#### FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

#### Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) Intelligence Records. To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. - (iv) National Name Check Program (NNCP). The mission of NNCP is to analyze and report information in response to name check requests received from federal agencies, for the purpose of protecting the United States from foreign and domestic threats to national security. Please be advised that this is a service provided to other federal agencies. Private Citizens cannot request a name check.

#### EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

#### SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence:
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

Dear Sir, I have never met you personally however my wife did meet you and highly appreciated what you did to obtain letter carrier service to the city of Lacon. What I am writing you about may have had many discussions between you M C's or it could have none I have been advocating for years that our federal Govt. should have a law requiring every individual to have finger prints taken. If not already registered as in service then new born children by required at a certain age and all immigrants upon admittance already a requirement I feel that if this were accomplished half of the future criminals would never start as this would be very much of a deterrent against starting and the fewer who start the fewer we will have It could easily cut crime activity 40 to 50% and upon the basis of federal authority for this law it could be required for identification purposes in advent of atomic warfare (it should be a must) for most every crime the first look is for a finger print. Then next match it against all records. If not on  $\overline{r}$  ecord what?

My dear Congressman:

I am in receipt of your letter dated April 16, 1959, which makes further reference to the suggestion from your constituent, Mr. R. M. Marper of Lacon, Illinois, that there should be a Federal law requiring every individual to be fingerprinted. It is noted that Mr. Harper is of the opinion that enactment of such legislation would be a deterrent to criminals. In addition, he feels that fingerprinting should be required for identification purposes in case of atomic warfare.

While I would like to be of assistance to you, as I indicated in my letter of March 18, 1959, I have always made it a point not to inject the TBI into issues involving local or Federal legislation. I am, therefore, unable to comment on the proposal for mandatory fingerprinting since this would be a legislative matter. I trust you will under-S stand my reason for this. Likewise I am unable to estimate 2 the cost of such an undertaking.

With reference to the voluntary submission of fingerprints for personal identification, I would like to elaborate further on certain information supplied in my letter of March 18, 1959. The FBI is always pleased to cooperate with individual citizens by accepting personal identification fingerprints for filing in our civil files. During the calendar year 1958, we received over 24,000 personal identification lingerprint cards from individuals. These were classified and placed Incour civil files.

It has come to our attention that public reaction to the possibility of atonic variare has resulted in suggestions from Parent-Teacher Associations and similar civic groups that local fingerprinting programs as a civil defense measure be instituted. No national policy has been formulated providing for voluntary fingerprinting as a civil defense measure and no funds have been appropriated for this purpose. For this reason, the FBI has not received or processed fingerprints taken under these local programs since we do not have the personnel or equipment for classifying and filing such a large volume of fingerprints.

I trust that the foregoing will be of some assistance to you in the consideration of Mr. Harper's proposal.

NOTE: Congressman Michel's constituent, R. M. Harper (not identifiable in Bufiles) suggests mandatory fingerprinting as a crime deterrent and to provide identification in case of atomic warfare. Desires to know if Director would 1. propose mandatory fingerprinting 2.voluntary fingerprinting 3. have printing done by Agents of Federal Government or 4. by State Agency who in turn would transmit prints to central agency for filing. Michel also desires estimate of cost of such project. While data supplied in our reply is general, it is believed we should avoid exact reply to questions because 1. We believe Director should not advocate national fingerprinting - this is dangerous. 2. Even a voluntary personal identification program could not be handled by Bureau without tremendous expansion of facilities.



By letter of March 29 Congressman Michel commented concerning an application for the National Academy filed by Gerald L. Daughters who is a Sergeant with the Creve Coeur, Illinois, Police Department. Congressman Michel stated he would appreciate every consideration that might be extended to Mr. Daughters in order that his application would be considered in time to enable him to enroll in one of the next two sessions. He advised he would appreciate our advising him of any action taken on this request.

Bureau files reveal Congressman Michel was formerly Administrative Assistant to former Congressman Harold Velde, Illinois, and is presently a member of the House Committee on Appropriations. was elected to the 85th Congress in 1956 and was re-elected in November, 1958. He is a representative of the 18th District of Illinois. Information was received in 1958 that he was allegedly carrying on an affair with a secretary in the office of another Congressman. We have had limited cordial correspondence with Congressman Michel in relation: to constituent matters and on 3/11/58 the Director sent him a letter of thanks for his very favorable comments before Congress on the Director's book "Masters of Deceit." Congressman Michel and his family were afforded a special tour of the Bureau on 8/1/61. In May of 1962 he inquired of the Attorney General that, in the event of a successor being appointed to the Director, must this appointment be consented by the Senate, and if not, what manner will the appointment be made. His inquiry was answered by the Department.

Application to the National Academy for Daughters received at Bureau 1/15/62. Daughters was interviewed and unfavorably recommended by SAC Gibbons who advised that the small size of applicant's department (7-man department) made it unlikely that applicant could in the foreseeable future carry out the objectives of the National Academy App SAC 1880 furnished

information received from a National Academy graduate of the Peoria, Illinois, Police Department who had heard that Daughters had consorted with a madam of a house of prostitution, and it was rumored that he had arranged a plan whereby a well-known local hoodlum was to commit a burglary and while it was in progress, Daughters was suppose to kill him. Only the timely arrival of the county Sheriff along with other deputies acted to prevent this outright murder. This NA graduate advised that police officers in the adjacent areas do not have a good opinion of Daughters who is further alleged to hang around a lot of taverns and tries to throw his weight around as soon as he enters a tavern. An officer on the Peoria PD advised in January, 1962, that he was aware of the poor opinion of Daughters, who was reported as unofficially involved in several fights in a tayern in Peoria. of the police officers interviewed advised that they doubted that Daughters would remain with his department if he completed the National Academy course; that in their opinion, he was interested in going to the National Academy only to give himself a chance to secure a higher paying job with another department.

#### **OBSERVATIONS:**

Since we have had basically cordial relations with the inquirying Congressman who was apparently advised by Daughters that his qualifications were in order, it is felt that response to this Congressman's letter would be best handled by personal contact. With a personal contact, he can be frankly advised for his personal information of the reasons why we will not accept Daughters to the FBI National Academy. This is over and above the fact that his application received in early 1962 could not guarantee him a place in either of the next two sessions even if his qualifications and background were in good order. It will be recommended that Assistant Director DeLoach or a representative of his office contact the Congressman, acknowledge his letter and furnish him the information set forth above as the reasons why we will not take him to the National Academy.

Dear Congressman Michel:

The Attorney General has requested me to reply to your letter of May 10, 1962, in which you inquire whether the appointment of a new Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation would require the advice and consent of the Senate. Under the law, the Attorney General and his Assistants in the Pepartment of Justice are authorized to give legal advice only to the President and the heads of departments. I therefore regret that I cannot render the opinion requested by you.

For your information, however, I wish to outline briefly the legal considerations underlying your inquiry. Under Article II, section 2, clause 2 of the Constitution, the President shall appoint the officers of the United States, by and with the sovice and consent of the Senate. Congress, however, has the power to vest the appointment of inferior officers in the President alone, the courts of law, and the heads of departments. 5 U.S.C. 300 authorizes the Attorney General to appoint officials vested with the authority for the execution of duties of detection and prosecution of crimes against the United States and the maintenance, etc. of criminal identification records. The predecessor to this section served as the basis for the appointment in 1924 of Mr. Hoover by Attorney General Stone.

The Code refers to the current Department of Justice Appropriation Act as the source of 5 U.S.C. 300. This would seem to be technically incorrect because from 1928 on, the Department of Justice Appropriation Acts have not contained a clause expressly authorizing the Attorney General to appoint the F.B.I. personnel. A provise to that effect was included in the Department of Justice Appropriation Acts for the fiscal years 1922 to 1928, but not in the subsequent ones. The House

Judiciary Committee, which supervises the preparation and publication of the United States Code (1 U.S.C. 202), apparently felt that this provise constitutes permanent substantive legislation which does not have to be repeated annually.

A similar position was taken by the staff and possibly by the Subcommittee on Revision of the Laws of the House Judiciary Committee itself, which has been preparing legislation enacting title 5 of the United States Code into positive law and transferring to title 28 some of the sections now found in title 5. The comments on proposed 28 U.S.C. 533, which would confer on the Attorney General the authority to appoint special agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, explain that the section would be derived from the proviso of the Department of Justice Appropriation Act for fiscal 1922--enacted in 1921--which vested in the Attorney General authority to appoint officials charged with the detection and prosecution of crimes. Revision of Title 5, United States Code ontitled "Government Organization and Personnel," Report from the Committee on the Judiciary, House of Representatives, to accompany H. R. 8748, 86th Cong., 2d Sess., Committee Print. p. 116. The provisions of the United States Code, of course, establish prima facie evidence of the lew. (Act of June 30, 1926, sec. 2, 44 Stat. (Ft. 1) 1.)

At 2:20 p.m. today, SA D. J. Dalbey of the Legal Research Desk was visited by Leon Ullman, Second Assistant, Office of Legal Counsel, Department of Justice, and Herman Marcuse, another lawyer in the Department. They said they were looking for help in answering a letter of May 10, 1962, to Attorney General Robert Kennedy from Congressman Robert H. Michel (R-Illinois, Peoria) which they displayed and which reads approximately as follows:

"Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, whose name is practically synonymous with law enforcement, will someday have a successor though I personally wish he would live forever.

"In the event of a successor being appointed, must his appointment be confirmed by the Senate? If not, what manner would the appointment be made."

Mr. Ullman said the Congressman calls for an answer and they feel that one must be given to him but they don't know what to say because the law is not clear. Ullman thought Dalbey might have done some research on this subject. Dalbey said that he has never had or anticipated any need to answer this question and is in no position to be of any assistance to them at all.

The problem goes back to language in Article II of the Constitution where it says that the President shall have power "by and with the Advice and

The problem goes back to language in Article II of the Constitution where it says that the President shall have power "by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate"... to appoint ambassadors, etc., "and all other officers of the United States, whose appointments are not herein otherwise provided for, and which shall be established by law: but the Congress may by Law vest the Appointment of such inferior Officers, as they think proper, in the President alone, in the Courts of Law, or in the Heads of Departments." In none of this language is there any mention of the position of Director of the FBL. The inquiry then turns to Title 5, U.S. Code, Section 300 which provides that 102-1036 14-13 MAY 20 1962

The difficulty here, Mr. Ullman said, is that this language originally came from the Appropriations Acts but has not appeared in the Department of Justice Appropriations Bill for many years. The question then is one of whether this language in Title 5, Section 300, is substantive law that does not need repeating or whether it must be included in each Appropriation Act to remain in force. This is a question of statutory construction and thus far the Office of Legal Counsel has not found a satisfactory basis for taking a position one way or the other.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That SA Dalbey of the Legal Research Desk keep in touch with Mr. Ullman to learn what position the Department takes on this question.

The Civil Service Commission submitted a request for a check of our files on Robert H. Michel, Republican Congressman from Illinois, who is to attend the 19th session of the World Health Assembly as an advisor. Under provisions of Public Law 643, 80th Congress, as amended, the Civil Service Commission is required to conduct a full field investigation on advisors to the World Health Assembly.

We have had cordial relations with Michel and Michel has been complimentary to the Director and the FBI on several occasions on the floor of the House. Bureau files contain no derogatory data concerning Michel other than information received from Claude A Taylor in July, 1958, at which time Taylor was superintendent of the House of Representatives Folding Room. Taylor advised that Michel, who was married, was carrying on an affair with a Congressional secretary. On May 17, 1961, Claude A. Taylor, former superintendent of the Folding Room, United States House of Representatives, was convicted in U. S. District Court, Washington, D. C., on a 52-count indictment charging him with submitting false payroll vouchers on fictitious employees between 1955 and 1957.

We have not conducted an investigation of Michel and our files reflect no derogatory data on Michel other than that furnished by Taylor. Taylor is our only source of this derogatory information and our files do not reflect where Taylor obtained this information.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1)That we not disseminate the unsubstantiated, uncorroborated rumor concerning Michel.

The FBI conducts investigations of individuals on referral from the Civil Service Commission when information of a loyalty or security nature is developed. These investigations are conducted primarily under Executive Orders 10422, involving United States citizens employed or applying for employment by the United Nations, and 10450, involving employees or applicants of Government agencies participating in the Federal Employee Security Program.

He is a conservative. He is a progressive. He is a man of letters and of science, a professional, always in step with the best new thoughts and developments of his time. He is not afraid of change. He has always welcomed progress. But he has time and again raised his voice to warn this Nation to preserve its heritage.

Today we honor J. Edgar Hopver. But how can we add to the luster of his reputation? What can we say that people do not already know? His name is bound up irrevocably with the law enforcement organization he has built to distinction, and his place is secure in

the affection of our people.

Mr. CAIIILL. Mr. Speaker, as a former special agent of the FBI, I am pleased to Join my colleagues in paying tribute to J. Edgar Hoover, Director of the Federal Durent of Investigation, on the occasion of the completion of 50 years' service with the Department of Justice. As an agent, I came to realize the tremendous role Mr. Hoover played in the development of the FBI and in the great progress in the field of crime detection in the United States. In my day in the Bureau we were concerned principally with bank robbers and kidnapings. Later the Bureau was given the full responsibility by President Roosevelt to coordinate all matters relating to espionage, sabotage, and violations of the neutrality regulations. During the administration of President Truman'the FBI was assigned the task of checking the loyalty of all Federal employees. Today the FBI has jurisdiction over more than 100 major Federal laws.

During these 50 years of service, the Bureau has grown not only in numbers but in the respect and confidence of the American people. When Mr. Hoover was appointed Director by the then Attorney General Harlan Stone back in 1924, he was given complete authority to revitalize the Bureau. During these years Mr. Hoover has been responsible for the policy that has made the FBI the most respected police organization in the

It was his decision that required special agents to have law training, accounting experience, or extensive police experience. The central fingerprint bureau, the new crime laboratory, the National Police Academy are but a few of the great contributions resulting from the policymaking of Mr. Hoover.

In addition to his demanding work as the Director of the FBI, Mr. Hoover is a noted author, a confidente to Presidents, a lecturer of note, the holder of honors too numerous to mention including honorary academic degrees from some of the leading universities of our country. He is unquestionably one of the great men of America. While his accomplishments are many, I personally believe his personal example and his strong and effective leadership have been outstanding. No man ever served in the FBI without having been influenced by the strength and the courage and the dedication of the Director. He has lifted law enforcement to the status of a profession. He has proved to the American people that the FBI is not only a competent but an honest and just police force.

Our country is indeed fortunate that he is willing at the conclusion of 50 years' service to continue the arduous and demanding role as the Director of the FBI.

To Mr. Hoover, I offer my congratulations on a lifetime of service and a sincere wish that he will enjoy good health so that he may continue for many years his dedicated work.

Mr. LAIRD. Mr. Speaker, it is a real pleasure for me today to join the gentleman from Illinois [Mr. Collier] and my other colleagues in saluting America's top law-enforcement officer as he celebrates his 50th anniversary with the Department of Justice.

There is little that we can add to the long list of honory degrees, citizenship awards, and other recognition which have come to John Edgar Hoover over his long and illustrious career. It is however, truly fitting that we pause and pay our respects to this distinguished civil servant who has done so much in the field of law enforcement.

Mr. Hoover's year of service to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and to the whole country represent the foundation on which modern law enforcement methods and techniques have been built.

Morcover, J. Edgar Hoover is an outstanding example of a universally respected and admired civil servant, who serves as an outstanding example not only to the fine men and women of the FBI but to all Government employees and indeed to all Americans.

Mr. MICHEL. Mr. Speaker. I would like to add my accolade of praise to J. Edgar Hoover upon his 50th year of public service in the Federal Bureau of Investigation. For a good many of those years, he has found himself under fire and attack from those who would deal softly with crime and subversion, Adverse news coverage, hostile reporters, and aggravated segments of the population have often tried to badger him but without success. In spite of pressure more than sufficient for the breaking of a lesser man, J. Edgar Hoover has never weakened, and because of his forbearance and unwavering adherence to the principles of justice throughout his last 50 years. he rightly deserves the title "Hero of Our Republic."

It is indeed appropriate, Mr. Speaker, that we pay tribute at this time to our Nation's finest law enforcement official. I cannot help but think that it is a comfort to everyone that Mr. Hoover has set an outstanding example of liberty under law. Today when our society seems to be in a constant state of flux, changing values, morals, and ideas, it is with pride that we point to Mr. Hoover as representing uncompromising, no-nonsense law enforcement. Having served under 15 Attorney Generals and seven Presidents, J. Edgar is not a publicity secker. His modesty is as resolute as the way he tracks down criminals. Under his administration, Hoover has been responsible for the arrest of hundreds of organized crime and syndicate leaders. FBI investigating units have been sent into all fields of endeavor-from the Communist Party to civil rights to peace demonstrations.

It is indeed appropriate, Mr. Speaker, that we take time to honor and commend the Director of the FBI for a hard job well done. The land of the free is made a lot safer thanks to the personal insights and efforts of one of America's greatest public servants. I would be the first to admit that there is a lot of truth in the old adage that no one is indispensable. But to assume that Americans would enjoy the security provided by an FBI as sound and efficient as the one we have today without J. Edgar Hoover, is one assumption that I am not daring enough to make.

Mr. Speaker, while I hate to ever see the day come when we will have to give consideration to Mr. Hoover's successor, I certainly hope that we will enact legislation prior to that time that would require Senate confirmation of this allimportant post, and insert the text of the bill I introduced again in this 90th Congress, H.R, 874, to be reprinted at this point in the Recoun:

H.R. 874

A bill to provide that the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation shall heroafter be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senato

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (n) the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the Department of Justice shall be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.

(b) The functions of the Federal Bureau of Investigation shall include the detection and prosecution of crimes against the United States, the acquisition, collection, clarifi-cation, and preservation of identification and other records, the exchange of such records with and for the official use of the duly puthorized officials of the Federal Covernment and of States, cities, and other in titutions (such exchange to be subject to cancellation if dissemination is made outside the receiping departments or related agencier), and such other matters within the juit-diction of the Department of Justice as the Attorney General may direct.

Sec. 2. Subsection (a) of the first section of this Act shall not apply to the individual who holds the office of Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on the date of the enactment of this Act.

Mr. MICHEL. Mr. Speaker, with all the flights of fancy and hyperbole we have heard in this House lately with regard to Mr. Hoover and the FBI, I am happy to bring to the attention of my colleagues' an imminently sensible and forthright editorial which appeared in the Peoria Journal Star on April 20:

That made sense to us.

But the panic over there BEING investi-gations is quite the opposite—accompanied by unsupported charges!

There has not been a single example or even allegation that investigators of the Army or FBI have misused information the way McCarthy did-by methods of scarey and unfair publicity seeking.

Instead, for fear that somebody MIGHT. a nervous group is doing just what Joe Mc-Certhy did making such lurid publicity charges themselves WITHOUT investigation and without evidence against the FBI and army: It's a sort of "preventive McCarthyism."

That seems pretty-Alice-in-Wonderland

funtil you realize that a sizable segment of the Democratic-liberal community has panicked into silliness far beyond anything the "little old ladies in tennis shoes" ever man-P.ged.

We have some experience of our own, also testified to by Harrison Salisbury of the New York Times (who is one of them) in a recent book, that this "intellectual" group was peddling the most absurd rumors to each other and getting worked up about them-such as welrd tales the secret construction of concentration camps "in the West," and diabolical plans to foreclose there being any election in 1972, imposing dictatorship instead!

Salisbury testifies that these unwholesome "rumors" persisted in some circles (which circles are obvious!) long after they became demonstrably ridiculous.

Joe McCarthy created a dangerous climate of excessive suspicion.

These people of the "left." have busily created a most unwholesome climate among themselves, and are now trying to create a dangerous climate of absurd suspicion across this land.

It marks the lowest mental health status in Washington in 20 years, if we equate it to the "little old ladies in tennis shoes."

What did he do, besides nail ONE Communist agent, Alger Hiss, with specific investigation, specific charges, specifically proven in federal court?

He compared Helen Gahagan Douglas' rec-

ord with that of a pro-Communist congress-man and pointed out how closely they seemed to tally! Today that would be TAME politics.

President Dwight Eisenhower awarded Mr. Hoover the National Security Medal in 1955 for "brilliant leadership in a position of great responsibility" and for "the highest ideals of Federal Law Enforcement."

When Mr. Heover joined the Justice Department in 1917, there was no well organized FBI to protect the law abiding citizens of this Nation. During the course of his career he has often come under attack by the criminal, the left, the right, and has been subjected to political pressure. However, he continues to give this Nation the same dedicated service that was used in the formation of the FBI.

At the age of 76, having given this country more than half a century of distinguished service, Mr. Hoover deserves the respect of every law-abiding citizen. He has, and he continues to earn, my respect. He continues to adhere to the

It is a pleasure to extend my felicitations and best wishes to Mr. Hoover on the 47th anniversary of his tenure as addressor of the FBI

Mr. MICHEL. Mr. Speaker, it is with great pleasure that I join my colleagues in the House today to express our appreciation for a grand American—J. Edgar Hoover.

The phrase "dedicated public servant" has been bandled about considerably, but there is no other description that fits Hoover. He has served our Government for 54 years, 47 of them as head of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

During that time he has earned the respect and admiration of our people. He has performed a tough job in a manner that has garnered credit for the Bureau. Hoover has served under eight Presidents and 16 Attorneys General.

The Bureau has grown in stature in the nearly five decades Mr. Hoover has been at the helm. It has been a crack law enforcement agency, not just at the federal level, but also through the foresight of Mr. Hoover in establishing training programs for local police and the shuring of information and crime-righting techniques. He has established a fingerprint bank of nearly 200 million sets, which has proven invaluable in identification of individuals, and has in itself solved many cases by producing irrefutable evidence of a criminal's whereabouts at the time of a crime.

We are fond of saying that certain things can happen "only in America." The tenure of Mr. Hoover at the head of the FBI has been truly such an example. In many Nations such an enforcement bureau would eventually have grown into a Gestapo-like organization, or become involved in internal politics.

Mr. Hoover has haved to the line with-

out fear or favor. He has demanded the highest caliber of men and the most stringent training and work regulations. As a consequence, the PBI and historruptibility have become synonymous in the United States.

Perhaps the most telling of how good, a job the FBI has done is that it strikes terror into the hearts of hoodlums—large and small. No one on the chier side of the law wants to have the "Feds" after him, for their arrest record is high, and their conviction rates phanomenal. Due again to the strict standards of gathering evidence hir. Hoover has instilled in the Bureau fast year the FBI obtained 13,000 convictions, and ran up a batting average of 53 percent convictions to arrests—and this against some of the most skillful criminal lawyers in the country.

The rest of the Federal Government might well envy the FBI's fiscal operations. During 1970 the Bureau took in, in fines: and recoveries, \$422-million—or about \$1.60 for every dollar we in Congress appropriated for their discretions.

The FBI does not stand still it has been in the forefront of developing and utilizing the latest, in crimefichting equipment—and in sharing that knowledge with law enforcement officials across the land. Currently under construction is a modern FBI building which will bring together its operations now scattered in several buildings in the city. It is due to completion late in 1973, and will provide the Bureau with the room it needs, and coordination of all its many functions.

BACKGROUND:

By letter dated 5/18/71, Congressman Michel thanked Mr. Hoover for his note of 5/11/71, and indicated that some time ago one of the FBI employees had given him a set of cuff links made from his fingerprint impressions. He requested to meet the Director for the purpose of having a photograph taken. Mr. Hoover noted "O.K. H."

#### INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Congressman Michel, as of 1958, was married and the father of four children. #### SUMMARY PROVISIONS

#### 10/3/75

I. STATUTORY AUTHORITY TO CONDUCT INVESTIGATIONS

The Secretary is charged with the responsibility for the enforcement of the provisions of this act and regulations issued pursuant to this act. The Secretary is authorized to conduct such inquiries, audits, surveys, inspections and investigations necessary to insure compliance with this act and Department regulations applicable to student financial aid programs including violations of the fraud statutes.

II. ESTABLISHMENT OF RECIPIENT INSTITUTIONS AS CUSTODIANS OF FEDERAL FUNDS (AMENDMENT TO TITLE 20 AND TITLE 42 U.S. CODE).

Whoever receives disbursements of United States Government funds under a Title 20 or Title 42 student financial aid program is a custodian of such funds and is prohibited from using such funds for other than the purpose for which such funds were granted, awarded and/or disbursed to the educational institution. As custodians, they shall maintain trust or escrow accounts and records of such accounts. Such funds shall not be co-mingled with the operating funds of any institution or any other funds not held in trust or escrow. Violations of this provision of the act are subject to the penalties of Section 649, Title 18 U.S. Code, Chapter 31 "Embezzlement and Theft."

- III. SANCTIONS AND PENALTIES APPLICABLE TO ABUSES OF THE STUDENT ASSISTANCE AND GUARANTEED STUDENT LOAN PROGRAMS
  - A. It shall be unlawful to:
    - (1) Deliberately deceive or defraud any student attending or intending to attend an institution of postsecondary education in regard to:
      - a. Benefits which may be available under any Federal student aid or loan or loans guarantee program.
      - b. Tuition and fees for which Federal student aid or loans or loan guarantees are used or rights to refunds of such tuitions and fees.
      - c. Such offense shall be a misdemeanor if the actual or potential loss to the government or other parties is under \$5,000 and felony if such actual potential loss exceeds \$5,000.

- (2) Solicit, offer, or receive any commission, fee or other direct or indirect bribe, kickback, payment or compensation not expressly permitted by regulation, for:
  - a. Obtaining any Federal payment or commitment for student assistance, loan or loan guarantee.
  - b. Transfer, pledge or sale of any student loan obligation guaranteed by the Federal government.
  - c. Such offense shall be a misdemeanor if the aggregate amount of such payouts is less than \$500, or a felony if the aggregate amount is \$500 or more.
- (3) Knowingly and willfully make or cause to be made any false statement or representation of a material fact in any application for any Guaranteed Student Assistance Loan, or in any application requesting interest and/or special allowance payment by a lender for Guaranteed Student Assistance Loan (s).
- (4) Make or file or cause to be made or filed, any false statement, certification, claim or report to the government or any school, lender, guarantee agency, state agency, accrediting body, or other organization affecting benefits under any Federal program of student aid or loans or loan guarantees.
- (5) Have knowledge of the occurrence of any event affecting (a) one's initial or continued right to any such benefit or payment, or (b) the initial or continued right to any such benefit or payment of any other individual in whose behalf one has applied for or is receiving such benefit or payment, and to conceal or fail to disclose such event with an intent to fraudulently secure such benefit.
- (6) Make application to receive any such benefit or payment for the use and benefit of another and having received it, knowingly and willfully convert such benefit or payment or any part thereof to use other than for the use or purpose for which made.
- (7) Fail to maintain records as prescribed in regulations as deemed necessary by the Secretary or Commissioner of Education and to fail to produce these records at all reasonable times upon notice by a duly authorized representative of the U. S. Government and to refuse to afford such representative access to examine said records. In the event permission to inspect said records is refused, such representative may obtain a subpoena for such records through any U. S. Attorney or Court of competent jurisdiction. When construing or enforcing provisions of said sections of the act, omission or failure of any person acting for or employed by any individual, partnership, corporation,


or association acting within the scope of his employment or office shall, in every case, be deemed the act, omission, or failure of such individual, partnership, corporation, or association as well as of such person.

- (8) Make any payment of Guaranteed Student Loan proceeds to a student borrower except by check payable to the student and/or an educational institution, and to negotiate any such check unless personally endorsed by the student.
- B. Any individual, partnership, corporation or association who violates any provision under Part A shall be, upon conviction, subject to imprisonment for not more than one year or fined not more than \$1,000 or both; however, if such violation involves intent to defraud, such person, firm or corporation shall be subject to imprisonment for not more than three years or fined not more than \$10,000 or both.

#### IV. LIMITATIONS ON PROPRIETARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

- A. Proprietary educational institutions shall be prohibited from participating in the letter-of-credit system operated by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare through the National Institutes of Health.
- B. Proprietary educational institutions shall be entitled to receive payments of funds pursuant to Federal grant and student assistance allocations only on the basis of vouchers attesting to specific commitments and expenditures of funds.
- C. Proprietary educational institutions shall be prohibited from eligibility as lenders under the Guaranteed Student Loan Program.
- D. No individual receiving sales commissions or compensation related to sales or enrollments may participate in any application for or processing of any application for Federal student assistance or Guaranteed Student Loans.
- E. Students attending proprietary educational institutions who have received Federal student aid, loans or Guaranteed Student Loans shall be entitled to refund of tuition and fees calculated on a pro-rata basis within 30 days after withdrawing from school or their enrollment is terminated for any reason. Any such refund shall first be applied to reduce the student's obligation on any outstanding Federal student loans or Guaranteed Student Loans and any balance paid to the student.
- F. The Secretary may adopt separate regulations governing the participation of proprietary educational institutions in Federal Student Assistance or Guaranteed Student Loan programs.
- G. Proprietary educational institutions shall be defined as those not qualifying under Section 501-C-3.

STATEMENT OF CONGRESSMAN BOB MICHEL ON THE INTRODUCTION OF THE STUDENT AID ABUSE ACT OF 1975 OCTOBER 3, 1975

It is now clear that there is substantial fraud and abuse in our Federal student aid programs, particularly the proprietary school segment of the guaranteed student loan program, and it is

high time we stopped it.

This fraud comes about in a great variety of ways. is no single m. o. Rather, the avenues which are used are as many and varied as the criminal mind. It is a con game of immense proportions, involving huge sums of money. When pieced together, it amounts to one of the most gigantic ripoffs in the

And who are the victims of this fraud? They are the taxpayers of the United States and the thousands of individual people who enroll in these schools after being led on by mis-

leading advertising and high pressure salesmanship.

My office has conducted a vigorous investigation on this problem, and I am delighted to say that we have had the cooperation of the new Secretary of HEW, and especially of the Commissioner of Education, Dr. Terrell Bell, who is with me today, and who is as committed as I am to rooting out this corruption, and ending the abuses which exist not only in the proprietary school industry, but also in the financial community and the Office of Education itself.

Dr. Bell deserves the applause and support of the people and the Congress for his commitment to good government. addition, he needs some new tools in order to do the job of cleaning up this blight on our education program.

The legislation which I am introducing today is designed

to provide those tools.

But before discussing the specifics of the bill, let me attempt to outline the parameters of the problem. This is a difficult task, because as I have indicated, there are a vast number of varieties of student fraud. But let me give you some idea of what we are talking about.

In many instances, the fraud comes about because fly-bynight proprietary school operators sign up students, have them
fill out the forms for the federal loans, sell the loan paper for cash, and then go out of business, leaving the student without the education they expected but still owing the government the loan money. In some cases, student names and signatures have been falsified on the loan applications.

Most of the time, the proprietary schools themselves are the lenders, and they frequently sell their paper to established lending institutions, who are willing to purchase it on the basis of the government guarantees. It is possible that in some instances lending institutions themselves have been party to these shady activities, although in most cases they are unwitting par-

ticipants, having purchased the notes in good faith.

Not all of the problems involve fly-by-night operations, There are some well-established correspondence schools, for example, that are systematically involved in the ripoffs. Characteristically, they operate on the basis of a high--perhaps enormous is a better word--rate of student dropouts. Justice would suggest that if a student drops out of a class after a few weeks, he should be refunded a prorated portion of his tuition, but in case after case this is not done. The result is that the school collects the full tuition through government

student loans, puts the money to its own use, and lets the government worry about trying to collect from the dropped-out student when the loan comes due. The student is then faced with a dilemma. He received no education, but he is in trouble with the law if he does not pay up. Given these conditions it is small wonder that the default rates on student loans are so astronomical. For the guaranteed loan program, these rates are currently about 18% and rising, with 70% of the defaults involving proprietary school students.

Let me cite for you here just three examples of cases that are currently under investigation by Federal authorities. Because these investigations are now in process, I cannot divulge the names of the schools involved, nor can I reveal which Federal agencies are doing the investigations. But I think these cases will give you some idea of what we are

dealing with.

The first case involves a vocational-technical school in Detroit. It has been discovered that 659 students of this school received Federal financial aid of \$400,000. The investigation also reveals that 20% of the 659 students never attended a single class, and that an additional 33% dropped out before completing the course. It is alleged that the school was ineligible for federal student aid to the 659 students. No accurate accounting system or documentation has been uncovered to substantiate or verify the school's claim to receive the Federal student aid money.

The second case. A Federal investigation into a proprietary school on the West Coast reveals approximately 7,000 students receiving Federal student aid. The drop-out rate is 50%. The estimated amount of money involved is between 9 and 14 million That is taxpayers' money the school collected on

behalf of students it never educated.

In the third case, a large, nation-wide proprietary correspondence school claimed 91,000 students receiving Federal Insured Student Loans. 89,000 of those students dropped out, and the investigation reveals that only 1,665 students graduated, some 2% of the students receiving government financial assistance. This school has averaged over 90 million dollars a year in FISL funds during the last five years.

There are any number of other cases, and some have received coverage in the press. At the moment, virtually all of them involve what is termed "program abuse," and therein lies the rub. There are at present no criminal penalties for these abuses. Unless the schools can be prosecuted for deceptive advertising or some other related crime, they cannot be

properly dealt with by the law.

My bill is designed to close this loophole. My bill would make it a Federal crime to defraud students receiving Federal assistance. It would also prohibit bribes, kickbacks, and other unethical inducements for individuals to make student aid grants or loans, or to sell student loan notes. It would make it a Federal crime to submit false claims and reports, make false statements or to falsify or destroy records needed to prove such violations. I intend to assure that Federal auditors and investigators have access to these records.

In addition, profit making schools will be prohibited from being lenders under the Guaranteed Student Loan Program, a power they have too often used as a sales device. And the student's and the government's rights to refunds will be

guaranteed in all proprietary schools.

The bill also provides that whoever receives disbursements of Government student aid funds be designated the custodian of those funds and be prohibited from using them for other than the purpose for which they were granted. The funds could not be co-mingled with other monies, and must be held in escrow.

Finally, we would charge the Secretary of HEW with the responsibility for the enforcement of these provisions, and authorize him to conduct appropriate investigations to insure compliance. In this regard, it is clear that a beefing up of the investigative staff of the Department from its current staff of ten is essential. We have added an additional 12 positions in the Labor-HEW Appropriations bill, and I intend to move for further increases when we put together a supplemental appropriation bill lates this fall mental appropriation bill later this fall.

Had these things been done years ago, we would not have the If they are done now, we will eradicate the problem today.

problem for the future. I intend to press for passage of this legislation with every resource at my command. I intend to stop the ripoffs and the fraud and the deception. cannot tolerate something like this in our country.

Ladies and gentlemen, let me say this. This thing is big; it is much bigger than we thought when we got started. How much money is involved? No one knows. It could be as

much as 500 million dollars; it could be more.

Who is involved? We're just scratching the surface. The tentacles of this thing appear to reach deep into the government.

They reach into some of the nation's largest corporations.

In the financial community, there are indications that banks, savings and loan associations, credit unions and other lending institutions are involved. The FBI has established task forces to probe the extent of this network.

There are people who have been perhaps unwittingly drawn

into it, including Congressmen and Senators who may have had no idea of the far-ranging ramifications of this thing.

I am gravely concerned about where it all may lead. It is

definitely not a penny ante matter.

There is going to be a lot of activity in this area as the investigations proceed. There is also going to be a lot of demagoguery, I fear, and some unproved charges tossed about. Those of us who are concerned about this problem have a special obligation to see that we do not by our conduct make statements which will damage the reputations of innocent people and infringe upon their personal rights. I intend to observe that standard.

On July 21, 1978, Congressman ROBERT H. MICHEL was interviewed at the Bethesda Naval Hospital, Bethesda, Maryland, where Congressman MICHEL was a patient. Congressman MICHEL advised that he is the Republican Representative from the state of Illinois, Peoria, Illinois. MICHEL resides at 322 8th Street, Southeast (S. E.), Washington, D. C. (WDC), home phone number 546-3729, business phone at the Rayburn House Office Building, 255-6201. MICHEL's date of birth is March 2, 1923.

MICHEL was advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the fact that the agents would like to question him concerning an assault and robbery against him during the early morning hours of July 21, 1978.

MICHEL advised that after work on Thursday,
July 20, 1978, he along with Congressman THOMAS RAILSBACK
and MARTIN RUSSO, along with several staff members had
participated in a softball game on a field near the
Lincoln Memorial. The game broke up around 9 p.m., and
MICHEL returned to his office in the Rayburn House Office
Building to shower and change clothes. He was then to meet
RAILSBACK and RUSSO at a small restaurant on 8th Street,
S. E. MICHEL stayed at this restaurant until sometime
after 10 p.m. when he said he drove RAILSBACK in his car,
to the Jenkins Hill Bar on Pennsylvania Avenue, S. E.,
WDC, where they met several other friends and had a few
drinks.

MICHEL said that around 12:15 a.m., July 21, 1978, he drove RAILSBACK back to his car on 8th Street, S. E., and then drove home alone. MICHEL stated that he could not park his car in front of his townhouse at 322 8th Street, S. E., because several police barricades were along the curb where a tree had fallen. MICHEL drove his car through the alley to the rear of his residence where a private parking space was located. MICHEL said that he noted nothing suspicious, parked his car and opened his trunk and got his athletic bag, closed the trunk and began

After he had taken several steps, MICHEL said he was hit from behind by an unknown individual who MICHEL could not further describe, but who appeared to hold him while another individual began beating him about the head and face. MICHEL could describe the individual that began hitting him as a Negro male, approximately six feet tall, and medium build. MICHEL said that he believes that this individual was wearing something red. MICHEL said that he was beaten repeatedly about the eyes and fell to the ground. He could feel that someone had removed his wallet from his rear trouser pocket, a money clip with approximately \$200.00 in bills from his front trouser pocket and some personal papers and his checkbook from inside sports coat pocket. MICHEL yelled for help during the assault and attempt to fight back and he said that apparently the assailants ran away when his neighbor came out and began yelling at them. was transported by ambulance to a Capitol Hill Hospital and then to Bethesda Naval Hospital.

In recalling the attack, MICHEL said that the only words spoken by the assailants were something to the effect of "let's go." He described the attackers as young males who seemed to know what they were doing. MICHEL said that he possibly struck one of the assailants as his right knuckles were cut. MICHEL said that his watch was also taken off of his wrist, he described the watch as a gold filled Bulova Accutron watch with a clip-on calendar on the band. MICHEL described the money clip taken as a gold clip with the seal of the Vice-President on it and the name GERALD R. FORD. In his wallet which was tan in color were the following credit cards: Standard Oil, Exxon, Shell, Mobil and Gulf Oil. Also American Express (gold), Avis Wizard Card, Capitol Hill Club, Bolling Air Force Base Officers Card, Illinois Registration Card, TWA and United Airlines credit cards. Also MICHEL said that he had an Illinois drivers license and insurance card plus several business cards with his name on them for his motel business in Peoria as well as his position as Republican Whip in the House of Representatives.

Narrative of Offense:

This investigation was instituted upon receipt of information from the Washington, D. C., Metropolitan Police Department on 7/21/78 that Congressman Robert H. Michel, Republican, Illinois, was assaulted and robbed at approximately 12:45 a.m. on 7/21/78, at the rear of his residence, 322 8th Street, S. E., Washington, D. C.

Investigation determined that on the above date, Congressman Michel parked his car in the rear of his residence at approximately 12:45 a. m., and while removing items from the trunk of his car, was assaulted by two males, one of whom was a Negro, who jumped him from the rear, knocked him to the ground and went through his pockets. The assailants removed personal papers from his sport coat pocket and threw them on the ground, wallet from his rear trouser pocket containing credit cards and personal identification and a money clip containing about \$200 from his front trouser pocket. One of the assailants said "Let's co." and the assailants departed the alley in an unknown direction. Congressman Michel was struck repeatedly in the face and admitted to the Bethesda Naval Hospital.

Two witnesses who reside in the vicinity of the 300 block of 9th Street, S. E., observed two Negro males enter the alley which runs west from 9th Street, S. E., to 8th Street, S. E., in the middle of the 300 block, about 12:40 a. m. on 7/21/78. Shortly thereafter, the two witnesses heard loud voices and dogs barking in the alley. A third witness who resides in the 300 block of 8th Street, S. E., also heard loud noises in the alley, looked out his window, and observed two Negro males assaulting a white male. He telephoned the police and again observed the two Negro males proceeding east in the alley toward 9th Street, S. E., and then proceed north on 9th Street, S. E.

A canvas in the vicinity of the 1300 block of Independence Avenue, S. E., resulted in the recovery of four credit cards which were in Congressman Michel's wallet at the time of the theft.

On 7/24/78, a white male, was
followed into the alley in the rear of the 200 block of
8th Street, S. E., about 8.00 m by two Negro males.
After entering the alley, was jumped from the
rear, knocked to the ground and the two assailants went
through his pockets removing personal papers and throwing
them on the ground. After finding no valuables, the
assailants left the alley in the direction of 8th Street,

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# SE Youth Convicted in Attack on Lawmaker

D.C. Superior Court judge yester-day convicted a 15-year-old Southeast Washington youth of the assault and robbery of Rep. Robert H. Michel (R-III.) near the congressman's Capitol Hill home in July.

Judge Joseph M. F. Ryan Jr. also found the youth guilty of assault with intent to commit robbery in connection with a second incident three days later in the same neighborhood.

Ryan said he would sentence the youth Nov. 3. The juvenile faces a maximum penalty of two years confinement in the city's Childrens Center unless the prosecutor moves to extend the term, according to Assistant D.C. Corporation Counsel James J. Stanford.

Michel, 55, was badly beaten and robbed of a gold money clip, \$200, his

wallet and watch during the assault at 12:45 a.m. July 21 in an alley behind his home in the 300 block of 8th Street SE. A second person, believed involved in the assault, has not been apprehended, Stanford said.

The youth was convicted of the as-

sault charge under a federal law the; makes it a separate offense to assassinate. assault or injure a member of Congress. That law was originally proposed following the 1968 assassination of Robert F. Kennedy, then a U.S. senator from New York.

# Youth Guilty of Assault )n a Congressman

By Allan Frank Washington Star Staff Writer

A 15-year-old Southeast youth accused of assaulting and robbing Rep. Robert H. Michel, R-Ill., and another man in a separate incident, was convicted today in D.C. Juvenile Court.

D.C. Superior Court Judge Joseph M.F. Ryan Jr., found the youth guilty of assault with intent to rob in connection with both assaults and guilty on one count of violating a federal law covering attempts to assassinate or attack members of Congress.

Michel testified yesterday he felt as if he had "been hit by a freight train" when he was attacked July 21 by two youths in an alley behind his home in the 300 block of 8th Street.

The congressman said he was returning home after dining with Rep. Tom Railsback, R-Ill., when attacked at 12:45 a.m. by two youths who pummelled his face and stole a vice presidential money clip, given to the congressman by Gerald Ford, \$200 in cash and an expensive wristwatch.

A second youth sought in connection with the attack on Michel has

never been arrested.

The 15-year-old also was convicted of one count of assault with intent to rob in a July 24 attack on Ernest Smith, 55, of the 1000 block of Independence Avenue SE. That attack occurred on 9th Street SE, one block from where Michel was assaulted.

A second suspect, Tony Curtis

Sanders, 20, of the 1700 block of W Street SE, is to be tried in Superior Court on a charge of assault with intent to rob in the attack on Smith.

SHE SAID she saw the face of the shorter youth. A second neighbor of Michel testified that after hearing scuffling, he saw some of the attack from his second-floor window.

Stanford then called to the stand two boys, ages 10 and 12, to testify in the case involving the assault on

Smith.

The boys said they were playing tennis about 8 p.m. in the alley behind a cluster of townhouses at 9th and C streets SE, when they saw two older boys attack Smith. The 10-yearold ran to comfort Smith while the 12year-old asked his babysitter to call

The two boys, who had watched the older youths flee from the alley, spotted the suspects walking toward Hine Junior High School at 7th and C streets SE. About the same time, a D.C. police officer drove by and the two young boys hailed him. The police officer then picked up two suspects for questioning.

The 15-year-old youth was not arrested and charged with the offenses until Aug. 25, when he was picked up by District police at his Anacostia home following the investigation of the Michel attack by FBI agents, U.S. Capitol police and District po-

lice.

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Enclosed for New York City and WMFO is one Xerox copy each of the envelope and letter, and on copy each of the LHM.

"Montana standard" Newspaper, Butte, Montana, telephonically advised the FBI Office, at Butte, that his newspaper had received a "filthy" letter from an unidentified source which threatened various people in political positions. That letter and its envelope were obtained from by the FBI at Butte, and appropriately handled to preserve any latent fingerprints of value.

The letter and its envelope were handled by the "Montana Standard" employees while they processed mail received on 4/23/90. The personnel handling the letter were identified as

Employees at the "Montana Standard" have no idea as to why they would have received such a letter.
