#### **FBI FOIPA Addendum**

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

#### Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. - (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that such records do or do not exist.

#### Part 3: General Information:

- (ii) **FBI Records.** Founded in 1908, the FBI carries out a dual law enforcement and national security mission. As part of this dual mission, the FBI creates and maintains records on various subjects; however, the FBI does not maintain records on every person, subject, or entity.
- (iii) Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative "FBI file." An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (iv) National Name Check Program (NNCP). The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

#### **EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS**

#### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA:

Otis G. Pike, Democrat of Riverhead, was born in 1921. He received his A.B. degree from Princeton University and his LL.B. from Columbia University. A lawyer, Pike has served as Justice of the Peace in Riverhead since 1953. He was elected to the 87th Congress on 11-8-60, defeating Republican Stuyvesant Wainwright.

#### INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

By letter 7-28-48, Otis G. Pike, Orangeburg, New York, forwarded a communication entitled "Class Justice" which he had found inserted in his door. This leaflet concerned the indictment of 12 leaders of the Communist Party on charges of "conspiring to overthrow the government by force and violence" and was issued by the Worker's Freedom League of New York City. The Director thanked Pike by letter 8-3-48 and forwarded reprints on communism. (100-3-4-6420)

By letter 5-25-50, Pike wrote the Director in his (Pike's) capacity as trustee and vice president of the Riverhead Free Library, concerning a publication entitled "Soviet Russia Today." The townspeople had complained that this magazine should not be on the shelves and Pike stated that for the time being they had elected to continue keeping the magazine and to file it under the heading of "propaganda."; however, he desired to know how the Director would rate the publishers of this periodical, and wondered if the Director had ever given any advise on the treatment of such literature. The Director replied by letter 6-5-50, advising Pike that the information in files of the Bureau is restricted and for official use only and that, therefore, he was unable to comment concerning the periodical mentioned. Pike's name appeared as a correspondent of the subject of an 'Internal Security-R; Perjury' investigation of the Bureau in 1954. Bufile 65-57435-17 reflected that the files of the New York Office contained moginformation of a

derogatory nature concerning Pike or any of the other individuals listed as correspondents of the subject.

The "New York Times" of 1-27-60, carried a story reflecting that Otis G. Pike, Suffolk County Justice of the Peace, had been accused of violating the Federal Migratory Game laws by shooting eleven ducks from a baited pond on 12-122-59. A Crimdel report from the New York Office dated 2-12-60 reflected that Judge Otis Pike, Riverhead, Long Island Justice of the Peace, "is screaming prejudice all over the county of Suffolk." Pike had been arrested and charged with illegal baiting of duck ponds and, while his two co-defendants paid a fine, Pike demanded a jury trial. Congressman Stuyvesant Wainwright, Pike's opponent in the 1960 elections, had been arrested for the same offense in 1956 and had been allowed to settle his case civilly, paying a \$25 fine. Hence, Pike claimed prejudice and the press took up his cause. The disposition of Pike's trial was not set forth in Bufiles. (8-0-A; 63-4296-34-529)

## FBI Checks Threat On Church, Pike

**Associated Press** 

A right-wing group has threatened to assassinate several prominent politicians, including the chairmen of congressional committees investigating the CIA and an announced presidential candidate, an FBI spokesman says.

He said yesterday the FBI was investigating the threat but that there had been no arrests yet in the case.

The spokesman said the group, which calls itself Veterans Against Communist Sympathizers, threatened to kill Intelligence Committee Chairmen Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, and Rep. Otis Pike, D-N.Y.

In addition, the group has threatened Fred Harris, a candidate for the Democratic presidential nomination, and Rep. Ron Dellums, D-Calif. a member of the House Intelligence Committee, the FBI spokesman said.

He added that the threat also was aimed at Tim Butz, head of a Washington-based organization which has been publicly blamed for blowing the cover of CIA agent Richard Welch, who was slain last week in Greece.

The threat came in a note delivered to a Houston television station by "an unidentified individual" on Dec. 26, according to the spokesman, Tom Coll.

During the latter part of December, 1975, and during January, 1976, Houston Division conducted investigation to identify this individual. Neighborhood investigations were conducted with negative results and photos of numerous left and right wing extremists were displayed with negative results. In addition, regular contact was maintained with the Houston Police Department, Criminal Intelligence Division; Harris County Sheriff's Office; and U. S. Secret Service, Houston.

Further, increased contact with sources in extremist matters has failed to produce any information concerning the identity of the unknown subject.


On February 2, 1976, contact with U. S. Secret Service, Houston, Harris County Sheriff's Office, and Houston Police Department - Criminal Intelligence Division, revealed that their investigations had failed to identify any subjects.

Indices checks at Bureau Headquarters, Houston Division, and other field offices of the FBI failed to develop any additional information on Veterans Against Communist Sympathizers (V.A.C.S.).

To date no additional notes have been received at KDOG-TV and no additional information regarding V.A.C.S. has come to the attention of the Houston Division.

On February 3, 1976, this matter was discussed with Assistant U. S. Attorney Houston, who stated that no further investigation is warranted.
