolshevik propaganda. With the swallowing of this, 'MISSION TO MOSCOM', and other pro-Russian sentiment, we can believe that the men who rule Russia today are a group of kindly old men whose only thought is for the betterment of humanity. We are told to please overlook the bloody purges, enslaved regiments, throttling of the press-all after the most shameful murder since the French Revolution, that of Czar NICHOLAS II—by the very men that are Russian leaders today. We can be forever grateful that Russia ison our side instead of with HITLER, but I don't think it necessary to kiss him on both cheeks and call him 'brother'. What a difference it is from the last days of 1939, when people were debating which was the worst, STALIN or HITLER.

Confidential National Defense Informant advised that LILLIAN HELLMAN was the writer of the script. Miss HELLMAN is the wife of ARTHUR KOBER, a writer and Communist who has long been active in Communist affairs. She is a member of the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS and a multitude of other front organizations. She was one of the leading figures in the AMERICAN PEACE MOBILIZATION and frantically opposed the entry of the United States into the war until Russia was attacked by HITIER. She is a Communist Party member.

JAY IEYDA was the technical director of this picture. He is a Communist of long standing. From 1932 to 1936 he was director of cultural propaganda in Moscow, Russia. In 1939 he was employed by the Rockefeller Foundation at New York City, Museum of Modern Art. He was discharged from that institution for Communist activity in 1940. He has a long record of Communist activity. He is a member of Branch A, Northwest Section, Communist Party of Ios Angeles County. He transferred to Los Angeles from New York City on July 16, 1943.

JAMES WONG HOWE was the photographer on thispicture. He has a long record of activity in Communist affairs; He is a Chinaman and is considered a trustworthy member by the Communist Party.

WALTER HUSTON was the leading actor in this picture. He played the part of Ambassador DAVIES in "MISSION TO MOSCOW" and is fanatically devoted to the Communist cause. He was a member of the MOTION PICTURE DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE and its successor, the HOLLYWOOD DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE. He is also a member of other Communist-front organizations.

The story of this film begins with the collapse of the German army and presents the plans of the German military caste to go underground even before the last shot is fired and plant the seeds for World War III. According to "HOLLYWOOD REPORTER", issue of September 21, 1944, the picture "has almost too many 'messages', but they are messages worth listening to".

According to LELA ROGERS and ROBERT FELLOWS, producers at RKO Studios, who were interviewed by Special Agent H. FRANK ANGELL recently, this picture contains many Communist messages, the exact nature of which to date have not been ascertained in view of the fact that it has not yet shown in Los Angeles and FELLOWS and LELA ROGERS had not seen the picture.

The scene of the story is laid in Belgium as it attempts to rise from its ashes under the guidance of an American officer of the AMS. After the German general staff decides that the Nazis have been a bad bargain specially selected officers are assigned to all parts of liberated Europe to blend unobtrusively into the background while they sow discontent and disunity to weaken the people for the next blitz. Actual Communist Party members and Communist Political Association members in the production include HERBERT BIBERMAN, MORRIS CARNOVSKY and LLOYD BRIDGES.

The picture was premiered in Dallas, Texas, and producer GOLDEN sent three women lecturers around the country praising this picture in order to insure its success. The picture is called a sequel to "HITTER'S CHILDREN", also produced by the GOLDENS.

RKO CONTRACTS WITH SOYUZINTORGKINO (SOVIET MOVIE TRUST) FOR SALE OF FILMS

The Bureau by letter dated September 11, 1944, advised that JOHN WHITAKER, one of the Vice-Presidents of RKO Studios, had discussed with the Foreign Agents Registration Section of the War Division of the Department of Justice, the matter of setting up a corporation composed of stockholders from RKO and SOYUZINTORGKINO, the Soviet motion picture combine, and investigation was begun to determine what the activities of this corporation are to be.

Mr. WHITAKER desired to ascertain whether such a corporation would be required to register under the Foreign Agents Act of 1938 as amended. WHITAKER informed that RKO and SOYUZINTORGKINO were contemplating the formation of a domestic corporation to engage in the business of distributing Russian films in the United States and elsewhere. The stocks of the company and the profits were to be divided equally between RKO and SOYUZINTORGKINO. Each of the two stockholders would elect an equal number of directors and the directors would elect one additional director. Mr. WHITAKER had never heard of ARTKINO PICTURES, INC. and had no idea whether each contract with SOYUZINTORGKINO was to be terminated or whether SOYUZINTORGKINO was to have in effect two distribution outlets in this country. WHITAKER later informed that no further progress had been made with respect to the formation of the proposed corporation. It was ascertained, however, at that time that the corporation would export RKO Films to Soviet Russia.

The October 9, 1944, issue of the "NEWSWEEK MAGAZINE" carried an article to the effect that RKO and SOYUZINTORGKINO (Soviet Movie Trust) had entered into an arrangement whereby RKO will distribute five films each year which cost \$50,000.00 each to produce, and that in turn the Soviet Movie Trust would release a like number for RKO in Russia. It was stated that the Soviet Movie Trust would not make RKO the sole global distributor of Russian films.

MISCELLANEOUS COMPLAÎNTS TO THE LOS ANGELES BUREAU OFFICE

LESLIE F. WARREN of the los Angeles Field Division the influence of Communism in the motion picture industry. She stated that she had taken the position of Associate Producer at RKO of approving all scripts produced by RKO and the position of advisor to CHARLES W. KOERNER, Vice-President in Charge of Production at the Hollywood studio, with the understanding that Mr. KOERNER would give her a free hand in censoring anything which she did not believe best for the studio as well as for the country in general. She stated that she pointed out to Mr. KOERNER that the majority of the writers in Hollywood, California, were very closely allied with the Communist Party and many of them were thought to be members of the Communist Party. She stated that as a result these writers continually attempted to inject Communist propaganda in a very subtle form in the scripts they wrote.

Mrs. ROCERS stated that an agreement was made and placed on record providing that she had the right to reject any script submitted to RKO for production which contained any Communist propaganda and she stated that she had already rejected several scripts.

Mrs. ROGERS stated that she felt that she could identify most of the big Communists among the writers and directors at RKO but she stated that she did not feel that she was in a position to determine who were Communist Party members among the other employees at the studio. At that time Mrs. ROGERS offered to aid the Bureau in every manner possible.

Mrs. LELA ROCERS, Producer at RKO, mother of GINGER ROCERS, has been very active in the Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals andhas stated that "by its very existence it was serving a good purpose". She further stated that the Communists in the Screen Writers Guild thought they could get away with anything they wanted but when the Motion Picture Alliance set itself up, by merely being in existence, it would combat the Communists.

Mrs. ROGERS referred to the picture "TENDER COMRADE", in which her daughter, GINGER ROGERS, starred and cited several parts which she, LELA ROGERS, had fought out with CHARLES W. KOERNER, Vice-President in Charge of Production at RKO. She stated that KOERNER is politically

blind and that several "messages" which had been written into the script by DALTON TRUMBO she succeeded in killing but she stated not all of them were disposed of before the picture came out. She stated that she made many speeches critical of the picture. She further stated that Mr. KCERNER asked her if she thought it fair to campaign against the picture when her daughter was the star in it. She stated that she informed him that that made no difference if Communist propaganda was being spread.

Mrs. ROGERS stated that EDWARD DMYTRYK directed the picture "TENDER COMRADE" and she referred to DMYTRYK along with TRUMBO as being a Communist. She stated that she called DMYTRYK right in the presence of KOERNER and RATHVON, another RKO executive.

Confidential National Defense Informant has advised that Mrs. ROGERS on this occasion accused DMYTRYK of being a Communist and that he did not deny it. Mrs. ROGERS further stated that it appeared to her that KOERNER was not at all concerned about Communism in RKO pictures.

PEARL KAMM

Confidential National Defense Informant has advised that PEARL KAMM has been an employee at RKO since April, 1936, and formerly was secretary to HOWARD BENEDICT, who was at that time Publicity Director for RKO and was later a Producer at RKO and is a Producer at Universal at the present time.

FLEETA PRESTON

FLEETA PRESTON, who is in charge of the stenographic pool at RKO Studios, informed that she had known Miss KAMM for several years and had "looked upon her as a possible Communist". Miss PRESTON further informed that Miss KAMM at one time was Secretary to ADRIAN SCOTT, a producer at RKO, whose brother is ALLEN SCOTT, a member of the Screen Writers Guild and the LEAGUE OF AMERICAN WRITERS and the HOLLYWOOD WRITERS MOBILIZATION, who was an organizer in the industry. The Illes of the Los angeles Field Division office reflect that FEARL KAMM was the Group Membership Director of Branch N-1, Northwest Section, Communist Party, Los Angeles County, as of November 16, 1943. In 1944 she was Labor Chairman of Group I, Northwest Section, Communist Party, Los Angeles County, and her 1943 Membership Book was #25127. Her 1944 Membership Book was #48855. She is also a key figure in the Los Angeles area.

Miss PRESTON further advised that PEARL KAMM is a very close friend of KATHRYN TROSPER, who in 1940 and 1941 was secretary to ORSON WELLES, who at that time was on the RKO lot in connection with his activities in his personally-owned Mercury Productions. She stated that KATHRYN is in New York at the present time. Miss PRESTON further stated that TROSPER had openly acknowledged that she was a member of the Communist Party.

Miss PRESTON also stated that KATHRYN TROSPER got ORSON WELLES to sign a petition which she was circulating "Not to Deport HARRY BRIDGES" and she also put on a testimonial dinner for HARRY BRIDGES in the spring of 1941 while he was on trial for deportation at San Francisco, California.

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

The producers are principally interested in completing a picture for profit, and might be neither aware of nor interested in any Communist messages which might be injected into the picture by the writers or directors so long as the picture as a whole has box office appeal.

The producer is the final arbiter of what the picture is to contain when it is completed. Therefore he is in a position to cut out all Communist propaganda if he recognizes it or cares to do so. Similarly, if the producer desires to inject Communist propaganda into a picture, he being in charge can do so; then the only person who could override the producer would be the executive head in charge of production.

A review of the pictures released by RKO since January 1, 1942, to date reveals that there were thirty-five different producers on the approximately ninety pictures released. Some of these producers were the heads of independent production companies, which released their pictures through RKO, and others were regular RKO contract producers. As of November 1, 1944, RKO had fifteen producers, fourteen associate producers, and one short subject producer.

Following are listed the RKO producers who have the Communist affiliation indicated. Those producers on whom the Los Angeles Office has no Communist record are not being listed.

BUSCH, NIVEN. CNDI advised that BUSCH, who is also a writer, appears to be sympathetic to the Communist Party, and they support him because of his writings. He knew of no organizations of a Communist nature to which BUSCH has belonged, nor did he recall any specific pictures which the Communists liked that BUSCH had produced. He described BUSCH as a liberal writer.

HARTMAN, DON, Associate Producer. According to CNDI HARTMAN is a member of the League of American Writers, taught in the League of American Writers School for Writers, was active in the 1943 Writers. Congress, and is presently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee and the Hollywood Writers! Mobilization. All of these organizations are reportedly controlled by the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association. HARTMAN has also written for Russian War Relief, which in Los Angeles was formed under the leadership of HERBERT BIBERMAN, Hollywood Communist and West Coast Director of the American Peace Hobilization.

HEMPSTEAD, DAVID. According to CNDI HEMPSTEAD is a former screen director who he stated followed the line of the Communist fraction in the Screen Directors! Guild. He stated that HEMPSTEAD was a sympathizer of the Communist Party, but he had no evidence that he was an actual member of either the Communist Party, U.S.A. or the Communist Political Association, nor could he advise of any organization controlled by the Communists in which REMPSTEAD has been active.

JOHNSON, NUNNALLY. According to CNDI JOHNSON was active in the Contemporary Theater in 1936 and 1937, which informant stated was organized and controlled by the Communist Party. He believed that JOHNSON was active in the New Theater League, which was also under the domination of the Communists. He called JOHNSON one who, by his activities, had shown a sympathy for the Communist Party, but described him as having a "spotty" record, that is, active only occasionally.

LENZIES, WILLIAM CAMERON. CNDI advised that MENZIES was a former instructor at the League of American Writers School for Writers in Hollywood, and is presently teaching at the People's Educational Center, Hollywood Extension, which is the successor to the League of American Writers School. He described MENZIES as one who follows the Communist Party line only "mildly" and who is not particularly active. He did not know that MENZIES was a Communist Party, U.S.A. or Communist Political Association member.

NICHOLS, DUDLEY. CNDI has informed that NICHOLS was born in Ohio, educated at Oxford University, England, and came to Hollywood in 1933, and soon became a member of the John Reed Club, and that in 1934 he was associated with JOHN HOWARD LAWSON, JOHN WEXLEY, ROBERT TASKER, and others in organizing the Hollywood Motion Picture Writers' Union, now the Screen Writers' Guild. He stated that in 1936 the Communists gained control of this guild and that NICHOLS has been very active in a large number of Communist front organizations, among which are the League of American Writers, the Hollywood Writers' School, in which he was a teacher and now is a teacher, and the People's Educational Center, which is a Communist operated institution.

According to Dozier, though not known as a Communist Political Association member, has been active in Communist affairs during the past year and one-half. The informant has also advised that Dozier was active in the 1943 Writers! Congress sponsored by the Communist controlled Hollywood Writers Mobilization. At this Congress he was a member of the Advisory Committee, as well as a member of the Feature Film Panel, which was chaired by Richard Collins, known member of the Communist Party. 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Adriant Scott was formerly a writer at Paramount Studios and was elevated to the rank of producer at Paramount by William Dozier, described hereinbefore. According to available records pertaining to the membership list of the Northwest Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party of 1944, Scott was a member of Club A-1. These same records reflect Scott is presently a member of Club A-1, Northwest Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Political Association holding 1944 Communist Political Association Book Number 46832. Pearl Kamm, the secretary of Scott, according to the same records, has acted as group membership director, as well as labor chairman in two clubs of the Northwest Section of the Communist Party, Los Angeles.

Orson Welles was born in the State of Wisconsin in 1915. He has been a director, actor and writer, and was formerly employed by RKO as a director. Positive proof of his affiliation with the Communist Political Association is not available. Prior to listing the various directors, the following observations are made as based upon information of general knowledge and that supplied by

The director of a motion picture is in charge of the actual making and filming of the picture. He is in turn directly responsible to the producer. He has complete charge of the set, the actors, cameramen and other employees on the lot. He is in a position to inject Communist lines in a motion picture, subject only to revision by the producer.

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As of November 1, 1944, there were eighteen directors on the payroll at RKO Studios. Following is a list along with descriptive data of those who have Communist affiliations:

Herbert Joseph Biberman is presently employed by RKO as a director and writer. According to membership records available of the Northwest Section, Los Angeles County, Communist Political Association, Biberman is presently attached to Club A-3. He was formerly organizer of Branch - B, Northwest Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in 1943. He was the former West Coast director of the American Peace Mobilization, renowned Communist front. According to Biberman at one time was the leader of Communist activity in the motion picture industry, but since June, 1941, when the Communist line changed to advocating all-out aid for the war effort. he has been superseded by John Howard Lawson, movie writer. However, according to he is a member of the League of American Writers, a Communist front and was a teacher at the League of American Writers School in Hollywood. He is presently an instructor of motion picture direction at the People's Educational Center, Hollywood Extension, which is the successor to the school sponsored by the League of American Writers. Prior to listing the various writers the following observations
are set forth as based on information of general knowledge and that supplied
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There are two types of writers in the studios, the original story writer and the scenario writer. The scenario writer writes dialog from an original story and consequently propaganda might be injected either into the original story or by the scenario writer. It is certain, however, that it is the writer who actually injects Communist propaganda into a picture because it is he who writes the script upon which the production of the picture is based.

It is to be noted that in the motion picture industry in the Los Angeles area, the Communists are the strongest nucleus of the writers' group. From information available as developed in connection with the case entitled "Communist Infiltration of the Motion Picture Industry", there are approximately eighty-five screen writers in the two writers' clubs of the Northwest Section of the Communist Political Association. According to Communists have recognized the basic value of the writer in the production of the picture.

As of November 1, 1944, there were fifty-three writers at RKO, sixteen of whom are contract writers, the remainder being hired only for individual pictures. Following is a list of those writers who have Communist records of affiliations as noted:

. Zoe Akins in 1912 acted as an official of the Pasadena Book Panel for Allied Relief which group, according to information developed in the investigation of Communist activities, was organized by known Communists.

Benjamin Frank Barzman was born October 12, 1910 at Toronto, Canada and admitted to citizenship in this country, November 13, 1942, at Los Angeles, California. He has been a free lance writer and, as of June 1944 he was employed at RKO Studios. According to available membership lists of the Communist Party in Los Angeles, Barzman has been a member of Group A-2, Branch A, (Writers' Branch), Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party. His wife, Norma Barzman, is a writer who has been employed at the Los Angeles Examiner, and who has been a member of Branch A, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party.

Vickir Baum who is the novelist, was born, according to _____ in Austria. _____ has stated she has signed many petitions sponsored by Communist controlled organizations, and has been a follower of the Communist program continually. The informant has no evidence that she is an actual member of the Communist Political Association.

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Herbert Biberman. (Biberman was described previously under "RKO Directors").

Aller Boretz. According to Communist Party membership lists available Boretz was recently a member of Club A-1, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, holding 1944 Communist Party Book Number 48621. There is no record of his current activity in the Communist Political Association.

Harold Buchman. According to available Communist membership lists of the Northwest Section, Los Angeles Section, Communist Political Association, Buchman is literature director of Club A-1, Northwest Section, holding 1944 Communist Political Association Book Number 46802. Buchman has been active in the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization and in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. He was a member of the Executive Board of the West Coast American Peace Mobilization during its existence.

Valuation. According to available membership lists of the Los Angeles Communist Political Association, Burton is a member of Club A-3, Northwest Section, holding 1944 Communist Political Association membership card number 46808. He is active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee and the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization.

Edward Chodorov. According to available membership lists of the Communist Party, Northwest Section, Ios Angeles, Chodorov was a member of Branch Y., (composed of people out of the city), and was scheduled to be transferred to the New York Cultural Section of the Communist Party on April 28, 1944.

Lewis Meltzer, according to 1943 Communist membership records, joined the Party in 1943 under the name of Lewis Callahan, holding 1943 membership book #36025.

Horace McCoy. According to McCoy has been a member of the League of American Writers, taught in this organization s school and has been active in the Hollywood Writers Mobilization. No evidence is available that McCoy is actually a Party member.

Jose Mischel, alias Peter Warner, is a writer for RKO Studios according to the most recent information. He was born in Austria and naturalized in Los Angeles, October 10, 1914. Available Los Angeles Communist Party membership lists indicate Mischel joined the Communist Party in Los Angeles in May, 1943, under the name Peter Warner, and was assigned to Branch 1, Northwest Section. He is said to have been a newspaper correspondent before coming to America. In his work with RKO, according to he translates American films for foreign consumption. He has been a member of the Hollywood Writers Mobilization, and states he has advocated an alliance on the part of that organization with the Society for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries (VOKS) in the Soviet Union. He was a sponsor of the Writers Congress, University of California, Los Angeles, in 1943.

Leo Mittler. Mittler is an associate of reported German Communist sympathizers in Hollywood and has been a contributor to the Free German Movement. He was present at a reception given in honor of Mikhail Kalatozov, Soviet Film Representative in Hollywood, on August 22, 1943.

Jane Murfin, according to _____ is not a member of the Communist Political Association, but is used apparently by the Communists. Her activities have been generally in the Screen Writers' Guild as a member of the Executive Board, and in the 1943 Writers' Congress where she was a Chairman of the Ticket Committee.

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Henry Myers, according to membership records available, was formerly Educational Director of Branch A. Northwest Section, holding Party membership book for 1943, #25065. He was a member of the League of American Writers and taught in their Hollywood school. Through a surveillance by Agents it is known he attended a meeting with Alexander Trachtenberg on February 7, 1943, at the League of American Writers School. Trachtenberg is a member of the National Committee of the Communist Political Association and Literary Director. He was one of the three authors of the CIO stage show entitled "Marching with Johnny," which played in the Eastern part of the United States in 1943.

Dudley Nichols. (Previously described in Section "RKO Producers").

Archoboler, according to was formerly Western Regional Vice President of the Radio Writers' Guild and is an alternate on the Executive Council of the Radio Directors' Guild, Hollywood Chapter. He was a member of the League of American Writers and was active in the 1943 Writers' Congress, subsequently being a member of the Continuations Committee thereof. On April 15, 1944, as a result of a physical surveillance, it was learned that a car registered to Oboler was observed at the Hollywood Mobile Theater where John Howard Lawson was addressing new recruits of the Northwest Section of the then Communist Party. This was strictly an invitational meeting and a man was observed who may have been Oboler and who left Oboler's car.

Clifford Odets. (Previously described under Section "RKO Directors").

Don Quinn. (Described hereinbefore under Section "RKO Directors").

Stanley Moberts. A car registered to Stanley Roberts was observed as a result of a physical surveillance at a "People's forld" (Communist West Coast news organ) benefit party at the home of E. Y. Harburg on July 16, 1944. From technical sources close to John Howard Lawson, Hollywood Communist leader, it has been learned that Lawson stated that Roberts is the kind of person who will go along with "the others", but who is not important - undoubtedly meaning that Roberts will go along with the Communist cause when he has supporters.



David Robison. Robison is a reader and a whiter at 180. According to membership records available for early 1944, Robison was a member of Club B, Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, and later was active in Branch B, Communist Political Association, holding Communist Political Association card for 1944, #46889. His wife, Naomi Robison, is Northwest Section Financial Director, apparently handling all money in the Northwest Section. She is a member of Branch D (Radio Artists), Northwest Section.

Waldo Miller Salt is a free lance screen writer. According to membership records until recently he was organizer for Branch A (Writers)
Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, holding 1944 Communist Party membership book #48986. He has been active in the League of American Writers, the Hollywood Democratic Committee, the Hollywood Writers' Mobilization, and the Council of Hollywood Guilds and Unions. He was formerly Los Angeles Treasurer of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties, a Communist dominated group. On September 24, 1944, he was observed by Agents in attendance at a birthday party at the home of Carl Winter, President of the Los Angeles County Communist Political Association. His wife, Mary Salt, is a member of Branch F (Actors) Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party, and is an instructor in the Actors' Laboratory, Communist actors' work shop.

Adrian Scott. (Previously described under Section "RKO Producers")

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Dalton Frumbo was born in Montrose, Colorado, December 9, 1905. He is said to have been the writer of "Tender Comrade", recently produced by RKO, and has also been employed as a screen writer by MCM Studios. Available Communist Party membership lists in Los Angeles indicate he was a member of Branch A, Northwest Section, Communist Party. Los Angeles County, under the Party name Hal Conger. Trumbo is a member of the Screen Writers' Guild, the League of American Writers, and was a contributor to the "Clipper", the publication of the Hollywood Writers Mobilization. He was a member and speaker at the meetings of the American Peace Mobilization, and the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties. states Trumbo wrote a pamphlet in defense of Harry Bridges, and has written articles appearing in the Communist West Coast news organ, the "Peoples World." He has been one of the most active members in the Hollywood Democratic Committee and was extremely active in working against the Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of Democratic Ideals, an anti-Communist group formed recently to fight Communism in the motion picture industry.

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Brendameisberg. has advised that Weisberg was formerly active in the now defunct Hollywood-Nazi League, and the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. She is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. The informant has described her as a rank-and-file person who has never been a leader in any of the groups, but he has stated he does not know if she is an actual Communist Political Association member.

John Wexley. The November 15, 1944, issue of "Variety" states that this person has just returned from military service and was assigned by RKO to handle the screen play "Cornered" for Producer Allan Scott.

According to available 1944 Communist Party membership records, Wexley was a member of Branch A, Group 2, Northwest Section, holding 1944 Communist Party book #48640. These records reflect he was given special leave by the Party to go into the United States Army. According to dispatches in the "People's World", he made a trip to Europe and was in Russia, but returned around the first of November, 1944, at which time he was discharged from the United States Army.

V. R.K.O. Actors and Actresses

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R.K.O. has no contract "star players" although it employs what are known as "stock players", generally hired for a period of six months, and consequently, the players roster is continually changing.

The "star players", when used in a R.K.O. release, are signed only for the picture and are not under regular contract. Since January 1, 1942, approximately 160 different actors and actresses have had leading roles in R.K.O. feature pictures. As of November 1, 1944, R.K.O. had fifty-five stock players" on its roster. Listed below are those actors and actresses who, since January 1, 1942, have taken a leading part in pictures producted or released by R.K.O. and who have Communist connections as indicated. There are listed also those "stock players" with Communist connections who are presently on the R.K.O. roster.

Lucille Ball, motion picture actress. According to she
is a member of the Screen Actors' Guild and to his personal knowledge, she
has taken an active part in and supported Communist-controlled fronts in

Jean Brooks. According to available Communist Party membership record, Jean Brooks held 1944 Communist Party membership book No. 48972. She is a subscriber to the Communist news organ on the West Coast, the "People's World".

	Virginia Bruce. According to she became active in Communist affairs in 1938. She is a member of the Screen Actors' Guild. According to she was a member of the Emergency Committee of the Communist Anti-Nazi League to save that organization at the time many deserted the organization because of the pact between Stalin and Hitler. She has also been a member of the American Peace Mobilization and the Motion Picture Artists' Committee for Spanish Aid. Proof of her membership in the Communist Political Association is not available.
	Morris Party in Los Angeles, Carnovsky and his wife, known professionally as "Pheobe Brand", were transferred from New York to the Northwest Section of the Los Angeles Communist Party in early 1944. Carnovsky now holds 1944 Communist Political Association membership card No. 46951. He is attached to Branch F, Northwest Section.
	Aaron Copland is a musician and according to was a member of the League of American Writers and a former instructor at its school. has also advised that Copland was active in the 1944 Musicians' Congress reportedly organized and controlled by Communists. He was also active in supporting the Harry Bridges Defense Committee.
	Josephicotton. According to Cotton is a member of the Executive Board of the Screen Actors! Guild and is a sympathizer with Communist aims, but is not a member. has advised that Cotton supplied his name to many front organization rallies and is a member of the Communist Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. He is a product of the Actors! Laboratory, Communist actors! workshop and is currently active in the Hollywood Democratic Committee.
* *	Olivia Device I land. has informed that to his personal knowledge, this person began exhibiting sympathy for the Communist cause in Hollywood in 1942, and since that time, has taken an active part in various Communist front activities such as the Hollywood Committee for Writers in Exile and the Free People's Dinner honoring Paul Robeson. She is a sponsor of the Communist Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee. She signed a protest sent to the State Department, protesting the detention of Jesus Hernandes Homas, Spanish Communist who was temporarily held by Immigration authorities at Seattle, Washington in 1943. She attended the reception of Mikhail Kalatozov, Soviet motion picture representative, at the Mocambo Cafe, Hollywood, on August 22, 1943. She is a sponsor of the Los Angeles Council of American-Soviet Friendship and a member of and active in the Russian-American Club.

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

At the outset, Informant has stated that the "western" or "mystery" type of escapist film are not a suitable vehicle for Communist propaganda and that Communists do not expect that every picture or even a majority of pictures produced by a studio, be a Communist vehicle. The informant has advised that from his experience in the Communist movement, Communists consider themselves successful even if one of twenty-five motion pictures contain important Communist propaganda. He stated this propaganda may consist of the spoken words, the actions or even the implications in sequences.

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Communist propaganda has varied over a period of years and it is to be remembered that prior to June 1, 1941, Communists declared the present war to be an imperialist war, but since that time and continuing to the present time, Communists have completely reversed themselves and in varying stages have fallen in line with the Government's program of "win the war and win the peace", proclaiming themselves to be "super patriots". This pretended position, according to ______ is merely a pretext and in fact, the Communists have so cloaked themselves in order to deceive the public and gain prestige and leadership.

The informant has advised that the present, tactics of the Communist movement in the use of the motion picture as a propaganda medium are to refrain from directly advocating Communism, but to create sympathy for the Soviet Union and picture the Communist, either national or international, as a patriotic, loyal supporter of democratic processes. It is for these reasons Communist propaganda in motion pictures may be extremely difficult to detect. Further, the "patriotic" role of the Communists is being utilized to the fullest extent to further penetrate the industry. The informant states that the purpose of this intensive penetration is to prepare for the future so that the powerful influence of the motion picture may be used in the interests of internationalism, according to the Marxist-Lenin philosophies.

Recently two articles have appeared in the press, one in PM and the other in the Daily Worker, which have indicated feelings that R.K.O. cooperates with "Fascists". In the July 28, 1944, issue of PM, in the column by McManus, entitled, "Speaking of Movies", R.K.O. is referred to in the following manner:

"Most recently, however, it has accepted the unique and unenviable stigma, being the only American film company willing and anxious to distribute Fascist-made films in the U.S.A. It is distributing (or trying to distribute) the Franco-made Spanish film, Goyescas, in the U.S.A. as a tribute for the privilege of distributing its Nollywood product in Fascist Spain. Goyescas is the film Winchell attacked on the radio Sunday night."

It was further stated in this article:

"Apart from a mounting indignation and disgust with this sort of trading with the enemy's agents, there has also been a growing concern over how such a reciprocal trade agreement with a Fascist country might affect a Hollywood studio's own production quality. Obviously anti-Fascist films would not be permitted on the market in a Fascist land. Obviously too, no business-like Hollywood studio can afford to produce films for export only. The inescapable conclusion therefore is that all its productions must be acceptable to all its markets which, logically means an end to anti-Fascist film-making by studios aiming to trade with Fascists."

The article then refers, however, to the fact that R.K.O. had, in the past, produced anti-Fascist films, such as "This Land is Mine" and "Tender Comrade".

With regard to its future releases, the articles states that R.K.O. promises fifty or more feature—length "escapist and comedy themes" predominately, with the exception of one or two "prestige pictures". The article states,

"Otherwise, for the great burden of the way, the going will be intrigue, bang-bang, and technicolor kisses, the same old messy misrepresentation of America and its tastes that characterized most Hollywood film production in the prewar years."

In the other article referred to previously, the one appearing on page fifteen, Section*I of the September 17, 1944, Daily Worker, was entitled "Warner Brothers Respect Franco": This article refers to a West Coast article describing how Hollywood has responded to Franco's summons to do business with him and his silent Axis partners. It is stated:

"R.K.O. and Universal are already doing business with him.
Paramount and 20 th Century-Fox are reported interested, but Warner
Brothers has unofficially let out the word that they will not take
part. 'Unofficially' perhaps because our State Department is involved to the extent that it is encouraging this exchange of business between the countries. Yet no anti-Axis sentiments are permitted in any of the pictures accepted by Franco. This is bound to
have some influence on the content of films. Does it account for
the fact, or is it just coincidental, that Universal acknowledges
a present schedule of chiefly 'escapist' musicals?"

The reported exchange of films between this country and Spain is attacked in the article and Warner Brothers is set up as the "consistent" studio since it will reportedly not do business with Spain.



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Within the past year, several movies which, according to the informant, contain Communist propaganda, have been produced by R.K.O. These are listed hereinbelow with a brief description of each.

"The North Star" - a Samual Goldwyn production released by R.K.O.
The director of this picture was Lewis Milestone, a sponsor of and active in a large number of Communist fronts. The writer of the script was Lillian Mellman, a reputed Communist and a close associate of known Communists. Jay Leyda who was Technical Director is a known Communist Party member. The film deals with life in a small town in Soviet Russia prior to the time of the Nazi invasion and subsequent to that invasion. The picture has been attacked viciously in the press as Communist propaganda of the Soviet Union and as a picture of life in the Soviet Union which is not consistent with the facts.

drama dealing with conditions in the occupied territories under Nazi domination. The screen play was written by Dudley Nichols who was co-producer with Jean Renoir, both of whom have been described hereinbefore.

has advised that this picture conveys the idea that the middleclass cannot be trusted to fight against dictatorship, but that only the working class can be relied upon to fight Fascism and that it follows the priciple of class opposition as advocated by Marxist ideology. In its cast are George Sanders, Phillip Merivale and Walter Slezak, all of whom, according to have cooperated with persons favoring the Communist Political Association line.

Covernment Girl". This was produced and directed by Dudley Nichols, described hereinbefore. The writer of the picture was Bud Wilson Schulberg, described hereinbefore. The star of the picture was Olivia De Havilland who, according to has been in frequent contact with Communist elements and has been associated with the Communist-controlled Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

Arender Comrade". This was written by Dalton Trumbo, described hereinbefore. It was produced by David Hemostead and directed by Edward Dmytrik,
who has been described hereinbefore. claims that lines in this movie
were of the Communist propaganda type.

Wone But The Lonely Heart". This was directed by Clifford Odets and produced by David Hempstead who, according to has shown decided sympathies for Communism over a period of years. The male star is Cary Grant, who has been alleged by to move socially in Communist circles.


VII. R.K.C. Contracts With Soyuzintorgkino (Soviet Movie Trust) For Sale Of Films

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It has been learned from the Foreign Agents Registration Section of the War Division, Department of Justice that on July 13, and July 27, 1944, conversations were had with John Whitaker, one of the Vice-Presidents of R.K.O. studios relative to the matter of establishing a corporation composed of stock holders from R.K.O. and Soyuzintorgkino, the Soviet motion picture combine. Mr. Whitaker pointed out to the Foreign Agents Registration Section that R.K.O. and Soyuzintorgkino were contemplating dividing the profits equally. No further progress at that time was indicated. However, the October 9, 1944, issue of the "News Week" Magainze carried an article to the effect that R.K.O. and Soyuzintorgkino had entered into an arrangement whereby R.K.O. will distribute five films each year which cost \$50,000 each to produce, and in turn, Soyuzintorgkino is to release artike number for R.K.O. in Russia. R.K.O., according to the article, was not made the sole global distributor of Russian films.

To date, no additional information has been received with regard to this arrangement or with regard to the character of the movies to be released. Undoubtedly, however, the Soviet films which will be furnished to R.K.O. will be highly propagandistic if the previous policy of the Soviet Union in the making and distribution of its films is followed. Furthermore, any film made by R.K.O. for distribution in the Soviet Union will undoubtedly be censored most carefully by the Soviet Union.

The Director

Believed to be of interest are the following figures obtained from WIAL the attached memorandum:

- 1. There are four men, including the General Production Aide to the Executive Vice President in charge of production, who have Communist affiliations of varying degrees.
- 2. Of the 30 producers and associate producers of RKO 10 have Communist affiliations.
- 3. Of the 18 directors, 15 have Communist affiliations in varying degrees.
- 4. Of the 53 writers employed by RKO 48 have Communist affiliations of varying degrees. In this connection there are 8 persons not included in the number of writers, who act as both directors and writers, with Communist affiliations of varying degrees. Adding these 8 to the 53, results are 56 out of 61 people who write for RKO have Communist affiliations of varying degrees.

The following information concerning the employment of Mrs. Lela Rogers as an associate producer at RKO is not contained in the attached memorandum, but is set forth herewith for your information:

On September 11, 19th, Mrs. Rogers discussed with an Agent of the Los Angeles Field Division the influence of Communism in the motion picture industry. At that time she stated she had taken the position of associate producer at RKO with the duties of approving all scripts produced by RKO. She also assumed the duties of an adviser to Mr. Charles W. Roerner, Vice President in charge of production at the Hollywood RKO Studios, with the understanding that Mr. Koerner would give her a free hand in censoring anything which she did not believe in the best interests of the studio, as well as of the country in general. She has advised of pointing out to Mr. Koerner that the majority of writers in Hollywood are closely allied with the Communist movement, and many are thought to be members of the Communist Political Association. She advised that these writers continually attempt to inject Communist propaganda in a subtle fashion in the scripts they write.

Mrs. Rogers advised that the agreement with Mr. Koerner has been placed on record providing her with the right to reject any script submitted to RKO for production which contains any Communist propaganda. She has advised of already rejecting several scripts.

Mrs. Rogers has informed she feels she can identify most of the big Communists among the writers and directors at RKO, but she stated she does not feel that she is in a position to determine who are Communist Party members among other employees of the studio.

Mrs. Rogers has been active in the Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals and has stated that "by its very existence it was serving a good purpose." She further stated that when this organization really becomes active it will combat the Communists who, particularly those in the Screen Writers' Guild, think they can get away with anything.

In referring to specific examples, Mrs. Rogers cited the picture "Tender Comrade" in which her daughter, Ginger Rogers, starred. She cited several parts which she "fought out" with Mr. Koerner, whom she believes to be politically blind. She advised that several "messages" which had been written into the script by Dalton Trumbo, whose membership in the Communist Party has been established through available membership records, were done away with, although not all of them were disposed of before the picture was finally released. She related she had made many critical observations of the picture and in this regard Mr. Koerner had asked her if she thought it fair to campaign against the picture when her daughter was the star in it. She advised that she informed Mr. Koerner that it made no difference if Communist propaganda was being used.

Mrs. Rogers advised that Edward Dmytryk directed this picture, and she referred to Dmytryk, along with Trumbo, as being Communist. She said she called Dmytryk this in the presence of Mr. Koerner. In this regard the informant, has advised that Mrs. Rogers, on this occasion, accused Dmytryk of being a Communist and he did not deny it. It might be noted that Dmytryk, according to available Communist Party records, was a member of Club A-3 (Writers), Northwest Section, Los Angeles County Communist Party in June, 1944.

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

ORIGIN OF THE ICCASP

The New York TIMES for December 20, 1944 carried a news item to the effect that the ICCASP to function "as a political force" was ancounced by JODAVIDSON, Chairman, at a conference in the organization's temporary headquarters at the Hotel Astor, New York City. The TIMES statedthe new organization is an outgrowth of the INDEPENDENT VOTERS COMMITTEE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES which campaigned for the re-election of President Roosevelt.


The TIMES stated, "The new group has no party affiliations but will participate in what it approves and oppose what it is against." The goals of the organization as defined in an announcement given out at the meeting are:

"Swift and complete victory, a durable peace, full employment, and decent standards of living in the postwar America; extension of democracy in the United States, extension of democracy abroad, and the strengthening of international unity through the exchange of ideas between the men and women of the arts, sciences and professions of our country and the United Nations."

The temporary Executive Council at that time consisted of Mr. DAVIDSON, FREDERIS MARCH, HERMAN SHUMLIN, BEATRICE KAUFFAN (since deceased), VAN WYCK BROOKS, LOUIS CALHERN, FRANK KINGDOM, NORMAN CORVIN, DR. MOSES DIAMOND, MOSS HART, LILLIAN HELLMAN, JOHN TO MCMANUS, WILLIAM MORRIS, PAUL ROBESON and one or two others.

The "New Masses", the Communist weekly publication, for March 13, 1945 carried the following announcement concerning the origin of subject organization.





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"The Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, which played so important a part in the last elections, has become a permanent organization. The Literature Division of the Committee set itself up at a luncheon meeting on February 28th."

MEMBERSHIP

At the annual election of officers held on February 10, 1946, MORIAN CORWIN stated as follows:

"We have 10,000 members and have chapters set up and fully functioning in Hollywood Seattle, Chicago, Minneapolis, Philadelphia Connecticut, and New York. We have a national office. We have a Legislative Bureau in Washington, D. C."

AIMS AND PURPOSES

The October 1945 issue of "The Independent", the official organ of the subject organization, stated as follows:

"We are part of a national organization of artists, scientists, and the professions founded to support the economic, political and social and cultural principals laid down by Franklin D. Roosevelt."

In a letter sent to all members over the signature of VAN WYCK.
BROOKS, it was stated that ICCASP is:

"A non-partisan association of men and women who believe and who have proved that by united action we in the arts, sciences and professions can become a strong, vital force in American political life. Briefly the aims of the ICC are:


- 1- To work toward winning the war and helping to prevent World War III.
- 2- To combat forces which oppose American cooperation in world affairs.


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- 5- To campaign for that legislation which is good and against that which is bad.
- 6- To support those public servants who carry out the will of the people and oppose those who do not. "

PROGRAM, METHODS, AND SERVICES OF THE ICCASP

In a mimeographed report, the subject organization stated that is "an educational and political action committee" with the five main objectives listed above.

As to the methods to be employed in achieving these objectives, it was announced that the committee will conduct intensive education and political action campaigns in the arts, sciences, and the professions and among the general public. The committee will use pamphlets, radio programs, meetings, legislative activity, advertising, publicity, and posters and all other means available to effectively carry out the purposes of the organization.

It was also announced that the committee will participate in the national election campaigns and in state and local elections in those areas where the committee is functioning. Since the last general election, the ICCASP gave its active support in the 19th Congressional Election in New York City to Johannes Steele, the candidate of the AMERICAN LABOR PARTY who was also supported very actively by the Communist Party. The Democratic candidate, ARTHUR KLEIN, former representative, won over Mr. STEELE and the Republican candidate, Lieutenant SHEA.

As to services, the subject organization stated that it maintained a Washington Legislative Bureau which keeps the national and regional head-quarters and the membership informed on legislative issues; that it publishes a monthly journal of opinion, "The Independent", which is sent to all members and to more than 1,500 daily and weekly newspapers throughout the country. It also publishes a monthly Washington news letter containing information of political trends, legislative situations, etc. It maintains a Speakers Bureau which services 30 to 40 meetings each week with prominent speakers from our fields".

The above named PETER LYON is definitely a member of the Communist Party; MARTIN POPPER is highly regarded as a member of the Communist Party as is JOSE FERRER and possibly NORMAN CORVIN.





Recently the public press has announced that HAROLD L. ICKES, former Secretary of the Interior, has been named Executive Chairman of the ICCASF, and that JAMES ROOSEVELT, eldest son of the later President Roosevelt, has been selected as the National Political Director of the subject organization.


COMMUNIST PARTY AFFILIATIONS OF THE OFFICERS AND THE OLD BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ICCASP

There is set out below some of the Communist Party affiliations and activities of the officers and the old Board of Directors of the ICCASP which conduct the affairs of the subject organization from its inception to the present time. The information is not intended to supply all the known Communist activities and affiliations of these individuals, but the information is set out below to show only briefly the Communist sympathies of these efficers and directors.

JO D.VIDSON, Chairman

Sculptor of note: name has appeared in connection with various CP front organizations and associates with Communist circles. He is vice-chairman of the Artists Committee o f the National Council of American Soviet Friendship. The DAILY WORKER for Jan. 30, 1944 reported that JO DAVIDSON would speak with EARL BROWDER at a meeting honoring ARIVYOUNG. The DAILY WORKER for Sept. 9, 1944 stated that JO DAVIDSON was the sponsor of a nationwide celebration commemorating the 27th anniversary of the founding of the Soviet Union. He is a member of the American Committee for Yugoslav Relief, an alleged CP front organization. In 1943, he was listed as a sponsor of the Reichstag Fire Trial Anniversary Committee. In 1944, he is listed as a sponsor of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties. During the Spanish Civil War, he was in Spain on behalf of the Loyalist cause.





FREDERIC MARCH, Treasurer

Sponsor in 1943 of Committee for Protecttion of the Foreign Born. In 1942 was a Patron of the Congress of American-Soviet Friendship. In 1945, gave award at a "New Masses" dinner. In 1945 signed statement supporting Army order granting commissions to Communist Party members on behalf of the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties.

HERMAN SHUMLIN, Chairman of Finance Committee

Contribution to American Peace Mobilization picketing the White House. According to the "Daily Worker" of Feb. 21, 1940, he signed a letter to President Roosevelt and Attorney General Jackson protesting attack to Veterans of Abraham Lincoln Brigade and "condemning war hysteria now being whipped up by the Roosevelt Administration". Signed statement sponsored by the Council for Pan American Democracy. Vice President for the Committee for HarryBridges praising Bridges. Member of the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER. Executive Board member of American League for Peace and Democracy. Is reported to have contributed heavily in a financial way to the Communist Party. Tried to prevent a theater performance for benefit of Finland when that country was attacked by Soviet Russia; in 1940 signed a petition asking for immediate dismissal of charges against SAMUEL ADAMS DARCY, then a Communist Party leader in California. On March 5, 1941 HERMAN SHUMLIN urged President and Congress to uphold the rights of the Communist Party in the United Guest at a testimonial dinner for States. THEODORE DREISER, Communist Party author. Contributed \$1,000 to Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in 1945. In 1941 sponsor and member American Council on Soviet Relations. In 1939 Executive Board member of American League for Peace and Democracy. In 1941 sponsor of American Rescue Ship Mission.

She is the full time Executive Director of subject organization and performs most of the . details for the ICCASP. She is reported to be the wife of one PETE WEINSTEIN who is Director of the Public Relations of the War Relief Fund of the Americans of South Slavic Descent, 58 Park Avenue, New York City, He is reported to be a member of the Party and is very friendly with NAT EINHORN, Executive Secretary of the American Wewspaper Guild and also reported to be a Party member. The Congress of American Soviet Friendship held a convention on November 6-7, 1943 at Madison Square Garden, New York City. Miss HANNAH DORNER was Publicity Director for this Congress which celebrated the anniversary of the founding of the Soviet Union and the 10th anniversary of American Soviet diplomatic relations. She is connected with the National Council of American Soviet Friendship. She was a guest at a dinner. in tribute to the Red Army February 21, 1944. ALEXANDER LEOTRACHTENBERG, CP leader in New York, was invited to a meeting at her home, 340 Riverside Drive, NYC, on June 16, 1944. He was invited by SAM XEVIN. It was further reported to this office that ALEXANDER LEO TRACHTEMBERG

and A. A. HELLER during the period when both were connected with INTERNATIONAL PUBLISHERS, (A. A. HELLER has since resigned from the CP and is a follower of Earl Browder), held a conference concerning a meeting of the Jefferson School of Social Science, a Communist school in New York City. HELLER mentioned HANNAH DORNER stating, "She is sort of an advertising specialist". TRACHTENBERG stated that HANNAH DORNER did publicity for the National Council of American Soviet Friendship, She was listed as being a member of the Advisory Committee of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee to assist that committee in fund raising.

He did not agree with the JACQUES DUCLOS article. Thought CPA under BROWDER was following a basically correct policy. Supported the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

Signed statement for National Federation for Constitutional Liberties supporting Army in granting commissions to Communists.

EVIDENCE OF COMMUNIST PARTY INFILTRATION, INFILIENCE AND CONTROL OF THE ICCASP Machine Galacter

Confidential Informant T-1, a most reliable and accurate infor-7 mant, was present at the State Convention of the Communist Party in New York City in July of 1945 and again during August 10 to 12, 1945. Informant T-1 stated that one JANE WOFFMAN, in giving information concerning the Cultural Section of the Party, among other things stated.

"Besides being members of these trade unions, the comrades of the Cultural Section have helped to organize and build a vitally important mass organization. I think one which you all know as, Comrades, the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions and which you no doubt will remember in the past election campaign as a committee which is based and has as its program reconversion and anti-discrimination



Many of the delegates felt at the last State Convention (July 1945) that there was a leftist sectarian tendency. It was rectified here today on the floor and at the national convention, but there was a tendency to slur over and underestimate the necessity often point out by Ienin of aligning the middle class intellectuals and professionals as well as other progressives in the middle strata, of allying these broad groups of the working class and linking them inextricably to the working class as part of the democratic coalition.

Confidential Informant T-1 stated that in listing the qualifications of recommended members of the new State Committee of the New York State Communist Party, RENJAMIN J DAVIS, JR. of the National Committee read the qualifications of LIONEL BERMAN as follows

"Comrade Berman is the head of the Cultural Section of the Party. He is a very able and effective organizer. He was the first choice of the comrades in the Cultural Section to be on the State Committee and it seems to me in his work in the past period, particularly in the elections when he was one of those instrumental in setting up the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, he has demonstrated a very excellent capacity for organization of a very excellent political character."

The "New Leader", the anti-Communist weekly published in New York, in a column entitled "Is the ICCASP A Communist Front", listed certain information in the affirmative. It pointed out that the ICCASP took a lead at a "Conference on Puerto Rico's Right to Freedom" held at the Essek House, New York City, Associated with the organization were the following pro-Communist organizations:

The NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD
THE NATIONAL NEGRO CONGRESS
COUNCIL FOR PAN AMERICAN DEMOCRACY
COUNCIL ON AFRICAN AFFAIRS.

The chairman of one session of this joint meeting was FREDERICK VANDERBILLY FIELD, columnist for the "Daily Worker" and who was seen in attendance at the National Convention of the Communist Party. Chairman of another



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session was FERDINAND C. SMITH of the NATIONAL MARITIME UNION, also a member of the Communist Party. Among other sponsors of this conference which the "NewLeader" listed as Communists are ROCKWELL KENT, head of the INTERNATIONAL WORKERS ORDER; LANGSTON HUCHES, and IRVING POTASH, member of the National Board of the Communist Party. Other Communist sponsors were LOUIS MERRILL, SAUL MILLS, MICHAEL QUILL, PAUL ROBESON, JOSEPH SELLY, and MAX ERGAN, all very reliably reported to be members of the Communist Party.

The ICCASP for some time has carried on its payroll as Press Agent, according to the "New Leader", "An avowed Communist RAYYORR", He is reported to be receiving 18,000 a year as the ICCASP publicity man. TORR was formerly employed by the "Daily Worker" in 1938 and 1939. According to FREDERICK TOLTMAN of the New York WORLD, TORR admitted to him some time ago that he was a member of the Communist Party.

The "New Leader" further reported that the ONION FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION (liberal but non-Communist) refused to unite with the ICCASP on a projected plan to bring about a united front of various groups, the ICCASP incients that the LAWYERS QUILD and the NATIONAL FEDERATION FOR CONSTITUTIONAL LIBERTIES, both Farty fronts, be included.

The "New Leader" quoted from the "Daily Worker" of Desember 24, 1944, SAMUEL SILLEN'S column, that "It is good news and important news that a new Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions has been organized for political action to insure victory and security." The "New Leader" stated that the Daily Worker has never in 23 years backed any organization which was critical of Communism.

The "New leader" reported that a review of just a few issues of "The Independent", the ICCASP official organ, revealed articles by ALLAN SHESE, defender of Communism in Spain, ANTON AEFREIGIER, a former teacher at Communist art schools, and MARTIN POPPER of the LAWYERS GUILD. It stated that "The Independent" does not carry one word of criticism against the Communist Party or Russia's imperialism, although it is full of proclamations dealing with world labor, and freedom of nations.

As further evidence of Communist infiltration and control, the Buffalo Field Division in a letter dated February 27, 1945 reported that Confidential Informant whose identity is known to the Bureau, had reported that

ALBERT BY KAHN, who is a member of the Communist Party, Cultural Section, and who attended as a delegate the New York State Convention of the Communist Party, prepared an advertisement for the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE. This advertisement related to the strikes then going on in American industry and the right of American working men and women to secura for themselves a higher living wage. The advertisement stated, "But the giant industrial corporations, whose wartime profit reached unprecedented heights, refuse to grant this living wage to the working men and women in their employ."

Concerning further Communist influence and infiltration into the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE, it was reported that ANGUS CAMERON, who has been reported by the Boston Office to be a member of the Communist Party, addressed the Writing and Publishing Panel of a conference called by the subject committee. JOSEPH R. BRODSKY, the Communist Party attorney and himself a Party member, was likewise a speaker at this conference, representing Local 802 of the American Federation of Masicians, AFL. WILLIAM S. CALLMOR was chairman of the Radio Panel. PETER LYON, a radio script writer and known to this office to be a member of the Panty, was also a speaker.

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stated that recently the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE has distributed leaflets "Protest the Freeport and Tennessee Killings", which the complainant stated was typical of the activities the ICC is now interested in.

On January 23, 1946, a special meeting was called by the Art Division of the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE. Speakers were NAX EBER, head for the MERICAN ARTISTS CONGRESS; JOSE FERRER; EUGENE P. CONNOLLY, New York City Councilman, and HENRY BILLINGS, who acted as chairman. EUGENE P. CONNOLLY has been reliably reported to be a secret member of the Communist Party, a member of the New York County and the New York County Committee of the Communist Party and who was elected to the New York City Council with the help and assistance of the American Labor Party. CONNOLLY urged a Federal WPA Art

New York City: resorted to this office that he is an actor and a member of the cast of he advised that most of the members of the cast were Communists, and that as a member of this cast he was forced to join the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE OF THE ARTS, SCIENCES AND PROFESSIONS, which he stated is dominated by the Communist Party. He stated that he is also a member of ACTORS EQUITY ASSOCIATION which is rapidly being infiltrated by Communists in the key positions of this union. He stated he joined the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE only to protect his position.

On Monday, February 4, 1946, the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE sponsored a meeting entitled, "The Confidential Report on China", The speakers were HARRISON FORMAN, the author of "The Report from Red China"; ISRAEL EPSIEIN, author of "The Peoples War", and VILLIM SIOAN, of Henry Holt and Company, book publishers. Mr. FORMAN, the main speaker, in following the Communist Party line, went into the subject of the presence of American troops in China. He stated that the American troops should be withdrawn from China and that Chian Kai Shek's army is not a national army, but only a private Army. He admitted that the Chinese Army is a private Army. He said the main problem of China is one of unity; that the Communists really fought against the daps with hardly any arms or no material from America; and that he spoke from personal experience when he reported about the fighting done by the Chinese Communists. On the other hand, he stated, Chiang's Army deserted whole areas of

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
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battle leaving the Chinese people to their own destiny. He stated that instead of using American transports to transport China, the United States could use these boats to better advantage by transporting American troops out of China.

FORMAN in his remarks further stated that the Chinese Communists constitute a regime and not an illegal mob with one million regular troops and two million five hundred thousand trained and armedicivilians who look to Yenan for leadership. He declared that CHIANG continues in power only because of American support. He stated peace can come to China only when American troops are evacuated.

HOWARD FAST, who was another speaker at this rally, stated that the principles of the ICCASP were unalterably opposed to Fascism, anti-Semitism, Jim-Crowism, etc.

TSRAEL EPSTEIN, who is connected with the "Allied Labor News", a pro-Communist news agency, spoke and referred to "Chian Kai Shek's corrupt dictatorship".

The literature table in the back of the room contained Communist publications for sale such as the pamphlet by JOSEPH JORTH, member of the Communist Party and editor of "New Masses".

The INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE OF THE ARTS SCIENCES AND PROFESSIONS is preparing a pamphlet attacking the Committee on Un-incritan Activities.

The New York THES for March 14, 1946 contained a full page advertisement under the auspices of the Citizens United to Abolish the WoodRankin Committee, Suite 170, Hotel astor, New York City. This is the address
of the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE OF THE ARTS, SCIENCES AND PROFESSIONS.
A list of the names mentioned in the edvertisement of those who are supporting
this new committee contained virtually every member of the Board of Directors
and leading members of the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE.

It is noted that one of the grievances the INDEPENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE has against the House Un-American activities Committee is the fact that it is investigating the COUNT ANTI-FASCIST REFUGER COMMITTEE, THE MATIONAL COUNCIL OF AMERICAN SOVIET FRIENDSHIP, certain pro-Communist radio commentators, and the NATIONAL COMMITTEE TO COMBIT ANTI SENTITISM. The committees listed above have been reliably reported to be Communist Party front organizations.

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
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


