PRM wondered if there is any thought of Temporary Protected Status for Chileans. Craig Kelly said he did not
think so, noting that there has not been much Chilean immigration to the U.S. in recent years, and most of those
who have arrived are documented.

- Johnnie confirmed that the Kenyans claim they have no more capacity for prosecution, having accepted as many as 150 pirates up to now. He added that the international community has not stepped up.
- On Somalia, Johnnie reported the situation is deteriorating now have "in-land piracy" in Puntland. Bandits
 have captured 8-9 WFP food trucks and are holding the drivers for ransom.
- On the good news front, Kenya has agreed to open another refugee camp for Somali refugees, but needs funding. PRM noted we will announce a \$200 million commitment to UNHCR, which should help.

<u>SCA</u>

• Recent elections in Tajikistan were beyond the pale in terms of level of manipulation. Our embassy has issued a critical statement as has the OSCE.
