FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) **National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

Unquestionably you receive all kinds of odd requests from every type of "crackpot". For that reason, one hesitates about pursuing the subject of this letter. "I have also learned that a few men from this battalion have expressed agreement with these policies to German fraeuleins. This practice will stop immediately and you may be sure that I will use great effort on the part of the counter-intelligence corps and S-2 personnel to see that it stops right now.

"The Soviet Government is an ally of the United States of America and you are individually and collectively representatives of our Government. I will not tolerate any disparaging remarks against our allies to the German people.

Lynch Mobs Don't Always Wear

You don't always lynch a man by hanging him from a tree. There is a great lynch mob among us and they go unhooded and work without the rope. They have no leader but their own hatred of humanity. They are the quietly degraded, who plot against the helpless with skill and a coward's stealth and without fear of reprisal. Their weapon is as painful as the lash, the hot tar, the noose or the shotgun. They string up a man with the whisper of a lie and they persecute him with ridicule. They require no burning cross as a signal of assembly and need no sheet to identify themselves to each other. They are the night riders who operate 24 hours a day.

They lynch a man with a calculated contempt which no court of law can consider a crime. Such a venomous conspiracy is the one now trying to run Jackie Robinson out of organized baseball. It does not go for all ball players and not even all the St. Louis Cards, some of whom are accused of trying to arrange a strike to protest against the presence of a Negro in the big league. But such a state exists and we should all be ashamed of it, not only those connected with the sport, but any one who considers this his country. It is an indication, I believe, that as a people we are a failure and not as good as the laws by which we live.

We are a people guaranteed more freedoms than any other. on earth. Yet there are among us some who would refute those documents which pledge us the things that people fight for everywhere and rarely achieve. When such persecutions become the aim of a government it is the record of history that men rise in revolt against the leaders of their state. It was to defeat such persecutions that men fought in the undergrounds of Europe and in every righteous army since man first realized freedom is seldom achieved without struggle. We are a people who consider such privileges as ordinary because they were written down in the book for us to live by long ago. But among us are those who consider these FRIDBY MBY 16, 1947 liberties as their own and would take them from the defenseless whom they can afford to torment. They form a lynch mob that is out to avenge a right.

Only the stupidly bold among them collect on mountain sides by the light of torches. You find them wherever you go and their lodge is national although they pay no dues and carry no card. It is only ratural that baseball, being our country's sport, should be played by some of them because they are in all trades and professions and they carry an invisible rope with them at all times. It is my belief that such a philosophy of hate does not dominate baseball. If it does, then they should burn up all the bats and balls and turn cattle to graze on the outfield grass. Baseball is not a way of life but an escape from it. It is to the bleachers and the grandstands that the multitudes flee to forget the world beyond the fences. Such a haven should not be corrupted by senseless hate, but once it is, baseball has no reason to exist.

Baseball is supported by the people and I have heard them demand justice for Robinson. If their applause is any indication, they ask that Robinson be accepted as an athlete and is entitled to the right to be judged by the scorer's ledger and not by the prejudices of indecent men. It is my belief that Robinson is a big leaguer of ordinary ability. If he is not, then he should be sent down to the minors because it is the opinion of all of us who consider baseball a sport that skill and honesty are the only qualifications a man should have. It is doubtful if Robinson has yet shown his true worth. He came up as a shortstop, was transformed into a second baseman at Montreal and now is playing first. It is a tribute to his solidness as a man that he hasn't fallen apart as a ball player. Less heart has burned better ball players out of the big leagues. About him rages the silent uproar of a perpetual commotion. He is the most discussed ball player of his time and his judges do not evaluate him for his actions on the field alone. But he has concealed the turmoil within him and when you talk to him there is no indication he regards himself as a special man who faces problems no other big leaguer ever faced before. The times I have spoken to him he has praised all those with whom he plays.

What goes on in the privacy of the hotel rooms where the Dodgers gather I don't know. I have listened to Eddie Stanky praise Robinson for his alertness. Jackie told me himself that Hughie Casey had helped him when he needed practice and advice on making the difficult plays a first baseman must face.

But in the clubhouse Robinson is a stranger. The Dodgers are politic and courteous with him but it is obvious he is isolated by those with whom he plays. I have never heard remarks made against him or detected any rudeness where he was concerned. But the silence is loud and Robinson never is part of the jovial and aimless banter of the locker room. He is the loneliest man I have ever seen in sports.

We have been involved in a war to guaranted all people the right to a life without fear. The peoples of the earth are saill assailed by the same doubts and terrors. The old men once more talk of violence and only the dead are sure of peace. In such a world it seems a small thing that a man be able to play a game unmolested. In our time such a plea should be unnecessary. But when it happens we must again remember that all this country's enemies are not beyond the frontiers of our home land.

BRITISH AIM TO RULE MIDDLE EAST THRU PUPPET KING ABDULLAH

Here is the real explanation of Britain's current plot against Palestine, the reasons for which have mystified the entire world. I cannot disclose the identity of my informant—but here are the facts.

The world has not been able to understand Britain's secret motives in disarming the Jews while arming the Trans-Jordania Arabs; the motives for permitting British officers to accompany the Trans-Jordanian invaders while Britain was sabotaging the U.S. eleventh hour plan for a trusteeship over the Holy Places. Why, people ask, should His Majesty's Government stoop to a final offensive against its Jewish wards just when Britain was withdrawing from Palestine altogether?

Here are the answers:

Britain does not expect to stay out of Palestine, at least not out of all Palestine. Britain expects to stay out of the State of Israel.

them. This they would never do voluntarily. Therefore it must be captured by Abdullah's British-armed and British-officered Arab Legion. At this point the Jews could, the British believe, be compelled to give up the Negeb in exchange for western Galilee.

But this is not all of Britain's plans. Abdullah's present kingdom is, with the exception of a narrow strip along the river Jordan, a desert waste. Its capital, Amman, is a Bedouin village. The British are planning to let him (Abdullah) take over a new and splendid capital, namely, Jerusalem itself.

If Abdullah can seize the Holy City, take over the Arab areas of central Palestine, add the Negeb, link up a port on the Mediterranean with Aqaba on the Red Sea, then his country will be one of the most important in the entire area. Arab Trans-Jordania and not Jewish Israel will become the radiating center of occidental influence in the Middle East.

But Britain is very much in Trans-Jordania-and expects to remain there.

Trans-Jordania can, however, serve Britain adequately only if it can be enlarged in a certain way. The frontiers of partition drawn by the U. N. Commission do not satisfy Britain's ambitions for King Abdullah.

These frontiers leave to the Palestinian Arabs northwest Galilee along the Lebanon border-which British plans do not require Abdullah to possess. Yet to permit northwest Galilee to go to the state of Lebanon would alarm unduly the Christian half of the Lebanese. Therefore, the Jews can be permitted to acquire northwestern Galilee.

In exchange, Abdullah must obtain most of the Negeb, that wedge-like portion of Palestine that extends from the Mediterranean down to the Red Sea. This would make Trans-Jordania the only country in the Middle East except Egypt that fronts on both the Mediterranean and the Red Seas. A railway line connecting a Mediterranean port, perhaps Gaza or a place farther west, with Agaba on the Red Sea, would parallel the Suez Canal. Thereby Britain, forced out of Egypt, could both defend and control the Suez Canal from the eastern side.

For this reason the Jews must be forced to yield the coveted portion of the Negeb which the U. N. Commission bestowed upon Occidental influence would mean

This joint British-Arab dream can be brought about only subject to three conditions:

- 1. There must be no trusteeship that will let American and French forces back into the area. More important, there must be no international trusteeship over the Holy Places for otherwise Abdullah could not make Jerusalem into his capital city.
- 2. Abdullah's armies must be strong enough to wrest Jerusalem from the Jewish Haganah. This they can best accomplish under British leadership. Therefore the British commander and the British officers must remain with the Arab Legion unless and until the United Nations make this impossible.

Finally, Haganah must be defeated quickly or it cannot be defeated at all. Once ports of Israel are open to the free influx of Jewish volunteers and Jewish war materiel, Haganah will quickly become unbeatable. Therefore Abdullah must take what he covets now-or never.

Stop-Look-Listen WARNING

Briefly, the International Latex Corporation was chartered in Delaware in 1937 and Abraham N. Spanel became and still is President and Chairman of the Board of this company. We investigated Spanel in April, 1953, after receiving a report that he associated with communist sympathizers. gation revealed that he had married one Margaret Liberson, who at one time was a contributor to the publication "New Masses" and a communist sympathizer. sources that have stated that Spanel was pro-Soviet while others have indicated he is a patriotic American. He is also said to be very liberal in his views. conducted an investigation of Spanel in 1943 relative to an editorial by Max Lerner (formerly associated with "PM" newspaper, New York City) which appeared in the 7-7-43 issue of the "Washington Post." This editorial was printed in that paper, according to the caption, as a public service by the International Latex Corporation and the editorial constituted an apologia of the Russians and their methods. There has been no indication that Spanel is a member of the Communist Party. He was born at Odessa, Russia, on 5-15-99 and by profession is a chemical engineer. Over the years on numerous occasions he has had published lengthy/ seditorial advertisements in various newspapers. Some years ago his advertisements were of a left-wing nature and he has reportedly advertised in the "Daily Worker" and reprinted articles from it in other newspapers. In more recent years his articles have been of an anticommunist nature. The editorials usually concern foreign political matters and in 1959. Spanel published an article called "An Appeal to Enlighten Self-" Interest" in the New York Times which was favorable toward France and critical of the United States concerning the then present problems of the French and the Americans linvolving international policies and the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. articles in the late 1940's quoted speeches of former Vice President Henry A. Wallace.

An article written by Westbrook Pegler on 3-15-45 charged Spanel with spreading pro-communist and pro-Russian propaganda through his full page advertisement in newspapers which advertisement was characterized as a public service feature. Later, in October, 1945, there was a news article that Spanel was suing the King Features Syndicate, who syndicated Pegler's column, for 6 million dollars alleging that the column by Pegler was libelous.

An informant in the mid 1940's advised that Spanel was "an extreme liberal of the Henry A. Wallace type." The informant stated that Spanel was a personal friend of Wallace and entertained groups of "liberals" in his home at Princeton, New Jersey, which has a dormitory set up in one wing of the building to accommodate a large number of friends who remain at his place overnight and during weekends. The informant attended one or two of the informal meetings at Spanel's home and he stated that all of the conversations seemed to favor Russia.

Albert E. Kahn, who was a delegate to the New York State Convention of the Communist Party in 1945 and co-authored the pro-Soviet work "The Great Conspiracy," gave autographed copies of the book which was published in 1946 to Spanel and the International Latex Corporation. One source suggested that a possible source of funds for Kahn was Abe Spanel. One of the visitors to his Princeton home, Louis Hyman Bean, a former economist at the Department of Agriculture, was affiliated with several Communist Party front organizations and a close associate and advisor of Henry Wallace. In 1948, a confidential source advised that Spanel was a contact of Alfred Stern, subject of a Russian espionage investigation.

In 1943, Spanel reported to our New York Office information relative to the efforts on the part of individuals sympathetic to the Axis Powers to secure the records and models of one Nikola Tesla, an outstanding scientist. Tesla was conducting experiments on a "death ray." In 1945, an informant advised that he had received information which led him to believe that a group sympathetic to Russia was making efforts to secure the effects of Tesla and it was the informant's understanding that the motivating force behind the attempt was Spanel.

CLEMENCY

A. N. SPANEL, Chairnan
International Latex Coppration

The insidious activities of domestic communists have long posed difficult legal and moral problems for the democratic societies under Kremlin attack.

When measured by its menace to a free nation's security, Red subversion is a crime more serious, if anything, than "ordinary" crime. To ignore or condone it would be suicidal complacency. But how can a democratic society, treasuring its civil liberties, deal with communists who seek to destroy them — without in the process diluting those very liberties?

For four decades our State and Federal legislatures have tried to frame laws to meet this dilemma, without much success. Either the legislation is nullified by courts concerned first of all with protecting the Bill of Rights, or it is so ambiguous that it cannot be effectively entorced.

The Smith Act, passed by Congress June 28, 1940 has survived a long series of tests in the courts. It has put a handful of Red leaders in prison. But its utility has been limited, and rightly so, by our Constitutional safeguards.

CONVICTIONS SCARCE

One of the vital sections of the Act, the so-called Membership Clause, in theory opens all active members of the Communist Party to prosecution. In practice, the stringent proofs of "knowing" participation in the communist conspiracy prescribed by the Act have made conviction all but impossible.

A number of important communists have been indicted under the clause — but the conviction of only one; Junius Irving Scales, has been made to stick.

The Scales case is so ironical, so unfair, that it offends the common sense and the conscience of patriotic Americans aware of its background. The legality of the man's conviction is not in question, having been reviewed and sustained by the Supreme Court. But legality and justice do not necessarily coincide. It is precisely for this reason that executive intervention is available to redress the balance.

The startling fact is that the only man punished, and punished harshly, under legislation designed against communists, actually is no longer a communist! Here is the gist of the strange and disturbing story:

Junius Scales became a communist in 1940, while a student at the University of North Carolina. Because of his social prominence and his ability as an organizer, the Party bosses quickly assigned him to leadership in North Carolina.

In 1954, he was indicted under the "Knowing membership" section of the Smith Act. A year later he was convicted. On appeal, a retrial was ordered. In 1958, he was again convicted and received a six-year sentence — a heavier term than Eugene Dennis and other top national communist leaders had drawn under other clauses of the Act. In June, 1961, the Supreme Court, by the narrowest margin of 5-to-4, sustained the conviction and four months later Scales entered. Federal penitentiary.

QUITS PARTY: JAILED

But in the years when his case was dragging through the courts, Scales had undergone the kind of change of views all too familiar in the communist movement. The revelations of Stalin's sordid crimes early in 1956 and the brutal crushing of the Hungarian revolt shattered his faith in communism. In February, 1957, he quit the Party in utter disgust. He joined the legions of ex-communists, whom the Party hates and abuses more viciously than mere non-communists.

Thus Junius Scales, when he was retried and reconvicted in 1958, actually was no longer a communist. Technically, of course, that was irrelevant to the judicial procedure. His renunciation of communism had not been influenced by his personal plight. It was a genuine revulsion against the cause he had served for nearly 17 years.

The Communist Party protested against his conviction, since it feared that the Supreme Court precedent might put other members behind bars. But in the nature of the affair, the comrades gloated over the discomfiture of one whom they call a "renegade". They relished the joke that the only person ever convicted under the membership clause is an "ex":

BUT JOKE IS ON US

Unfortunately the joke is on us, not on the communists. While 10,000 members of the Party, hundreds of them "knowing" activists, remain free to ply their mischief, this former communist is in prison.

A committee of reputable Americans, is seeking executive clemency for Junius Scales. We believe that simple human decency, logic and political good sense support their effort.

Indeed, there is every reason why more Americans — and especially those who are outspoken and ardent opponents of communism — should add their voices to a demand for a quick and full pardon.

The purpose of the Smith Act and of any such laws is not vengeance but the protection of our national security. As a defector from communism, Scales is no longer a threat to our social order. On the contrary. As J. Edgar Hoover has repeatedly attested, ex-communists have the among the ablest, most devoted and most effective enemies of communism.

At worst, Junius Scales, if released, will fade into anonymity. At best—if he plays true to the pattern set by so many other disillusioned communists— he will help fight the conspiracy of which he was once a part.

In either case, his continued imprisonment is a stain on true justice. All judicial processes in his behalf have been exhausted. Only Presidential clemency remains. We believe it should be exercised without delay. After all, we want more ex-communists. We must bring understanding and human sympathy to the plight of those who "choose freedom" from the dark forces of communism.

He is listed as Director of the Child Welfare League of America in 1957, and as being connected with the Scott Horticultural Foundation, the Spanel Foundation and the Memorial International House. home address is Swarthmore, Pennsylvania.

Heinze is not identifiable in Bufiles.

In response to your request, following is a resume of information in Bufiles on captioned firm:

The International Latex Corporation (ILC) has never been a subject of FBI investigation, except for a recently opened inquiry regarding possible Fraud Against the Government violation involving Jen Products, a subcontractor of ILC. This inquiry is based on a letter of 4-3-64 from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, indicating an allegation had been received that Jen Products was overcharging ILC in connection with a Government contract. The inquiry is pending. (46-50177)

There is a main Information-Concerning type file (62-107342) on ILC containing three serials. This file and pertinent see references to the firm deal with one individual in the firm, Abraham N. Spanel, formerly listed as President and Chairman of the Board of this firm. He does not presently hold the position of President, but is still Chairman of the Board. Spanel has sponsored public-service type ads in newspapers which in past years have been of a pro-communist nature. In the mid 40's, some of these ads constituted an apology for the Russians. There is no indication he has ever been a member of the Communist Party. He is said to have been very liberal in his views and reportedly was associated with communists in the 1940's. Others have described him as a patriotic American.

In more recent years his articles have been of an anticommunist nature. He has recently attempted to promote a favorable attitude toward France in her efforts to build her nuclear strength in response to the communist challenge. An article by Spanel in the "Washington Post and Times Herald," 2-26-62, condemned "the insidious activities of domestic communists," but suggested that Junius Scales, whom Spanel described as an excommunist, be released, since like many other disillusioned communists, he might help in the fight against communism.

Irving Ferman, a Vice President of ILC since 1960, is a strong supporter of the Bureau and on the Special Correspondents' List on a first name basis. He accompanied the Brotherhood of the Washington Hebrew Congregation group which presented Mr. Hoover a First Century artifact and engraved Bible on 1-9-64.



Dear Mr. Spanel:

I have been an appreciative reader of your various paid political advertisements through the years. Like many other Americans, I am grateful for your public service.

In a small way, I am attempting to render public service also. It is my belief that, regardless of one's viewpoint of the actual tack that we should take at this time with respect to Vietnam, and regardless of one's degree of endorsement of President Johnson's policies, we must unite behind President Johnson so as to strengthen his hand when his emissaries commence to treat with those of the communist aggressor in the hope of working out a stabilized situation in Southeast Asia. Towards that end, I have organized a group called The Committee of Responsible Americans for the support of our fighting men and our President.

I have taken the liberty of enclosing a copy of a press release which went out and got just about no coverage that we have been able to determine. Had we been flag-burners, I am certain that we would have had our pictures in the paper. We hope shortly to commence publishing our advertisements and to garner at least one million signatures as tangible evidence of support for our foreign policy. Again, we do not believe that we are unique. Many other fine groups have devoted themselves successfully to showing expressions of support for our fighting men in the field. However, these tokens of support do not normally include support of the Commander-In-Chief as one of their announced goals. In that one regard, we expect to make a contribution of a different sort.

Dear Mr. Spanel:

One salutes, thankfully, your decision to republish your excellent and highly prescient article, "For Communists the Target is the World." I have just read it in the November 13 issue of the International Herald Tribune. and if, as you said on April 7, 1959, "Actually the threat to what remains of freedom on this planet is vastly greater than it was ten years ago," how much greater is this threat today, eight years after 1959:

But how shall we overcome these "debilitating delusions," how shall we convince the people of the United States that the communist menace is ever real, that it always has been, and that it is even more horribly real today? Can we, with a map of the world, show them that Russia's aims have always been, even in the time of the Czars, to move south to the warm water of the Mediterranean? And now, having added communist ideology to old Czarist dreams, Russia already has outposts in Syria and Egypt. What will prevent her from taking over the oil-rich countries of the Middle East and moving from there into the new nations of Africa, confused by tribal bickering and ripe for the plucking? Can we show these Americans, again looking at a map of Asia, that China, with half the area of Russia but with three to four times the population, can, unless stopped, easily move south, swallow all of the countries of Southeast Asia, take over the rich islands of Indonesia and, once established, find Australia a helpless victim? With this aggression accomplished by China, what will happen to South Korea, Japan and the Philippines?

These are not silly "communist-under-the-bed" fears. These are very possible and, even worse, probable geo-political facts of life. For the target of the Communists is indeed, as your title plainly spells out, the world.

But, our wishful-thinking compatriots will tell us, mussia and China are at sword's point, they detest each other because each wishes to be the leader of the communist world. Are we so sure of this? If we take the time to read history, we can find that many hoaxes have been perpetrated to the dismay, later, of the hoaxed. Can we be certain that the quarrel between mussia and China is real—or only apparent? Can we be sure that it is not part of a grand design to bemuse, lull and anaesthetize the free world? The "crisis of the month" theory, so cogently set forth first in your article of April 7, 1959, bears out this slow "boring from within" process. Note: Cuba, the Congo, Nigeria, the Middle East, Vietnam, Bolivia. Where will the Communists stoke the fire for the next "crisis of the month?" And shall the United States run from crisis to crisis, bleeding men and money, until there is no blood left?

And now the Russians have announced the FOBS. Secretary McNamara says this does not violate the space treaty, signed last month, which bars atomic weapons in orbit. But suppose the Russians send this weapon only half way around and drop it on Washington and New York, or on the heart of the continent, or on the West Coast? How much comfort will the Americans who remain be able to take in the knowledge that Russia has not violated the treaty? And when have the Russians not unilaterally violated any treaty or agreement whenever it suited their purposes?

Certainly the public service division of the International Latex Corporation has done and is doing its utmost to apprise the free world of the dangers which threaten to engulf it. You have made it clear that the rulers of the communist world suffer neither from fatigue, nor from human weakness, nor from wishful thinking, nor from "debilitating delusions." They are tough and adamant, and their aim is to reduce the free world of Western Europe and America to a status of vassalage and submission to their rule. Shall we of the free West recognize the danger only when we see that all that remains to us is Western Europe and the Western hemisphere? Is it not possible that such recognition will come too late?

Synopsis:

Mr. DAVID CHALE, Cincinnati, Ohio, formerly employed as a Consulting Engineer by Jen Products, a subcontractor to InternationLatex Corporation, Dover, Delaware, which firm was engaged in the manufacture of Apollo Space Suits, states Jen Products submitted false overhead rate figures to Latex Corporation at Dover, Delaware. CHALE said Jen Products, formerly a one man operation engaged in photographic supply work, had total overhead of \$10 per month for office rental, and charged Latex at a fixed rate of 29% of \$8 for each hour of work performed by two employees. CHALE also alleges Jen Products used this name in establishing a new Consulting Engineer Firm, in order to meet requirement of having been in business at least one year prior to working on a Government contract.

DETAILS

Investigation in this matter is predicated upon receipt of a letter, dated April 3, 1964, addressed to the Director, FBI, from Mr. CHARLES G. HAYNES. Director of Inspections, National Aeronautics and

Space Administration, Washington 25, D.C.

Mr. HAYNES' letter sets forth said allegations against Jen Products, which allegations were furnished to National Aeronautics and Space Administration by Mr. DAVID CHALE, a former employee of Jen Products. According to Mr. CHALE, International Latex is a subcontractor of Hamilton Standard, which company reportedly has a NASA CPFF contract for the development of an Apollo Astronaut Space Suit.

The letter states that Jen Products is a one man company represented by a Mr. JENNER, who employees consultants whenever required by his work load. JENNER is said to be a brother-in-law of Mr. FELLOWS, a vice-president of International Latex.

Mr. CHALE reported that Mr. JENNER billed the International Latex Company for personnel services at the rate of \$8 per hour plus 29 percent overhead, plus 2 percent profit. According to Mr. CHALE, Mr. JENNER's only overhead was a \$10 per month rental of desk space. Mr. JENNER is said to be involved in the reliability aspects of the work done by International Latex, but according to Mr. CHALE he is not qualified to do this work.

Mr. CHALE also stated he received approximately \$360 per week as a consultant to Jen Products and implied that Mr. JENNER was billing International Latex at a considerably higher figure. Mr. CHALE expressed the opinion that this was possible because of the relationship between Mr. JENNER and Mr. FELLOWS. Mr. CHALE is convinced that the Government, through the NASA CPFF contract with Hamilton Standard, is probably the recipient of excessive claims.

Our Manned Spacecraft Center at Houston, Texas, awarded a CPFF contract to Hamilton Standard Division, United Aircraft Corporation, for the development of Apollo Space Suits and associated life support systems and International Latex Corporation is an approved subcontractor. From the information in our files, we could not establish a contractual relationship between Jen Products and International Latex Corporation or with Hamilton Standard Division, United Aircraft

Corporation.

The above information is being furnished for whatever action you deem appropriate. Our efforts to secure, by mail, more specific information from Mr. CHALE have been unsuccessful, as he has not replied to our correspondence.

Mr. DAVID CHALE, home address 1125 Fort View Place, Cincinnati, Ohio, telephone 241-5456, furnished the following information under oath:

Mr. CHAIR stated that he has known MYRON (MIKE)
JENNER for many years. JENNER owned and operated a
photographic supply and camera business known as Jen Products
in New York. For the last 10 years, JENNER lost money
steadily since the influx of foreign camera parts and
supplies, and, for the past three or four years he had been
doing nothing. He had no income and was residing on his
sister's farm in Bethel, Vermont.

Approximately three years ago, while employed in Montreal, Canada, for a Labor Relations Consulting Firm, CHALE said he made frequent trips to Bethel, Vermont, just to see Mr. JENNER.

CHALE said he often brought groceries and arranged dates and entertainment for JENNER just to try and help cheer him up.

During one of these visits, CHALE mid he offered to help JENNER find a job and get him back on his feet. He described JENNER as being an excellent tool and die maker, as well as being an excellent mechanic. JENNER holds several patents on small inventions, and is very intelligent in his field, however, he has had no experience as a mechanical engineer and was not qualified to make decisions, furnish estimates, proposals, write documentations, or reports.

CHALE admitted he obtained a position for JENNER

as a Consulting Engineering with Aero Tech, Dayton, Ohio, where both he and JENNER worked for Aero at a General Electric Plant.

CHALE said he carried JENNER in this job, wrote his reports at night, made proposals and recommended prices and explanations for him.

CHALE explained that as a Consulting Engineer, he, CHALE, moves from one consulting engineer firm to another for periods ranging from a year to several years, or until a particular project is completed.

He advised that after working with JENNER for a while, JENNER then got ambitious and thought they could start their own firm. JENNER had a fixation for spy work. He had been associated with "OSS" during the war years as an enlisted man. He did quite well because of his ability to invent and adapt small gadgets for use in "OSS."

He was a close friend of General DONOVAN of "OSS," now deceased.

It was JENNER's plan to hire out to large firms as consulting Engineers, but in reality they would report on the abilities and work habits of the firm's employees.

Mr. CHALE explained that in obtaining Government contract work, the Government requires that the firm be in business for at least a year prior to obtaining Government contracts. Since Jen Products had been in business for more than a year, even though the operations of Jen Products had been curtailed for several years, this name was used for the new consulting engineer firm.

International Latex Corporation, Dover, Delaware, had agreed to hire Jen Products as Consulting Engineers on a

sub-contract, which Latex held from Hamilton Standard.

Mr. JENNER is the brother-in-law of Mr. FELLER, President of International Latex Corporation. JENNER had been in touch with FELLER, and FELLER was impressed with JENNER's idea of starting a new consulting engineer firm.

Apparently Mr. FELLER needed the immediate services of consulting engineers in connection with the Hamilton Standard sub-contract.

CHALE said International Latex Corporation of Dover, Delaware, was awarded a sub-contract from Hamilton Standard to produce Apollo Astronaut Space Suits. Latex Corporation normally produces rubberized goods such as Latex gloves, women's foundation garments, girdles, brassieres, and all types of rubberized fabrics.

In hiring Jen Products as Consulting Engineers, and since a Government contract was involved, a Government clearance was necessary for Jen Products before the firm could work on the project.

JENNER, upon being advised of this, telephoned Mr. FELLER and told him they would not be able to work on the project until a clearance came through on Jen Projects.

CHALE said he could only hear one side of the conversation with FELLER, and does not know what FELLER's reply was, but after completing the telephone call, JENNER then told CHALE that they, JENNER and CHALE, were to start on the project as International Latex Corporation employees until the clearance for Jen Products came through.

The organization of officers of Jen Products was handled by JENNER. The distribution of profit was to be 60 per cent for JENNER, 30 per cent for CHALE, and 10 per cent for Mr. AUBREY TUNNELL.

CHALE advised that Mr. TUNNELL is a former U.S. Army Colonel in business for himself in the labor relation field. His address is 38 Park Row, New York City, New York, and he is a close friend of JENNER. TUNNELL was to be designated as Security Officer of Jen Products in order to facilitate security clearance of Jen Products.

Mr. CHALE explained that JENNER had requested TUNNELL to serve in this capacity, and TUNNELL offered office space for Jen Products which space consisted of nothing more than a desk and possibly a telephone.

For this, TUNNELL was to receive \$10 a month rental from Jen Products.

CHALE stated that this office space was the only location of Jen Products and constituted the entire overhead.

Mr. CHALE said he and JENNER worked as employees of International Later at the IndustrialProducts Division Plant, Dover, Delaware, doing the work of consulting engineers, but were actually being paid weekly salaries by Later Corporation at the rate of \$8 per hour each, or approximately \$320 per week plus expenses.

CHALE said they were employed in this capacity from November 1, 1963, to the end of December, 1963.

The security clearance for Jen Products came through in December, 1963, at which time CHALE and JENNER resigned their positions with International Latex and became Consulting Engineers for Jen Products.

This change of employment was a mere paper change. According to CHALE, they remained at the same desks in the same office at Latex; the only change consisted in salary. CHALE and JENNER were dropped from the Latex payroll as employees, and Jen Products commenced to bill Latex for time,

expenses, and overhead of CHALE and JENNER.

The total amount established was \$12 per hour for each CHALE and JENNER, which included \$8 per hour wages, plus 29 per cent of \$8 for overhead, plus two per cent profit plus expenses. This came to slightly above \$12 per hour, but was rounded off to the nearest dollar.

CHALE said he cautioned JENNER, who computed the rates, to be charged, that the rate was too high and the Government would not stand still for these rates. CHALE stated that the overhead rate of 29 per cent of \$8 per hour is completely false in that the only overhead consisted of \$10 a month agreed upon with Mr. TUNNELL for rental of a desk and telephone in Mr. TUNNELL's office.

CHALE stated he doubts if Mr. TUNNELL was ever paid \$10, that the greement to rent office space was a means of obtaining a mailing address for Jen Products rather than an actual office.

During the month of January, 1964, CHALE said he had many differences of opinion with JENNER. He said JENNER became an obnoxious know-it-all.

Laterin January, 1964, after the Later Plant had closed for the day, CHALE said the security guard for fater came up to his desk and said he was sorry to hear that Mr. CHALE had resigned, and that he wanted to be sure that Mr. CHALE left his identification badge at the office before he left the plant.

CHALE said he was momentarily stunned. Hessaid he confronted JENNER and asked him why he was being discharged. JENNER told him he no longer needed him and was not cutting CHALE in on something this good.

A few words were passed, and Mr. JENNER threatened CHALE that if he started trouble for JENNER, he would know how to take care of CHALE.

Mr. CHALE said he was fired from Jen Products the day before they were to finalize their agreement in writing, of shares in interest and organization of Jen Products.

Mr. CHALE said he has heard that JENNER or Jen Products was removed from the Apollo Project by Mr. FELLER of Later. The reason given to JENNER for his dismissal was the fact that he had too many lies on his clearance questionnaire.

Mr. CHALE furnished his present home address as 1125 Fort View Place, Cincinnati, Ohio, telephone 241-5456. His prior address was 3057 Brighton Second Street, Brooklyn, New York, where his parents presently reside. His date of birth was furnished as July 29, 1913, and he has a high school education. He is divorced and was remarried about three weeks ago.

CHALE said MYRON JENNER resides in the 400 Block of West 24th Street, New York City, New York, and is listed under the name of MYRON JENNER in the local telephone directory.

CHALE also furnished information that the Security Clearance Questionnaire submitted by Jen Products to ILC contained false statements. CHALE also advised that Mr. FELLER, President of ILC was a brother-in-law of MYRON S. JENNER, who had determined the rate of overhead and other services to be billed ILC by Jen Products, Inc.





ROBERT J. REDDEN, 20 Fairfield Drive, Dover, Delaware, furnished the following information after being placed under oath and advised by SA(A) CHARLES W. ROHREN that he did not have to make a statement, that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law, and that he could consult with or obtain the services of an attorney prior to making any statement.

REDDEN advised that he has been employed by the International Latex Corporation, Industrial Products Division, (ILC), Dover, Delaware, since December, 1955. His present position is that of "Manager of Design Engineering", and he is also the Corporate Security Officer. His duties as Corporate Security Officer consist mainly of interviewing new employees and verifying information furnished by them so that a security clearance can be granted the new employee.

The new employee is furnished a copy of ILC pamphlet dated October 8, 1962, entitled, "Standard Practice Procedures for Safeguarding Classified Information", and a copy of "Federal Laws Covering Espionage, Sabotage and Subversive Activities".

The employee is told to read the two pamphlets and then fill out DD Form 48-2 entitled, "Application and Authorization for Access to Confidential Information". After the employee fills out the form, REDDEN then reads the first paragraph and the section regarding "Certification" on DD Form 48-2 to the employee. After reading these two items to the employee, he then asks the employee if he would like to change any of the information which he has furnished prior to signing the form. The employee also fills out Form Number 1619 entitled, "Security Statement" at that time.

REDDEN then verifies the employee's birth and checks with other companies should the employee have listed that he received a Security Clearance prior to seeking employment with ILC.

On DD Form 48-2, the employee states where he was born and that he does not belong or has ever belonged to any organization designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

REDDEN said that he does review the employee's personnel file and obtains information regarding his educational background which the employee has listed on his application for employment. This application for employment is filled out by the employee prior to being interviewed by him. There are no warnings on the employee's application advising the person seeking employment that false statements submitted are in violation of any Federal law.

The DD form 48-2 and form number 1619 which the employee fills out and signs for a Security Clearance as well as the other information furnished the employee does not contain any statement or information to the effect that false statements on the application for employment are in volation of any Federal law or that the application for employment is to be utilized in any manner regarding the Security Clearance.

Someone whom he does not recall made a statement regarding MYRON S. JENNER's educational background. He then obtained JENNER's personnel file and found on the application for employment that JENNER had listed he attended Erasmus Hall High School in Brooklyn, New York in 1934. He had also listed under colleged, NYU, New York City and that he obtained a M.E. in 1939. REDDEN stated that he assumed that M.E. meant Mechanical Engineer. JENNER's file revealed he had used the name of MYRON S. SCHWARTZ, at one time.

JENNER's personnel file indicated that attempts to verify his education at Erasmus High School were negative. A letter in his personnel file dated January 3, 1964 from the New York University, Office of the Registrar, advised that MYRON S. JENNER had satisfactorily completed an extensive War Training Course, entitled "Design of Production Tools," given from October 14, 1941 to December 11, 1941, consisting of 45 hours of study and that the course was not offered for college credit. There was no confirmation in JENNER's personnel file that he attended New York University in 1939.

REDDEN then wrote a letter to the Second U. S. Army Industrial Security Field Office, Building number 7, Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland, directed to the attention of Mr. G. EDGAR STEFFEE, JR., Chief Industrial Security Field Officer, regarding JENNER's education background which had not been verified. He

did this not because he thought JENNER had violated any law but merely to have this checked out and if he was not a graduate engineer it could be used to terminate his employment with International Latex Corporation. He did not question JENNER regarding this matter and to the best of his knowledge no one else did. He also reviewed DAVID H. CHALE's personnel file and found that CHALE had listed on his application for employment that he had graduated from the University of North Carolina at Chapell Hill, N. C. in 1929. A letter in CHALE's personnel file dated January 18, 1964, from the University of N. C., Chapel Hill, N. C. advised that a search of the file at the University failed to locate any record of DAVID H. CHALE having attended that University. CHALE was not questioned regarding this as he had already been terminated by MYRON S. JENNER.

REDDEN had also heard something about ERNEST JONN REGELMANN's educational background and had also attempted to obtain REGELMANN's personnel file with negative results. He had examined REGELMANN's personnel file at the time REGELMANN began his employment with ILC and at that time it had contained an application for employment.

The files regarding the Security Clearance Questionnaire submitted by Jen Products, Inc. can not be located and he has no idea what has happened to them.



She stated CHALE and his wife had left that address about two weeks ago and understood they would be returning the following week. She stated she had no idea where they were presently located. She also advised she did not know anyone by the name of ERNEST JOHN REGELMANN.

MYRON S. JENNER, 440 West 24th Street, New York, New York was interviewed at 38 Park Row, New York, New York. Mr. JENNER was advised that he did not have to make any statement; that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law; and that he had a right to consult an attenuable fore making any statement.

Mr. JENNER was placed under oath and was interviewed at length concerning the contract JEN PRODUCTS, INC. furnished engineers to International Latex Corporation during November and December, 1963 and January, 1964. Mr. JENNER stated that the overhead rate of 30% of direct labor was based on actual overhead experienced by the Company. He stated that the records of the company are in the possession of Philip Rubin, a public accountant, 327 Central Park West, New York, New York and he would request Mr. RUBIN to make them available for examination.

JENNER was questioned concerning information furnished to International Latex Corporation that he was a gradualte of New York University and Erasmus High School. JENNER advised that he attended Erasmus High School but did not graduate. JENNER said he attended a short course at N.Y.U. but never was enrolled as a regular student. JENNER said that the false information was supplied only because International Latex needed their help very much and he did it for the benefit of International. JENNER stated further that employees of JEN PRODUCTS did very good work on the contract and they were paid almost as much as JEN PRODUCTS received.

JENNER declined to furnish a sworn, signed statement.

JENNER stated that JEN PRODUCTS has been in business since 1946 and the plant is in Bethel, Vermont.

JENNER said that other engineers also indicated that they were graduate engineers when in fact they were not.



DETAILS:

On August 26, 1964, Mr. EDWARD SCHRECK, Executive Assistant to Mr. MAXWELL FELLER, Vice President, International Latex Corporation (ILC), Dover Delaware, advised that Mr. FELLER was out of town and was not available for interview, but he expected him back in Dover, Delaware during the week of August 31, 1964.

On September 2, 1964, Mr. SCHRECK advised that Mr. FELLER was ill and had been admitted to the hospital in Dover, Delaware for tests but he expected Mr. FELLER to be available for interview by September 9, 1964.

On September 9, 1964, Mr. SCHRECK advised that Mr. FELLER had suffered a heart attack on September 6, 1964, b7D

and that the doctors had advised him, Mr. SCHRECK, that they expected Mr. FELLER to be hospitalized for a period of at least six weeks and several weeks more for recuperation at home prior to returning to work.

On August 26, 1964, Mr. ROBERT J. REDDEN, Security Officer, ILC, Industrial Products Division, Dover, Delaware, advised that he had not as yet located the security clearance questionnaires regarding JEN Products, Inc. employees, which should be in the files of ILC.

On September 2, 1964, Mr. REDDEN advised that he had made a thorough review of his security files as a result of which he had fired his security clerk, namely, LARRY WILEY, for misplacing documents. Mr. REDDEN advised that his secretary was in the process of reorganizing his security files and that he expected to have them completely reorganized and in order by September 9, 1964.

On September 9, 1964, Mr. REDDEN advised that he had not located any additional documents regarding the security clearances for JEN employees but that his secretary had obtained information that JEN Products, Inc. had obtained a facility clearance of secret in November, 1963. She has also determined from this same Industrial Security Office that MYRON JENNER also had a secret security clearance and there was also indications that this same Industrial Security Office had information regarding security clearances for DAVID H. CHALE and ERNEST JOHN REGELMANN.

LEONARD F. SHEFARD, 54 Rodney Road, Dover, Delaware, was interviewed at his place of employment, the International Latex Corporation (ILC), Industrial Froducts Division, Dover, Delaware. SHEPARD was advised as to the nature of this investigation and that information would be furnished on a free and voluntary basis. SHEPARD was advised he did not have to furnish information and that no threats or pomises would be made to him to induce him to furnish information. SHEPARD was also advised that any information furnished by him could be used against him in a court of law, and that he could be called upon to testify in court in this case. SHEPARD was advised as to his rights to consult an attorney prior to furnish any information and that he would be requested to furnish information in this case under oath.

SHEPARD stated he had no objections to furnishing information in this case and furnished the following information under oath:

SHEPARD is presently the Apollo Program Manager for ILC, which is a project title and previously was Director of Research and Engineering, which is a division title, but has always been directly responsible for the Apollo Program at ILC. SHEPARD has been employed by ILC for the past 13 years and with the Industrial Products Division for the past 10 years.

In the Fall of 1963, ILC was in need of engineers for an expedite phase of their work in connection with the contract ILC has with Hamilton Standards Division, United Aircraft Corporation on the Apollo Program. A number of prospects for this work, who had been sent to ILC by M & T Company, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, an Engineer Employment Agency, had been interviewed but failed to qualify for the work.

SHEPARD stated he was becoming anxious about the situation and, because of his prior association with MYRON JENNER and JENNER's contacts in the engineering field, felt that possibly JENNER would help him locate competent engineers. Due to the fact JENNER is a brother-in-law of MAX FELLER, Vice President of Industrial Relations, ILC, SHEPARD cleared

his contact with FELLER and JENNER with his superior, Mr. D. IRVING OBROW, Vice President and Treasurer, ILC, prior to contacting FELLER regarding contacting JENNER. SHEPARD stated he recalls that Mr. FELLER also cleared his hiring of JENNER by ILC with Mr. WALTER HEINZ, President, ILC, Empire State Building, New York, New York.

SHEPARD stated he has known JENNER for approximately 10 or 12 years through his association with MAX FELLER, who is, in addition to being Vice President of ILC, also a neighbor of SHEPARD. Through this association, SHEPARD has learned that JENNER had developed, patented and produced a minox flash attachment and a blue dye for dipping flash bulbs in photographic work. SHEPARD does not have personal knowledge of this and has never seen the Jen Products, Incorporated, place of business, but all of his information was obtained from JENNER and FELLER and he also noted he has seen these products on the market.

SHEPARD contacted FELLER regarding contacting JENNER and he and FELLER jointly contacted JENNER, by telephone, from FELLER's office. SHEPARD contacted JENNER with the idea of employing the engineers as employees of ILC and JENNER proposed that he, JENNER, furnish the engineers to ILC on a contract basis. To the best of his recollection, SHEPARD believes that JENNER was working for or had recently worked for Republic Aviation, Dayton, Ohio. At this time, JENNER advised he had two engineers in mind but he was not positive they were available, JENNER stated he would contact these two men and advise SHEPARD if they were available. SHEPARD stated he does not recall if he specified to JENNER he was looking for engineers or implied this from the description of the work he wanted them to perform.

SHEPARD stated he has no idea as to when this occurred or the time lapse between contacts, but JENNER subsequently contacted him and advised that the two men he had considered for them were available and he would make them available for interview. SHEPARD stated he does not recall the details, that is if JENNER identified these perspective contract engineers or other arrangements at that time, but subsequently DAVID CHALE and JOHN REGELMANN were interviewed and accepted by DONALD WOHLGEMUTH, Manager

of Engineering, ILC, Industrial Products Division, on the basis of the interview and the resume submitted by CHALE and REGELMANN.

At that time JENNER advised that he was also available for work at ILC, and SHEPARD, based on his personal knowledge of the capabilities of JENNER, accepted JENNER. SHEPARD stated he was aware of the fact that JENNER was not a graduate engineer, but personally felt that JENNER had acquired equivalent ability and experience and was capable of doing the work. SHEPARD advised that JENNER was doing reliability work, which is the personal responsibility of SHEPARD and JENNER was therefore working directly for SHEPARD and CHALE and REGELMANN were working in the engineering section.

To expedite obtaining the services of these men they were hired as ILC employees until JENNER could obtain a Facility Security Clearance for Jen Products, Incorporated. When the necessary clearance was obtained their employment with ILC was terminated and they were considered as contract engineers furnished by Jen Products, Incorporated. SHEPARD does not recall when this occurred but the date will be reflected in ILC records.

With regard to the fees charged by Jen Products, Incorporated, SHEPARD stated that to the best of his recollection, the following events occurred in this regard:

JENNER first made an oral quote of \$15.00 per hour per man, SHEPARD advised him this was too high to be considered and that he had to be competitive to be considered for the work. SHEPARD does not specifically recall, but believes JENNER asked him what would be considered competitive and SHEPARD advised him that \$12.00 per hour per man would be the maximum offer considered. SHEPARD based this statement on the fact that ILC was paying M & T Company a maximum of \$12.02 per hour per man regular time and \$15.13 per hour over time, for contract engineers. As an example SHEPARD furnished the following breakdown of fees paid to M & T for a contract Mechanical Engineer:

SHEPARD stated he believes negotiations were carried on between _____ buyer for ILC, and JENNER, until there was a difference regarding the per diem rate. SHEPARD advised JENNER the per diem rate in his quote was too high and he could not approve a per diem rate of \$2.40 per hour as JENNER had quoted, because it was not competitive. SHEPARD told JENNER that employees were not particularly interested in the breakdown between the hourly rate and the per diem rate, that they were only interested in the total income. JENNER then reduced the per diem rate from \$2.40 per hour per man to \$1.40 per hour per man and increased the hourly rate from \$7.00 to \$8.00 per hour per man, resulting in the same charge to ILC, but still a competitive rate. submitted a new quote in writing on this basis, which was approved by SHEPARD. SHEPARD stated, to the best of his recollection, he did not discuss the other items in the itemized quote submitted by JENNER and accepted by ILC, with his, SHEPARD's, approval.

SHEPARD stated he subsequently received a report, he believes from WOHLGEMUTH, that CHALE's work was sub-standard and they were also having an administrative problem with CHALE. SHEPARD was asked if he objected to CHALE's being released and SHEPARD referred the report to JENNER. The problem of substandard work and the administrative problem continued with CHALE and JENNER was instructed to release CHALE.

The work performed by JENNER and REGELMANNwas satisfactory, but subsequently, information come to the attention of ROBERT REDDEN, ILC Security officer, that JENNER and REGELMANN had furnished false information on their employment application. When this was confirmed, the employment of JENNER and REGELMANN was terminated. SHEPARD advised that REDDEN would be in a better position to furnish information in this regard.

SHEPARD stated he was unable to furnish further information regarding this matter.

Data as to time sheets submitted by Jen to International Latex set forth in statement and CHALE alleged in statement that overhead rates established by JENNER for billing to International Latex are false. Physical description of CHALE set forth. CHALE furnished information as to whereabouts of subject REGELMANN.

DAVID H. CHALE, Pine Crest Hotel, Ocean View, Norfolk, Virginia, was interviewed at his place of employment, Tidewater Construction Company. After having been placed under oath by Special Agent RAYMOND E. TALLEY, he voluntarily furnished the following signed statement under oath.

"Norfolk, Va. 9/8/64

"I, David H. Chale, being duly sworn, know that I do not have to make a statement, but I freely and voluntarily make the following signed statement to Raymond E. Talley, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. No threats or promises have been made to me and I know this statement can be used against me in any court. I have been informed by Special Agent Talley of my right to counsel and that I can talk to anyone I want to before making a statement.

"I am 46 years of age and I was born July 29, 1918 at Cincinnati, Ohio.

"I have known Myron Jenner for many years. Jenner owned and operated a photographic supply and camera business known as Jen Products Co. in New York City but his camera business went practically defunct during the past few years. Jenner is very intelligent in his field but has had extremely limited experience as a mechanical engineer. I obtained a position for Jenner as a Consulting Engineer with Aero Tech, Dayton, Ohio, where we both worked. After working with Jenner for a while he got ambitious and thought we could start our own firm. It was Jenner's plan to hire out to large firms as Consulting Engineers, but in reality we would report on the abilities and work habits of the firm's supervisory employees.

In order to meet the Government contract requirement of being in business for more than a year, he used the name of Jen Products for the new Technical Consulting firm.

"International Latex Corporation, Dover, Delaware, had agreed to hire Jen Products as Consulting Engineers on a sub-contract which Latex held from Hamilton Standard. Mr. Jenner is the brother-in-law of Mr. Feller, Vice Pres. of International Latex Corp. Jenner had been in touch with Feller, and Feller was impressed with Jenner's idea of starting a new consulting engineer firm. Apparently Feller needed the immediate services of consulting engineers in connection with the Hamilton Standard sub-contract.

"In hiring Jen Products as Consulting Engineers, and since a Government contract was involved, a Government clearance was necessary for Jen Products before we could work on the project. Jenner contacted Feller by telephone one day about this, and, after the phone call, Jenner told me that we were to start on the project as International Latex Corp. employees until the clearance for Jen Products came through. Jenner submitted some sort of facilities clearance form which was a Government clearance form. I have no knowledge of any false information having been placed on this form by Jenner or anyone else attached to Jen Products.

"The organization of officers of Jen Products was handled by Jenner. Profit was to be distributed 60% to Jenner, 30% to me and 10% for Mr. Aubrey Tunnell. Mr. Tunnell is in business for himself in the hardware manufacturing field and has offices at 38 Park Row, New York City. He is a close friend of Jenner's. Tunnell was to be Security Officer of Jen Products in order to facilitate security clearance for Jen Products. Jenner had requested Tunnell to serve in this capacity and Tunnell offered to continue office space for Jen Products, which space consisted of nothing more

than a desk and possibly a telephone. For this, Tunnell was to receive \$10 a month rental from Jen Products. This office space was the only location of Jen Products and constituted the entire overhead.

"From about 11/1/63 until about 11/25/63, Jenner and I worked as employees of International Latex, Dover, Del., doing the work of consulting engineers, but were actually being paid weekly salaries by Latex at the rate of \$8 per hour each or approximately \$320 per week plus expenses. this time, the security clearance for Jen Products came through and Jenner and I resigned our positions with International Latex and became Consulting Engineers for Jen Products. This change of employment was a mere paper change. Jenner and I remained at the same desks in the same office at Latex and the only change consisted in salary. We were dropped from the Latex payroll as employees and Jen Products commenced to bill Latex for time, expenses, and our overhead.

"The total amount established was \$12 per hour for Jenner and I each, which included \$8 per hour wages, plus 29 per cent of \$8 for overhead, plus 2 per cent profit, plus expenses. This came to slightly more than \$12 per hour, but was rounded off to \$12.

"Time sheets for the employees of Jen Products, that is, Jenner, Ernest John Regelmann and myself were submitted to Latex Corp. weekly and were used as the basis for payment by Latex to Jen Products, and the reimbursement to the 3 of us by Jen Products. The 3 of us signed these time sheets, certifying we had worked the hours indicated on them and for which Latex would be billed by Jen Products for these hours. I know of no falsification in the hours listed on these time sheets.

"I cautioned Jenner, who computed the rates to be charged, that the rate was too high and the

Government would not stand still for these rates.

"The overhead rates of 29 per cent of \$8 per hour is completely false because the only overhead expense consisted of \$10 a month agreed upon with Tunnell for rental of a desk and telephone in Tunnell's office. I never actually saw this \$10 paid and this agreement to rent office space was a means of obtaining a mailing address for Jen Products rather than an actual office.

"In December, 1963, I had many differences of opinion with Jenner and, also in this month, I was fired from Jen Products. I was actually fired the day before we were to finalize our agreement in writing pertaining to shares in interest and organization of Jen Products.

"I have read the above statement on this and eight (8) other pages and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

At this time REGELMANN furnished information which was incorporated into a sworn signed statement which is as follows:

"Evendale, Ohio November 25, 1964

"I, Ernest John Regelmann, being duly sworn, hereby make the following free and voluntary statement to Quentin F. Hansen, who has identified himself towne as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. "came to General Electric Company Evendale, Ohio where he was employed until May 1963. I lost contact with him at that point.

"At about at this same time I left General Electric Company, Evendale, Ohio, and went to work for the Continental Aviation Detroit, Michigan. David Chale was also employed there too. Chale left this employment at the end of August.

"Sometime during October 1963 Jenner contacted me originally through my wife, at our home in Babylon, New York concerning going to work for him at the International Latex Corporation located at Dover Delaware. I finished my job at Detroit, Michigan the last week of October, 1963 and drove to my home in Babylon, New York, where I spent the weekend, then drove on to Dover, Delaware where I met Jenner.

"I believe I reported for work at the International Latex Corporation on November 1, 1963 & learned that I was to be tentatively hired by International Latex Corporation at an hourly rate of \$8 per hour with no perdiem. This arrangement was made as Jen Products, Inc., clearance had not come through.

"I wish to state that Jenner agreed to reimbursing David Chale, who also had been hired, and myself the perdiem which is based on the rate of \$1.40 an hour for the first 40 hours. I recall that Jenner later paid me \$224 which represented the perdiem due me.

"Originally International Latex Corporation paid my salary for the first month from November 1, 1963 through November 30, 1963. At that time

"Jenner & David Chale were also being paid by the above named corporation, to the best of my knowledge.

"As I recall about December 1, 1963 Jenner received clearance & then started paying David Chale & myself at the rate of \$8 per hour plus perdiem. Jenner also agreed to pay us holiday pay for Thanks-giving, 1963 as we would have received this pay at our former place of employment.

"I wish to state that I have no information as to what Jenner billed International Latex Corporation. I do not have any information as to any false information Jen Products, Inc. submitted to International Latex Corporation in any security clearance questionnaire. I do know that Jenner's overhead at least consisted of paying each of us holiday pay, back perdiem, as well as having business cards & stationary printed for us which certainly was an expense to Jenner.

"I also wish to state the only unusual arrangement in my being employed by Jenner Products, Inc. was working alongside of Jenner even though he was the official of that organization.

"I completed my phase of the crash program of this project on January 31, 1964, and it was at this time that my employment was terminated. David Chale had left the early part of January, 1964 after having a disagreement with Jenner.

"I also wish to state that I was an employee on field assignment, not an official of Jen Products, Inc., therefore I was not familiar with any arrangements dealing with the original formation of that corporation by Jenner.

"I also recall that Mr. Jenner had travel and motel expenses prior to the start of work by Jenner employees and also had secretarial expense during the duration of the job. This information has come to mind since stating the other expenses I recall Jenner having had on this job.

"I have read the above statement, consisting of this page & four other pages, & it is true & correct to the best of my knowledge.

He stated that he believed that JENNER DAVID H. CHALE had a "falling out" due to the fact that CHALE had anticipated becoming a partner with JENNER in the organization Jen Products, Inc. He also stated he believed CHALE had expected to be more closely associated with JENNER in this organization and when this fact did not materialize, he left the organization during the first week of January, 1964.

REGELMANN stated that he has recently learned that DAVID H. CHALE is presently residing in Chicinnati, however, he does not know the location of his employment, if any.
