PUBLIC DIPLOMACY

Cheryl indicated that Judith McHale has a proposal for a new structure for public diplomacy in the Department and wanted to be sure Pat had reviewed it. Pat said he had seen it, as has Jack, and both like the approach, though Pat noted some in the Department (especially the regional bureaus) may be less enthusiastic.

"HARD LANDING" IN JAMAICA

The American Airlines plane that made a "hard landing" in Jamaica carried 73 Americans, a number of whom were injured, although there were no fatalities. The flight originated in Washington and carried official and private Americans. Embassy Kingston employees are on the scene and at the hospital to provide assistance.

GOLDMAN CASE

- Goldman's Brazilian attorney and the attorney for the Brazilian family are discussing a possible "voluntary" handover of the boy to Mr. Goldman this morning. If that does not happen, Goldman will request an involuntary return. An NBC jet is standing by to return Mr. Goldman and his son back to the U.S.
- Rich said that the letter from the Secretary to Senator Lautenberg had not been delivered because Lautenberg's staff had indicated it might not be sufficient to persuade him to lift his hold, but the letter now appears to be overtaken by events in any event.

NATIONAL SECURITY STRATEGY
