This is the second interim release of information responsive to your FOIPA request. This information is being provided to you at no charge.

Duplicate copies of the same document were not processed.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **Intelligence Records.** To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

Part 2: The standard responses below apply to all requests for records on individuals:

- (i) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Watch Lists.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of any individual's name on a watch list pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(7)(E) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that watch list records do or do not exist.
- (ii) **Requests for Records about any Individual—Witness Security Program Records.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could identify any participant in the Witness Security Program pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3) and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(3), 18 U.S.C. 3521, and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.
- (iii) **Requests for Records for Incarcerated Individuals.** The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

Part 3: General Information:

- (i) **Record Searches.** The Record/Information Dissemination Section (RIDS) searches for reasonably described records by searching systems or locations where responsive records would reasonably be found. A standard search normally consists of a search for main files in the Central Records System (CRS), an extensive system of records consisting of applicant, investigative, intelligence, personnel, administrative, and general files compiled by the FBI per its law enforcement, intelligence, and administrative functions. The CRS spans the entire FBI organization, comprising records of FBI Headquarters, FBI Field Offices, and FBI Legal Attaché Offices (Legats) worldwide; Electronic Surveillance (ELSUR) records are included in the CRS. Unless specifically requested, a standard search does not include references, administrative records of previous FOIPA requests, or civil litigation files. - (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. For a fee, individuals can request a copy of their Identity History Summary Check. Forms and directions can be accessed at www.fbi.gov/about-us/cjis/identity-history-summary-checks. Additionally, requests can be submitted electronically at www.edo.cjis.gov. For additional information, please contact CJIS directly at (304) 625-5590.
- (iv) **National Name Check Program (NNCP).** The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

The purpose of this memorandum is to commemorate, in all relevant case files, certain findings made by the Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General (OIG) regarding forensic work performed by former Special Agent Terry Rudolph. The OIG's findings were issued in connection with a broader investigation of three units in the FBI Laboratory: the Explosives Unit, the Materials Analysis Unit, and the Chemistry-Toxicology Unit.

The OIG reviewed Rudolph's work in the Psinakis case, as well as several other matters. Based on that review, the OIG criticized Rudolph strongly, and reached the following conclusions:

- Rudolph failed to conduct appropriate scientific analyses or to adequately document his work in a substantial number of cases;
- Rudolph did not perform his work as an examiner in a manner that would withstand peer review or judicial scrutiny; and
- Rudolph's "lack of competence" was not isolated to one case.

Based on these findings, the OIG specifically recommended that a notation regarding its findings with respect to Rudolph be placed in each case file in which Rudolph was the principal or auxiliary examiner. If the forensic work performed by Rudolph in this case is used in any way in the future, both the OIG's findings and Rudolph's forensic analysis should be reviewed. In addition, legal advice should be obtained as to the FBI's disclosure obligations.



Attached Boston teletype reports that on 3/5/83 victim Olsen received a telephone call at his residence from an unknown female who demanded a two-million-dollar interest-free loan or members of victim's family would be killed. Olsen notified local authorities; however, the Boston Division was not notified.

On 6/2/83, Olsen received a letter by U. S. mail purportedly written by a paramilitary organization involved in covert activities in the United States. The letter demanded a \$1,250,000 interest-free loan or members of Olsen's family would be killed. The letter indicated that subsequent instructions will be received for the drop on 6/7/83 and that prior to the drop, unsub will demonstrate the organization's capabilities by using explosives on unnamed target, which will not result in injury.

The original letter will be forwarded to the Laboratory Division for analysis, and a copy will be facsimiled to Murray Miron.

A forensic linguistic examination was conducted on the facsimile copies, Qc1 through Qc3. It was concluded that the author is most likely 25-35 years old, family oriented, with possibly some college courses and possibly from a low socioeconomic and/or rural background. Conflicting indicators were found concerning the author's sex, with the majority leaning toward female. (This could also indicate a male with effeminate characteristics.) It is probable that the extortion money, once obtained by the author, would be split two ways. In addition, the author of Qc1 through Qc3 most likely was not in the military, but may well have a close relationship with one who is/was.

Since application of linguistic methodology to forensic science is a relatively new technique and its reliability is as yet unproven, linguistic examinations are provided for investigative assistance only, and are not intended for testimony.

Additionally, indented writing of portions of the questioned hand printing appearing on specimen Q38 was observed upon examination of the top sheet of specimen Q42, which indicates that specimen Q38 probably originated from the specimen Q42 tablet.

Indented writing was observed upon examination of the top sheet of specimen Q41. Two photographs depicting this indented writing are enclosed for your investigative assistance. No other indented writing of value was observed upon examination of the remaining submitted specimens.

Some physical characteristics in common were noted during comparison of the Q40 tablet paper and the previously submitted specimens Q7 through Q9; however, no association could be made with regard to their common origin.

The specimens Q28 through Q35 envelopes do not correspond in observable physical characteristics with either the Q4 or Q5 envelope, previously submitted.

By way of background, on 6/2/83 Kenneth Olsen received a letter by U. S. Mail purportedly written by a paramilitary organization involved in covert activities in the U. S. The letter demanded a \$1,250,000 interest-free loan or member of Olsen's family would be killed. On 6/16/83, at Boston, Massachusetts, a U. S. Magistrate's arrest warrant was issued for subject charging violation Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 876 (Mailing Threatening Communications).

Attached Boston teletypes advise that the execution of a Federal search warrant on subject's Ft. Devens, Massachusetts, residence on 6/23/83 resulted in the recovery of the original demand letter, a large quantity of chemicals and equipment for the production of explosive devices, detonating cord, fuses, blasting caps, C-4 explosives, two handguns and one rifle.

On 6/24/83, subject arrived in Boston, in custody of U. S. Army CID. He was transported to Ft. Devens, Massachusetts, where he voluntarily surrendered approximately 100 pounds of TNT, several antipersonnel mines and other explosive material secreted on the base. b6 b7C

You should refer to the previous FBI Laboratory report, numbered 30615032 and 30617023, dated July 21, 1983 for the results of the examinations on resubmitted specimens Q10 through Q26.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

You requested an examination of specimens K1 through K6 and an intercomparison of those items with specimens previously examined and reported in above referenced report.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

Enclosed for your investigative assistance are two sets of photographs (19 photographs per set) depicting the submitted items.

EXPLOSIVES AND EXPLOSIVE ACCESSORIES:

Present in the submitted items are nonelectric blasting caps, rolls of safety fuse, a blasting cap crimper tool, and C-4 type high explosive material. All items are manufactured for the use of the United States Military and are not normally available on the commercial market. Also present is a partial roll of black plastic tape.

A detailed description of the individual items is set forth hereafter:

Main Charge Explosive

The white puttylike material in specimen K1 was determined to be C-4, a United States Military demolition explosive.

Safety Fuse

Present in specimen K5 are two rolls of type M700, safety fuse, a United States Military fuse used to safely initiate nonelectric blasting caps like the ones present in specimens K4 and K6. The green plastic covering of the fuse is colored with a single yellow band every 18" and double yellow bands every 7'6".

Tape

Present in specimen K3 is a partial roll of 3/4"-wide black plastic tape whose free end has been cut/torn and is suitable for end match purposes. This roll of tape was manufactured by the Plymouth Rubber Co., Inc., Canton, Massachusetts during June 1976.

Blasting Caps

Present in specimens K4 and K6 are twenty-eight (28) United States Military Type M7 nonelectric blasting caps which contain the explosives, RDX and lead styphnate. These aluminum shelled blasting caps which measure approximately 2.35" X .239" are capable of initiating the C-4 explosive in specimen K1. Present on the exterior of the paper boxes in specimens K4 and K6 is the following United States Military LOT number: CIL 2-3 3-72. The 3-72 indicates the blasting caps were manufactured during March 1972.

Crimper Tool

Present in specimen K2 is a nonelectric blasting cap crimper type M2 manufactured by the Sargent Company. An instrumental analysis of the white powder removed from the cutting portion of the crimper was determined to be PETN, the high explosive component in detonating cord.

COMPARISON EXAMINATIONS:

The free end of the 3/4"-wide black plastic tape in specimen K3 was compared with the 3/4"-wide black plastic tape in specimen Q12, Q13, Q14, Q17, Q18, Q19, Q23, Q24, and Q25. Although the lengths of tape have similar surface characteristics, no end match was affected.

The metal fragments of an aluminum shelled blasting cap in specimen Q10 were compared to one of the nonelectric blasting caps in specimen K4. Although the presence of the aluminum fragments in specimen Q10 are similar to the type aluminum used in the K4 nonelectric blasting cap, no positive determination was reached regarding the exact source of specimen Q10.

The length of burned safety fuse in specimen Q11 was determined to be like the military M700 green colored safety fuse in specimen K5.

DISPOSITION OF SPECIMENS:

Unless advised to the contrary, specimens Q10 through Q26 will be returned to your office under separate cover by registered mail. However, specimens K1 through K6 will be retained in the Explosives Unit, FBI Laboratory until final disposition is determined.

You should refer to the previous FBI Laboratory report, numbered 30615032 and 30617023, dated July 21, 1983 for the results of the examinations on resubmitted specimens Q10 through Q26.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

You requested an examination of specimens K1 through K6 and an intercomparison of those items with specimens previously examined and reported in above referenced report.

PHOTOGRAPHS:

Enclosed for your investigative assistance are two sets of photographs (19 photographs per set) depicting the submitted items.

EXPLOSIVES AND EXPLOSIVE ACCESSORIES:

Present in the submitted items are nonelectric blasting caps, rolls of safety fuse, a blasting cap crimper tool, and C-4 type high explosive material. All items are manufactured for the use of the United States Military and are not normally available on the commercial market. Also present is a partial roll of black plastic tape.

A detailed description of the individual items is set forth hereafter:

referred Main Charge Explosive

The white puttylike material in specimen K1 was determined to be C-4, a United States Military demolition explosive.

Safety Fuse

Present in specimen K5 are two rolls of type M700, safety fuse, a United States Military fuse used to safely initiate nonelectric blasting caps like the ones present in specimens K4 and K6. The green plastic covering of the fuse is colored with a single yellow band every 18" and double yellow bands every 7'6."

Tape

Present in specimen K3 is a partial roll of 3/4"-wide black plastic tape whose free end has been cut/torn and is suitable for end match purposes. This roll of tape was manufactured by the Plymouth Rubber Co., Inc., Canton, Massachusetts during June 1976.

Blasting Caps

Present in specimens K4 and K6 are twenty-eight (28) United States Military Type M7 nonelectric blasting caps which contain the explosives, RDX and lead styphnate. These aluminum shelled blasting caps which measure approximately 2.35" X .239" are capable of initiating the C-4 explosive in specimen K1. Present on the exterior of the paper boxes in specimens K4 and K6 is the following United States Military LOT number: CIL 2-3 3-72. The 3-72 indicates the blasting caps were manufactured during March 1972.

reworded

Crimper Tool

[Present in specimen K2 is a nonelectric blasting cap crimper type M2 manufactured by the Sargent Company. An instrumental analysis of the white powder removed from the cutting portion of the crimper was determined to be PETN, the high explosive component in detonating cord.]

COMPARISON EXAMINATIONS:

The free end of the 3/4"-wide black plastic tape in specimen K3 was compared with the 3/4"-wide black plastic tape in specimen Q12, Q13, Q14, Q17, Q18, Q19, Q23, Q24, and Q25. Although the lengths of tape have similar surface characteristics, no end match was affected.

The metal fragments of an aluminum shelled blasting cap in specimen Q10 were compared to one of the nonelectric blasting caps in specimen K4. Although the presence of the aluminum fragments in specimen Q10 are similar to the type aluminum used in the K4 nonelectric blasting cap, no positive determination was reached regarding the exact source of specimen Q10.

The length of burned safety fuse in specimen Q11 was determined to be like the military M700 green colored safety fuse in specimen K5.

DISPOSITION OF SPECIMENS:

Unless advised to the contrary, specimens Q10 through Q26 will be returned to your office under separate cover by registered mail. However, specimens K1 through K6 will be retained in the Explosives Unit, FBI Laboratory until final disposition is determined.





Figure 46. Cap, blasting: special, nonelectric, M7.
