Goldstone

• Anne-Marie said she had attended Goldstone's lecture yesterday where he had largely stayed away from discussion of his report, other than to note that the perpetrators generally "dump on the process." In an interview with Judy Woodruff, Goldstone said that he did not think the Administration had rejected his report entirely, noting that they had in effect embraced his central recommendation – that both sides conduct "credible public inquiries" within six months. Anne-Marie thinks that if there were such inquiries, Goldstone would be prepared to say that the two sides had complied with his recommendation.
