

New Public Opinion Survey Findings from Pakistan Office of Opinion Research, U.S. Department of State

A January 2011 Office of Opinion Research survey of Pakistan's four provinces, conducted largely before the recent shooting incident in Lahore involving a U.S. embassy employee, finds favorable opinion of the U.S. has returned to levels found before flooding struck the country in mid-2010. Favorable opinion had increased last fall, likely due in part to U.S. flood relief efforts.

- Sixteen percent of Pakistanis now express a favorable view of the United States. Seventy percent express an unfavorable view (49% very unfavorable).
- The survey was conducted January 9-30, 2011.
