## FBI FACT SHEET

- The primary functions of the FBI are national security and law enforcement.
- The FBI does not keep a file on every citizen of the United States.
- The FBI was not established until 1908 and we have very few records prior to the 1920s.
- **FBI files generally contain reports** of FBI investigations of a wide range of matters, including counterterrorism, counter-intelligence, cyber-crime, public corruption, civil rights, organized crime, white collar crime, major thefts, violent crime, and applicants.
- The FBI does not issue clearances or deny clearances for anyone other than its own personnel or
  persons having access to FBI facilities. Background investigations for security clearances are conducted by
  many different Government agencies. Persons who received a clearance while in the military or employed with
  some other government agency should contact that entity. Most government agencies have websites which are
  accessible on the internet which have their contact information.
- An identity history summary check or "rap sheet" is NOT the same as an "FBI file." It is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and related documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization or military service. The subject of a "rap sheet" may obtain a copy by submitting a written request to FBI CJIS Division Summary Request, 1000 Custer Hollow Road, Clarksburg, WV 26306. Along with a specific written request, the individual must submit a new full set of his/her fingerprints in order to locate the record, establish positive identification, and ensure that an individual's records are not disseminated to an unauthorized person. The fingerprint submission must include the subject's name, date and place of birth. There is a required fee of \$18 for this service, which must be submitted by money order or certified check made payable to the Treasury of the United States. A credit card payment option is also available. Forms for this option and additional directions may be obtained by accessing the FBI Web site at www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/identity-history-summary-checks.
- The National Name Check Program (NNCP) conducts a search of the FBI's Universal Index (UNI) to identify any information contained in FBI records that may be associated with an individual and provides the results of that search to a requesting federal, state or local agency. Names are searched in a multitude of combinations and phonetic spellings to ensure all records are located. The NNCP also searches for both "main" and "cross reference" files. A main file is an entry that carries the name corresponding to the subject of a file, while a cross reference is merely a mention of an individual contained in a file. A search of this magnitude can result in several "hits" on an individual. In each instance where UNI has identified a name variation or reference, information must be reviewed to determine if it is applicable to the individual in guestion.
- The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for records and provides copies of FBI documents responsive to Freedom of Information or Privacy Act (FOIPA) requests for information. RIDS provides responsive documents to requesters seeking "reasonably described information." For a FOIPA search, the subject's name, event, activity, or business is searched to determine whether there is an associated investigative file. This is called a "main file search" and differs from the NNCP search.



# 2 New Murder's Linked to Slaying of 5

From News Dispatches LOS ANGELES, Aug. 11-Homicide detectives fanned out across this sprawling city today chicking similarities between the murders of actress Sharow Tate and four others and the bizarre deaths of a married couple a dozen miles away.

At the same time, the only person found alive at the estate where Miss Tate and the others were slain was released from custody.

The five bodies found at the blonde actress' home in Benedicl Canyon Saturday were mutilated by multiple knife wounds, as were the bodies of market owner Leno La Bianca, 44, and his wife, Rosemary, 38. Their bodies were discovered Sunday night in their Silverlake home, which was once owned by Walt Disney.

The word "pig" was scrawled in blood on the door of Miss Tate's home, and the words "death to pigs" was daubed on the refrigerator door in the La Bianca home.

William E. Garretson, 19, a caretaker at the home leased by Miss Tate and her man Polanski, was released because of insufficient evidence against him, police said. He underwent a lie detector test and extensive questioning after he was arrested Seturday.

Kaffer and show to death with Mile Tate wore hair stylist Jay Schwing 85; coffee heiress Abiatil Folger, 26; writer Voy co Frykowski, 37; and Steven Arent, 18, who police said was a friend of Garretson and had visited him at the estate the night of the slayings.

Sebring was found with a. black hood over his head. He and Miss Tate were joined by a knotted white cord around their necks.

Police said both La Biancas had been knifed repeatedly and had makeshift hoods over their heads.

In addition, a series of X marks had been carved on La Bianca along with the word "war." A fork protruded from his body. The La Biancas were hot known to have any connection with the show business set.



The bodies of Leno and Rosemarie La Bianca were still inside and detectives were starting work on the inevitable question: was there a link between this and the killing of actress Sharon Tate and four others Friday night? Was a mad killer at large, able to strike again and again? As High Cop Sees If One woman nulled her robe closer around her, hugging.

One woman pulled her robe closer around her, hugging herself as if chilled, although the night was warm. "I don't know what to do" she said. "I can't sleep knowing whoever did this is still free. How can anyone go to sleep? I'll have to stand here all night. I feel better seeing that policeman at the arts" at the gate."

Later a gray-haired police inspector came out and said he did not think there was any connection between the two cases. If it was meant as a reassurance for the neighbors it was not helpful.

All it meant was that there was a surfeit of madness, enough for two separate horrors. The enemy was within the gates and nobody was safe.





Los Angeles. Aug. 11—Fears that a sadistic maniac was on the prowl ballooned today following a report from the coroner's office that a married couple found brutally murdered in their secluded Hollywood home were killed "in a manner closely related" to the savage murders of actress

Sharon Tate and four other persons.

"It's a carbon copy of the earlier murders," said a police investigator of the death of grocery chain heir Leno La Bianca and his wife, Rosemary, who were found dead last night, 36 hours after the discovery of the bodies of Miss Tate and the others.

A coroner's office spokesman disclosed his findings after viewing the bodies of the La Bianca couple. Full autopsies are still to be performed.

Working Around Clock

The latest murders threw the investigation of Sharon's slaying into chaos. Police, almost without clues in the death of Sharon, the wife of Polish film director Ro-man Polanski, working around the clock when they had to halt that impactionation and turn their that investigation and turn their attention to the new killings.

At least one suspect in the Tate

case is still at large. A second suspect, William E. Garretson, a 19-year-old caretaker at the Benedict Canyon estate, was released today without any charge now pending against him.

The latest victims were La Bianca, 44, an insurance agent, and his wife, Rosemary, 38. Two teenage children from a previous marriage of Mrs. La Bianca, Frank and Susan Struthers, came upon the grotesque scene as they returned home at 10:30 last night.

Stunned police found strong similarity between the murders of the La Biancas and those at the Benedict Canyon Estate .

In the latest murders, the killer dipped a hand in his victims' blood and smeared the words "death to pigs" in foot-high print across a living room wall. Police said the killer used the heel of his hand apparently in an effort not to leave any fingerprints.

The same method was soon an the earlier murders. On the door of Sharon's home-smeared in the blood by the heel of a hand-was the word "pig."

La Bianca's body was sprawled on the floor. A big heavyset man, he was wearing trousers but his white shirt had been ripped open and a meat-carving fork was stuck in his chest. The word "war" was carved into his chest, apparently with the fork. Under-neath the word, the killer had cut several Xs into his body. i white pillow cases covered

his head and a lamp cord had been field around his neck.

His wife lay face down in the bedroom next to her bed. She was wearing a negligee which had been pulled over her head. Her back had been so badly mutilated that police could not at first determine whether she had been stabbed or beaten with a whip. Later, it was theorized that she had been stabbed with a bayonet-like weapon.

Through the long night, fright-ened residents of Los Feliz stood on their lush lawns or came to the scene to watch police go in and out of the isolated singlestory white stucco home.

Though onlookers could get no

neaser than the foot of the 100foot driveway leading to the house, they watched detectives who stood silhouetted against a single house light as they dusted the front door for fingerprints.

At one point, a neighbor brought out field glasses and fo-cused through the open front door on the living room wall. He spelled out his findings to the small crowd: "d-e-a-t-h" — the first bloody word of the message.

Inch-by-Inch Search

At sunrise, eight rookie police-men in T-shirts were driven to the scene. They were handed prods and began an inch-by-inch search of the big well-manicured lawn and r guest house behind the main house.

The large house is flanked by even-more-plush estates. On one side is the enormous \$3.5 million estate built by a broadcasting excentive, Earle C. Anthony.

When Sharon's body was found at her \$200,000 red barn-style home, a nylon cord was looped around her neck and around the neck of her former boy friend, hairdresser Jay Sebring, 35, who had a piece of black cloth wrapped like a bandage around his head.

A police investigator said about the two sets of killings: "There is a similarity, but whether it is the same person, or just someone copying the Tate murders, we don't know. It's possible that someone read about the other killings and decided on the same kind of thing."

One of the strongest leads in the hunt for Sharon's killer evaporated late last night. Her fire-engine red Ferrari was

for fire-engine red Ferrari was found in Los Angeles garage. It apparently had been taken there for repairs last week. Police thought the car might have been

used for a getaway by the killer. Sharon and her four companions were killed Friday night or Saturday morning, savagely snding a party Sharon was giving for her friends.

Garretson took a 90-minute lie detector test at police headquarters yeserday. Police said it was a "favorable" test and he was returned to his cell as detectives sought to fill in some minor details. Later today, he was unconditionally released.

Garretson's attorney, Barry Tarlow, said that the Tate killer was more likely someone connected with the murder voitims themselves.

"There was a party at the house the night of the killings," he said. "From the investigation made by my office, our best guess is that whoever did it was involved in a personal way with these people who were killed."

#### **Results of Autopsies**

Coroner Thomas Noguchi released the results of autopsies which determined the causes of death for Sharon and the other four victims at her home:

Sharon, who was eight months pregnant, was killed by multiple stab wounds in the chest and back. The autopsy showed that the baby would have been a boy. Sebring died from stab wounds

In the upper part of the body. Abigail Folger, 26, heiress to the Folger coffee fortune, died

of stab wounds in the chest. Voityck Frokowski, 87, a Polish film producer, writer and direc-

tor, died of stab wounds and a gunshot wound in the back. Steven Parent, 18, of Suburban

El Monte, a friend of Garratson, was killed by multiple gunshot wounds in the chest and face.

Polanski, who returned here last night from London, where he had been working on a film for the last two months, was interviewed for several hours last night by two homicide detectives at an unknown location. Polanski was accompanied by Walter Wolf, Friend and lawyer.

On March 3, 1977, Postal Inspector advised he was aware of no postal regulations that would assist in terminating MANSON's threatening letter activity.

On February 22, 1977, California Department of Corrections, Sacramento, advised there were currently no procedures that would guarantee CHARLES MANSON could not mail communications outside the prison system. All of his mail is inspected by prison officials, but additional precautions are not possible at this time. Idditionally advised that MANSON has over the years communicated through other persons and other family members, both in and outside of the California Prison System. He furnished a list of correspondence with which follows:

At approximately 2:20 PM on April 10, 1957, Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY, Federal Correctional Institution, Terminal Island, California, advised SA EDWARD L. OLSEN telephonically that CHARLES MILLES MANSON, Federal Correctional Institution No. 3845-CAL, FBI No. 643369A, was discovered missing between 1:45 PM and 2:00 Pm this date from the premises of the United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California, where subject was assigned in a work detail doing landscape work. MOSELEY advised that he found the subject at approximately 2:10 PM on this date in a 1949 Chevrolet convertible parked north of the United States Coast Guard enclosed premises. He stated that apparently the subject was endeavoring to escape by the use of the above vehicle.

On April 10, 1957, ROBERT I. MOSELEY, Associate Warden, Federal Correctional Institution, Long Beach, California, advised that about 1:45 PM on April 10, 1957, he received information from an inmate to the effect that CHARLES MILLES MANSON was going to escape from the United States Coast Guard Detail that afternoon. MOSELEY advised he immediately endeavored to locate MANSON, with negative results. He then went to the front tower and notified the tower officer that he was of the opinion that MANSON had escaped, and asked that the officers be alerted. Associate Warden MOSELEY then decided to check the vehicles on the north side of the United States Coast Guard premises. While doing this, MOSELEY stated he found MANSON in a 1949 convertible, California license number KZB099, with his head underneath the dashboard, apparently trying to wire the starter with the ignition switch. MOSELEY stated that when MANSON saw him he got out of the car and offered no resistance.

Associate Warden MOSELEY advised that he then took the subject back to the Federal Correctional Institution at Terminal Island, California. MOSELEY stated that he searched the subject and found that he had approximately \$3.00 and some odd cents in his possession which the subject explained by saying he had sold a camera at the United States Coast Guard Station and that this camera had been given to him by one of the Coast Guard employees.

MOSELEY stated that underneath the subject's work clothes, the subject was wearing civilian clothes. MOSELEY stated that he questioned the subject regarding these civilian

clothes and the subject told him he had stolen them from one of the civilian employee's lockers at the United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California.

MOSELEY advised that in the trouser pocket of the clothes taken from the civilian employee of the Coast Guard, there was a set of car keys which apparently MANSON did not know were in this pocket, inasmuch as the car to which these keys belonged was approximately 20 feet from the car in which the subject was apprehended.

MOSELEY advised that MANSON told him he attempted to escape and gave several reasons for this attempt, namely that he was nervous and upset because of family conditions. MOSELEY stated that MANSON said that he was planning to escape and was putting his plans into effect when he was caught. MOSELEY advised that MANSON did not actually escape, although he did cut through the fence of the outer area of the United States Coast Guard perimeter. MOSELEY stated that he would call it an attempted escape, rather than an escape.

MOSELEY advised that he then returned to the United States Coast Guard parking lot and checked the 1949 Chevrolet in question and at that time found one pair of pliers and a pair of cutters on the floorboard.

He advised that he had Officer EASTMAN remain with the vehicle while he went back to the institution and telephoned the FBI at approximately 2:20 PM, advising them of the unsuccessful attempted escape of the subject.

Associate Warden MOSELEY advised that CHARLES MILLES MANSON, Federal Correctional Institution No. 3845, FBI No. 643369A, was received at the institution on May 2, 1956, based on a three-year sentence beginning April 23, 1956, for interstate transportation of a stolen motor vehicle.

On April 12, 1957, Associate Warden MOSELEY furnished the following transcript of the recording made by him on April 10, 1957, of his interview with CHARLES MILLES MANSON:

> MANSON: "I took a camera and I sold it for Three Dollars--Two Dollars and some change-and I got this old fellow's clothes out of his locker and I ...."

Mr. MOSELEY: "Where did you get a camera?"

MANSON: "There's a Coast Guard guy over there who came from Alaka and he gave it to me. And I took and sold it to another guy for Three Dollars. I don't believe that guy knew who I was because he looked at me kinda funny when I start talking to him."

Mr. MOSELEY: "When did you do this?"

MANSON: "This morning and I just decided to go."

Mr. MOSELEY: "What made you decide to go?"

- MANSON: "Well, nothing in particular, just everything in general. I've been debating on it for a year, off and on. Not deciding one way or the other; telling myself 'No' that I should stay here, and the next day telling myself I couldn't. Then putting it off another day and then another week and then starting all over again. Just sort of constant fight within myself to keep staying here as long as I have been here. You know yourself, I could have run off long time ago. I've tried but it's just everything come at once and I just run off."
- Mr. MOSELEY: "When did you make up your mind to do this?"

MANSON: "This morning."

Mr. MOSELEY: "You went out after lunch with the regular work detail?"

MANSON: "Yes sir."

Mr. MOSELEY: "And then you stole the clothes?"

MANSON: "Yes sir."

Mr. MOSELEY: "And climbed the fence over there on the north side, did you?"

MANSON: "Yes."

Mr. MOSELEY: "You didn't go thru the gate?"

MANSON: "No, No."

Mr. MOSELEY: "How long had you been out there when I came?"

MANSON: "Three minutes."

Mr. MOSELEY: "You didn't see me over at the Coast Guard Base a few minutes before that"?

MANSON: "No."

Mr. MOSELEY: "Were you trying to wire this car across. Is that what you were planning on doing?"

MANSON: "Yes sir."

Mr. MOSELEY: "You didn't realize that you had keys to an Oldsmobile in your pocket?"

MANSON: "Lot of Oldsmobiles out there."

- Mr. MOSELEY: "You even had the license tag on the key chain."
- MANSON: "It was probably parked on the other side. Most of the guys park their car in the inside."
- Mr. MOSELEY: "I'm glad you didn't find it. It was just two or three cars from where you were. You would have been long gone, I guess."
- Mr. KILDALL: "Where did you get the Oldsmobile keys?"

MANSON: "They were in the pockets of the pants."

- Mr. MOSELEY: "Well, just why did you decide to do it, MANSON?"
- MANSON: "Well, I don't know, Mr. MOSELEY. It's the same old story that everybody else has got. Everybody has their problems and my mother had to take care of my grandmother. So they

had to leave my wife alone and that leaves my wife making only \$38 a week if she doesn't work on Saturday. She makes a \$1.10 an hour. There's about \$12, \$13, \$15 in the baby sitter. She has to ride back and forth to work with an old couple so that's another Three Dollars. And then we have our own furniture and trying to hold on to it. She just can't keep an apartment and take care of the child with \$38 a week. And I don't knowwhat good I thought I was going to do with me going out there. I was just making things worse. I never stop to think. I just got disgusted, I think and decided to That's what I done." go.

- Mr. MOSELEY: "Where you planning on going up to Los Angeles?"
- MANSON: "Sure. There would be no sense in me running off if I didn't see my wife. I thought I could get there before they missed me, maybe. I don't know what I was thinking, to be honest with you. It's just another one of those old recurrences. I've been doing this sort of thing for so long that I'm beginning to get used to it. But I've done it now, and it's all over. The consequences is all on me."

Mr. MOSELEY: "You knew that."

MANSON: "Before I started, I knew."

Mr. MOSELEY: "At least we don't have you for a stolen car, do we?"

MANSON: "I'm sure glad."

On April 10, 1957, Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY and SA ISADORE H. MANN (A) made an inspection of the north fence of the United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California, and noted that this fence had been cut approximately two and one-half feet high and two and one-half feet on the bottom. This hole in the fence was photographed and the photographs are being made a part of this file. Portions of the cuttings from the wire fence found on the ground at the location of the hole have been obtained, as well as one strand of wire obtained from the fence.

. . . . . .

On April 10, 1957, Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY pointed out the 1949 Chevrolet convertible, red in color, in which he found the subject. The license number of this vehicle is KZB099. MOSELEY pointed out the pair of pliers and a pair of wire cutters which were on the floorboard. These items were turned over by Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY to SA ISADORE H. MANN (A).

Photographs were taken of the vehicle in question by JAMES W. CARTER, Federal Correctional Institution photographer.

On April 11, 1957, CHARLES MILLES MANSON, inmate number 3845CAL, was interviewed by SAS JOHN H. BORGMAN and ISADORE H. MANN (A) at the Federal Correctional Institution, Terminal Island, California.

MANSON, at this time, advised that he stole clothes out of a locker at the United States Coast Guard Station, Terminal Island, California, which he wore underneath his work clothes when he was apprehended. He stated that he went through the fence but did not say whether he did or did not cut the hole in the fence in question. He stated that after he got out of the United States Coast Guard premises, he got in the car in which he was apprehended by Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY.

MANSON said that he tried to run away, stating that he had to get to his wife's residence to try to help her out of financial difficulty. He said he operated on impulse. He then stated he was confused at present and he was sorry he told the Special Agents what he had. He stated he had intended not telling the agents anything. He subsequently stated that after he got out of the fenced enclosure at the United States Coast Guard, he did not know what he was going to do.

On April 11, 1957, FRANKLYN LUCAS, United States Coast Guard No. 276392, advised that he brought MANSON back to the United States Coast Guard Station from the Federal Correctional Institution at approximately 1:05 to 1:10 PM on April 10, 1957. He advised that he did not have any information with regard to the attempted escape.

On April 11, 1957, JACK E. WALTERS, United States Coast Guard Serial Number 322621, who was assigned to the

sentry gate during the pertinent period on April 10, 1957, advised that he was at the sentry gate when the subject was returned to the United States Coast Guard Station shortly after 1:00 PM on April 10, 1957. He stated he talked with the subject for approximately ten or 15 minutes after the subject had returned to the Coast Guard Station after lunch and thereafter did not see the subject.

He stated that between approximately 10:00 and 11:00 AM on April 10, 1957, he had a conversation with the subject at the Coast Guard Station and at that time the subject told him that he, the subject, felt bad, felt cooped up, and felt like taking off. He stated the subject told him that his wife had not called him recently and this apparently was effecting him. WALTERS told the subject that if the subject took off, the fellow in the tower at the Federal Correctional Institution would probably get him before he got fifty feet. The subject told WALTERS that probably that was right. WALTERS stated he felt the subject was just joking and had no idea that the subject would attempt to escape. WALTERS advised that he did not see the subject attempt to escape.

On April 10, 1957, GEORGE W. ELLIOTT, Blacksmith's Helper, United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, who resides at 1025 East 51st Street, Long Beach, California, telephone number Hemlock 5-0640, advised that his clothing, consisting of blue slacks and a terrycloth white shirt with a blue and white collar, were stolen from his locker in Building 13 at the United States Coast Guard Station, Terminal Island, California. ELLIOTT advised that his locker was not locked. He stated that he did not give the subject permission to take these clothes.

GEORGE W. ELLIOTT identified the slacks and terrycloth shirt which were worn underneath the subject's work clothing when the subject was apprehended by Associate Warden ROBERT I. MOSELEY.

These items were photographed and were returned to ELLIOTT by Associate Warden MOSELEY.

On April 11, 1957, RONALD LEE REED, United States Coast Guard Serial Number 316279, who is assigned to the Coast Guard Cutter "HEATHER" (W331), United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California, advised that the 1949 Chevrolet convertible, license number KZBO99, is his vehicle. He stated that he had parked this vehicle on the

outside of the north fence of the United States Coast Guard Station in the parking lot. REED advised that he did not give anyone permission to use his vehicle. The pliers and wire cutters found in his vehicle were displayed to him and he stated that they did not belong to him and did not belong in his vehicle.

REED accompanied SA ISADORE H. MANN (A) to the location of his vehicle, at which time REED advised that the subject could not have moved his vehicle because his battery was low. At that time RONALD LEE REED and SA MANN found a copper wire attached to the key switch of his vehicle. REED advised that he had not placed this on his vehicle and was of the opinion that the subject was endeavoring to jump the switch on the vehicle in the endeavor to get it started.

On April 11, 1957, SAM MORRIS, Assistant Industrial Manager, United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California, advised that it would be impossible to identify the pliers and wire cutters in question as having come from the United States Coast Guard Station at Terminal Island, California. He stated that there was an abundance of tools of this type and description on the base in various locations. He stated that these items are not accountable.

On April 11, 1957, STANLEY PUCHOSIC, Boatswain, United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, California, advised that he did not see the subject on April 10, 1957. He stated that the subject's general work orders, while at the United States Coast Guard, were to take care of the north half of the grassed area of the United States Coast Guard Station.

STANLEY PUCHOSIC could not identify the pliers and wire cutters in question as being property of the United States Coast Guard. He, however, advised that the wire cutters could have been his, PUCHOSIC'S, inasmuch as they were missing. He stated that he knew that he was in possession of a pair of wire cutters on April 10, 1957, inasmuch as he saw them in his tools when he, PUCHOSIC, reported for work on April 10, 1957.

Lieutenant G. O. LESPARENCE, Industrial Manager, United States Coast Guard Base, Terminal Island, California,

advised that the subject, an inmate at the Federal Correctional Institution, Terminal Island, was assigned to the taking care of the northern grassed area of the United States Coast Guard Base, Terminal Island, California.

Lieutenant G. O. LESPARENCE advised that the last time he inspected the north fence of the United States: Coast Guard Base wasapproximately two weeks ago. He stated at that time the fence had not been tampered with.

On April 11, 1957, JOHN KOERNER, civilian electrician, United States Coast Guard, Terminal Island, was displayed the copper wire found attached to the key switch of the vehicle in which the subject was apprehended. KOERNER advised that this wire could have been wire obtained by the subject from the scrap pile on the United States Coast Guard Base.

On April 10, 1957, the basic facts were discussed with Assistant United States Attorney RAY H. KINNISON who stated that he desired a report reflecting the investigation prior to rendering an opinion.

The subject has admitted verbally to Associate Warden ROBERT I. Subject declined to state whether or not he cut the above mentioned hole for the purpose of escape to Agents of the FBI.







Synopsis: This report will serve as Los Angeles' program review for captioned title. It is the result of a survey of both FBIgenerated and open source material relating to so-called "millennialist" (millenarian) and apocalyptic cults. Additional information on this topic comes from a seminar presented at UCLA on 10/28/96, which dealt with the rhetoric of apocalyptic groups. Visiting Professor Steven O'Leary, author of the book <u>Arquing the</u> <u>Apocalypse</u>, was the featured speaker at the event which was hosted by UCLA Professor \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ Information on the Christian Identity (CI) movement comes from a lecture presented by Dr. \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the California Specialized Training Institute (CSTI).

Details: As seen in high profile cases such as Heaven's Gate, People's Temple, the Branch Davidians, and Aum Shinrikyo, the potential for loss of life on a large scale is just one of the dangers posed by cults which adhere to millennial or apocalyptic beliefs. One of the major differences between an apocalyptic cult and a non-millennial inspired religious group or commune is the cult's belief that its members' physical deaths will somehow serve to hasten God's appearance on earth or ensure their own ascension to a "higher level of existence".

Millennialist belief is seeded in the cataclysmic message found in the New Testament's Book of Revelation. Many Christian-based millennial groups plan for the second coming of Christ to take place around the end of the second millennium, the year 2000. Some believe that the event will be a followed by a thousand-year period of holiness during which Christ is to rule on earth. The movements which are of concern to the FBI's DT program are those which believe that the Apocalypse will be

13) The Manson Family - Charles Manson (DPOB - 11/11/34 at Cincinnati, Ohio) declared himself to be the Messiah and recruited a cult of followers in California for a predicted race war after his parole from prison in 1967. Manson's "Family" murdered as many as nine individuals including actress Sharon Tate on 8/8/69. He and seven followers received sentences carrying the death penalty in 1971, which were later reduced to life in prison by the California Supreme Court. One of Manson's disciples, Lynette Alice "Squeaky" Fromme \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ at Santa Monica, California) attempted to assassinate President Gerald R. Ford using a knife on 9/4/75. Charles Manson has been investigated by the FBI under numerous 175 (Assassination of the President), 90 (IFPI - Crime of Violence), 91 (Bank Robbery), and 9 (Extortion) classification files.

14) Order of the Solar Temple (OST) - also known as the "Solar Temple Cult" in some English-speaking circles, exists in the French-speaking areas of Switzerland, France, and Quebec, Canada. OST is a millennialist-inspired cult which claims to have ties to the Knights Templer Order of Crusaders from the Middle Ages. It teaches that its followers will be transported to a planet near the star Sirius, located in the constellation of Cainus Major, if they engage in ritualistic suicide followed by the burning of their bodies.

The group has been associated with at least three ritualistic mass murder-suicides in recent years, to include the deaths of 53 members in Canada and Switzerland in 1994. Cult b6 b7С
