The SYG just spoke with Susan.

On Haiti - the SYG said that it was his understanding that SRSG Mulet had agreed in recent conversations to a coordination plan with Raj, Amb. Merten, and Gen Keen. He said that Mulet has forwarded this "approved" plan (hereafter "the Mulet plan) and the SYG intends to present it in Montreal for approval. The SYG said that the Canadians are also on board with the Mulet plan.

Amb. Rice was non-committal with the SYG noting that she had not seen the Mulet plan.

As far as I know, nobody in Washington has seen the Mulet plan.

We need to urgently track down a copy of this plan quickly before the SYG calls the Secretary.

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Points for S-UN SyG Ban phone call on Montreal conference

- Look forward to Montreal conference as way to focus international community on both short-term relief and longer-term reconstruction effort in Haiti.
- Next opportunity for Haitian government to convey its priorities on the international stage and underscore that all efforts are in support of the Government of and people of Haiti.
- Greatly appreciate efforts of newly arrived SRSG Mulet and the entire UN team—both those who have come in since the earthquake, and those who continue to do outstanding work after going through such terrible losses to the UN Mission.
- [Anything else specific we need to highlight/ask of Ban about efforts right now w/UN either on the ground in Haiti or in NY???]
- We believe the Montreal meeting must set us on the right course for our reconstruction efforts to build a better Haiti. Getting our efforts off to the right start is critical. Appropriate and efficient coordination among international organizations and donors paramount.
- For this reason we hope that a donors conference will be announced at the end of the meeting, which the United States will offer to host.
- [If Ban mentions UN plan and architecture for coordination: We appreciate that the UN is thinking about this. Our views are very similar, and we look forward to hearing more details, recognizing that no decisions on these issues will be taken on Monday.]

Background: UN Secretary General Ban Ki Moon wishes to speak to you in preparation for the Canadian-convened meeting on Haiti in Montreal January 25. He has reached out to the Canadians as well and indicated that Special Representative Mulet will be bringing with him a "plan and architecture for coordination." We know nothing further on details. The Canadians have told Ban that they welcome the UN thinking about this and will take a hard look.
