### FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

### Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

### Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

### Part 3: General Information:

- (i) Record Searches. The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. A standard search normally consists of a search for main files in the Central Records System (CRS), an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include references, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files. - (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. - (iv) National Name Check Program (NNCP). The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

#### EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual:
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552a

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.



Investigation at Nogales, Arizona reflected that MARIA MORENO, sister of applicant's mother, CARMEN MORENO, married a German, WILLIAM ODOMKIRCHEN (phonetic), whom she later divorced. They resided at San Gabriel, California near the Town House night club and since her divorce, Mrs. MARIA ODOMKIRCHEN has continued to reside at this location with her children.

The former chief of police at Nogales, Arizona, who is now the county jailer, reported that ODOMKIHCHEN is an ex-German Army officer of the First World War and was reportedly pro-German and was possibly a member of the German-American Bund. CDOMKIRCHEN was reportedly investigated by the Los Angeles Division for his German activities. ODOMKIRCHEN reportedly worked for defense plants in both Los Angeles and San Diego, California during the war.

Both Los Angeles and San Diego are requested to furnish any information in their files concerning the German activities of ODOMKIRCHEN. In view of the alleged activity of MARIA ODOMKIRCHEN's husband, it is suggested also that Los Angeles obtain comments as to her present loyalty, reputation and character

As a matter of information, the Inreau advised as follows:

"In the case entitled 'Dr. EZRA POUND, TREASON, one HUGH ANGLETON, 325 E. 72nd Street, New York City, brother of Lieutenant JAMES J. ANGLETON, who may be identical with applicant, advised that he and JAMES went to Italy in June, 1939, on an Italian ship. POUND was also aboard this vessel. HUGH ANGLETON recalled that JAMES was instrumentalvinihaving POUND lecture for a club at Harvard during the Spring term of 1939.

Dr. JOSEPH R. NUMBERS, Idaho Building, stated his father was the attending physician when the Applicant was born. His father has since died. Dr. NUMBERS advised that he knew the family well and associated with the Applicant's father and mother socially. He remarked that the family left Boise about 1925 while the father was advancing rapidly in the employ of the National Cash Register Company. Prior to that time the father had been an outstanding salesman for the Idaho Candy Company, Boise. Dr. NUMBERS remarked that he knew Applicant as a youngster but had not seen him since he left Boise. Dr. NUMBERS stated he considered the family an outstanding one whose reputation was spotless and whose patriotism and loyalty he would not question.

CHARLES A. ADAMS, General Manager, Idaho Candy Company, 412 South Eighth, advised he has known the ANGLETON family since 1914, and recalls the Applicant as a youngster but has not seen him since about 1925 when the family moved to San Francisco, California. He said the family enjoyed a splendid reputation and that its loyalty and patriotism was of the highest order.

CLARENCE WAKEMAN, Engineer, Idaho Candy Company, 412 South Eighth, stated he had known the ANGLETON family since 1912. The father was employed as a salesman by the candy company from approximately 1919 until 1923 when he resigned to accept employment with the National Cash Register Company. The Applicant's father served in both World Wars and was decorated for outstanding service on numerous occasions. WAKEMAN stated he lived as a neighbor to the ANGLETON family in the Zurcher Apartments, Boise, and would not hesitate to state that the family reputation is excellent. He recalled the Applicant as a small boy but has not seen him since 1928 when he visited the ANGLETON family at Dayton, Ohio.

There was no information concerning any member of the ANGLETON family at the Boise Credit Bureau, the Boise Police Department, or the Ada County Sheriff's Office.

from JAMES J. ANGLETON. This file indicated that JAMES J. ANGLETON is a non-resident of Tucson, Arizona, and that his address was care of American Embassy, Rome, Italy, where he was an Army Captain. She and ANGLETON were married on July 17, 1943 at Battle Creek. Michigan. They had one child who was born in

CICELY's complaint charged ANGLETON of being guilty of cruel treatment toward her; that he has become so engrossed and absorbed in his work, that he regards his marriage with her as an impediment that should be removed; that by reasons thereof, he has continuously neglected her and has advised her that he should not be under the restraint of marriage and should be free of all marital obligations; that his actions and attitude as aforesaid have persisisted for a period of more than one year to her mental and physical distress. Wherefore, she prays for judgment that the bonds of matrimony existing between them be dissolved; that she be awarded the custody of their child with rights of reasonable visitation on his part.

The summons was mailed to ANGLETON and an attorney was appointed for him, and who also wrote him. None of these communications were answered by him.

A dismissal notice was filed without comment in the Clerk's office, Superior Court, Tucson, by Mrs. ANGLETON's attorneys, CONNER, JONES and MURPHY on October 22, 1948.

Mr. JAMES MURPHY, Valley National Bank Building, advised he was not acquainted with the facts in this divorce case, however, he said he did know CICELY, but not her husband. Mr. MURPHY advised that CICELY D'AUTREMONT is the daughter of HUBERT H. (deceased) and Mrs. HELEN D'AUTREMONT, pioneer residents of Tucson, Arizona. Her father was formerly a State Senator and President of the Southern Arizona Bank and Trust Company. He was of the opinion they were of excellent regutation and good loyal Americans.

Mr. CHARLES CONNER, of CONNER, JONES and MURPHY Law Firm, stated he was of the opinion that CICELY ANGLETON was not serious when she filed the complaint to divorce ANGLETON. He said she requested that the complaint she filed be dismissed which was done and that she and ANGLETON are presently reported to be on good terms. Mr. CONNER stated he was not acquainted with the applicant, however, he does know his wife and members of the D'AUTREMONT family. He regarded them as being people of good reputation, character and loyal Americans.

Mr. JOHN SAKRISON, President of the Souther Arizona Bank and Trust Company, advised he is not acquainted with applicant, however, he is well acquainted with his wife and members of the D'AUTREMONT family. To his knowledge, ANGLETON never actually resided in Tucson, however

he has visited his inlaws. Mr. SAKRISON considered applicant's wife and other members of her family as being of unquestionable patriotism and loyalty. He also regarded them as being of excellent reputations and character. He said he has never heard of anything of a disloyal or derogatory nature concerning applicant. Mr. SAKRISON, also verified the residence of applicant's mother-in-law, HELEN D'AUTREMONT, 5045 East Grant Road, Tucson, Arizona.

Files of the Tucson Police Department failed to contain ANGLETON's or his wifes name.

The following investigation was conducted by SA RICHARD BERT CARTER.

### AT NOGALES, ARIZONA

Mrs. DOROTHY TITCOMB. Clerk of the Santa Cruz County Superior Court, made available her records, which reflected that JAMES H. ANGLETON, age 28, and CARMEN MORENO, age 18, were married December 18, 1916 at Nogales, Arizona, by Reverend G. C. VAN GOETHEM, in the presence of ROLLA D. DAVIS and ANITA MORENO. Mrs. TITCOMB stated that Mrs. ANGLETON automatically became an American citizen by her marriage to an American citizen, and that prior to 1923 no document of any kind had to be filed to indicate such citizenship.

JOSE M. SOTO, former Chief of Police and present county jailer at the courthouse, reported that a sister of CARMEN MORENO, (who is believed to be identical with the mother of applicant) is named MARIA MORENO, and the latter was a former resident of Nogales. SOTO reported that to the best of his knowledge, MARIA MORENO was a loyal American citizen of good reputation and character, whose only foreign connections were some relatives residing in Mexico. MARIA MORENO is believed to have married a German, WILLIAM ODOMKIRCHEN (phonetic) whom she later divorced. They resided at San Gabriel, California, near the Town House night club, and since her divorce. Mrs. ODOMKIRCHEN has continued to reside at this location with her children. SOTO stated ODOMKIRCHEN worked for defense plants in Los Angeles and San Diego, California, during the war. ODOMKIRCHEN had been a German army officer during the first World War and was reportedly pro-German and there was a rumor going around that ODOMKIRCHEN was a member of the German-American Bund. SOTO stated that he had no personal knowledge of any such activity and knew of no one in Nogales who could give any further details about this activity, but stated that he believed ODOMKIRCHEN was investigated by the FBI at Los Angeles, California. The only occasion when ODOMKIRCHEN was at Nogales was with his wife to visit his mother-in-law, MERCEDES CORALES de MORENO, who continues to reside at 209 Sonoita Avenue, Nogales. SOTO stated that MERCEDES MORENO is a Mexican citizen, but is believed to be loyal to the United States, which has been her land of residence for many years, and believed to be a person of good character and reputation.

SOTO stated that ANITA MORENO, who is believed to be a sister of applicant's mother, married and divorced JAMES WATSON, and is now married to SIMON B. DRUM, better known as JACK DRUM, who is with the Hoof and Mouth Disease Control group working for the U. S. Department of Agriculture at Mexico City, Mexico. ANITA MORENO DRUM formerly resided at Magdalena, Sonora, Mexico.

HARRY A. WILSON, assistant manager, and Miss MARY WILLIAMS, secretary, Valley National Bank, Nogales Branch, reported that they are acquainted with CARMEN and ANITA MORENO and their mother MERCEDES MORENO and that to the best of their knowledge, the MORENO's are all loyal to the United States and are persons of good reputations and character with no foreign connections, other than relatives in Mexico.

No record for ANGLETON or the MORENO's was found at the following places: Nogales Police Department, Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office, Nogales Merchants' Credit Association.



which was from 1943 to 1945, he had always found ANGLETON to be a person of good character, reputable associates, and unquestionably loyal to the United States. He further stated that ANGLETON was most discreet and very conscientious in his work.

Mr. WILL advised that he had heard ANGLETON speak of his sister, whose name he cannot recall, numerous times, and also that he had met ANGLETON's father, who was associated with the National Cash Register Company in Italy. Mr. WILL further stated that he at no time had ever heard ANGLETON speak of any brothers. He stated that he recalled ANGLETON having attended for a short time some school in England, and that he did recall ANGLETON having spoken of attending prep schools in England and in the United States, the names of which he could not recall.

Mr. WILL advised that during his short acquaintanceship with ANGLETON'S father, he appeared to be a person of good reputation. Mr. WILL stated that the National Cash Register Company in Italy to his knowledge is a large company enjoying a favorable reputation. Mr. WILL advised that he knew of no subversive foreign tendencies or sympathies on the part of ANGLETON and that he would recommend ANGLETON very highly for a position of trust.

as such he had used a large amount of EZRA POUND in his selection of authors. PEARSON stated that ANGLETON had discontinued POUND when he realized that it was understood that POUND was pro-Fascist.

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect that Professor NORMAN HOIMES PEARSON, who may be identical with Professor NORMAN H. PEARSON at Yale University, was a signer of a statement by the "League of American Writers" in behalf of a second front in 1942.

HCUA files further reflect that NORMAN H. FEARSON was a sponsor of the "Artists Front to Win the War" in October, 1942. It is to be noted that the "League of American Writers" has been cited by the Attorney General as coming under the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The "Artist Front to Win the War" was cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities on March 29, 1944.

R. L. PURDY, Assistant Professor of English, Yale University, advised that he had had ANGLETON as a student in Victorian Poetry in 1940 and that it was his opinion that ANGLETON was advanced in thinking. PURDY stated that ANGLETON did not take to the course in Victorian Poetry but was very much enthused with the writings of EZRA POUND, which writings he included in his poetry magazine "FURIOSO". PURDY stated further that ANGLETON had given him the impression of being loyal and patriotic to the United States.

H. B. FISHER, Liaison Officer, Yale University, advised that his records reflected that ANGLETON had been born December 19, 1917, at Boise, Idaho; that his father was JAMES HUGH ANGLETON, born at Sharpsburg, Illinois, and that his mother was CARMEN MERCEDES MORENO, born in Mexico. FISHER further stated that the records reflected that ANGLETON prepared at Malvern College, Malvern, England, entered Yale in September 1937, receiving a B.A. Degree in 1941. It was also reflected that ANGLETON entered the Armed Services November 17, 1943, as a Corporal and that prior to this service was a student at the Harvard Law School.

No credit or criminal record of ANGLETON was located in the New Haven area.





He stated that he has never heard anything derogatory concerning applicant or his family and that he considers them to have excellent character and to be patriotic, loyal American people of good reputation.

Mr. S. C. ALLYN, President, National Cash Register Company, reference, advised that he has known applicant's father since 1925 as a former employee of the National Cash Register Company and at present as an Agent in business for himself in Italy for the National Cash Register Company. He stated in this way he has also known applicant and his mother, and that he considers the entire family as above reproach in character, reputation, associates and loyalty. He said that the entire ANGLETON family can be trusted to the limit with any confidential information to the best of his belief.


Mrs. NELL ECKLEY, advised that for approximately two years around 1930 applicant and his father and mother resided at 105 Stonemill Road as her neighbors. During this time she found them to be a very lovely family and they had a very good reputation in the community. She stated that applicant's mother was Mexican by birth and that she reared applicant in a very fine manner. Mrs. ECKLEY advised she knew nothing whatever derogatory concerning applicant or his family.

Mr. FRANK THEOBAOD, advised that he knew applicant and his family as neighbors around 1930 for approximately two years and that he observed them to be a very nice family. He stated that at that time he felt certain that their character, reputation, patriotism and loyalty was above repreach.

Mrs. MABEL ADDIS, Credit Bureau of Dayton, Inc., advised she had a favorable record concerning applicant's father, JAMES HUGH ANGLETON and mother, CARMEN ANGLETON, Mexican, for the period of 1929 to 1933 at which time they resided at 105 Stonemill Road, Dayton, Ohio.

The Bureau of Identification, Dayton Police Department, advised they have no record of applicant or any member of his family.

In February, 1941, the files of the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization Service, Federal Building, Cleveland, Ohio, reflected that ODENKTRCHEN was born in Rheyat, Germany, on March 19, 1899, and lived in Germany until he arrived in the United States through New York City on October 10, 1923. According to these records, he married MARTA MORINA on October 4, 1928, at Nogales, Arizona. MORINA was born at Gumpas, Mexico, April 8, 1908, and entered the United States at Nogales. Arizona. in 1913. There were two children by this marriage;

ODENKIRCHEN'S Declaration of Intention was filed at Orland, California, Butte County Court, December 3, 1923, and a second Declaration of Intention was filed in the U. S. District Court at Cleveland, Ohio, March 15, 1932. His final citizenship papers were received at the U. S. District Court on October 4, 1934, in Cleveland, Ohio.

On July 29, 1940, Mr. G. N. LYNCH, Manager, Sears Roebuck and Company, San Diego, advised that ODENKIRCHEN had recently been employed by his company as a vacuum cleaner salesman, and upon checking his personal history he ascertained that ODENKIRCHEN had been employed by this company at Glendale, California, and was discharged for alleged pro-Nazi statements which he made to customers. Mr. LYNCH stated that the subject spoke German fluently and that while talking to a woman in Pasadena, California, who was a customer of Sears Roebuck and Company he condemned the present conditions in this country in no uncertain terms.

On October 3, 1940, information was received through the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office to the effect that an insurance company investigator from Los Angeles, while investigating a fire in Phoenix, Arizona, had interviewed a man by the name of SCHARNOFF, who stated that his former partner, Mr. ODERKURKEN, was a former member of the Gestapo and was also a former military officer in the German Army, and that he is now engaged in espionage work and sends reports regularly to Germany.

Mr. LOUIS ASTHUR SCHARNOFF,
Chio, was interviewed in February, 1941, at Cleveland, and he stated that he had formerly been associated with ODENKIRCHEN in Phoenix, Arizona, in 1940. SCHARNOFF vigorously denied having made any statement concerning the subject's connection with the German Gestapo or any espionage or sabotage work. SCHARNOFF stated, however, that ODENKIRCHEN was of the opinion HITLER had done a lot for Germany. SCHARNOFF continued by stating that ODENKIRCHEN

had said that he would not like to see the United States go to war against Germany, but SCHARNOFF stated he believed that ODENKIRCHEN was no different in this regard from the average individual in this country, and he did not believe that ODCNKIRGHEN was engaged in any subversive activities.

On June 14. 1940. Mrs. W. T. SIMPSON, wife of Dr. W. T. SIMPSON. California, advised that she was suspicious of WILLIAM CDENKIECHEN, 646 North 2nd Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona. She stated that her daughter had met CDENKIRCHEN in Phoenix and had become engaged to him and was to be rarried in a short time. She continued that recently her daughter had returned from Phoenix and had brought CDENKIRCHEN to her house, where, during a conversation, he had told her that he was a former Captain in the German Army. He made the statement that there was no such thing as a Fifth Column, and when Ers. SIMFSON asked him how the Germans had captured Norway, he stated that Norway was predominantly German anyway, and that it should have been taken by the Germans.

Mrs. SIMPSON stated that a few months ago ODENKIRCHIN had made a trip to San Francisco, where he called on FRITZ MEDELANN, German Consul, and offered to do anything he could to clarify the position of the German ration in this country.

On September 10, 1940, FUGH MURRAY. California, Branch Lanager, Pacific Coast Division of the Hoover Vacuum Cleaner Company, called at the Los Angeles Office and advised that CDE.NKIRCHEN, an employee of that company, was suspected of being a Fifth Columnist. MURRAY continued by stating that ODENKIKCHEN was living much higher than his salary warranted, and it was his opinion that CDENKIRCHEN should be watched.

On April 8, 1941, GUY E. MC COMI. California, stated that one JACK BRADSHAW, California, had called to his attention the fact that CDENKIRCHEN. who was engaged in the electrical appliance business, is outspoken in his praise of the Mazi order in Europe, is particularly voluble in the telling of tales of his activities during the First World War, claiming to have been a member of the German Military General Staff. He stated that on one occasion

Mrs. K. M. PRANIER, stated that she had been a neighbor of ODENKIRGHEN and his wife for several months and had engaged both of them in conversation from time to time, but had never heard either of them make any derogatory statement concerning this government, and she knew nothing derogatory concerning either of them.

Wr. J. F. LENZ, who is employed as a meat cutter at Youngs Market, residing at stated that he is the owner of the apartment house at which ODENKTROHEN and his wife lived. He described them as satisfactory, quiet, respectable neighbors. He stated that he had heard neither of them make any unamerican statements, and had noticed nothing unusual regarding their activities.

On July 1, 1942, WIILIAM LUDWIG JOSEPH ODENKIRCHEN appeared at the San Diego Office and produced a letter from the San Diego County Civil Service Commission dated June 26, 1942, which advised that he had been removed from the eligible list for a position as Deputy Sheriff. At this time ODENKIRCHEN stated that he was thoroughly American and democratic in his viewpoint, that he was definitely for America and against Germany, and that he was willing to offer his services to help fight subversive activities, and that he hated HITLER and the Nazi regime. He stated that he married BARBARA SILIPSON in 1940 at Phoenix. Arizona. Who is the daughter of Dr. W. I. SIMPSON, California. He gave his address at this time as Box 181, Route 2, San Diego, California.

Office and gave detailed information regarding his background, and again offered his assistance to the Bureau in connection with the war effort. He stated that he had been connected with the Fourth Bavarian Infantry from the beginning of the First World Mar until 1922, being given the rank of Captain at the time of his departure. He stated that he came to the United States in 1923, becoming a naturalized citizen in 1935. According to CDENKINGHEN, he waited accepting citizenship until he was sure he was willing to renounce his allegiance to Germany before he did so. He stated that in 1935 he was certain that he was ready to adopt the United States as his country, right or wrong. He continued by saying that his sister, ELETE CDENKINGHEN, is presently one of the secretaries in the office of JOSEFH GOMBELLS, German Minister of

Propaganda, and that GCEBBEIS was a former schoolmate of his. He stated that he had been a friend of many staunch Mazis, including HEMMAN GCERING.

He explained his trip to San Francisco to see FRITZ WIEDELIANN, German Consul, by saying that this was a business trip for the purpose of trying to recover his share of his father's estate in Germany. He stated that WIEDELIANN was not friendly with him, and he was unsuccessful in his attempt to secure a portion of this estate.

ODENKIRCHEN stated that while an officer during World War I during a battle for one of the Belgium towns, his troops were fired upon by guerrillas, and many of the German soldiers were killed or wounded by this fire. In an attempt to locate the snipers the German soldiers entered a church and found a priest and another man, apparently praying. He said that his troops searched the church, and immediately behind the alter found rifles which were still hot. He said that the priest was killed for this reason, and stated that he himself did not kill the priest.

ODENKIRCHEN stated that he had married twice, one time to a girl of Mexican descent, and presently to a girl of English descent.

He further stated that he was a member of the German Guard of Arms, which escorted the Kaiser to Doorn when he retreated at the close of the First World War. He denied that he had ever been a member of the German-American Bund in Can Diego.

ODENKIRCHEN insisted that the sole purpose of this visit to the San Diego Office was to offer his assistance to this Bureau in any way that he might be used to further the war effort.

In October, 1942, Mrs. MERCEDES MAKENO, 209 Sonoita Avenue, Nogales, Arizona, was interviewed and stated that her daughter, MARIA MARENO, was married to WILLIAM ODENKIRCHEN.

Mrs. MARIA MARENO CHENKIRCHEN, who is believed identical with the applicant's aunt, was interviewed at Tucson, Arizona, and stated that she married ODENKIRCHEN October 4, 1928, and received a divorce from him in Nogales, Arizona, on June 21, 1939. Neither ODENKIRCHEN'S wife nor his mother-in-law could furnish any definite information reflecting disloyalty on the part of CDENKIRCHEN.

The facts in the case regarding WILLIAM LUBJIG JOSEPH CDENKINCHEN were presented to Assistant U. S. Attorney JOHN GAULT on April 16.

ODENKIRCHEN was formerly married to a MARIA MORENO and resided with her and their two children in San Gabriel, California. He was reported to have been divorced by MARIA MORENO in Mexico and subsequently, about 1940. married BARBARA COLE.

Dr. P. L. HARRINGTON, advised in 1944 that he knew that BARBARA COLE's parents, Dr. and Mrs. W. I. SIMPSON, had been very much opposed to their daughter's marriage to ODENKIRCHEN because they were of the opinion that ODENKIRCHEN was an agent working in behalf of the German Government.

charles P. Harris,

of the SIMPSON family, advised that he first met ODENKIRCHEN in 1940, and
on their first meeting ODENKIRCHEN had displayed outwardly his respect for
the Nazi Government and its ideologies. It was his opinion that ODENKIRCHEN
was definitely pro-German, and by means of a proper marriage hoped to meet
individuals who could furnish him with information vital to the war effort.
He recalled that ODENKIRCHEN told him that his, ODENKIRCHEN's, sister was
a secretary to GOEBBEIS, Propaganda Minister for the German Nazi Government,
and that his father had been a high officer in the German Nazi Government.

FABION LEPPICK, a close friend of ODENKIRCHEN's wife, BARBARA COLE, reported that ODENKIRCHEN told him that he had visited FRITZ WIEDEMAN, who was the German Consul General in San Francisco, California, and that WIEDEMAN was a friend of his. According to LEPPICK, ODENKIRCHEN's wife, BARBARA, told him that on numerous occasions ODENKIRCHEN, while listening to the radio and hearing reports of German losses or disasters, would become violent and throw furniture at the radio.

S. G. GRAMEN, advised in 1944 that he had been retained by BARBARA ODENKIRCHEN to handle divorce proceedings for her against her husband, WILLIAM ODENKIRCHEN, and that BARBARA had indicated in an interview that her husband had strong Nazi sympathies and that he had made numerous remarks that were derogatory to the United States Government.







no discussion ever took place between them concerning same. He stated that since his discharge from the service he has not had a great deal of contact with the applicant and is not presently certain of his present occupation. He stated that from what he knew of the applicant, he would not hesitate to recommend him from a standpoint of reputation, character, honesty, dependability, loyalty and patriotism. WHITTEMORE felt that applicant's war record would speak well enough of his past and he considered him to be the type of person that could very capably handle a position of trust.

Concerning the applicant's background, WHITTEMORE stated that he was born in Idaho and during his early youth the family moved to Ohio where applicant's father was made an official of the National Cash Register Company. He stated applicant's father later was transferred to Italy as Italian representative of the above company, making it necessary for the family to also move to Italy. He related that applicant's prep training was received in England and following his graduation he returned to the states and attended Yale University. Mr. WHITTEMORE stated that he was not too well acquainted with the whereabouts and activities of applicant's family and relatives but understood that he had a married sister presently living in Italy who is married to a writer on the staff of the Saturday Evening Post. He further related that the last he heard, applicant's mother and father are presently residing somewhere in Italy.

Mr. WHITTEMORE stated that even though it appears that applicant has considerable connections in foreign countries, he believes that his loyalty is centered entirely in the United States and that he could not be considered a risk in connection with the security of this country. He stated he understood that applicant's father is considered one of the bigger international business men and has always enjoyed an excellent reputation similar to that enjoyed by the rest of the applicant's family.

Mr. WHITTEMORE stated that he had not had the opportunity to become acquainted with applicant's wife but felt he could give applicant his unqualified recommendation for any position he is seeking.





Mrs. EDITH NEWTON, Registrar, Harvard Law School, Cambridge, Massachusetts, advised that the applicant was admitted to the school in September, 1941. He failed his examinations in June, 1942, but was allowed to repeat his first year. The applicant remained at the school through January, 1943, successfully completing one year of a three-year law course. Mrs. NEWTON advised that the records reflected that the applicant was born at Boise, Idaho, December 9, 1917, the son of JAMES HUGH and CARMEN MERCEDES di MORENO. Mrs. NEWTON stated that there was nothing of a derogatory nature concerning the applicant's character or loyalty on file in that office.

Miss HELEN GOODWIN, Alumni Office, Harvard Law School, Cambridge, Massachusetts, advised that during the applicant's attendance at the Law School he resided at 19 Farwell Place, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Correspondence in the file reflects he attended the public schools in England and Yale University prior to attending the Law School. Correspondence reflects that his father was employed as President of the National Cash Register Company of Milan, Italy. The file also reflected that the applicant failed his examinations in June, 1942. In a communication addressed to the Administrative Board, he advised that his failure was attributable to the fact that

was delinquent in the amount of approximately 470 for housing and board. Miss GOODWIN stated that Professor MORGAN had notified the school that an examination of the school records reflected that the school had no reason to question the applicant's dependability. He pointed out that the applicant and family were in a rather difficult financial situation due to the freezing of the funds of the applicant's father who was living in Italy, during the early part of the war. Miss GOODWIN advised that there was nothing of a derogatory nature concerning the applicant's character or loyalty on file in that office.

Mrs. N. E. COLWELL, of the Hygiene Department of Harvard University, advised that the records of that office reflected that the applicant had contacted the department in order to receive advice concerning psychiatric treatment for another member of his family. Mrs. COLWELL stated that the applicant's record in the department was clear and there was no indication of any mental instability.

#### REFERENCE

JOHN L. SWEENEY, Curator of the Poetry Room, Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts, advised that he became acquainted with the applicant when they were both students in the law school. He stated that their association developed because they both were interested in poetry. Mr. SWEENEY advised that he had rather close contact with the applicant and members of his family, having visited with them in Italy during the past two years. He stated that the applicant can be described as a stable, reliable individual of unquestioned integrity. He advised that during their association he never observed anything which would cause him to question his loyalty and patriotism as an American citizen. He stated that the applicant's rather poor record at the law school was brought about by





L. H. SCHERB, Sr., 4725 Rosemont Street, La Crescenta, California, advised that he recalls WILLIAM ODENKIRCHEN and MARIA MORENO and knew that they were married in Nogales, Arizona; however, he was very vague about dates.


Mrs. L. H. SCHERB, Sr., advised that she was well acquainted with the MORENOs; stated that MARIA MORENO was employed by her husband as a cashier in his drug store in Nogales, and that her sister ANITA MORENO was also employed in the store. Another sister CARMEN MORENO, who was subsequently married to a person by the name ANGLETON, had been employed as a cashier in the Owl Drug Store in Nogales.

She recalls that she and her husband were witnesses to the marriage of WILLIAM ODENKIRCHEN and MARIA MORENO in Nogales, about 1928. ODENKIRCHEN, according to Mrs. SCHERB, was merely an acquaintance of theirs and she has had no contact with ODENKIRCHEN or MARIA MORENO since that time. She has been told that ODENKIRCHEN and MARIA were subsequently divorced and that ODENKIRCHEN has remarried.

Mrs. SCHERB advised that she would question ODENKIRCHEN's loyalty to the United States; however, upon questioning, could give no basis for this other than that she believes that a person "who is once a German, is always a German."

Neither Mr. nor Mrs. SCHERB was able to give any information concerning the activities of ODENKIRCHEN subsequent to his marriage to MARIA MORENO.

It is to be noted that Mrs. L. H. SCHERB, Sr., was described by her daughter-in-law as being mentally ill. Mrs. SCHERB, Sr., gave a considerable amount of information concerning the MORENO family which is not being reported in the body of this report since Mrs. SCHERB's reliability is questionable and since part of the information is undoubtedly hearsay. This office has no information as to the extent of this investigation, neither does it have any background information on the applicant JAMES ANGLETON or his father and mother. It is being left to the Bureau to determine if information furnished by Mrs. SCHERB warrants any further investigation.

Mr. and Mrs. SCHERB resided in Nogales, Arizona, where during the First World War Mr. SCHERB was stationed in the 11th Cavalry at Nogales. Subsequent to his discharge from the Army he opened the International Drug Company in Nogales and operated that until he retired several years ago. He employed MARIA MORENO as a cashier and also employed her sister ANITA MORENO as a cashier. Another sister CARMEN MORENO was employed by the Owl Drug Company in Nogales as a cashier. Still another sister left Nogales and settled in San Gabriel, California, where she and her husband opened a cafe and so far as Mrs. SCHERB knows, is still operating this cafe.


The MORENO sisters were all very attractive and intelligent girls. Their father was killed in a mining explosion which made it necessary that they go to work in order to support their mother.

CARMEN MORENO met a man named ANGLETON who was stationed in Nogales in the United States Army while she was employed at the Owl Drug Company, and they were married. After he was discharged from the Army he was employed by the National Cash Register Company and subsequently worked himself up in the company and she believes became Vice-President and very wealthy. In his position he travelled abroad a great deal of the time and their children were well educated. The sons were educated at Harvard and Oxford and the daughters in Switzerland. While in Italy, CARMEN had an affair with an Italian nobleman which she believes was a cause of their subsequent divorce. She recalls CARMEN visited her mother in Nogales a number of years ago and that at the time her husband was attempting to gain custody of their children.

ANITA MORENO was married to a Major WATSON who was stationed at Nogales and subsequently WATSON went with the E. I. du Pont de Nemours Corporation and became a high official with the company. They resided in Parlin, New Jersey. In connection with WATSON's work they travelled a great deal in South and Central America. ANITA subsequently divorced WATSON and married JACK DRUM and they presently reside in Mexico City, where DRUM is an official of the Mexican Government. JACK DRUM was at one time a United




States Customs Official at Nogales, Arizona; was married to a wealthy Mexican who owned the Alamo Ranch in the State of Sonora, Mexico. Mrs. SCHERB believes that ANITA was responsible for breaking up this marriage since DRUM and ANITA married soon after his divorce.

ODENKIRCHEN met ANITA in Chile, South America and had an affair with him." He subsequently came to the United States and looked up ANITA's sister MARIA in Nogales and subsequently married her.

Mrs. SCHERB advised that all of the MORENO sisters were very ambitious, in most cases were successful; however, she considers them all to be law morally and ruthless.

This is to advise that the Phoenix Division was previously requested to conduct necessary investigation to determine if WILLIAM LUDWIG JOSEPH ODENKIRCHEN, the subject of a previous sabotage investigation, was identical with the WILLIAM ODOMKIRCHEN, who married an aunt of the applicant in instant case.

Records of the Santa Cruz County Clerk, Nogales, Arizona, were checked with respect to the marriage license issued October 22, 1928 to WIIHELM ODENKIRCHEN, who married MARIAN MORENO in Nogales, Arizona, on that date. MARIAN MORENO, presently residing in Italy, is the aunt of the applicant in instant case.

The above records fail to reflect any date or place of birth for ODEN-KIRCHEN. However, witnesses to the marriage were said by persons in the clerk's office to have been very friendly with ODENKIRCHEN. These persons, L. H. SHERB and wife, described as Belgians, presently reside at 4725 Rosement, La Crescenta, California.
