[1] If you look at the President's campaign pledges, nearly all of them are diplomatic undertakings, e.g.:
Loose Nukes: Secure all loose nuclear materials around the world in four years;
Reductions in Stockpile: Negotiate dramatic reductions in the stockpiles of U.S./Russian weapons and material;
· Fissile Ban: Seek a global ban on the production of fissile material for weapons;
NPT: Strengthen NPT so that nations that don't comply automatically face strong sanctions; and,
• Fuel Bank: Create an international fuel bank to back up commercial supplies to remove excuses for nations like Iran that are building enrichment plants.
