> We arrived at the general hospital last night with 1500 people sick or		

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> dying with 40 percent needing surgery. It has no water electricity or
> food and very limited surgical suites or supplies It the largest and
> most well known public hospital in the city and according to PIH and
> paul farmer needs to be supported and it's infrastucture needs to be
> rebuilt.
> Right now we have surgeons but not enough operating rooms set up. We
> desperately need to get a generator and fuel and surgical lights and
> surgery supplies not just first aid. There are hundreds including
> children with festering wounds needing amputation and emergency
> surgical care. The doctors nurses and patients have no food or
> water.
> Can you help get the infrastructure of electricity water and a medical
> hospital tent for post op patients. We are operating with headlamps
> and hacksaws rinsed with alcohol.
> If we have the electricity and water we can open 11 operating rooms
> tomorrow if we get what we need. Can the military help ASAP and for
> security of equipment and medication.
> Until this morning when
                               did the first amuptation there was almost
> no surgery happening at all here in the city and none at the General.
> Five days after the quake with no acute surgical care wounds are
> festering patients are getting septic and dying. If we had a little
> help with basic servcices we could stop this.
> I don't have cell or email at the hospital. Please coordinate with
> Claire Pierre or Nancy from PIH.
