The enclosed documents represent the final release of information responsive to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request.

Some records which may have been responsive to your request were destroyed. Since this material could not be reviewed, it is not known if it was responsive to your request. Record retention and disposal is carried out under supervision of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), Title 44, United States Code, Section 3301 as implemented by the Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1229.10.

For your information, a search of the indices to our Central Records System reflected there were additional records potentially responsive to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request. We have attempted to obtain this material so it could be reviewed to determine whether it was responsive to your request. We were advised that the potentially responsive records were not in their expected location and could not be located after a reasonable search. Following a reasonable waiting period, another attempt was made to obtain this material. This search for the missing records also met with unsuccessful results.

This material is being provided to you at no charge.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. FBI responses are limited to those records subject to the requirements of the FOIPA. Additional information about the FBI and the FOIPA can be found on the www.fbi.gov/foia website.
- (ii) **Intelligence Records.** To the extent your request seeks records of intelligence sources, methods, or activities, the FBI can neither confirm nor deny the existence of records pursuant to FOIA exemptions (b)(1), (b)(3), and as applicable to requests for records about individuals, PA exemption (j)(2) [5 U.S.C. §§ 552/552a (b)(1), (b)(3), and (j)(2)]. The mere acknowledgment of the existence or nonexistence of such records is itself a classified fact protected by FOIA exemption (b)(1) and/or would reveal intelligence sources, methods, or activities protected by exemption (b)(3) [50 USC § 3024(i)(1)]. This is a standard response and should not be read to indicate that any such records do or do not exist.

- (iii) **Requests for Criminal History Records or Rap Sheets.** The Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division provides Identity History Summary Checks – often referred to as a criminal history record or rap sheet. These criminal history records are not the same as material in an investigative “FBI file.” An Identity History Summary Check is a listing of information taken from fingerprint cards and documents submitted to the FBI in connection with arrests, federal employment, naturalization, or military service. - (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute (A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;

For the information of the Identification Division, referenced teletype sets forth details of assault and robbery of Congressman MICHEL on 7/21/78. Congressman MICHEL was severely beaten and robbed by two Negro males as he was parking his car in the rear of his residence, 12:30 a.m., 7/21/78. MICHEL interviewed Bethesda Naval Hospital on 7/21/78, and furnished WFO enclosed personal papers. MICHEL stated UNSUBS took these papers from his suit coat pocket and when they determined they were of no value, threw them on the ground. Enclosed American Express and Admiral's Club cards were recovered by WFO approximately eight blocks from Congressman MICHEL's residence during Crime Scene Search during evening of 7/21/78.

WFO conducting joint investigation with the United States Capitol Police and WDC Metropolitan Police Department. Several suspects identified so far by nickname only.

Identification Division is requested to expeditiously process enclosed evidence as it is anticipated subjects will be identified 7/24/78.



For the information of the Identification Division, referenced teletype sets forth details of assault and robbery of Congressman MICHEL on 7/21/78. Congressman MICHEL was severely beaten and robbed by two Negro males as he was parking his car in the rear of his residence, 12:30 a.m., 7/21/78. MICHEL interviewed Bethesda Naval Hospital on 7/21/78, and furnished WFO enclosed personal papers. MICHEL stated UNSUBS took these papers from his suit coat pocket and when they determined they were of no value, threw them on the ground. Enclosed American Express and Admiral's Club cards were recovered by WFO approximately eight blocks from Congressman MICHEL's residence during Crime Scene Search during evening of 7/21/78.

WFO conducting joint investigation with the United States Capitol Police and WDC Metropolitan Police Department. Several suspects identified so far by nickname only.

On August 2, 1978 [redacted] was arrested by the FBI and the Metropolitan Police Department, WDC. [redacted] was in the company of another individual, a juvenile, who was turned over to WDC juvenile authorities. Both [redacted] and the juvenile denied involvement in the July 24, 1978, attempted robbery in WDC, on which the UFAP matter was based. The juvenile, who was also found guilty in the previously mentioned July 24, 1978, assault with intent to rob offense, continuously maintained he was not involved in the assault on Congressman Michel and would not implicate [redacted] who was an alibi witness for the juvenile.
