I am trying to follow your work and every time I run into information that involves you as a speaker or presenter, I know that strong advocacy for the benefit of women is coming for the future.

I am starting a foundation, with a objective to advocate policies on health, environment and human rights. Women in the region have serious obstacles to access health care and services, and are suffering from a luck of information. Many preventable diseases are taking its toll because of the lack of information and facilities, especially regarding breast cancer and cervical cancer.
