## Clinton in a squeaker

We knew the race between Secretary of State <u>Hillary Rodham Clinton</u> and her predecessor, Condoleezza Rice, for most-traveled secretary in the first two years in office, was going to be a nail-biter - and it was.

But, in the end, Clinton, with a late flurry of January jaunts - including a six-day 16,500-miler to the Middle East - broke the tape with a virtual last-minute, one-day trip on Jan. 30 to Haiti. (The two-year count, compiled by our colleague *Glenn Kessler*, ends on Jan. 31 because a new administration's Cabinet members aren't confirmed until late January.)

So, the final standings:

Clinton - 165 days on the road, 40 trips.

Rice - 163 days on the road, 39 trips.

Warren Christopher - 148 days, 28 trips.

Madeleine K. Albright - 146 days, 35 trips.

James A. Baker III - 139 days, 27 trips.

Colin L. Powell - 127 days, 29 trips.
