Cheryl: I have an excellent relationship with Senator Coons, brief him at least once a month on key issues, and do not understand why (if the attached email is accurate) he would say/suggest I or someone in the Bureau did not inform him about the Secretary's trip. Checking my records, I met last met with Senator Coons on May 17<sup>th</sup> in his office. At that time I briefed him on his forthcoming trip to Ghana, Benin and Abuja over the Memorial Day recess.

I remember telling him that the Secretary would be going to the AGOA Forum in Lusaka and to Tanzania and possibly several East other African countries. (I was not specific about the other stops because they were still up In the air at the time.) Coons said the AGOA trip sounded interesting, but he was committed to traveling with Senator Johnny Isakson, the Chairman of the Senate's Africa Subcommittee, who has also been very supportive our policies. I also mentioned the prospects of the First Lady's trip in broad strokes.) The AF legislative officer also calls on Senator Coon's staff at least two or three times a month. Since Senator Coon's return from Africa, his staff has called to express his sincere appreciation for the outstanding support he received from our embassies and the Bureau. I intend to give Coons a back brief on the Secretary's trip and will make sure he feels our love. Johnnie
