The enclosed documents represent the final release of information responsive to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request.

This material is being provided to you at no charge.

For your information, a search of the indices to our Central Records System reflected there were additional records potentially responsive to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request. We have attempted to obtain this material so it could be reviewed to determine whether it was responsive to your request. We were advised that the potentially responsive records were not in their expected location and could not be located after a reasonable search. Following a reasonable waiting period, another attempt was made to obtain this material. This search for the missing records also met with unsuccessful results.

FBI FOIPA Addendum

As referenced in our letter responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request, the FBI FOIPA Addendum provides information applicable to your request. Part 1 of the Addendum includes standard responses that apply to all requests. Part 2 includes standard responses that apply to requests for records about individuals to the extent your request seeks the listed information. Part 3 includes general information about FBI records, searches, and programs.

Part 1: The standard responses below apply to all requests:

- (i) **5 U.S.C. § 552(c).** Congress excluded three categories of law enforcement and national security records from the requirements of the FOIPA [5 U.S.C. § 552(c)]. This report contains the results of the trace evidence examinations (Hairs and Fibers).

Results of Examinations:

Fabric impressions were made from specimens K1 through K6 for comparison to fabric impressions found in specimens Q1 through Q28; however, the examinations were limited to the one to one photos specimens Q4 through Q11 and Q13 through Q28. The K1 through K6 fabric impressions are dissimilar to the fabric impressions found in specimens Q4 through Q11 and Q13 through Q28. Accordingly, specimens K1 through K6 are not consistent with having produced the fabric impressions found in specimens Q4 through Q11 and Q13 through Q28. No exams were conducted with specimens Q1 and Q2 as the files that were able to be opened appeared to be consistent with the printed photos Q3 through Q28.

The specimens were examined visually.

home and property. Dr, Mallove did not want his wife traveling with him on this particular trip, as he expressed to her, he feared there may be some issues with squatters on the property.

Dr. Mallove suffered multiple blunt trauma injuries to his face and scalp, fractures of the thyroid cartilage, and a stab wound to the arm, all indicative of a prolonged physical assault with one or more person(s). The crime scene was processed by the CT State Police. Items of evidence, including; blood from an unknown source, were discovered. It had been determined the victim's car had been stolen. The vehicle was later recovered from a commuter lot at the Mashantucket Foxwoods Resort and Casino.

A significant item of evidence discovered by crime scene investigators was a blood like substance (BLS) transfer pattern present on the beige trousers (NPD Item # 1) and white T-shirt (NPD Item # 5) worn by the victim. These items of evidence were seized by investigators on May 15, 2004, at the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner in Farmington, CT. Initially, this BLS transfer pattern was believed to have been created by footwear. A closer examination suggested the BLS pattern may have been created by an article of clothing, possibly the weave pattern of the fabric. An impromptu test was later conducted by the CT State Police Crime Unit utilizing a particular shirt with a similar weave pattern. This test was not conclusive.

On June 22, 2009, I spoke with the VP/GM-Sports Licensed Division, Reebok International located in Canton, Mass., regarding the identification of the fabric used to produce the Denver Nuggets jersey said Reebok International held the exclusive license to manufacture, market, and sell NBA (National Basketball Association) licensed merchandise, which included NBA branded apparel clothing said Reebok had Carmelo Anthony under contract and had produced apparel in his name along with his NBA team, the Denver Nuggets assemble swatches of material for a 2003-2004 Denver Nuggets Carmelo Anthony jersey which he made available to investigators. Investigators determined Carmelo Anthony apparel would have been available following the 2003 NBA draft where Anthony was drafted by the Denver Nuggets in June of 2003.		ъ6 ъ7с

This case is being investigated with the assistance of Senior State's Attorney of the New London County, CT State's Attorney's Office.

The Denver Nuggets Carmelo Anthony jersey worn by on the night of the murder was never recovered by the police. The samples submitted for comparison are swatches provided by Reebok International and are samples which cover the period of time when the 2003-2004 Carmelo Anthony jersey was produced.



It is requested the following items (1-6) be utilized for comparison to photographs of a BLS pattern present on the clothing of the victim, Dr. Eugene Mallove. Presently, the actual articles of evidence are maintained at the Norwich Police Department for submission to the CT Forensic Science Laboratory when requested. Arrangements will be made, if the actual items must be forwarded to the FBI Laboratory.

The beige trousers (NPD Item # 1) and white T-shirt (NPD Item # 5) worn by the victim at the time of his death had previously been examined by the CT Forensic Science Laboratory's Trace Unit, Biology Unit and DNA Unit. No testing for fabric or BLS pattern analysis was conducted. Personnel at the CT Forensic Science Laboratory were consulted prior to this request being made and supported this request. There is no controversy or conflict with this submission and no other interest by a separate police agency.

On May 15, 2004, Norwich Police Officer interviewed a witness who advised Officer he thought he had information pertinent to this investigation. The witness indicated that on May 14, 2004, he was had made several trips to the Mohegan Sun Casino. On May 14, 2004 sometime between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM., he observed the green van with www.infinite-energy.com sticker on the back in the Mohegan Sun Parking lot near the intersection of Sandy Desert Rd. The van was heading towards Rte. 2a and was being operated by a white male. The witness subsequently provided a detailed sworn statement to b6 Detective concerning his observations. The witness stated that right after b7C at Mohegan Sun Casino he saw a green colored mini-van with www.infinite-energy.com written b7D across the rear window of the vehicle. The van was stopped in traffic at the intersection of Cove Rd. and Sandy Desert Rd. at the Mohegan Sun Casino. The witness stated he was stopped next to the van and could clearly see into the van. The witness described the driver of the van as a white male, approximately 35 - 45 years of age, wearing a dark baseball cap. The witness noted the driver of the vehicle was wearing a white sock on his left had. On May 17, 2004this affiant and Investigator of the Norwich Police Department presented this witness with a line-up containing photographs of eight white males similar in appearance, including a photograph of witness identified as the subject he observed operating the victim's vehicle on May 14, 2004 15. On May 14, 2004, at 10:55 pm, Dr. Eugene Mallove was found brutally murdered at the residence of his childhood home in Norwich, CT. Dr. Mallove, a renowned M.I.T. and Harvard educated scientist, author and magazine editor, was a champion of alternate energy sources and embraced the controversial concept of Cold Fusion energy. Dr. Mallove was the founder of the New Energy Foundation and chief editor and publisher for Infinite Energy magazine.

Dr. Mallove was raised in Norwich, CT and lived at 119 Salem Turnpike, a single family residence owned by his parents. Later in life, Dr. Mallove married and raised his family in New Hampshire. He and his wife lived in Pembroke, N.H. at the time of his death. Dr. Mallove maintained the Norwich, CT residence, later renting the house after a long period of it not being occupied.

Dr. Mallove rented the property in 2003, but, later evicted the tenants in April of 2004 for lack of rent payments. On May 14, 2004, Dr. Mallove traveled to Norwich, CT, alone, to clean out the property which had been left in a bad state of affairs following the eviction. The investigation revealed this was not a common practice, as his wife would normally travel to CT and assist with the upkeep of the home and property.

Dr. Mallove suffered multiple blunt traumatic injuries to his face and scalp, fractures of the thyroid cartilage, and a stab wound to the arm, all indicative of a prolonged physical struggle with one or more person(s). The crime scene was processed by the CT State Police which revealed many items of evidence, including; missing items from the victim, particularly his shoes, blood transfer from an unknown source, and the theft of the victim's vehicle. The vehicle was later recovered from a commuter lot at Foxwoods Casino.

Two suspects, were later charged with the murder of Dr. Mallove. In late 2008, charges against were dropped. To date, dozens of witnesses, including the past residents, have been interviewed to no avail. DNA samples have been obtained from witnesses and suspects, no matching profiles have been established. Suspicious unidentified persons were seen in the area of the homicide scene, which is adjacent to a McDonalds Restaurant and a strip mall, up to 36 hours prior to and within the time frame it is believed the murder occurred.

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No clear motive has been established, however, it is believed Dr. Mallove may have been the victim of a robbery or had interrupted a burglary at the residence. He was actively seeking new renters and had signage on the front lawn advertisings the property. It was learned Dr. Mallove may have been visited by unknown persons the day of his murder who inquired about renting the property. A witness told investigators Dr. Mallove wrote the names of three potential renters in a spiral pocket note book he would always carry with him in his shirt pocket. Dr. Mallove's shirt and notebook were determined to be missing. Ironically, Dr. Mallove's body was found by a prospective renter who had stopped to inquire about the property.

Norwich, CT is a typical New England mill city with a mixed population of roughly 40,000 residents. It is situated in eastern CT within miles of Foxwoods Resort Casino and Mohegan Sun Casino. There is a large transient population, as well as, visitors from outside the area frequenting the casinos. The area of Salem Turnpike where the homicide occurred is mixed residential and commercial and is adjacent to Interstate 395, a strip mall and a McDonald's Restaurant.

Investigators have received numerous tips and assistance from the scientific community regarding several conspiracy theories revolving around the work done by Dr. Mallove in the Cold Fusion arena. No leads or investigative material moved investigators in this direction.
