FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. The FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records which could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any incarcerated individual pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(7)(E), (b)(7)(F), and (j)(2)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

There is attached a copy of a letter addressed to the Attorney General by Senator Harry F. Byrd, chairman of the Joint Committee on Reduction of Nonessential Federal Expenditures under date of February 19, 1954, which was furnished to my office by the Statistical Section of the Department of Justice.

For the last 10 years each government agency has been required by the above committee to furnish a monthly report on the number of employees on their rolls broken down as to the number in each of the classes under the Classification Act; i.e., general services (GS), crafts, protective and custodial services (CPC), etc. These reports will not have to be prepared after the submission of the one for the month of February.

However, in lieu of such report, the committee is requiring that we furnish them with an extra copy of Standard Form 113 which is the monthly report on employment and turnover furnished to the Civil Service Commission. In addition to the information shown on this Standard Form 113, certain additional footnotes are required similar in nature to the information now furnished the committee on the present report as footnotes. The only item affecting this Bureau that is different is in connection with employees reported in Standard Form 113 as being employed overseas in that there be indicated the number of employees so shown who are paid at United States rates.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that we comply with the request for the extra copy of Standard Form 113 for the Byrd Committee. This copy can be sent to the Department at the time the report on employment and turnover (Standard Form 113) is sent to the Department. Unless advised to the contrary, this will be done when the report for the month of March is submitted.

My dear Mr. Brownell:

Under authority of Section 601, Title 6, Public Law 250, 77th Congress (55 Stat. 726), the Joint Committee on Reduction of Nonessential Federal Expenditures for ten years has been requiring a monthly report on the number of people employed by each department and agency, and each of their component units, in the Executive Branch of the Federal Government, and certain related information. This letter continues that requirement.

But, effective after the report for February employment, due not later than March 15, 1954, has been submitted, all previous instructions and advice as to personnel reporting to the Committee are to be disregarded and all previous forms for reporting to the Committee are to be discarded.

Effective with the report on March employment, due not later than April 15, 1954, compliance with the following instructions is requested:

- 1. Submit to the Committee not later than the 15th of each month a carbon copy of Standard Form 113 (as revised in January 1954) conforming with Civil Service Commission Departmental Circular No. 741, dated February 2, 1954, executed by your agency certifying to the Civil Service Commission personal service information for the preceding month.
- 2. By addenda or footnote to the copy of Standard Form 113 for the Committee, submit the following information:
 - a. The number of employees reported in Standard Form 113 who were assigned or detailed to the Mutual Defense Assistance Program, together with their pay.
 - b. The number of people on terminal leave not included in Standard Form 113.

- c. The number of employees engaged in industrial activity employment, on the basis used by your agency to date.

 (You are advised that revision in reporting in this category for committee purposes is under consideration and probably will be the subject of new instructions at an early date. But until such instructions are received the report is to be continued in this respect on the current basis.)
- d. The number of people employed under labor contracts and agreements with foreign governments. (A copy of the attachment to CSC Standard Form 113 on this subject will suffice)
- e. The number of people whose personal services to United States agencies are provided by the Federal Republic of Germany and the Berlin Magistrat.
- f. The number of people reported in (1) Standard Form 113, and (2) addends submitted to the Committee employed overseas by the executive agencies paid at United States rates, together with their pay.
- g. The number of people reported in (1) Standard Form 113, and (2) addends submitted to the Committee employed overseas by executive agencies paid at rates other than United States rates, together with their pay.
- 3. This report, with addenda, should be certified over the signature of the head of the agency, or some responsible official who may be designated by him, to the Joint Committee on Reduction of Nonessential Federal Expenditures, Room 217-D, U. S. Senate Office Building, Washington, D. C., and submitted to the Committee not later than the 15th of the month following the period covered by the report.
