Re Washington Field letter to Bureau dated March 1, 1949.

Records of the Civilian Personnel Records Branch, Adjutant General's Office, Department of the Army, St. Louis, Missouri, indicate TEIJI KOIDE was employed on December 1, 1945 as a Bombing Research Analyst with the U.S. Strategic Bombing Survey (Pacific) by transfer from the Strategic Services Unit (formerly Office of Strategic Services), for duty at Tokyo, Japan. On October 23, 1945, travel orders were issued directing movement from Washington, D.C., to San Francisco, California, for further movement to an overseas destination for temporary duty. Employment was terminated overseas on January 27, 1946 by reason of completion of assignment.

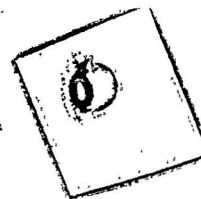

For the information of the New York Office, the Indianapolis Office advised by letter dated January 21, 1949, in the case entitled William Ward Pigan, Security Matter - C that Mrs. A. L. H. Barragh, 1018 Bergen Street, South Bend, Indiana, advised that she and Pigan's wife, Alice, had attended high school together in Chicago, Illinois, and they both had taken an active part in the Scarfire Girls organization and since have kept in contact with each other. She advised that in April, 1935, she was delegated to attend a conference in Washington, D. C., and on April 10, 1935, she was taken to a dinner at the Y.M.C.A. by William Ward Pigan and his wife. According to her diary, which she has kept for a number of years, a notation was made therein for that date concerning William Ward Pigan, "By - he must be a Communist." She cannot recall specifically the reasons for such a notation, but generally recalled that he has made numerous disparaging remarks about the U.S.A., which at that time was holding its Continental Congress in Washington, D. C. She recalled that he ridiculed anything that had to do with the American democratic form of government.

Mrs. Barragh stated that a guardian of the Scarfire Girls group, Ralph H. Moore, 123 North Hampshire Avenue, Oak Park, Illinois, had gone to Washington, D. C., the fall of the year and had had some contact with Pigan and his wife. She said that Moore had also concluded Pigan was a Communist.

By letter dated January 27, 1949, the Chicago Office advised that Mr. and Mrs. Ralph H. Moore were travelling throughout the western states and would not return to Oak Park, Illinois, until approximately March 30, 1949.

The Chicago Office should arrange to interview Mr. Ralph H. Moore upon his return to Oak Park, Illinois, for any information he may have concerning William Ward Pigan.

HELEN F. HARRINGTON stated she knew RENO at Farm Credit Administration and Social Security, but had only official relationship with him. Believes him OK as to loyalty. ROBERT E. REYNOLDS stated he knew RENO at Farm Credit Administration and later heard that RENO was active in the left wing group of UFWA but did not know him well personally. JOHN J. CORSON knew RENO well at Social Security and believes him to be absolutely loyal to United States.

Air Force, Pentagon Building; stated she was employed with the Classification Section of the Farm Credit Administration in 1935 and 1936. She stated she was employed under Mr. A. H. ARONSON and when he transferred to the Social Security Board in 1936 she followed in a few weeks. She

stated she was employed at Social Security until 1945. Miss HARRINGTON stated she had had only an official relationship with RENO and then only indirectly. She stated her only recollection of RENO is that he has a keen mind and is a good worker. She stated she had no knowledge that he had ever associated with any member of the Communist Party. She stated she had seen nothing which would indicate he was acquainted with ALGER HISS or WHITTAKER CHAMBERS or that he would deliver confidential material to an unauthorized person. She stated she did not know he had a brother named FRANKLIN RENO.

Miss HARRINGTON stated RENO had worked with one HIRAM S. PHILIPS at both the Farm Credit Administration and Social Security. She stated it is her impression that Mr. PHILIPS is presently an employee of the Social Security Board.

ROBERT E. REYNOLDS, Civil Service Commission, Temporary Building E, stated he recalled working with PHILIP RENO in 1935 - 1936 at the Farm Credit Administration. He stated he did not become very well acquainted with RENO at that time. He stated he knew RENO had transferred to the Social Security Board in 1936 and had been in Washington until about 1941. REYNOLDS stated he himself did not become active in the United Federal Workers of America union until 1944, but he had heard of RENO's being very active in the Social Security Local, just before RENO left Washington. Mr. REYNOLDS stated he heard RENO was active in the Left Wing group of the United Federal Workers of America and that he had associated with ELEANOR NELSON and MORTON FRIEDMAN. Mr. REYNOLDS stated while he had no specific knowledge that PHILIP RENO was a member of the Communist Party, he would not be surprised to hear that PHILIP was actually a member of the Communist Party. He qualified this by stating his opinion was based particularly on his knowledge of RENO and what he had heard regarding RENO'S union activities. Mr. REYNOLDS stated he had never known PHILIP RENO had a brother named FRANKLIN RENO.

It is to be noted that MORTON FRIEDMAN is the brother of GLADYS FRIEDMAN WEBBINK. It is to be noted further that MORTON FRIEDMAN was dismissed by the War Manpower Commission in about 1945 for alleged Communist Party activities and appealed his case to the Supreme Court where the dismissal was upheld.

JOHN J. CORSON was interviewed by Special Agent F. R. MCGINTY and the reporting agent and he advised he is presently Circulation Director for the Washington Post newspaper. He stated he recalled PHILIP RENO as a former fellow employee at the Social Security Board from about 1936 until about 1941. Mr. CORSON advised he also knew PHILIP RENO for several years after he left Washington, D. C. to go to Denver, Colorado. He said he does not recall having seen PHILIP RENO since 1945. Mr. CORSON stated in his opinion PHILIP RENO is

a man of absolute loyalty to the United States and he has never seen any activities or heard any comment on the part of PHILIP RENO which would indicate he was a member of the Communist Party. Mr. CORSON stated that many people during the late 1930's were considered liberal and Left of Center but it was not considered unusual. CORSON further mentioned that PHILIP RENO was an active union member of the United Federal Workers of America and it was his recollection that PHILIP had served as President of the Social Security Local. CORSON stated that in his (CORSON'S) position, he had supervision over several employees and therefore it was necessary for him to negotiate with the union regarding various complaints made by the employees. CORSON stated that during the above union negotiations he had always found PHILIP RENO to be a man of above average intelligence, who was a genuine unionist, and a man with whom it was easy to reason. PHILIP RENO, according to Mr. CORSON, could not be classed as radical in any sense of the word. Mr. CORSON stated that should the opportunity arise he would be very pleased to employ PHILIP RENO. He stated he would certainly be surprised to learn that PHILIP RENO had ever been a member of the Communist Party or that RENO had ever given any confidential information to any unauthorized person.

Mr. CORSON stated he had never heard of FRANKLIN VICTOR RENO. Mr. CORSON stated he recalled PHILIP RENO had been a victim of poor health and this situation had depressed him somewhat. Mr. CORSON stated that if PHILIP RENO were ever charged with being a member of the Communist Party or violated any trust, it could, in his opinion, be attributed to his poor physical condition. Mr. CORSON stated he had never heard of PHILIP RENO's ever associating with ALGER HISS or WHITTAKER CHAMBERS.

The files of the Washington Field Office reflect that JOHN J. CORSON has been in contact with CHARLES KRAMER, DAVID WAHL, and MAX LOEWENTHAL.

Regarding DAVID WAHL, Confidential Informant [] advised that DAVID WAHL was a member of a Communist Party underground movement operating in Washington, D. C., and that WAHL had admitted to the informant he had been sent from New York to Washington to direct the activities of this group.

Regarding MAX LOEWENTHAL, the files of the Washington Field Office reflect he is a close associate of DAVID WAHL.

Regarding CHARLES KRAMER, Washington T-1 advised KRAMER was involved in a Soviet espionage conspiracy in Washington, D. C. and New York in the early 1940's; that he was a close associate of Communists and pro-Soviet sympathizers, and for a period was a dues paying member of the Communist Party. Further, that KRAMER was a contact of an admitted Soviet Espionage Agent.

It is to be noted further that the Post Office at Washington, D. C. had been advised on February 1, 1949 that mail for MARTIN KURASCH should be forwarded to 1546 Trinity Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. (The above lead was previously set forth by letter to the Pittsburgh Office dated February 14, 1949).

THE WASHINGTON FIELD OFFICE:

At Washington, D. C., will locate and interview Mr. PHILLIPS of the Federal Security Agency who was named by W. C. BOWEN as a fellow employee of RENO. This individual may be identical with HIRAM S. PHILLIPS who was named by HELEN F. HARRINGTON as a fellow employee of RENO at the Social Security Board.

Will locate for interview Dr. ERNEST J. ENGQUIST, reported to have been a supervisor of PHILIP RENO in 1935 - 1936. It is to be noted that in 1935 - 1936, PHILIP RENO was employed at the Farm Credit Administration.

On March 2, 1949, BERNARD JAFFE, the attorney who is representing Mrs. HARRY DEXTER WHITE, advised this office that his client's memory has been refreshed and that, to the best of her recollection, the WHITE family spent the summer of 1937 in a rented cottage that was called "Marginal Acres" at Hancock, New Hampshire. This cottage was rented by the WHITES from LOUGHLIN CURRIE, who was the owner at that time.

It will be recalled that LOUGHLIN CURRIE was prominently mentioned in the Gregory Investigation.

It is also to be noted that at the time CHAMBERS originally related the circumstances surrounding his trip with ALGER and PRISCILLA HISS from Washington, D. C. to HARRY WHITE'S summer home in 1937, CHAMBERS recalled that this farm was located north of Peterboro, ~~Connecticut~~ ^{New Hampshire}. The city of Hancock, it is noted, is located directly north of Peterboro on Route 202, which is the route CHAMBERS stated he and the HISSES followed on the trip in 1937.

CHAMBERS was informed of the above and he stated that the name Hancock seemed somewhat familiar to him. He related that the WHITE farm at that time was located to the best of his recollection on a secondary road, leading off the main road (202) that went through Hancock, New Hampshire, and probably about four or five miles from the junction of Route 202 and this secondary road. The farm was located on the left-hand side of this secondary road and the property was approached by entering a dirt lane which left the secondary road to the left at an acute angle. At the junction of this lane and the secondary road were second growth woods. The WHITE place could not be seen from this secondary road. CHAMBERS recalled that it was a good size colonial style home and recently built (in 1937). He can recall that it had one large living room that occupied most of the ground floor on the left-hand side of the house as one faced it. He has somewhat of a recollection of the porch in the front which may have had a concrete floor. The living room, which is the only one in which he was in, had a door in front and a door in the rear. He recalled that for some reason, he went into this living room through the rear door.

At 2:30 p.m. today, at the request of Mr. Ray Whearty of the Department, Supervisor F. L. Jones and I conferred with Mr. Whearty and Mr. Fred Strine of the Department. Mr. Whearty explained that McLean, attorney for Hiss, had brought a motion before the Court to secure certain documents in possession of the Government. Included in this motion first was a request for the Baltimore papers, which are those typewritten documents and handwritten items furnished by Chambers. These are in the possession of the Bureau, and Mr. Whearty was advised that they would be furnished to him, since Mr. Whearty had stated that he had agreed to make them available to Mr. McLean for examination. Mr. Whearty stated that the motion of Mr. McLean also called for the production of copies of the pumpkin film. They plan, however, to give him copies only of the material emanating from the State Department as is reflected in the pumpkin film. I advised Mr. Whearty that we would furnish him a complete set of the copies of the pumpkin film.

The question of the classification of the various State Department documents involved in this matter came up, and I advised Mr. Whearty that so far as I knew, the State Department has not furnished us the current classification of these documents. I told him that a report had been received identifying the documents as furnished by Chambers with the original State Department documents. I advised him that this report was being processed in the Bureau, but that he would be immediately furnished a copy thereof. Mr. Whearty indicated that he was going to take up with the State Department the question of the classification now applicable to each of the documents involved in this case. This is information which we have sought since December, 1948, without success.

Mr. Whearty stated that it had also been agreed that there would be made available to Mr. McLean various typewriting specimens which have been identified by the Bureau with the typewritten documents. I advised him that we would turn over to him the various specimens.

I pointed out to Mr. Whearty that there was still pending the question of the development of the latent fingerprints of the typewritten documents as furnished by Chambers. I told him we had taken this up with Mr. Alexander Campbell, but that no final decision had been reached. I further informed him that if the documents were to be processed for latent fingerprints, it should be done before they are given to Mr. McLean. I pointed out to him that it was the opinion of the Technical Laboratory that the development of latent fingerprints was very remote, because so far as it could be ascertained the documents have not been handled by either Hiss or Mrs. Hiss since at least 1938. I told him

confidentially that the Bureau has never developed latent fingerprints which had been placed on paper more than 2½ years previously. I also pointed out to him that one process for the development of latent fingerprints on paper would change its texture and would make it impossible to conduct certain document examination. I told him that another process would cause a discoloration of the paper. It was also pointed out that numerous individuals had handled the papers since they were produced by Chambers on November 19, 1948.

No decision as to latent fingerprint examination was made, but in the event Mr. Whearty now turns the documents over to Mr. McLean as attorney for Hiss, it will mean, of course, that they have decided against the latent fingerprint examination. As indicated, both Mr. Campbell and Mr. Whearty have been alerted to the fact that these papers have not been processed for latent fingerprints.

I further advised Mr. Whearty that we desired to know what handling had been given to the documents by the Department from the time they were turned over to the Department on November 29, 1948, until they were returned to the Bureau on December 10, 1948; that we wished to make as a matter of record the custody of the documents. I advised him that we had already worked out the custody so far as it related to the Bureau. Mr. Whearty indicated that Mr. Vincent Russo would prepare this information.

ACTION:

A memorandum is being prepared for the purpose of transmitting the various documents requested by Mr. Whearty. This is being handled by memorandum so as to maintain a written record of what is furnished to the Department and the date thereof.

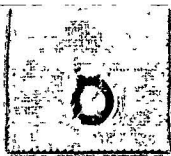

Rebulet February 3, 1949 and Chicago letter to Director, February 23, 1949, copies to Miami, Philadelphia, New York and Washington Field Offices.

ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN, formerly employed by the Railroad Retirement Board, Washington, D. C., from March 16, 1936 to March 26, 1942, at which time he transferred to the Army Air Forces, War Department, as a civilian employee. Information developed by this office reveals that from approximately July, 1941 to March, 1942, SILVERMAN was on non-reimbursable loan to the Division of Monetary Research, U. S. Treasury Department. The Railroad Retirement Board Personnel File of SILVERMAN failed to substantiate this information.

For the information of the Chicago and Miami Offices, it has been requested that a departmentalwise investigation be conducted with regard to ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN and individuals associated with SILVERMAN, during his government employment, be interviewed along lines heretofore following in this investigation.

It has also been brought to the attention of this office that, according to CHAMBERS, during the latter part of December, 1936, or the first part of January, 1937, three Persian rugs were shipped to SILVERMAN in Washington, D. C. from New York City. Thereafter, SILVERMAN delivered one rug to the late HARRY DEXTER WHITE, and subsequently delivered a second rug to ALGER HISS at a prearranged meeting on the outskirts of Washington, D. C. in the vicinity of Maryland University. CHAMBERS advised that SILVERMAN put the rug in his car and drove to the prearranged meeting place, and that he, CHAMBERS, accompanied by ALGER HISS in the latter's automobile, met SILVERMAN where the transfer of the rug from SILVERMAN's car to HISS' car was made.

SILVERMAN has been interviewed on various occasions, and has declined to furnish any information in connection with this case, on advice of counsel.

In the conduct of the following requested interviews, it is suggested that effort should also be made to substantiate the fact that SILVERMAN received three rugs during the first part of January, 1937, and subsequently, transported two of them in his automobile, as alleged by CHAMBERS.

Re report Special Agent DAVID E. TODD dated February 10, 1945, at San Francisco, a copy of which is enclosed for the Charlotte Office.

Page eight of this report and the following pages indicate the results of an interview by agents of the San Francisco Office with C. EASTON ROTHWELL. It is noted that ROTHWELL recalls a meeting held in the Department of State where ROTHWELL was employed in about September 1946, at which meeting ROTHWELL recalls that some unidentified individual told him that ALGER HISS "could be a Communist or even be Communistically inclined".

ROTHWELL recalls few details in connection with this meeting but does recall that one DON RUSSELL was the Assistant Secretary of State in charge of the Office of Special Political Affairs, now known as the Office of United Nations Affairs, and that this meeting was held for the purpose of reorganizing the Office of Special Political Affairs.

Reference report sets out a lead to interview DON RUSSELL and one JOSEPH PENNOCK, both formerly officials of the State Department, Washington, D. C., who were associated with ALGER HISS at the State Department, and who may have further knowledge of this meeting or other information of value to this investigation.

DONALD H. RUSSELL is an attorney who maintains offices in the Colorado Building of Washington, D. C., but who resides at 716 Otis Boulevard, Spartanburg, South Carolina. According to his office, he visits Washington only two or three times a month as the demands of his business require. The Charlotte Office is requested to interview RUSSELL at his home. For the information of the Charlotte Office, RUSSELL's law office has stated that he travels about South Carolina a good deal. A special effort should be made to determine the identity of JOSEPH PENNOCK, mentioned above, and an effort should be made to ascertain whether or not that individual is JOSEPH PANUCH, and the Washington Field Office should be advised of the outcome of the interview. Reference is made to the Baltimore Teletype of 2/2 and Bureau Teletypes of 2/4 & 21/49 relative to the typewriters and cameras which WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has possessed or of which he has knowledge.

With reference to Leica cameras, CHAMBERS on interview has stated that he has knowledge of the following cameras which were used in the places or the incidents mentioned below:

1) 9 Gay Street

It was CHAMBERS' recollection that this was a German Leica. It was also his recollection that the calibration tables on the camera were in German. The other equipment which was maintained at this address, such as the enlarger and the developing tanks, CHAMBERS did not know whether it was of a foreign or domestic make. He stated that he did not know where this equipment came from or what happened to it when the apartment at this address was abandoned.

2) Leica used in connection with the operation at the Electric Boat Company, New London, Connecticut

CHAMBERS thought that this, too, was a German-made Leica. He states that it could have been the same camera used at the Gay Street address, but he does not know definitely. It was his recollection that he received this camera from ULRICH; that it was packed in a suitcase, and included a stand for photographing documents. To the best of his recollection, he returned it to ULRICH.

3) Leica used to photograph documents received from ALGER HISS while latter employed on Nye Committee

CHAMBERS states that he believes this camera was given to him by J. PETERS and "I returned it to him eventually". He thinks that he kept this camera for a period of probably some months. It was, he continued, an American-made Leica, had a stand for photographing documents, and was packed in a small suitcase.

4) Leica used to photograph material received from JULIAN WADLEIGH and WARD PIGMAN

CHAMBERS believes that it is possible that in this instance he used the same camera mentioned above as having been received from J. PETERS. In this connection he has stated, "I either still had this camera or J. Peters gave it back to me". It is his recollection that he returned this camera to PETERS and never saw it again.

5) Leica used in the SPIEGEL apartment, Baltimore, Maryland

CHAMBERS states that Colonel BYKOV supplied him with this camera and, to the best of his recollection, it was American-made. As he has stated previously he gave this camera to DAVID CARPENTER. He states, "I either gave it to him (CARPENTER) or perhaps he got it himself (from the apartment)". CHAMBERS claims that he does not know what happened to this camera after he gave it to CARPENTER. He recalled that there was a stand for photographing documents, developing tanks, and a reel included with this camera and all were packed in a suitcase.

6) Camera used by the unknown subject FELIX

CHAMBERS stated that he does not believe he ever saw the camera used by FELIX for photographing documents. However, he thinks that it was a Leica and he bases this on "Conversation, I suppose". CHAMBERS assumes that FELIX secured his camera from BYKOV inasmuch as it was through the latter that CHAMBERS first met FELIX.

7) Camera used by WILLIAM EDWARD CRANE, wa. KEITH

CHAMBERS stated that this, too, was a Leica and it was his definite impression that it was CRANE'S personal property. CHAMBERS has denied that he ever gave a camera to CRANE or provided him with the necessary funds to purchase one. He states that CRANE had dreams of being a news photographer and used to carry his camera with him almost continuously. It was also CHAMBERS recollection that CRANE had a stand, flash equipment, and a tele-scopic lens.

The above, CHAMBERS states, represents his entire recollection of the receipt, the use and disposition of all the cameras which he possessed or of which he had knowledge. He adds that he never knew at any time the numbers of any of these cameras and as to their type he could state no more other than that they were Leicas.

Referenced Bureau Teletype of 2/4/49 requests that CHAMBERS be asked to turn over any "35 mm camera" that he has or formerly had for comparison with the "pumpkin" microfilm. In this connection CHAMBERS states that he has never at any time had a "35 mm camera".

With reference to typewriters, Mr. CHAMBERS stated that he possessed or had knowledge of the following:

1) Standard typewriter, make unknown

CHAMBERS stated that this was the ^{first} typewriter he ever had and it was given to him by his father. He is unable to recall the make of typewriter, but believes that his father brought it to him from someplace where he worked. He stated that the only thing he could remember concerning this machine ^{was} that it was very old and never worked too well.

2) A Remington Portable

CHAMBERS stated that he bought this machine in 1925 and used it for a number of years. It is his recollection that he bought the machine at Macy's in New York City, but he claims that he does not know when or how he disposed of it. He says that his recollection that the machine was purchased in 1925 was based on the fact that he recalls buying it out of the proceeds from the translation of "Bambi", which he did in that year. He states that this, of course, was a new machine.

3) An Apparatus Typewriter

This, too, CHAMBERS believes was a Remington portable. However, he believes that it was an old machine and was not new at the time he first saw it. CHAMBERS states that he got this machine from ULRICH at the time that apparatus disbanded in about 1934. Sometime after his own break from the Communist Party CHAMBERS stated he deliberately left this typewriter on

a train or streetcar in order to get rid of it. It was his recollection that he had done this in 1939 or 1940. CHAMBERS said that he usually moved this typewriter around with him during his work.

4) Personal Typewriter

CHAMBERS stated that during the last war his wife bought an old typewriter, make unknown, at Coffman's in Westminster, Maryland. He advised that this machine was still in their possession.

5) Daughter's Typewriter

CHAMBERS stated that he purchased a portable typewriter of a Swiss make for his daughter. He thought that he purchased this at Macy's in New York City at Christmas time of the last year of the war or the subsequent year. This typewriter is still in the possession of his daughter.

Mr. CHAMBERS has made available the following typewritten specimens:

1) A 14 line poem beginning with the words "The Harbor" and ending with the words "less appalling". Mr. CHAMBERS states that he does not know which typewriter was used to type this specimen.

2) A 16 line poem beginning with the words "These barren nights" and ending with the words "prepare the days". CHAMBERS believes that this specimen was typed on his own Remington portable, which was purchased in 1925.

3) A 20 line poem beginning with the words "Come, come away" and ending with the words "you once trespassed". CHAMBERS believes that this specimen was likewise typed on his own Remington portable.

The above three specimens were received from WHITTAKER CHAMBERS on 2/9/49 and have been appropriately identified by him.

4) A carbon copy of a letter dated 2/10/42, addressed "Dear Dr. Sperry;" and concluding with "Sincerely yours, Whittaker Chambers: Associate Editor". CHAMBERS states that this letter was probably typed on some typewriter at "Time" magazine.

5) A typewritten office memorandum of "Time Incorporated" dated 3/20. This begins with the words "Thanks for", continues for four lines, and ends with the words "plagiarized Stalin". As indicated, CHAMBERS believes that this, too, was typed on a machine in the office of "Time Incorporated".

6) A carbon copy of a memorandum dated 2/3 and directed to "Mr. H.H. Luce". It is entitled "For Christianity and Crisis", consists of six lines beginning with the words "Americans have" and ends with the words "the human crisis".

The last three items mentioned above were made available by WHITTAKER CHAMBERS on 2/16/49 and they have been appropriately identified by him. As indicated above, these latter three items were typed on machines available to CHAMBERS at "Time" magazine. They would have been typed, of course, at a date which was subsequent to CHAMBERS break from the Communist Party in 4/38. However, he has submitted them as samples of his typing. Mr. CHAMBERS has stated that he is continuing to search his effects and in the event he is able to provide any additional specimens he will do so.

It is suggested that the Baltimore Office make appropriate arrangements with Mr. CHAMBERS to obtain necessary specimens of the typewriters which he or any member of his family presently have in their possession. The matter of obtaining these specimens was taken up with CHAMBERS at the time he submitted the information previously set forth in this letter, and he stated that he had no objection to the obtaining of specimens from these other typewriters.

Re WFO letter 2/24/49 furnishing information to the effect that HENRY JULIAN WADLEIGH has recently advised that he was visited in about 1934 or 1935 by an individual whom he recalls only as "BLUMBERG", believed by the WFO to be identical probably with Dr. ALBERT E. BLUMBERG was, subject of Baltimore File #100-95.

A review of Baltimore file #100-95 indicates that Dr. BLUMBERG taught Philosophy at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore from 1930 to 1937. Enclosed with a copy of this letter is a photograph of Dr. BLUMBERG with his wife, DOROTHY ROSE BLUMBERG, taken at a CP dinner in Dr. BLUMBERG's honor in November 1942 for exhibition to WADLEIGH in an effort to make a positive identification. This photograph is reported to be an excellent likeness of BLUMBERG, is the best likeness available and no photographs taken prior to 1940 are available to Baltimore.

Mrs. CATHERINE GARLAND, formerly secretary to A. MANUEL FOX, Tariff Commission, was interviewed relative to the ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN aspect of instant case. She furnished the following information.

While employed at the Tariff Commission as an economist, SILVERMAN's superior was A. MANUEL FOX who at that time was head of the Economics Division. In 1936 when SILVERMAN left the Tariff Commission to go to the Railroad Retirement Board, he did so on the invitation of a MURRAY LATIMER. SILVERMAN was well regarded at the Tariff Commission and was on excellent terms with FOX.

In 1941 or 1942 A. M. FOX, who then had become a commissioner with the Tariff Commission, was selected by the Treasury Department to represent the United States as a member of the Chinese Stabilization Fund Board. Mrs. GARLAND recalled that the board was made up of representatives from England and China, as well as the United States.

During the time that FOX was in China some sort of disagreement arose between HARRY DEXTER WHITE, who at that time was with the Treasury Department, and FOX. HARRY DEXTER WHITE, it should be noted, at one time served under FOX as an economist with the Tariff Commission and Mrs. GARLAND advised that they had been on excellent terms. In regard to this misunderstanding between WHITE and FOX, GEORGE SILVERMAN made a number of calls on Mrs. FOX, the purpose being to have her transmit certain information to her husband in China. Mrs. FOX did not wish to send this information and shortly thereafter FOX advised that he was returning from China. SILVERMAN invited Mrs. GARLAND to lunch at this time and advised her that he had been to see Mrs. FOX in an effort to have Mrs. FOX transmit certain information to her husband. The reason this information was not to be sent to Mr. FOX through official channels, SILVERMAN had advised, was because it might prove embarrassing to FOX. Mrs. GARLAND stated she had the feeling that SILVERMAN's invitation to lunch was merely for the purpose of advising her of the reason why the information was not submitted through official channels. Mrs. GARLAND stated she had no knowledge of the specific information which SILVERMAN desired Mrs. FOX to transmit to her husband.

Upon FOX's return from China, Mrs. GARLAND mentioned SILVERMAN to Mr. FOX at which time FOX became very upset and indicated he did not wish to discuss SILVERMAN. Sometime later FOX returned to China, still as a representative of the

Stabilization Fund Board and after some three weeks in China, FOX was found dead in bed one morning. The time of FOX's death was fixed by Mrs. GARLAND as in June 1942. Mrs. GARLAND stated she had no reason to believe that FOX's death was by unnatural causes but she had always had a feeling that something was wrong. The cause of the death was supposedly heart failure but Mrs. GARLAND stated that FOX had never had any heart trouble to her knowledge and that a year prior to Mrs. FOX's trip to China his physician had pronounced his heart as sound.

Mrs. GARLAND stated that she had no knowledge of what the specific misunderstanding was between WHITE and SILVERMAN on the one hand and Mr. FOX on the other and she could never quite understand why SILVERMAN had had any particular interest in the subject since it was her belief that he was employed at the Railroad Retirement Board at the time. According to Mrs. GARLAND, both Mrs. FOX and Mr. FOX's son, MELVIN JAMES FOX, were very much put out with SILVERMAN and could possibly furnish more details concerning the incident.

Mrs. GARLAND stated that she had been FOX's secretary for some 18 years prior to the time of his death but that his work in connection with the Stabilization Fund Board was taken care of at the Treasury Department where he had been assigned several secretaries to handle his affairs.

The New York Office is requested to interview MELVIN JAMES FOX in regard to the incident related above and also obtain from him all the background information he may have concerning the activities of SILVERMAN and his associates and any other information he may have in regard to subject case.

Mrs. JOSEPH J. COHEN, formerly Mrs. A. MANUEL FOX, should also be interviewed in this matter and the New York Office is requested to arrange for this interview upon her return from Europe.

Reference is made to the report of SA JOSEPH M. KELLY at New York, dated February 8, 1949, which reflects that Mrs. JOSEPH J. COHEN and her husband are touring Europe and are not expected to return to the United States until spring. This report also reflects that MELVIN J. FOX was interviewed in New York at which time he was an associate of the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace and was questioned concerning the ALGER HISS aspect of instant case.
