Reference is unde to Mustington Field teletype dated March 2, 1949, concerning the withdrawal of \$400 by Pythodilla Miss from the joint envings account of Alger and Priscills Hims at the Riggs Sational Bark, Machington, D. C., on November 19, 1937.

You will recall that Chambers is of the opinion that this amount of money or probably as smeh as \$500 was repaid to the Hisses by Colonal Bykov.

In order that the Coverment may have available information \*\* to support any alibi offered by the Misses for the withdrawal of the \$400 from their savings account, the following information should be checked in the files of the Washington Field Offices

The mavings and checking account of Almer and Priscilla Hiss should be obsolved to determine if the \$400 was redeposited by one of them immediately subsequent to November 19, 1937, which would substantiate the allegations of Chambers that the money was repaid by Colonel Bytov.

The files should be cheshed for any information which would indicate any reasons why the Hisses might claim that they withdrew the \$400 from their maxings account such as, family illness or hospitalization, the purphase of an automobile, furniture, a house, payment on insurance presiums, or any known outstanding indebtedness. It should be determined if Algar Hiss or his wife are known to have wantioned for an extended period of time subsequent to the date of the withdramal.

This check should be limited to a review of the files of your office since any alibis for the expenditure of this sorry which the Hisses may present during the course of the trial. our, of course, to checked at that time.

A comparison has been made between the documents received from the Washington Field Office on December 9, 1948 from Sam Boykin of the State Department and those in the possession of the Bureau. It will be recalled that the Bureau is in possession of documents turned over during the course of a deposition in Baltimore consisting of 65 documents, and documents that were furnished to the New York Grand Jury by the House Un-American Activities Committee. As a result of this comparison, the following documents are in the possession of the Bureau and were found to be missing from those turned over by Mr. Boykin:

- 1. A typewritten letter bearing a penciled date 1-7-48 in the upper right-hand corner beginning, "Reliable source reports since signing the tripartite Anti-Comintern Fact an agreement has been reached...." and ending with the last sentence, "Japanese agents are reported to be fomenting action by Mohammedans in Ninghsia and Chenghi to harrass the Urinchi-Lanchow Road.
- 2. One page of typewriting which appears to be excerpts from State Department documents. In the left-hand corner at top appears the word "Europe" under which is the date Jan. 5. Following this date appears "Bullitt cabled from Paris' that Leger in charge of Foreign Office in Debbos' absence had told him that the French Government was very apprehensive..." There also appears two other items on this page dated Jan. 12, year not given, that referred to cables from Bullitt.
- One page of typewriting which contains information appearing to be excerpts from State Department documents. On the left-hand top corner are the words "Europe" under which is the word "England." The first paragraph begins as follows: "Jan. 24. Johnson, US Charge at London cabled that the US Military Attache informed him....". Also on this page is an item referring to Spain dated Jan. 21 beginning, "Bay US Consul in Seville cabled:".

first sentence reads: From Tsingtao Dorn of the US Military Attache's staff....". There also appears on this page another item dated Jan. 22 and others dated Jan. 27, 28 and 29.

- 5. A page containing two paragraphs of typewriting dated February 15, 1938, 4 P.M. The document appears to be typewriting of a excerpt from a telegram sent to the American Legation at Vienna, Austria and begins "6. Your No. 18, February 14, 9 P.M." The next paragraph begins, "The Department has found your recent telegraphic reports....". The communication is signed "Hull."
- 6. A document which appears to be a typewritten copy of an excerpt from a cable from Paris dated February 15, 1938 received at 5:03 P.M. and addressed to the Secretary of State, Washington. It begins "241, February 15, 4 P.M. Reference my 194, February 4, 6 P.M." and ends, ".... Thus outwardly acceding to Hitler's demands but actually not doing so in that the learers' real desire was to have a Nazi sympathizer control the police" and signed "Bullitt."
- 7. A typewritten copy of a State Department document from the American Consulate in Yokohama, Japan dated January 6, 1938. The subject matter is, "ENCLOSING A REPORT ON THE NEW ECONOMIC ORGANIZATION IN 'MANCHUKUO'." The communication is two paragraphs in length and is signed by Richard F. Boyce. American Consul."

The above documents were missing from the group which were obtained from Thittaker Chambers, that is, the 65 documents he presented at the deposition.

The following missing document was from the group that the Bureau obtained from the New York Office which had been presented to the Grand Jury by the House Un-American Activities Committee:

A typewritten copy of a State Department document which is a telegram from Hankow, China dated January 11, 1938 to the Secretary of State. Washington. This communication was

received at 8:20 P.M. January 12. On the right—hand top corner appears a stamp of the Assistant Secretary of State, Mr. Sayre dated January 14, 1948. The communication begins: "24, January 11, 3 P.M. (GRAY) Following for War Department for Colonel Stillwell....". The document is three pages long and the last paragraph on page three is as follows: "Query. Does War Department desire further report direct movements of personnel to Filitary Attache's Office in China, or will Filitary Attache be free to make changes that may seem desirable?" The communication is signed. "Johnson."

It is noted that the Washington Field Office in its letter dated December 9, 1948 advised that according to Mr. Boykin there were three additional documents which were to be photostated since they were then being searched, however, they would be photostated on the morning of December 10, 1948 and requested that an Agent contact him at that time for these documents.

#### ACTION:

When these documents are received from Mr. Boykin, they should be compared with those documents listed above as missing.

Addendum: (12-10-48)

By letter dated December 16, 1948, the Mashington Field Office forwarded to the Bureau some additional photostatic copies of documents obtained from Lr. Boykin. These were found to be identical with the documents described above as numbers 3, 4 and 8. Therefore, the Bureau has five documents in its possession that either were not furnished to the State Department by the Committee or the State Department has not furnished them to the Bureau.

Relet from Washington Field to the Director dated 2-23-49, copy to Oklahoma City requesting interview of LAURA MERMIN.

Mrs. LAURA MERMIN, wife of SAMUEL HERMIN, Professor of Law, University of Oklahoma, Norman, Oklahoma, was interviewed on March 1, 1949. LAURA MERNIN stated positively that she did not know DAVID VERNON ZILMERMAN, was., nor did she identify his picture.

MERMIN related that she worked for the Federal Bureau of Investigation as a Clerk at 9th and Pennsylvania Streets, Washington, D. C., engaged in filing prison records for a period of about three weeks in the spring of 1939.

The Washington Field Office by letter dated November 12, 1947, advised an informant of that office, reported on January 13, 1948 that SAMUEL MERMIN in 1937 was a member of the Communist Party through Intellectual Conviction, and his wife was a weaker member not through conviction but to follow her husband in order to maintain a happy home. No activity in Communist affairs have been developed regarding the MERMINS by the Oklahoma City Office.

In connection with the current investigation of Abraham George Eilverman, particularly with respect to his activities in the underground movement of the Communist Farty, it is believed necessary that Helen Ringe be interviewed by the San Francisco Office. Therefore, the New York Office should irradiately furnish sufficient background information to the San Francisco Office to accomplish this interview in the immediate future.

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identity he did not know. This girl was known to him to be the secretary of one ANDREE EMERY, who according to CHAMBERS, was a Communist Party member and the daughter of a former police official in Hungary. CHAMBERS stated that EMERY was able to obtain a position in the "Bureau of Indian Affairs" in the United States Department of Interior and that the unknown girl who superseded CHAMBERS as courier was secretary to EMERY while EMERY held this position. CHAMBERS mentioned that at this time EMERY was intimate with ROTATUDSON, known Communist of New York City. CHAMBERS recalled that he, CHAMBERS, drove EMERY, J. PETERS and the unknown girl from New York City to Washington, D.C. at the time when EMERY and the unknown girl began their employment in the Bureau of Indian Affairs and this was the only time he saw the unknown girl. He understood from the conversation in the car, with J. PETERS that the unknown girl was to act as courier for "Apparatus A".

CHAMBERS recalled that he saw ANDREE EMERY on one other occasion at which time he visited her apartment located on Florida Avenue near the intersection of Connecticut Avenue in Washington, D.C. CHAMBERS does not remember the occasion of this visit but offers the observation he was probably sent there by J. PETERS.

In connection with the unknown girl CHAMBERS could describe her only as "Jewish, small and dark".

# Data from Washington, D.C. City directory

The Washington City directory for 1936 reflects that one ANDREE EMERY employed as a research director with the U.S. Department of Interior, resided at 2129 Florida Avenue. It is noted this listing is in the alphabetical section of the directory and the name ANDREE EMERY does not appear in the street address section of this same directory under the address 2129 Florida Avenue. It should also be noted this apartment house is one short block away from the intersection of Florida and Connecticut Avenues, NW.

### Credit Checks

On February 11, 1949, records of the STONE's Mercantile Agency, checked by Special Agent Thomas J. Barry, reflected EMERY resided in Apartment number 604, 2129 Florida Avenue, that she was born November 30, 1905 and since September 11, 1935, had been employed in the Planning Section, Indian Rehabilitation Division, Resettlement Administration. These records indicated EMERY was reported to have been recently divorced and that she had occupied apartment 604 since July 1, 1935.

On the same date the records of the Washington Credit Bureau were noted to reflect that EMERY's residence was listed as 1747 F Street, NW. There was no date set forth for EMERY's occupancy at this address.

On February 11, 1949, the writer was advised by Miss L. SPRINGER, bookkeeper of the Fidelity Storage Company, 1420 U Street, NW, that apartment number 604 at 2129 Florida Avenue, had been occupied during 1934, 1935, and 1936 by one Mrs. WILKINSON and that it had been Mrs. WILKINSON's custom to sublet her apartment in the summertime. The Fidelity Storgage Company which owns and operates the apartment house at 2129 Florida Avenue is not in possession of any record of these subleases.

On February 14, 1949, the writer was advised by Mrs. NELLIE BORNE, former manager of the apartment house at 2129 Florida Avenue and still a resident thereof, that she could not recall ANDREE EMERY and could not recognize a picture of her. (This picture was secured at the Brookings Institute in connection with a record check, which will be detailed below). Mrs. BORNE advised that Mrs. JULIE WHIKINSON, present occupant of apartment 504, and formerly occupant of apartment 604, was a reliable individual, and a descendant of an old and distinguished Charleston, South Carolina family. Mrs. BORNE added that Mrs. WILKINSON's husband, a Naval officer, had died recently and that her son and daughter-in-law had recently been killed in an automobile accident near Charleston and that Mrs. WILKINSON's mental faculties, in the opinion of Mrs. BORNE, had been somewhat affected by this shock.

On the same date Mrs. WILKINSON advised that it was her custom to sublet her apartment in the summer while she and her husband took an extended vacation. She stated she could not recall having rented apartment number 604 to a single girl or girls and added that since her husband was a Naval officer most of the subletting was done to other Naval officers. Mrs. WILKINSON faintly recalled that in about 1938 she had sublet apartment 504 to a tall blond girl and a shorter brunette, both of whom she believed to be from Chicago. She recalled the tall blonde girl had stayed there approximately three months and had later moved to the Castleton apartments, and that the shorter girl had returned to Chicago in about one month. Mrs. WILKINSON could add no further details.

#### Files of the U.S. Department of Interior

After some difficulty the file of ANDREE EMERY was located on February 7, 1949, in the mail room of the Office of Indian Affairs, Department of the Interior. This file contains only EMERY's application, indicating she was appointed to the position as principal social economic expert at P-5 in the Resettlement Administration, Land Utilization Division. The date of this appointment was variously set out as July 5, 1935, and July 11, 1935. This file indicates that EMERY's immediate superior was one WARD SHEPARD. Other information in this file in connection with EMERY is set out below under the appropriate

caption. This file contained no information pertinent to the identity of EMERY's secretary.

Also at the Office of Indian Affairs Mr. JAMES W. HUTCHINSON, Administrative Assistant to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Room 4228 U.S. Department of Interior, produced copies of the payrolls for the year 1935, and a list of all employees of the Office of Indian Affairs between 1934 and 1941. It is noted that EMERY's name does not appear on either the payrolls or the list of employees.

HUTCHINSON and Mrs. KATHLEEN TEAGUE, Assistant Director of Personnel, Office of Indian Affairs, both recalled that in 1935, the U.S. Department of Agriculture furnished funds and personnel to the U.S. Department of Interior for the creation of an Indian Rehabilitation unit. They explained that although this work properly fell within the Office of Indian Affairs, U.S. Department of Interior, the only funds available in 1935 were Agriculture funds and that the arrangement mentioned above was made. HUTCHINSON and Mrs. TEAGUE said that very early in 1936 this arrangement was discontinued because the U.S. Department of Interior had obtained a grant of funds from the Federal Emergency Relief Program and from this date until the present Indian rehabilitation had been carried on by the Office of Indian Affairs, U.S. Department of Interior. Mr. HUTCHINSON and Mrs. TEAGUE advised that at about the end of 1935 personnel from the U.S. Department of Agriculture who had been working in the Indian Rehabilitation Unit of the U.S. Department of Interior were returned to the Department of Agriculture.

#### Files at the U. S. Department of Agriculture

On February 9, 1949, Mrs. JOYCE KELLY, Assistant Chief of the Training Division, Farmers Home Administration, U.S. Department of Agriculture, produced the file of ANDREE FMERY. This file reflects the dates of FMERY's employment with the Indian Rehabilitation program to be from July 11, 1935, to November 15, 1935, at which date her employment was terminated within the department, without prejudice due to the curtailment of the Indian Rehabilitation work. This file indicates that FMERY had a staff of 13 technical assistants and 15 clerical, stenographic, file and drafting assistants in her capacity as chief of the Planning Section. This file does not contain any information with respect to the identity of FMERY's secretary. Other information with respect to this file is set forth below.

Mrs. KELLY was of the opinion that the records of the Indian Rehabilitation Unit were possibly maintained by the U.S. Department of Interior and advised that no records of this organization had been forwarded to the Department of Agriculture. Accordingly inquiry in the file room of the U.S. Department of Interior of one GEORGE COODER, a file clerk, indicated that COOPER had a vague recollection that sometime about 1938, numerous miscellaneous boxes of Indian Rehabilitation Unit records were forwarded to

the National Archives. COOPER after a thorough search of his own file room could produce no record of the Bureau of Indian Rehabilitation.

#### Files at the National Archives

On February 24, 1949, Mr. CARL L. TRAVERS, Archivist-in-charge, Interior and Public Works Section, National Reserve Division, room 13 E, National Archives, advised that after considerable search he had located several boxes of miscellaneous files of the Indian Rehabilitation Division, U.S. Department of Interior. Among those records was a two page document entitled "Status of Personnel". Indian Rehabilitation as of October 1 " and sub-captioned Washington Office. The first name on this list was that of ANDREE EMERY and indicates she was a principal social-economic expert, P-5, and "(Chief, Planning Section)". This document indicates EMERY was appointed effective July 11th. The 8th name on this list is that of THEIMA OSTER, a senior stenographic employee, CAF-3 and "(secretary to Chief of Planning Section) . This roster reflects that OSTER's appointment was effective September 1. Although the date 1935 does not appear on this document it is noted this particular phase of the Indian Rehabilitation office was in existence only in the year 1935. Other documents in this file indicated that both EMERY and OSTER used telephone extension 4058 and miscellaneous memoranda dictated by ANDREE EMERY on the following dates bore the stenographic initials "to": 9/16/35, 8/28/35, 8/27/35 (three memoranda on this date) and 9/16/35.

The file of THEIMA OSTER at the U.S. Department of Agriculture

On February 25, 1949, Mrs. JOYCE KELLY produced the file of THELMA OSTER, at the U.S. Department of Agriculture. This file contained an application dated October 14, 1935, which reflected OSTER resided at կկ00 Volta Place, NW and that she was born in Rochester, New York, August 25, 1910 and that her legal residence was at Rochester. The file reflects that OSTER was educated in Rochester and graduated from Eastern High School in that city. Her past employment is shown as a secretary for the legal firm of ARTHUR EX SUTHERLAND AND DWYER, Union Trust Building, Rochester, New York for 32 years, 1928 until 1931, followed by a  $3\frac{1}{2}$  year employment at the Rochester Board of Education, from 1931 to 1933. For the nine months previous to her employment at the Indian Rehabilitation Office, this file reflects that OSTER was employed as the secretary to ANDREE EMERY in New York City and that she was so engaged in compiling research data. The exact dates of this employment are from October, 1934 to June, 1935 and the place of employment is listed as 68 Barrow or Burrow Street, New York City. This file reflects that OSTER entered on active duty as secretary in the Indian Rehabilitation Unit on September 3, 1935. She executed an oath of office on September 30, 1935 and again on November 8, 1935. On October 7, 1935, according to this file OSTER was transferred to the Project Planning and Control Section, Selection and Analysis Unit, Land Utilization Office, Rural Rehabilitation Administration and on July 21, 1937

resigned to accept a position with the Social Security Board.

This file contains a job outline of OSTER's position at the Indian Rehabilitation Unit which indicates she was in fact secretary to Miss EMERY and as EMERY's receptionist relieved EMERY of "numerous important details". OSTER's file lists the following references:

In further connection with THEMA OSTER it is to be noted that she was in 1944, according to Confidential Informant T-1, a member of the white collar group of the District of Columbia, Communist Party. Further in the end of 1945, Confidential Informant T-2 advised THEMA OSTER was the leader of the Women's Abraham Lincoln White Collar group of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia. In October, 1948, OSTER resided at 11 Cranberry Street, Brooklyn, New York.

#### Other Corroboration

It is to be noted that on February 8, 1949, the file reflecting ANDREE EMERY's employment with the National Research Commission in December, 1945, was checked by Special Agent Thomas J. Barry. This file reflected that EMERY resided at 1400 Volta Place, NW. The 1935 and 1936 city directories indicate that Mr. FRED EMESSELL resided at this address. Mr. NESSELL's employment was shown as Registrar of George Washington University.

On February 24, 1949, NESSELL, who is presently business manager of the GEORGE WASHINGTON University and who presently resides at 4517 Western Avenue, NW, recalled that one ANDREE EMERY roomed with him for about two months in about 1938. NESSELL stated that this period could have been 1935, but that he was inclined to place it at a somewhat later period. He advised he had a clear recollection of EMERY and remembered living with her at the time was a short dark girl whose name he could not recall. After NESSELL had conversed with his wife, he was reinterviewed and he advised that after discussing this matter with his wife they recalled the last name of the girl who lived with EMERY was OSTER and that her first name was possibly THELMA. NESSELL was unable to furnish a description of OSTER.

Mr. HUTCHINSON and Mrs. TEAGUE advised that at about the end of 1935 personnel from the U.S. Department of Agriculture who had been working in the Indian Rehabilitation Unit of the U.S. Department of Interior were returned to the Department of Agriculture.

#### Files at the U. S. Department of Agriculture

On February 9, 1949, Mrs. JOYCE KELLY, Assistant Chief of the Training Division, Farmers Home Administration, U.S. Department of Agriculture, produced the file of ANDREE EMERY. This file reflects the dates of EMERY's employment with the Indian Rehabilitation program to be from July 11, 1935, to November 15, 1935, at which date her employment was terminated within the department, without prejudice due to the curtailment of the Indian Rehabilitation work. This file indicates that EMERY had a staff of 13 technical assistants and 15 clerical, stenographic, file and drafting assistants in her capacity as chief of the Planning Section. This file does not contain any information with respect to the identity of EMERY's secretary. Other information with respect to this file is set forth below.

Mrs. KELLY was of the opinion that the records of the Indian Rehabilitation Unit were possibly maintained by the U.S. Department of Interior and advised that no records of this organization had been forwarded to the Department of Agriculture. Accordingly inquiry in the file room of the U.S. Department of Interior of one GEORGE COOPER, a file clerk, indicated that COOPER had a vague recollection that sometime about 1938, numerous miscellaneous boxes of Indian Rehabilitation Unit records were forwarded to

the National Archives. COOPER after a thorough search of his own file room could produce no record of the Bureau of Indian Rehabilitation.

#### Files at the National Archives

On February 24, 1949, Mr. CARL L. TRAVERS, Archivist-in-charge, Interior and Public Worke Section, National Reserve Division, room 13 E, National Archives, advised that after considerable search he had located several boxes of miscellaneous files of the Indian Rehabilitation Division, U.S. Department of Interior. Among those records was a two page document entitled "Status of Personnel". Inclian Rehabilitation as of October 1 " and sub-captioned Washington Office. The first name on this list was that of ANDREE EMERY and indicates she was a principal social-economic expert, P-5, and M(Chief, Planning Section) . This document indicates EMERY was appointed effective July 11th. The 8th name on this list is that of THELMA OSTER, a senior stenographic employee, CAF-3 and "(secretary to Chief of Planning Section) \*. This roster reflects that OSTER's appointment was effective September 1. Although the date 1935 does not appear on this document it is noted this particular phase of the Indian Rehabilitation office was in existence only in the year 1935. Other documents in this file indicated that both EMERY and OSTER used telephone extension 4058 and miscellaneous memoranda dictated by ANDREE EMERY on the following dates bore the stenographic initials "to": 9/16/35, 8/28/35, 8/27/35 (three memoranda on this date) and 9/16/35.

The file of THELMA OSTER at the U.S. Department of Agriculture

On February 25, 1949, Mrs. JOYCE KELLY produced the file of THELMA OSTER, at the U.S. Department of Agriculture. This file contained an application dated October 14, 1935, which reflected OSTER resided at 4400 Volta Place, NW and that she was born in Rochester, New York, August 25, 1910 and that her legal residence was at Rochester. The file reflects that OSTER was educated in Rochester and graduated from Eastern High School in that Her past employment is shown as a secretary for the legal firm of ARTHUR E. SUTHERLAND AND DWYER, Union Trust Building, Rochester, New York for 32 years, 1928 until 1931, followed by a 3½ year employment at the Rochester Board of Education, from 1931 to 1933. For the nine months previous to her employment at the Indian Rehabilitation Office, this file reflects that OSTER was employed as the secretary to ANDREE EMERY in New York City and that she was so engaged in compiling research data. The exact dates of this employment are from October, 1934 to June, 1935 and the place of employment is listed as 68 Barrow or Burrow Street, New York City. This file reflects that OSTER entered on active duty as secretary in the Indian Rehabilitation Unit on September 3. 1935. She executed an oath of office on September 30, 1935 and again on November 8, 1935. On October 7, 1935, according to this file OSTER was transferred to the Project Planning and Control Section, Selection and Analysis Unit, Land Utilization Office, Rural Rehabilitation Administration and on July 21, 1937

resigned to accept a position with the Social Security Board.

This file contains a job outline of OSTER's position at the Indian Rehabilitation Unit which indicates she was in fact secretary to Miss EMERY and as EMERY's receptionist relieved EMERY of "numerous important details". OSTER's file lists the following references:

In further connection with THEIMA OSTER it is to be noted that she was in 1944, according to Confidential Informant T-1, a member of the white collar group of the District of Columbia, Communist Party. Further in the end of 1945, Confidential Informant T-2 advised THEIMA OSTER was the leader of the Women's Abraham Lincoln White Collar group of the Communist Party of the District of Columbia. In October, 1948, OSTER resided at 11 Cranberry Street, Brooklyn, New York.

### Other Corroboration

It is to be noted that on February 8, 1949, the file reflecting ANDREE EMERY's employment with the National Research Commission in December, 1945, was checked by Special Agent Thomas J. Barry. This file reflected that EMERY resided at 4400 Volta Place, NW. The 1935 and 1936 city directories indicate that Mr. FRED E. MESSELL resided at this address. Mr. NESSELL's employment was shown as Registrar of George Washington University.

On February 24, 1949, NESSELL, who is presently business manager of the GEORGE WASHINGTON University and who presently resides at 4517 Western Avenue, NW, recalled that one ANDREE EMERY roomed with him for about two months in about 1938. NESSELL stated that this period could have been 1935, but that he was inclined to place it at a somewhat later period. He advised he had a clear recollection of EMERY and remembered living with her at the time was a short dark girl whose name he could not recall. After NESSELL had conversed with his wife, he was reinterviewed and he advised that after discussing this matter with his wife they recalled the last name of the girl who lived with EMERY was OSTER and that her first name was possibly THEIMA. NESSELL was unable to furnish a description of OSTER.

It is noted that in October, 1944, THELMA OSTER was observed by agents of the Washington Field Office and was at that time described as follows:

It is noted that subject EMERY's research problem was entitled "Economic Status of the Intelligentsia in a Depression". EMERY listed the following names as references:

This file further reflects that EMERY sailed for Europe on July 1, 1932, aboard the SS Olympic and indicated that first class mail should be forwarded to her at the following address: Mrs. BORISKA SZIRMAI, Budapest II, Neszutca and that periodicals for her should be forwarded to the Workers Educational Bureau, 1440 Broadway, New York City. The file indicated that EMERY expected to return to the United States at the end of August, 1932.

JONES ADVISED NAVY DOCUMENTS KEPT ON OPEN FILE AND AVAILABLE TO ANYONE IN BUSTANDARDS; CHARGE OUT WAS REQUIRED BUT CHARGE OUT ELIPS DESTROYED AFTER TWO YEARS AND NO FURTUER RECORD KEPT. JONES STATED THERE WAS NO DISTRIBUTION OF MATERIAL WITHIN THE BUREAU AND DOCUMENTS WERE NOT ROUTED THROUGHOUT BUREAU. STATED SHE RECALLS NO REQUEST FOR DOCUMENTS BY PIGMAN OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL. JONES ADVISED SHE IS COMPETENT TO PRODUCE AND IDENTIFY DOCUMENTS AS WELL AS TESTIFY TO THEIR AVAILABILITY. LAB WILL SUTEL UPON COMPLETION OF EXAMINATIONS. DETAILED REPORT FOLLOWS.

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
